CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Blount keyed Gardner-Webb's dominance of the game clock in Saturday's 3-0 win at No. 8/10 Wofford. He rushed 35 times for 139 yards and helped GWU control the time of possession game with a 35:38 advantage. Ten of Blount's carries went for first downs -- which were more than Wofford's total on the night (8). He carried nine times in a key second quarter drive that chipped 8:02 off the clock, including four first down rushes -- one of which was a fourth down conversion. Blount rushed seven times on GWU's final sustained drive of the game with the Runnin' Bulldogs clinging to the 3-0 lead, and nearly matched Wofford's rushing total of the night (144).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

O.J. LE'IATUA MAU • NG • Sophomore
Gardner-Webb • Masefau, American Samoa

Mau posted a career-high nine stops from his interior line position, including 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a quarterback pressure. He had an early tackle behind the line that forced a punt and tallied three tackles on third down -- with two forcing punts. Mau made tackles on three consecutive plays with Wofford deep in its own territory, and his sack came on the next drive to force a 3rd-and-17 situation. He made a team-high six stops in the fourth quarter and his pressure resulted in a game-clinching interception. Mau helped the GWU defense hold the triple-option Terriers to 149 total yards, eight first downs and nearly 100 yards below its season rushing average. For this effort, Mau has been named National Defensive Player of the Week by *The Sports Network* and a National All-Star by *College Sporting News*.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JORDAN DAY • PK/P • Senior
Gardner-Webb • Marvin, N.C.

Day made his second game-winning kick in as many weeks, lifting Gardner-Webb to an upset of No. 8/10 Wofford. His 35-yard field goal in a driving rainstorm with 10:52 to play was the only score of the game. Day also handled punting duties for the Runnin' Bulldogs, getting off five clean kicks despite the conditions for a 37.4 average. Two attempts were muffed by Wofford and recovered by GWU, and the Runnin' Bulldogs did not allow Wofford any punt return yards.

Robinson carried 12 times for 98 yards and a 2-yard touchdown in Charleston Southern's 20-12 win at Norfolk State -- the Bucs' third road win of the year. He had carries of 39, 20 and two yards in CSU's opening touchdown drive.

MAKE THAT A DOZEN

The Big South is 12-3 through 15 games against FCS opponents, extending the Conference's best start against FCS competition in League history. It is the second-most non-Conference FCS wins for the League, and one away from tying the all-time mark of 13 set in 2006. Among the 12 victories this season are triumphs over the Colonial Athletic Association and the Southern Conference (four), marking the first time since 2008 that the Big South has recorded regular-season wins against the CAA and SoCon in the same year. The four wins over the SoCon is tied for the most in Big South history (2006). The Big South has 10 non-Conference FCS games remaining in the regular-season.

RED STORM RISING

Gardner-Webb is ranked No. 25 in *The Sports Network* poll, the first time in 11 seasons that the Runnin' Bulldogs have been nationally-ranked. The last time GWU was ranked was in the 2003 *USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll* (No. 25 in preseason/Week 1). It is Gardner-Webb's first appearance in *The Sports Network* Top 25 since the 2002 campaign. That season, GWU ranked as high as No. 18 in that poll.

GARDNER-WEBB SCORES LEAGUE FIRST -- BACK-TO-BACK WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Gardner-Webb blanked No. 8/10 Wofford this past Saturday, 3-0 -- becoming the first team in Big South history to defeat nationally-ranked opponents in consecutive weeks. The Runnin' Bulldogs knocked off then-No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3 (12-10), also without a touchdown. The Wofford win gives the Big South a League-record three wins over ranked teams in 2013. Meanwhile, GWU won its first road game against a non-Conference foe since Sept. 12, 2009 at Western Carolina, and this past Saturday's win was its first over a ranked team on the road since a 38-35 win at No. 23 New Hampshire on Nov. 11, 2000.

BIG SOUTH'S STREAK OF NATIONALLY-RANKED PROGRAMS CONTINUES

With Coastal Carolina ranked No. 11 this week in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 12 in *The Sports Network* ranking, the Big South has had a football squad nationally-ranked for 25 consecutive weeks, dating back to Week 9 of the 2011 campaign (Oct. 24). In fact, Coastal Carolina is now the second team in Big South history to be ranked in BOTH polls each of the first five weeks of the regular-season (including preseason). The Chanticleers join former member Stony Brook, which was ranked in the Top 25 every week of the 2012 campaign. Coupled with Gardner-Webb's national ranking, it is the third-straight year and fourth time overall in League history that two Big South teams were ranked in the same week.

