### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**LUCAS BEATTY • QB • R-Junior**  
 Gardner-Webb • Charlotte, N.C.

Beatty had a career-best passing day against Charlotte, as he was 35-of-52 for 389 yards and four touchdowns. He finished with 393 yards of total offense, and his 35 completions are tied for second-most in a single-game in Big South history. He staked GWU to a 10-point lead three different times in the first half and was 21-of-28 for 246 yards and three scores in the first 30 minutes. Beatty led three long scoring drives in the second half and tallied his fourth TD pass to open the second half scoring.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**KENNY SCOTT • CB • Junior**  
 Liberty • Appomattox, Va.

Scott recorded five tackles, two interceptions and a pass break-up at Old Dominion. Four of his five tackles were solo stops and both of his interceptions came in the end zone to keep the Monarchs off the scoreboard. Scott's two picks helped the Flames hold ODU to less than half of its scoring average, and he tallied one of Liberty's seven pass break-ups on the night.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**STEPHEN DOAR • P • R-Sophomore**  
 Presbyterian College • Landrum, S.C.

Doar averaged 40.4 yards on eight punts at Wofford, with a net average of 37.6 yards. He placed two of his punts inside the 20-yard line and had just three returned. Doar boomed seven of his eight punts more than 40 yards, including a 49-yarder. He also handled placekicking duties for the first time and was successful on two PAT attempts.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**MIKE ESTES • TE • R-Freshman**  
 Gardner-Webb • Raleigh, N.C.

Estes caught a career-high four passes for 74 yards and his first career touchdown against Charlotte. All four of his catches went for first downs and all four occurred in the second half. His 27-yard touchdown catch from receiver **Richard Jules** put Gardner-Webb ahead 45-24 in the third quarter. Estes added catches of 10 and 22 yards to keep GWU's final scoring drive alive.

**BLUE SWARM**

Charleston Southern is nationally-ranked for the first time since the 2006 season, as the Buccaneers are No. 25 in this week's FCS Coaches poll. The last time CSU was in the Top 25 rankings was the week of Nov. 6, 2006, following the Bucs' 9-0 start to the season (No. 24 - *Sports Network*, No. 25 - *Coaches*). Charleston Southern's entry marks the third Big South program to be ranked this year -- the second time in League history that three teams were nationally-ranked at any point of the season.

**TIS THE CONFERENCE SEASON**

The Conference portion of the 2013 schedule kicks off this Saturday, Oct. 12, with four of the six League members in action. It is the third time Gardner-Webb and Coastal will open the Big South season against each other (2003, 2005), while Charleston Southern and VMI open against each other for just the second time (2004). Liberty and Presbyterian have open dates this weekend and will play their Big South openers next Saturday. Below is a breakdown of how each squad has fared in its respective Conference opener, as well as some additional notes:

Charleston Southern will open Big South play on the road for the fifth-straight season and eighth time overall (0-7 in that span) ... Coastal Carolina has finished the season with a .500 record-or-better when winning its Conference opener ... Gardner-Webb won the very first Big South game on Oct. 5, 2002, a 31-21 victory at Liberty ... Liberty is averaging 45.3 points in its last six Big South openers ... Presbyterian is opening its League season following a bye week for the second time in three seasons ... VMI is 3-3 when starting the Big South campaign at home.

**THE TWENTIES**

Defending Big South co-champion Coastal Carolina has won its last five Big South games, the longest active streak in the Conference. The Chanticleers have won those five League tilts by at least 20 points -- a Big South record, with a 30.4 average margin of victory in the five contests.

