STAN OKOYE • F Sr. • VMI Raleigh, N.C.

Okoye averaged 30.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals in two wins last week. He opened with 21 points, six rebounds and six assists against Shenandoah on Jan. 2, and followed that performance with a career-high 39 points in the Keydets' Big South-opening win at Presbyterian College. Okoye tallied 26 points in the second half against the Blue Hose and also had eight rebounds and three steals in the victory. For the week, he was 20-of-33 from the field (=60.6 percent), 6-of-12 from beyond the arc (=50.0) and 14-of-16 at the charity stripe (87.5).

NIK BROWN • G Fr. • Longwood Ashburn, Va.

Brown averaged 15.5 points, 4.5 assists and 2.5 steals in two games last week. He dropped in 12 points with a career- and game-high five steals plus four assists and Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 31. Brown then scored a team-high 19 points in the Lancers' first-ever Big South game on Saturday against Coastal Carolina, as he was 6-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-7 from the free throw line to go along with five assists.

DIVIDE AND CONQUER

As the Big South has divisional play this season for the first time in League history, the League had its first crossover contests this past Saturday, and each Division went 3-3. The South Division was 3-1 in its road games while the North Division was 2-0 on the road. The first intra-division games will occur this Wednesday, Jan. 9.

A GAME OF MARGINS

The first Conference weekend saw the visiting teams go 5-1 in the six Big South games this past Saturday. Three games were decided by less than 10 points (8.0 average), while the remaining six were decided by double digits (13.0). Through six Conference games, the average margin of victory in the League season is 10.5 points.

STREAKERS

Both High Point and UNC Asheville have the longest active winning streak in Conference play at three consecutive wins, dating back to last season. Presbyterian carries the longest active Big South road win streak at five into this Wednesday's game at Coastal Carolina. The longest active home win streak in League contests belongs to UNC Asheville at five, and the Bulldogs will go for number six this Saturday against Radford.

BIG SOUTH'S ESPN3 GAME OF THE WEEK CONTINUES THIS WEEK

The Big South "BB&T Game of the Week" television package exclusively on ESPN3 continues this Saturday with Charleston Southern at Longwood airing live beginning at 2:00pm. **MATT HOGUE** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action from Willett Hall in Farmville, Va. For the first time, ESPN3 will carry a Big South match-up every Saturday of the Conference season (no League games are scheduled Feb. 23 due to BracketBusters), while ESPNU will televise two regular-season Big South games for the first time as well (Jan. 19 and Feb. 8).

CLIFF NOTES

Coastal Carolina head coach **CLIFF ELLIS** recorded his 100th win as Coastal Carolina's head coach with the Chanticleers' season-opening 74-70 overtime victory over Akron. He is now one of two coaches in NCAA history with 100 wins at four different Division I programs, joining **LEFTY DRIESELL**. Ellis is ninth among all active coaches with 639 Division I wins and is 35th all-time in Division I victories. His school-by-school breakdown: South Alabama - 171, Clemson - 177, Auburn - 186, Coastal Carolina - 105.

STEADY EDDIE

UNC Asheville head coach **EDDIE BIEDENBACH** is the Big South's all-time winningest coach for overall wins (247) and Big South victories (145). Now in his 20th year as a collegiate head coach, Biedenbach is 276-301 in his career, while his record in 17 seasons as the Bulldogs' leader is 247-250.

GREENWOOD ON CUSP OF BIG SOUTH'S 1,000-POINT CLUB

Coastal Carolina senior **KIERRE GREENWOOD** is one point away from becoming the fourth Big South player this season and 116th in League history with 1,000 career points. Below is a look at the Big South's active 1,000-point scorers, as well as those closing in on the milestone:

Meanwhile, Campbell's **DARREN WHITE** is 224 points away from scoring 1,000 points during his time in the Big South, and would need to average 13.2 in the Camels' final 17 games of the season to reach the milestone. White's season average is currently 21.8 markers per game.

SPEAKING OF COACHING WINS...

VMI head coach **DUGGAR BAUCOM** is three wins away from 150 in his career as a collegiate head coach, while Charleston Southern's **BARCLAY RADEBAUGH** needs six victories for 100 at CSU.