CHADWELL, TWO 4-0 TEAMS ALSO LEAGUE FIRSTS

Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern each are 4-0 -- the first time in Big South football history that two teams opened the season 4-0 in the same year. In fact, the Big South is currently the only FCS Conference with two 4-0 teams. The Chanticleers are 4-0 for the first time in school history, while the Buccaneers are 4-0 for the first time since opening the 2006 campaign with a 9-0 mark. In addition, new CSU head coach **JAMEY CHADWELL** is the first head coach to start 4-0 in his first season in the Big South.

50-50 PROPOSITION

Coastal Carolina defeated Hampton, 50-17, this past Saturday, one week after defeating then-No. 25 Eastern Kentucky, 51-32. The streak marks the first time in League history that a Big South member has scored 50 points in back-to-back games against non-Conference FCS opponents. The Hampton contest was also Coastal's 13th 50-point game in program history, the second-most in Big South annals.

BEWARE OF THE DOG


Gardner-Webb held No. 8/10 Wofford to 144 net rushing yards, 97 yards below the Terriers' season average of 241.7. The Runnin' Bulldogs have held its three FCS opponents to 10.3 points, 81.3 rushing yards and 233.3 yards of total offense per game thus far in 2013. GWU limited Richmond to just 10 net rushing yards in Week 3, the second-fewest allowed against a non-Conference FCS opponent in League history. The fewest net rushing yards allowed by a Big South member to a non-Conference FCS foe is minus-4 -- VMI vs. St. Francis (Pa.) on Sept. 6, 2008.

THREE-AND-IN

Gardner-Webb's 3-0 victory over No. 8/10 Wofford established the Big South record for lowest scoring game. It was the Conference's first shutout of a non-League FCS opponent since 2008 when VMI defeated St. Francis (Pa.), 49-0 in the season opener. It was Gardner-Webb's first shutout since a 65-0 victory over Southern Virginia in 2009 (a span of 41 games) and its first shutout of an FCS opponent since blanking Savannah State, 66-0, in 2007. Saturday's shutout was Gardner-Webb's seventh as a Big South member -- tied with Liberty for the most in League annals.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

Coastal Carolina is 9-1 in its last 10 games when rushing for more than 200 yards, including 3-0 this season. The Chanticleers have rushed for more than 200 yards 53 times in its history, and are 48-5 (=.906) when reaching the 200-rushing yard threshold.

BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL "GAME OF THE WEEK" ON ESPN3

The Big South Conference is televising nine football games exclusively on ESPN3 this season as part of its "Game of the Week" package. The next broadcast will be Saturday's Charlotte at Presbyterian College -- the second of two non-Conference games the Big South is televising this season for the first time. **EVAN LEPLER** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will handle the call from Bailey Memorial Stadium in Clinton, S.C. Overall, the Big South will appear on television every week of the season for the second consecutive year as a total of 23 games will be televised. The first League game on ESPN3 will be the Oct. 12 Gardner-Webb at Coastal Carolina contest.

BUC-ING THE TREND

Charleston Southern is in the midst of a three-game road trip, the third consecutive season that the Buccaneers will have played three-in-a-row away from home and the fifth time in the last six years -- including twice in 2008. The Bucs are 2-0 on their current swing and have won three-straight road tilts, the squad's longest road win streak since 2006.

KEEPING TALLIES ON TALIAFERRO

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO** has rushed for 486 yards through the Chanticleers' first four games, the second-highest rushing total by a Chanticleer after the first four games of a season. Former RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** gained 498 yards through Coastal's first four contests of its inaugural campaign of 2003. Taliaferro's 121.5 rushing yards per game is pacing ahead of **PATRICK HALL's** school record of 100.6 during the 2004 season, which Hall finished with a school record 1,107 rushing yards.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 89, while the second-longest active streak belongs to Coastal Carolina (20). Meanwhile, Liberty is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 33, the third-longest streak in Big South history. That record is 45 games, established by the Flames from Sept. 23, 2006 - Sept. 18, 2010.

CSU'S SEASON STARTS WITH DIXON

Charleston Southern dual-threat QB **MALCOLM DIXON** became the first quarterback in Big South history with back-to-back games of 100 yards rushing and 100 yards passing when he achieved the feat in Weeks 2 and 3. He rushed for 135 yards and passed for 140 in Week 3 at Campbell after gaining 102 rushing yards and 123 passing yards against Shorter in Week 2. Now the fifth quarterback in Big South history with two career 100-yard rushing and passing games, Dixon is the second quarterback in League annals to rush for 100 yards in consecutive contests. The first was VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2008.

BLOUNT FORCE

Gardner-Webb RB **JUANNE BLOUNT's** 35 rushing attempts at Wofford this past Saturday is tied for the third-most in a single-game in Big South history. It was the most rushing carries by a Big South player since Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** had 35 at Coastal Carolina on Oct. 4, 2008. Meanwhile, Blount is the first Runnin' Bulldog with more than 400 rushing yards (420) after four games since **KENNY LITTLE** in 2011 (407), and has the most rushing yards by a GWU back through four games since before the Big South began football in 2002.