**BURNING UP THE HOUSE**

Liberty owns a Big South-record 18-game Conference win streak, and swept its home Big South schedule for the sixth consecutive season in 2012. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 777 points (43.2 points per game), scored more than 30 points in 15 contests, and has held its League brethren to 335 points (18.6). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

**HIGH TIDE ALONG THE COAST**


Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 6 this week in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 8 in *The Sports Network* ranking -- the highest for the Big South at this point in the season in League history. It is also the League's highest ranking in the Coaches poll, as the previous best was No. 8 (Coastal in 2005 and Stony Brook in 2012). In addition, Coastal Carolina is now the second team in Big South history to be ranked in BOTH polls each of the first seven weeks of the regular-season (including preseason). The Chanticleers join former member Stony Brook, which was ranked in the Top 25 every week of the 2012 campaign. The Big South has had a football squad nationally-ranked for 27 consecutive weeks, dating back to Week 9 of the 2011 campaign (Oct. 24).

**THE UNDEFEATEDS**

Charleston Southern is the third team in Big South history to open the season 6-0, joining the 2006 Buccaneers (9-0) and 2008 Liberty Flames (6-0). Coastal Carolina (5-0) is looking to join the group this weekend. The Big South is one of two FCS Conferences with two undefeated teams (Ivy League) but is the lone with two teams at least 5-0. In addition, CSU first-year head coach **JAMEY CHADWELL** is the first head coach to start 6-0 in his first season in the Big South.

**TRIPLE OPTION OFFENSE**

Coastal Carolina is the first team in Big South history to score 50 points, rush for more than 300 yards and gain more than 500 yards of offense in three consecutive games, as the Chanticleers have surpassed all three benchmarks in the last three games. The Chants' achievement has also tied the Big South records in each category separately. Meanwhile, Coastal's season average of 507.6 yards of offense is pacing way ahead of the Big South single-season record of 468.1 established by the Chanticleers in 2006.

**BACKUS ADDED TO BUCHANAN LIST**

Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS** was added to the 2013 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List last week, becoming the first Big South candidate for the FCS Defensive Player of the Year award since 2011 (Coastal's **JOSH NORMAN** and Presbyterian's **JUSTIN BETHEL**). Backus is the seventh overall Big South student-athlete to be an official candidate for the Buchanan Award.

**REYES OF SUNSHINE**

Charleston Southern RB **CHRISTIAN REYES** is second in the Big South with 684 rushing yards after six games, which already surpasses the Buccaneer's leading rushing total from last season (576 - **TEDDY ALLEN**). In fact, Reyes has surpassed CSU's top individual rusher every year since 2006, and the last Buccaneer to rush for more than 600 yards in a season was **ANDRE COPELAND** in 2005 (721). Reyes is less than 100 yards from breaking CSU's single-season rushing record (774 - **VINSON BLAIR** in 1998).

**RECORD COMBO MEAL**

Gardner-Webb and Charlotte combined for 104 points, 186 plays and 1,163 yards of offense this past Saturday. The two teams set a Big South single-game record for combined plays, breaking the old mark of 183 that was set by the Runnin' Bulldogs (99) and VMI (84) in a triple-overtime classic on Oct. 22, 2005. The combined yardage is the third-most in a game while the combined points tied for the third-most in Big South history.

**TEN-TAMOUNT**

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO** is the first player in Big South history to score 10 touchdowns in his team's first five games. He leads the League with 11 TDs (10 rushing and one receiving), becoming the fastest player to reach double-digits in touchdowns. Taliaferro has scored a touchdown in every game this season, the second-straight year a Big South player has reached the end zone in each of his team's first five contests (Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET**). Taliaferro owns a streak of three consecutive multi-TD games, the longest in the Big South since Maysonet's League-record streak of six consecutive games with at least two scores in 2012.

**DOUBLED UP**

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 40. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 52 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 49 of its League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (24 games).

**ROSS FOR MORE**

In his last three games, Coastal Carolina QB **ALEX ROSS** is 53-of-78 passing for 713 yards and three touchdowns with a 171.78 quarterback efficiency. He has also rushed 30 times for 214 yards (7.1 average) and three scores, generating 309.0 yards of offense in that span.

**KEEPING TALLIES ON TALIAFERRO**

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO** has rushed for 691 yards through the Chanticleers' first five games, the second-most in Big South history after a team's first five contests. That record is 800, set by Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET** last season. Taliaferro's 138.2 rushing yards per game is pacing ahead of **PATRICK HALL**'s school record of 100.6 during the 2004 season, which Hall finished with a school record 1,107 rushing yards.