FIELD (GOAL) GENERAL

VMI senior **STAN OKOYE** is 10th all-time in Big South history with 650 career field goals and needs five to surpass former teammate **KEITH GABRIEL** (654) for ninth-place. Okoye, who reached the 600-plateau in the Keydets' win over Elon on Nov. 24, is 50 made field goals away from becoming the sixth player in Big South history with 700 career field goals. Meanwhile, Okoye is now the third player in the Conference record books to rank among the Top 15 in both scoring and rebounding, as he is 15th with 1,752 career points and 11th with 787 rebounds. He joins VMI's **REGGIE WILLIAMS** (1st - scoring, 8th - rebounding) and High Point's **ARIZONA REID** (5th - scoring, 2nd - rebounding).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

Campbell's **DARREN WHITE** owns the Big South's longest double-figure scoring streak in the Conference at 17 games, dating back to last season.

STAN'S THE MAN

Big South Preseason Player of the Year **STAN OKOYE** of VMI is the fifth player in Big South history with 1,700 career points and 700 rebounds after eclipsing the 1,700 career point mark vs. Shenandoah on Jan. 2. Okoye is three blocked shots away from 100 in his career, and is looking to become just the third player in League annals with 1,700 points, 700 rebounds and 100 blocks. He is also 248 points away from becoming the eighth player with 2,000 career points.

CAMPBELL'S FREEMAN NAMED A COUSY AWARD CANDIDATE

Campbell sophomore point guard **TREY FREEMAN** was named among the initial candidates for the 2013 Bob Cousy Award, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on Dec. 20. The Watch List will be narrowed down to 20 in January, the final 10 in February and the final five in March. The winner of the 2013 Bob Cousy Award will be announced at the Final Four in April.

GOING GREEN

Coastal Carolina senior guard **KIERRE GREENWOOD** became the 22nd player in Big South history with 400 career assists when he surpassed the milestone Dec. 13 against Toccoa Falls. Greenwood is now 18th all-time with 427 career helpers and needs three to move past UNC Asheville's **MATT DICKEY** (429 from 2008-12) for 17th. Greenwood is the third Chanticleer to make the Conference's all-time assist list, joining **ROBERT DOWDELL** (561 from 1987-91) and **ALVIN GREEN** (411 from 2000-05).

BOARD REPORT

VMI's **STAN OKOYE** is 13 rebounds away from becoming the 11th player in Big South history with 800 career rebounds. He became the 24th player in Big South history with 700 career rebounds when he surpassed the milestone Nov. 15 at Virginia Tech. Okoye is the second VMI player with at least 700 career rebounds in the Big South, as former Keydet and current Charlotte Bobcat **REGGIE WILLIAMS** grabbed 820 boards from 2004-08.

CUNNINGHAM HARDWARE

UNC Asheville redshirt-junior **D.J. CUNNINGHAM** has recorded 27 of his 38 blocked shots this season in his last eight games, an average of 3.38 in that span. He has at least three rejections in six of those contests as well. During his current streak, he became the 29th player in Big South history with 100 career blocked shots when he surpassed the milestone Nov. 29 against USC Upstate. Cunningham now stands at 125 blocks (T-20th all-time) and with 445 career rebounds, he is on his way to joining the Big South 500-rebound, 100-blocked shot club, which currently stands at 16 members.

HEIR APPARENTS

Charleston Southern's sophomore backcourt of **SAAH NIMLEY** and **ARLON HARPER** have replaced UNC Asheville's All-Conference guard duo of **MATT DICKEY** and **J.P. PRIMM** as the Big South's top guard tandem. As freshmen last season, Nimley scored 420 points (13.5 points per game), while Harper tallied 389 markers (12.5 per game). By comparison, Dickey scored 338 points (10.9 average) and Primm had 280 (9.0 a game) as freshmen in 2008-09. After 12 games into their sophomore seasons, Harper is at 15.7 per game and Nimley is averaging 15.1 points. Primm averaged 12.5 points as a sophomore in 2009-10, while Dickey scored 11.5 that season.

WINNING COMBINATION

Charleston Southern sophomore guards **SAAH NIMLEY** and **ARLON HARPER** have scored 15 points in the same game eight times in their young career (three times this season -- all consecutive), and the Buccaneers are 7-1 in those games. The duo has surpassed 20 points in the same contest in four of those eight outings, and CSU is 3-1 when they both score 20 in the same game.