COAST-TO-COAST

Coastal Carolina ran 91 plays this past Saturday against Hampton, the fifth-most in a single-game in Big South history. It was the most offensive plays run by a Big South team since Gardner-Webb's 94 against Western Carolina on Sept. 18, 2010. Coastal's 91 plays vs. the Pirates included a school-record 69 rushes -- tied for the third-most in a single-game in the League record book. The Chanticleers also amassed a Big South single-game record 27 rushing first downs, bettering the old mark of 26 by Stony Brook against Iona on Nov. 8, 2008. The Chants tallied 34 total first downs against Hampton, the second-most in a game and the most-ever against an FCS opponent.

WHISTLING DIXON

Charleston Southern QB **MALCOLM DIXON**, who became the sixth quarterback in the Conference record books to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards, is sixth on the list with 1,167 and 16 yards shy of moving past Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (1,182) for fifth-place. Meanwhile, Dixon needs 351 passing yards to become just the fourth QB in League annals with 1,000 career rushing yards and 3,000 career passing yards.

HOME RUNS

Liberty and Charleston Southern have the League's top two longest active home win streaks. Liberty has won six consecutive games at Williams Stadium, which is the Flames' longest since winning 10-straight home games from Oct. 3, 2009 to Sept. 17, 2011. The Buccaneers' run stands at five-straight, which is their longest since winning seven consecutive home games from Sept. 27, 2008 to Oct. 3, 2009.

BIG TIME RUSH

Charleston Southern rushed for 201 yards this past Saturday at Norfolk State, one week after gaining 327 yards at Campbell. It is the first time the Buccaneers have gained 200 yards on the ground in back-to-back games against non-Conference FCS opponents since the Big South began football in 2002. CSU has rushed for more than 200 yards in a game seven times since the start of the 2012 season, and has gone 6-1 in those contests.

DAY'S BIG DAY

Gardner-Webb PK **JORDAN DAY** tied the Big South single-game record with his four field goals against No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3, as he scored all 12 points in the Runnin' Bulldogs' 12-10 victory. Day is the eighth different kicker in League history to make four field goals in a game, and the first since former GWU kicker **TREVER AUSTIN** on Oct. 22, 2011 against Coastal Carolina.

REAL ESTATE ACQUISITION

Coastal Carolina surpassed 500 yards of offense for the second consecutive week with 511 against Hampton this past Saturday. The Chants had 631 total offensive yards in Week 3 at Eastern Kentucky, marking the second time in the **JOE MOGLIA** era that the squad eclipsed at least 500 offensive yards in back-to-back games. The first time was Nov. 3-10 of last season when Coastal racked up 596 yards at Gardner-Webb and 625 the following week at Presbyterian. The Chanticleers will look to become just the third Big South member with three consecutive 500-yard games this Saturday.

PRESS ON

Gardner-Webb senior DE **PRESTON PEMASA** is second in Big South history with 39.0 career tackles-for-loss. He is also eighth in the Conference record book with 13.5 quarterback sacks and is 4.0 sacks shy of moving into second in that category. Former Gardner-Webb All-American **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the Big South's all-time leader in both categories with 53.5 TFL and 20.5 sacks.

KORDENBROCK IS LOCKED IN

VMI senior QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** became the 10th player in Big South history with 5,000 career passing yards when he eclipsed the milestone in Week 3. He currently ranks eighth with 5,379 and is 621 yards shy of becoming the seventh quarterback with 6,000 career passing yards. Kordenbrock is also third all-time in the Conference record book with 507 completions and 949 attempts, and is chasing former Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** for second in both categories. Roberts had 597 completions and 1,007 attempts during his career from 2002-05.

FOGG ALERT

Liberty redshirt-senior **KEVIN FOGG** recorded a 29-yard pick-6 against Monmouth in Week 2 -- his sixth career return touchdown and first interception return TD. He is the first player in Big South history with return touchdowns on an interception (1), fumble (1), punt (1) and kickoff (3). Fogg is tied as the Big South's all-time leader for most kickoff return touchdowns, and coupled with his one career punt return score, he is second in League history with four kick return TDs. He needs one to tie the all-time mark of five, set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3 KR, 2 PR) from 2005-08.

BIG SOUTH SCORES LEAGUE FIRST WITH TWO WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS IN SAME WEEK

For the first time in League history, the Big South defeated two nationally-ranked teams in the same week of the regular-season as Gardner-Webb upset No. 11/15 Richmond and Coastal Carolina won at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. It was the second time overall in the Conference record book, as the Chants and former member Stony Brook achieved the feat in the first round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs. GWU also handed Richmond its first non-conference FCS loss since 2005 -- ending the Spiders' 17-game win streak in such games. Meanwhile, the Chants' win at EKU improved the Big South to 4-7 all-time when a ranked Big South team plays a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent.