**50-50 PROPOSITION**

Coastal Carolina is the first team in Big South history to score 50 points in three consecutive games against non-Conference FCS opponents. The streak began with 51 at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3, followed by 50 points against Hampton in Week 4, and 53 at Elon in Week 5. The Chants have tied the Big South mark for most consecutive 50-point games, joining Gardner-Webb (Nov. 20, 2004 - Sept. 10, 2005) and Liberty (Oct. 31 - Nov. 14, 2009). The Elon contest was also Coastal's 14th 50-point game in program history, the second-most in Big South annals. Liberty holds that record with 16.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 91, while the second-longest active streak belongs to Coastal Carolina (21). Meanwhile, Liberty is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 35, the third-longest streak in Big South history. That record is 45 games, established by the Flames from Sept. 23, 2006 - Sept. 18, 2010.

**HIGH RATE OF RETURN**

Coastal Carolina has rushed for more than 300 yards in three consecutive games (358.7 average in that span), the first Big South member since Stony Brook in 2011 to surpass the threshold in three-straight contests, and the fourth time overall. The Chanticleers' 18 all-time 300-yard rushing games are a Big South record. Meanwhile, Coastal is 10-1 in its last 11 games when rushing for more than 200 yards, including 4-0 this season. The Chanticleers have rushed for more than 200 yards 54 times in its history, and are 49-5 ( =.907) when reaching 200 rushing yards.

**BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL "GAME OF THE WEEK" RESUMES THIS SATURDAY**

The Big South Conference is televising nine football games exclusively on ESPN3 this season as part of its "Game of the Week" package. The next broadcast is Saturday's Gardner-Webb at Coastal Carolina game live from Conway, with **MATT HOGUE** (play-by-play) at **NATE ROSS** (analyst) on the call from Brooks Stadium. Overall, the Big South will appear on television every week of the season for the second consecutive year as a total of 25 games will be televised. The nine-game ESPN3 package included two televised non-Conference match-ups for the first time.

**AFTER FURTHER REVIEW**

The Big South is one of three FCS conferences utilizing video instant replay, as the League will use the technology during its final eight ESPN3 broadcasts. Replay was used for the first time in Week 5 for the Charlotte-Presbyterian game. Three calls were reviewed, and each confirmed the ruling on the field. The next replay game will be Gardner-Webb at Coastal Carolina game on Oct. 12.

**HOME RUNS**

Liberty and Charleston Southern have the League's top two longest active home win streaks. Liberty has won seven consecutive games at Williams Stadium, which is the Flames' longest since winning 10-straight home games from Oct. 3, 2009 to Sept. 17, 2011. The Buccaneers' run stands at six-straight, which is their longest since winning seven consecutive home games from Sept. 27, 2008 to Oct. 3, 2009.

**NEVER TALK ABOUT A STREAK, BUT...**

VMI QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** has not thrown an interception in his last 155 attempts, a span covering four games. His last pick was on the Keydets' second-to-last offensive play of the Richmond game in the season opener. Kordenbrock's streak is the longest in the Big South since Coastal Carolina's **ARAMIS HILLARY** threw 190 passes without an interception last season.

**BIG TIME RUSH**

Charleston Southern rushed for 298 yards at Appalachian State in Week 5, the first time the Buccaneers gained 200 yards on the ground in three consecutive games against non-Conference FCS opponents since the Big South began football in 2002. CSU has rushed for more than 200 yards in a game in four consecutive games and nine times since the start of the 2012 season, and has gone 8-1 in those contests.