TAKE COVER

VMI junior **D.J. COVINGTON** became the 30th player in Big South history with 100 career rejections when he surpassed the milestone with five blocked shots at George Washington on Dec. 22. Covington, who was hampered by injuries most of last season, is averaging 13.6 points, 6.4 rebounds, 2.69 blocks per game and is making 54.8 percent from the field in 2012-13. He has two 20-point, 10-rebound games this year among his three double-doubles. Through 13 games this season, Covington has logged 325 minutes with 177 points, 83 rebounds and 35 blocked shots. In 2011-12, Covington was limited to 362 minutes in his 24 appearances. He scored 121 points a season ago (5.0 average) with 64 rebounds (2.7) and 16 blocks.

BIG BROWN

In his last six games, High Point redshirt-freshman forward **JOHN BROWN** is averaging 20.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.2 blocked shots. In addition, he has grabbed 30 of his 51 total rebounds in this span on the offensive side. Brown has recorded his League-leading three 20-point/10-rebound games during this same timeframe.

MINUTE-BY-MINUTE

Presbyterian College senior KHALID MUTAKABBIR has played 3,911 minutes in his career, and is 268 away from becoming the Big South's all-time leader. He is 89 away from logging 4,000, which would make him the seventh player on record with that total. Mutakabbir has averaged 1,117 minutes played per season, and his average of 37.40 minutes played per game this year leads the Conference -- which would mark his fourth-straight year leading the League in the category. The Big South's all-time minutes played leader is Liberty's ANTHONY SMITH, who played 4,178 minutes from 2005-09.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

Several underclassmen continue to find themselves among the League leaders in various categories. Longwood freshman MICHAEL KESSENS is averaging a Conference-best 9.9 rebounds and has a League-leading seven double-doubles. Radford sophomore R.J. PRICE is the Big South's leader for most three-pointers made per game with 2.92. Campbell sophomore TREY FREEMAN is handing out a League-high 6.20 assists and is tops in assist-to-turnover ratio, while High Point redshirt-freshman JOHN **BROWN** leads the Conference in 20-point games (8), offensive rebounds (3.85) and steals (2.31). Lastly, UNC Asheville sophomore **KEITH HORNSBY** is first in the League in free throw percentage (95.3) as well as three-point percentage (45.5), based on a minimum of 2.0 3FG made per game.

REBOUNDING LESSONS FROM KESSENS

Longwood freshman MICHAEL KESSENS is looking to become just the second frosh in Big South history to lead the Conference in rebounding. The first was Big South Hall of Famer and former Campbell standout **JOE SPINKS**, who averaged a League-high 9.4 rebounds in 1990-91. Meanwhile, Kessens could also become just the second freshman to average double-figure rebounds in a season as well. The first was Gardner-Webb's JOSHUA HENLEY in 2008-09, who averaged 10.30 that year.

BAND OF BROTHERS

Liberty junior JOHN CALEB SANDERS and his brother and former teammate JESSE have combined to score 1,887 points during their respective careers with the Flames -- the third-highest scoring brother combination in Big South history. Jesse had 1,235 of the total from 2008-12, while John Caleb is at 652 since joining the program as a freshman in 2010-11. Below are the Brothers Sanders with the top two combos:

WHILE WE WERE AWAY ON BREAK...

The week of Dec. 17-23 was a memorable one for the Big South. In a four-day span from Dec. 19-22, the Conference collected wins over members from the ACC, BIG EAST and SEC. Coastal Carolina opened the victory parade with a 69-46 win over Clemson -- the Chanticleers' second consecutive win over the Tigers. UNC Asheville followed with a 72-65 victory at St. John's on Dec. 21 -- the Bulldogs rallied from 17 points down for the win. Winthrop concluded the run with a 74-67 win at Auburn on Dec. 22.

MORE ON THE BIG SOUTH'S LATEST BIG WINS

For the second consecutive year, the Big South has recorded wins over the ACC, BIG EAST and SEC in the same season, and the third time overall (1993-94 was the first). The Big South has now collected an SEC victory six out of the last seven seasons, an ACC win five out of the last six years, and a BIG EAST win five out of the last nine seasons. The Big South has two BIG EAST wins in 2012-13.

AGONY OF DEFEAT

The Big South suffered a total of 43 non-Conference losses this season by single digits, and the average margin of defeat in those games is 5.56 points. UNC Asheville suffered a League-high six of its eight losses by eight points-or-less -- including three-straight by an average of 3.0 points. The North Division teams lost a combined 24 non-League games under 10 points (5.67 average) while the South Division squads dropped 19 out-of-Conference games by single-digits by an average of 5.42 points.