COASTAL CAROLINA SETS BIG SOUTH SCORING RECORDS AGAINST A RANKED TEAM

Coastal Carolina's 51 points at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky was the most scored by a Big South member against a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent in League history. The previous high was 35 by the Chanticleers in last season's playoff loss at Old Dominion. Coastal's 19-point victory over the Colonels is the Big South's second-largest margin of victory against a ranked non-Conference team, just after Liberty's 23-point win over No. 12 Elon in 2008.

TONIGHT ON 20/20

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 20 points in 12 consecutive games, dating back to last season -- the longest current streak in the Big South and the Chanticleers' longest such streak since scoring 20 points in 20 consecutive contests from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 25, 2006. Coastal's 51 points at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3 was its most scored against a non-Conference FCS foe since scoring 66 points vs. Savannah State on Nov. 4, 2006.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR THIS ONE

Coastal Carolina and Liberty will meet this season in Lynchburg on Oct. 19 for the 11th time. The series is tied at 5-5, and the winner of the match-up has won or shared the Big South football Championship eight times. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the title in 2012 as well as 2010.

COMBO MEAL

Coastal Carolina (631) and Eastern Kentucky (477) combined for 1,108 yards in Week 3. The combined yardage is the sixth-highest total in Big South history, and the Chanticleers have been involved in three of the top six. Coastal has the top spot (1,212 with Old Dominion on Dec. 2, 2012) and also the third-highest (1,143 with Gardner-Webb on Nov. 3, 2012).

HEY YOU... I KNOW YOU, I KNOW YOU

Richmond Spiders and former Liberty head coach **DANNY ROCCO** faced his old team for the first time since taking over the UR program in 2012, and came away with a 30-21 win. Rocco, who coached against the Big South in three of the first four weeks of the season, is 4-1 against the Big South as Richmond's head coach, including 2-1 this year. Rocco spent six seasons in the Big South as the Flames' leader from 2006-11, and directed his teams to a 26-5 Conference record and 47-20 overall mark.

MORE FAMILIAR FOES

In addition to Richmond, the Big South will face two additional FCS opponents at least three times during the regular-season: Furman and Charlotte. The Big South went 2-1 in its three games against the Paladins, and will play the start-up 49ers four times in 2013.

MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE

Coastal Carolina senior **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the Big South's all-time leader for punt returns (68) and punt return yards (585). He is the third player in Big South history with at least 100 combined kickoff/punt returns in a career, as he is third all-time with 115 (47 KR, 68 PR). He needs 13 returns to break the Conference record of 127, which is held by former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY**. Maypray returned 98 kickoffs and 29 punts in his career from 2006-09. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is the only player in the Conference record books with two punt returns of at least 80 yards.

THREE BILLS

VMI quarterback **ERIC KORDENBROCK** threw for a career-high 369 yards against North Greenville in Week 3 -- his second consecutive 300-yard passing game. He is the first Big South quarterback with back-to-back 300-yard passing games since Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** last season on Oct. 27 and Nov. 3. Kordenbrock is the first Keydet QB with two-straight 300-yard passing games since 1986 when **DAVE BROWN** threw for 422 yards against Appalachian State and followed with 390 yards the next week at East Tennessee State.

MEMBERS ONLY

Coastal Carolina junior LB **QUINN BACKUS** became the 39th player in Big South history with 200 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. His career total now stands at 208, which includes 109 solo stops. Presbyterian College junior LB **DONELLE WILLIAMS** became the 38th player in the 200-tackle club during Week 2, and his career numbers stand at 209 tackles and 110 solo hits.

EYES ON HAZEL

Coastal Carolina senior WR and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **MATT HAZEL** is the Big South's active career leader with 128 receptions (12th in League history), 1,775 receiving yards (13th) and 19 touchdowns (tied for 7th). He has also been named to the 2014 Senior Bowl Watch List as well as the South Carolina Football Hall of Fame College Player of the Year Award Watch List.

COMING ATTRACTIONS

The Big South Conference will welcome **MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2014 and start-up program **KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2015. Monmouth's addition will maintain the League's membership at six squads, while KSU's addition returns the Big South to seven members, which was the total from 2008-12. The Hawks got an early taste of League play with their 45-15 defeat at Liberty in Week 2. The Big South is 3-0 against Monmouth, with Coastal Carolina also earning wins in 2008 and 2009.

MOVING ON

VMI is playing its final campaign in the Big South this season, as the Keydets are rejoining the Southern Conference next fall. The Big South bid farewell to Stony Brook following the 2012 campaign with the Seawolves' move to the CAA after five years as an associate member.