**BUYING STOCK IN KORDENBROCK**

VMI quarterback **ERIC KORDENBROCK** tallied his third 300-yard passing game of the season with 359 against Robert Morris in Week 5. It is the most 300-yard passing games in a season since Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** had four last year. Kordenbrock now has four career 300-yard passing games, third-most in League history. Meanwhile, Kordenbrock's efforts this season include back-to-back 300-yard passing games -- the first Keydet QB with two-straight 300-yard passing games since 1986 when **DAVE BROWN** threw for 422 yards against Appalachian State and followed with 390 yards the next week at East Tennessee State.

**SPEAKING OF BEATTY...**

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** was 35-of-52 passing for 389 yards and four touchdowns this past Saturday at Charlotte. It is tied for the second-most completions in a single-game in Big South history, and it was Beatty's fifth career 300-yard passing game -- tied for second-most in the Conference record books. In Week 5 against Point, Beatty was 21-of-25 passing, and the 84.0 completion percentage is the second-highest in a single-game in Big South history based on 20-29 completions. Beatty owns the record with his 84.4 percentage on 27-of-32 passing at Liberty last season on Oct. 6.

**PRESS ON**

Gardner-Webb senior DE **PRESTON PEMASA** is second in Big South history with 42.5 career tackles-for-loss -- the second player in League history with at least 40 career stops behind the line of scrimmage. Pemasa, who has recorded a TFL in all six games this season, is also eighth in the Conference record book with 13.5 quarterback sacks and is 4.0 sacks shy of moving into second in that category. Former Gardner-Webb All-American **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the Big South's all-time leader in both categories with 53.5 TFL and 20.5 sacks.

**KORDENBROCK IS LOCKED IN**

VMI senior QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** needs 262 passing yards to become the seventh quarterback in Big South history with 6,000 career passing yards. He is third all-time in the Conference record book with 541 completions and 1,000 attempts, and is chasing former Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** for second in both categories. Roberts had 597 completions and 1,007 attempts during his career from 2002-05. Kordenbrock's 5,738 career yards is seventh all-time in League annals, and with 30 career TD passes, he is two shy of cracking the Top 10 in that category.

**BIG SOUTH SCORES RECORD NON-LEAGUE FCS WINS**

The Big South is 14-7 through 21 games against FCS opponents -- the most victories against non-Conference FCS foes in the League's 12-year football history. The previous best was 13 wins in 2006. The Big South has also assured itself of its first winning record against out-of-conference FCS members, as four non-Conference FCS games remain in the regular-season. The Big South is 6-2 against the SoCon this season, another all-time win mark and bests the previous high of four in 2006.

**RECORD ROAD WARRIORS**

The Big South has won eight of its 14 FCS games on the road this season -- a League record. Charleston Southern has collected four of those wins in succession, a school-record and tied for the second-longest road winning streak in League history. That record is five, which was established by Liberty from Oct. 20, 2007 to Oct. 4, 2008. Coastal Carolina has won three-straight FCS road games and seven of its last eight.

**50 SHADES OF GREY**

The Big South has six 50-point games this season, with Coastal Carolina owning half of the total. Gardner-Webb has recorded two 50-point games -- both back-to-back affairs accomplished for the first time since GWU's first two games of the 2005 campaign. It is the most 50-point games in the League since seven in 2009, and two away from matching the all-time record of eight in 2004.

**WEBB TALES**

Gardner-Webb ran 97 plays at Charlotte this past Saturday, the second-most in a single-game in Big South history, and the most in a regulation contest. The Runnin' Bulldogs hold the all-time mark of 99, which was set against VMI in three overtimes on Oct. 22, 2005. GWU also amassed a Big South single-game record 22 passing first downs, bettering the old mark of 20 by Coastal Carolina against Liberty on Oct. 4, 2008.

**BLOUNT FORCE**

Gardner-Webb RB **JUANNE BLOUNT**'s 35 rushing attempts at Wofford in Week 4 is tied for the third-most in a single-game in Big South history. It was the most rushing carries by a Big South player since Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** had 35 at Coastal Carolina on Oct. 4, 2008. Blount had 32 rushes this past Saturday at Charlotte, becoming the fourth Big South player with two 30-carry games in the same season. Jennings was the last to do so in 2008. Meanwhile, Blount is 294 rushing yards away from becoming the 15th player in League annals with 2,000 in a career.