WHERE THEY RANK?

As mentioned previously, UNC Asheville head coach **EDDIE BIEDENBACH** is the Big South's all-time winningest coach with 247 career victories. VMI's **DUGGAR BAUCOM** is seventh in League history with 110 career wins, while Coastal Carolina's **CLIFF ELLIS** is 10th with 105 career victories. Charleston Southern's **BARCLAY RADEBAUGH** is six wins away from becoming the 11th Big South head coach with 100 overall wins.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

High Point redshirt-senior **COREY LAW** became the 41st player in Big South history with 600 career rebounds when he surpassed the milestone Dec. 5 at Wake Forest. He is 40th all-time with 617 and needs 11 to move past Augusta's **KEENAN MANN** (627 from 1988-91) for 39th-place.

MYRTLE BEACH MADNESS

The 2013 VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Men's and Women's Basketball Championships will be held at Coastal Carolina University's new on-campus arena, The HTC Center, in the first year of a three-year agreement to host the Conference's marquee event. It will be a combined tournament for the seventh time in League history and the first same site event since 2002 when the Conference staged its basketball postseason in Roanoke, Va. The combined tournament will feature all Big South men's and women's basketball teams -- 23 in total.

BIG SOUTH TO MAKE EIGHTH APPEARANCE IN ESPN'S BRACKETBUSTERS EVENT

The Big South Conference will again participate in ESPN's BracketBusters event this season during the weekend of February 22-23, with a League-record 12 teams among the field of 122. All of the Big South's men's basketball programs are participating in the same year for the second time, and the Conference is tied for the most members competing of the 15 Leagues involved this season. Six Big South teams will host a game while the remaining six members will play on the road. The Conference is 12-23 all-time in the BracketBusters, including a League-best four wins in 2012. The Conference also has been selected for national television appearances five times in the past six years: 2007 (ESPN2), 2008 (ESPN2), 2009 (ESPNU), 2011 (ESPNU) and 2012 (ESPN3).

MID-MAJOR MANIA

The Big South has had a member ranked in the *Collegeinsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25 seven consecutive seasons, and has had five programs receive votes in this year's weekly ranking. Below is a look at this year's rankings among the Big South members:

BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE

With the Big South having 12 men's basketball members and divisional play for the first time in 2012-13, the Conference will utilize a 16-game League schedule this season. Each team will play its divisional opponents twice (a 10-game round-robin schedule), and one game against each crossover division opponent (six games total -- three home and three road).

The Conference has developed a new tiebreaker for this new divisional format, which will be used to determine the seeding of teams for the Big South Championship Tournament, if necessary.

TOURNAMENT SEEDING

The top two teams with the best overall Conference won-loss percentage in both the North and South Divisions shall receive the top four seeds in the Conference Championship Tournament.

Other seeds shall be based on division finish. In the event of a tie for a particular seed, the seed will be determined within each division as noted below

TIEBREAKER PROCEDURE

- (A) If one team has defeated the other team twice, that team shall be awarded the higher seeded position;
- (B) If each team has won one game against the other, the higher position will be awarded to the team that has the best won-loss record against the highest seeded team in the division not involved in the tie;
- (C) If each team has the same record against the highest seeded team not involved in the tie, then the won-loss record against the next highest seeded team in the division not involved in the tie, would be considered and so on down the line until the tie is broken;
- (D) If the records are the same against all teams, then the tie would be broken by comparing each team's RPI as published by RPIRatings.com after the completion of the regular season;
- (E) In the event of a three-way tie, the won-loss record of the tied teams against each other is first considered;
- (F) If the teams are still tied, the teams' records against the highest seeded team in the division not involved in the tie would considered, and so forth until the tie is broken:
- (G) If there is still a tie, then the tie would be broken by comparing each team's RPI as published by RPIRatings.com after the completion of the regular season;
- (H) For multiple ties larger than a three-way tie, the same procedure will be applied as used to break a three-way tie, and;
- (I) For all multiple ties, the tie is broken by first deciding the highest seeded team involved in the tie before deciding other seeding positions.
- (J) If the process reduces the number of tied teams, the remaining tie will be broken by starting the tiebreaking process over.