**INSIDE THE TACKLE BOX**

Coastal Carolina junior LB **QUINN BACKUS** became the 39th player in Big South history with 200 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. His career total now stands at 215, which includes 114 solo stops, and he needs 45 tackles to enter the League's all-time Top 20. Presbyterian College junior LB **DONELLE WILLIAMS** became the 38th player in the 200-tackle club during Week 2, and his career numbers stand at 209 tackles and 110 solo hits. Gardner-Webb junior LB **TANNER BURCH** is 11 tackles away from becoming the 40th member of the club.

**MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE**

Coastal Carolina senior **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the Big South's all-time leader for punt returns (70) and punt return yards (605). He is the third player in Big South history with at least 100 combined kickoff/punt returns in a career, as he is third all-time with 117 (47 KR, 70 PR). He needs 11 returns to break the Conference record of 127, which is held by former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY**. Maypray returned 98 kickoffs and 29 punts in his career from 2006-09. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is the only player in the Conference record books with two punt returns of at least 80 yards.

**FOGG ALERT**

Liberty redshirt-senior **KEVIN FOGG** recorded a 29-yard pick-6 against Monmouth in Week 2 -- his sixth career return touchdown and first interception return TD. He is the first player in Big South history with return touchdowns on an interception (1), fumble (1), punt (1) and kickoff (3). Fogg is tied as the Big South's all-time leader for most kickoff return touchdowns, and coupled with his one career punt return score, he is second in League history with four kick return TDs. He needs one to tie the all-time mark of five, set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3 KR, 2 PR) from 2005-08.

**DAY'S BIG DAY**

Gardner-Webb PK **JORDAN DAY** tied the Big South single-game record with his four field goals against No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3, as he scored all 12 points in the Runnin' Bulldogs' 12-10 victory. Day is the eighth different kicker in League history to make four field goals in a game, and the first since former GWU kicker **TREVER AUSTIN** on Oct. 22, 2011 against Coastal Carolina.

**MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR THIS ONE**

Coastal Carolina leads the League in scoring offense and is fifth in the nation at 43.2 points, while Liberty tops the Conference in scoring defense at 16.7 points allowed to rank seventh nationally. The two teams will meet this season in Lynchburg on Oct. 19 for the 11th time. The series is tied at 5-5, and the winner of the match-up has won or shared the Big South football Championship eight times. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the title in 2012 as well as 2010.

**TONIGHT ON 20/20**

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 20 points in 13 consecutive games, dating back to last season -- the longest current streak in the Big South and the Chanticleers' longest such streak since scoring 20 points in 20 consecutive contests from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 25, 2006. Coastal's 53 points at Elon in Week 5 was its most scored against a non-Conference FCS foe since scoring 66 points vs. Savannah State on Nov. 4, 2006.

**THREE-AND-IN**

Gardner-Webb's 3-0 victory over No. 8/10 Wofford established the Big South record for lowest scoring game. It was the Conference's first shutout of a non-League FCS opponent since 2008 when VMI defeated St. Francis (Pa.), 49-0 in the season opener. It was Gardner-Webb's first shutout since a 65-0 victory over Southern Virginia in 2009 (a span of 41 games) and its first shutout of an FCS opponent since blanking Savannah State, 66-0, in 2007. The shutout of Wofford was Gardner-Webb's seventh as a Big South member -- tied with Liberty for the most in League annals.

**GARDNER-WEBB SCORES LEAGUE FIRST -- BACK-TO-BACK WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS**

Gardner-Webb blanked No. 8/10 Wofford, 3-0, in Week 4 -- becoming the first team in Big South history to defeat nationally-ranked opponents in consecutive weeks. The Runnin' Bulldogs knocked off then-No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3 (12-10), also without a touchdown. The Wofford win gave the Big South a League-record three wins over ranked teams in 2013. Meanwhile, GWU won its first road game against a non-Conference foe since Sept. 12, 2009 at Western Carolina, and the Wofford win was Gardner-Webb's first over a ranked team on the road since a 38-35 win at No. 23 New Hampshire on Nov. 11, 2000.