NORTH DIVISION

CAMPBELL FIGHTING CAMELS

Campbell extended its win streak to a season-best three games with wins at East Carolina (86-81 in OT) and vs. Gardner-Webb (93-81 in 3OT) ... The Camels played just their second 3OT contest in the Division I era (since '77-78) and first since Feb. 11, 1988, when CU fell to Radford 95-84 in 3OT at Fayetteville's Cumberland Co. Arena ... CU played back-to-back OT contests for the first time since Jan. 2-5, 2002, and also won back-to-back OT games for the first time since Feb. 4-6, 1984 ... Saturday's victory over Gardner-Webb marked the 4th-straight Conference opener the Camels have won ... TREY FREEMAN played 51 minutes (hitting season-highs with 24 points and 9 assists) in the win over Gardner-Webb. It marked the 2nd-most minutes played in a game by a Campbell player (BRAD CHILDRESS played all 55 in the 3OT contest vs. Radford in Feb. 1988) ... Campbell has defeated in-state rivals UNC WIlmington and East Carolina in the same season for the first time since 1989-90 ... DARIUS LEONARD hit career highs with 16 points and 15 rebounds vs. Gardner-Webb.

HIGH POINT PANTHERS

High Point opened Big South play with a win for the third time in four seasons under head coach **SCOTT CHERRY** ... The Panthers are 7-2 in their last nine meetings against Winthrop ... Five Panthers hit double digits in scoring at Winthrop for the second time this season. The other was in HPU's 99-36 win over Johnson & Wales. The last time High Point had five double-digit scorers against a Division I opponent was prior to 2008-09 ... **DERRELL EDWARDS** hit three 3-pointers at Winthrop. The only other player with three triples in a game this year was **DEVANTE WALLACE** at Chattanooga on Dec. 28. Last year, HPU players made at least three 3-pointers in a game 41 times.

LIBERTY FLAMES

Liberty has now lost its last three meetings with UNC Asheville, falling to 20-30 all-time against the Bulldogs ... Since returning to the lineup, **JOEL VANDER POL** has given Liberty a boost inside. In the first nine games without Vander Pol, the Flames averaged 30.4 rebounds per game and had a rebounding margin of minus-6. In the six games with the 6-10 center, the Flames are averaging 41.2 rebounds with a margin of +5.8. Liberty also has more blocks (22) with Vander Pol in the lineup than in games without (21). ... Liberty leads the Big South in three-point field goal percentage (37.6) and in three-point field goal percentage defense (28.1).

LONGWOOD LANCERS

Longwood played its first-ever Big South Conference game this past Saturday, falling at home to South Division opponent Coastal Carolina, 80-72. Freshman **NIK BROWN** scored 19 points to lead the Lancers, adding five assists, and classmate **MICHAEL KESSENS** posted his seventh double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Freshman **LUCAS WOODHOUSE** had a career-high and game-high eight assists ... Longwood remains at home this week for games against North Division favorite Campbell on Wednesday night, followed by preseason South Division favorite Charleston Southern on Saturday afternoon, Jan. 12.

RADFORD HIGHLANDERS

R.J. PRICE returned to the starting lineup vs. North Carolina A&T after missing three starts due to an injured ankle ... **YA YA ANDERSON** recorded a career-high 21 points at North Carolina A&T ... **JAVONTE GREEN** recorded his fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and 13 rebounds vs. Charleston Southern ... **BLAKE SMITH** is now 18 steals away from setting the career record at Radford. He is currently fourth with 175. The record is 192. He is 25 away from becoming the 16th player in Big South history with 200 career steals.

VMI KEYDETS

STAN OKOYE's career-high 39 points at Presbyterian tied him for the 10th-best scoring output in Keydet history ... Okoye moved past TRAVIS HOLMES (2006-09) into seventh place on the VMI all-time scoring list with 1,752 points and now stands 15 points behind AUSTIN KENON (2008-11) for sixth-place ... Freshman guard TIM MARSHALL scored a career-high 18 points against Shenandoah on Jan. 2, marking the third consecutive game when he had either tied or set a new career scoring high ... The Keydets' 86-77 win at Presbyterian College was VMI's first Conference opening win since 2008-09. It was also VMI's second Conference road opening win since joining the Big South in 2003-04 ... VMI's 14 3-pointers against Shenandoah matched a season-high set in the season opener against The Citadel ... RODNEY GLASGOW's 17 points against Presbyterian matched a season-high and he combined with teammates D.J. COVINGTON (18 points) and Okoye (39 points) to account for 74 of VMI's 86 points against the Blue Hose ... The 10 turnovers committed by the Keydets against the Blue Hose matched a season-low.

SOUTH DIVISION

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN BUCCANEERS

The Bucs moved to .500 this season with a win at Radford in their Big South opener, 81-74. **SAAH NIMLEY** had 20 points and 11 assists, one shy of his career high, while **MATHIANG MUO** had 15 points and career-high 15 rebounds. The Bucs put together an 18-1 rally to close the first half to turn a nine-point deficit into a 40-32 lead at the break. CSU also made 14-of-26 three-point attempts ... Nimley has scored 20+ points in five of his last seven games ... Following the win at Radford, CSU makes two more trips to Virginia in January to face Longwood and Liberty.

COASTAL CAROLINA CHANTICLEERS

The Chanticleers picked up their first road win and Conference victory of the season at Longwood this past Saturday. Coastal was led by **ANTHONY RAFFA** (26 points), **WARREN GILLIS** (21) and **KIERRE GREENWOOD** (19), as the trio combined for 66 of CCU's 80 points ... Greenwood is now just one point shy of 1,000 for his career and could become the 18th player in CCU history to reach the mark ... The Chants are now 22-6 all-time in Big South Conference openers ... The Chants host Presbyterian this Wednesday in their Conference home opener before traveling to Liberty on Saturday.

GARDNER-WEBB RUNNIN' BULLDOGS

Gardner-Webb hosts UNC Asheville on Wednesday. GWU is 0-8 vs. UNC Asheville since joining the Big South in 2008-09. The Runnin' Bulldogs hold a 24-13 overall record in the series, which dates back to the 1970-71 season when both schools were members of the NAIA ... Gardner-Webb's triple overtime loss at Campbell marked the program's longest game and first 3OT contest since moving to NCAA Division I status in 2000-01. Gardner-Webb had played two previous double overtime games, falling at home, 100-97, to Radford on Dec. 3, 2007, and defeating Liberty, 95-90, at home on Feb. 4, 2008.

PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE BLUE HOSE

Despite its record, PC has a higher field goal percentage than its opponents and is tied in free throw percentage ... PC owns a 46.5 FG% and 72.2 FT%, compared to 44.8 and 72.2 for its opponents, respectively ... **ERIC WASHINGTON** is averaging 6.57 assists per game, but has played in just seven of PC's 15 games this season. If he can maintain his average he will shatter PC's Division I season record of 3.5 set by **PIERRE MILLER** in 2010-11. Washington needs just 15 total assists to take the season total record ... **KHALID MUTAKABBIR** needs 201 points and 76 assists to move into PC's Division I career record books in each of those categories. He is tied with **AL'LONZO COLEMAN** in games started with 105.

UNC ASHEVILLE BULLDOGS

UNC Asheville split a pair of road games last week. The Bulldogs fell to 12-2 Charlotte in overtime, 71-63 before opening Big South Conference play with a win at Liberty, 83-69. Asheville scored a season-high 55 points in the second half vs. the Flames ... Asheville has now won six of its last eight games ... The Bulldogs are now 16-1 in Big South openers under EDDIE BIEDENBACH ... In the Charlotte loss, KEITH HORNSBY scored 16 points and grabbed a career-best 10 rebounds. JEREMY ATKINSON grabbed a career-best 13 rebounds against the 49ers ... At Liberty, Hornsby tallied a career-high 27 points by going 10-of-17 from the field and 1-of-5 from FT line. WILL WEEKS added a career-high 15 points ... Hornsby has hit 25-straight free throws and is fifth nationally in free throw percentage ... The Bulldogs are 11-1 in their last 12 Big South Conference road games and 26-2 in their last 28 games against League opponents.

WINTHROP EAGLES

The Eagles' struggles in Big South openers continued on Saturday in a 74-61 loss to High Point in which they gave up 48 second half points. It was the first halftime lead the Eagles have blown all season ... Winthrop, which had won its last two Big South openers, falls to 11-18 all-time in the first Conference game of the season and has lost two straight when opening League play at home ... The loss was also the fourth straight to the Panthers and the seventh in the last nine games between the squads ... Winthrop entered the week ranked 25th nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense (28 percent), but both opponents this past week knocked down eight threes in each game and combined for 16-for-36 (=44.4 percent) from beyond the aarc ... A bright spot this past week was the emergence of sophomore forward LARRY BROWN, who scored a career-high 16 points against North Carolina Central. He averaged 12 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks while shooting 63 percent from the field in the two games.