**BIG SOUTH SCORES LEAGUE FIRST WITH TWO WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS IN SAME WEEK**

For the first time in League history, the Big South defeated two nationally-ranked teams in the same week of the regular-season as Gardner-Webb upset No. 11/15 Richmond and Coastal Carolina won at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. It was the second time overall in the Conference record book, as the Chants and former member Stony Brook achieved the feat in the first round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs. GWU also handed Richmond its first non-conference FCS loss since 2005 -- ending the Spiders' 17-game win streak in such games. Meanwhile, the Chants' win at EKU improved the Big South to 4-7 all-time when a ranked Big South team plays a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent.

**COASTAL CAROLINA SETS BIG SOUTH SCORING RECORDS AGAINST A RANKED TEAM**

Coastal Carolina's 51 points at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky was the most scored by a Big South member against a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent in League history. The previous high was 35 by the Chanticleers in last season's playoff loss at Old Dominion. Coastal's 19-point victory over the Colonels is the Big South's second-largest margin of victory against a ranked non-Conference team, just after Liberty's 23-point win over No. 12 Elon in 2008.

**COMING ATTRACTIONS**

The Big South Conference will welcome **MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2014 and start-up program **KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2015. Monmouth's addition will maintain the League's membership at six squads, while KSU's addition returns the Big South to seven members, which was the total from 2008-12. The Hawks got an early taste of League play with their 45-15 defeat at Liberty in Week 2. The Big South is 3-0 against Monmouth, with Coastal Carolina also earning wins in 2008 and 2009.

**MOVING ON**

VMI is playing its final campaign in the Big South this season, as the Keydets are rejoining the Southern Conference next fall. The Big South bid farewell to Stony Brook following the 2012 campaign with the Seawolves' move to the CAA after five years as an associate member.

\* Coastal Carolina is coming off a bye week, and the Chants are 8-2 when coming off a bye. Coastal won its first game off a bye week from 2003-06 before losing at Furman in 2007. Coastal's other loss off a bye week came last season versus Stony Brook, which was also Coastal's last regular-season loss.

\* Coastal lost its first ever Big South game, a 38-17 loss to Gardner-Webb at home in 2003. CCU's other Big South opening losses came in 2008 versus then #20 Liberty, 43-38, and in 2012 versus then #11 Stony Brook, 27-21.

\* Starting late in game two of the season versus Furman, CCU has scored on 26 of its last 41 drives (63.4 percent), not including three "victory" formations.

\* In six career starts at quarterback, **ALEX ROSS** has led CCU to three of the program's top-five, single-game total offensive efforts. He is also 6-0 in that span.

\* Last year, Ross made his first career start at Gardner-Webb for an injured **ARAMIS HILLARY** and led CCU to a 55-33 win. In that game, CCU rolled up 596 yards of offense, which was the second-best school total at the time, and Ross completed an 81-yard TD pass to **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO**, which is the longest pass play in CCU history.

\* Gardner-Webb meets Coastal Carolina for the 11th time on Saturday. GWU's two wins in the series came in Conway -- 2003 (38-17) and 2011 (26-24). Six of the last eight meetings with Coastal have been decided by five points or less.

\* Gardner-Webb's vaunted defense allowed nearly as many yards to Charlotte on Saturday (586) as it had combined in its three previous games vs. Point, Wofford and Richmond (653).

\* Six of the seven touchdowns allowed by Gardner-Webb Saturday came on drives that lasted less than two minutes -- and two came on one-play drives.

\* GWU's 577 yards of total offense was the most against a Division I opponent since it had 607 against Savannah State on Nov. 3, 2007.

\* WR **KENNY COOK** hauled in a career-high 10 passes on Saturday for 136 yards and two touchdowns. He collected six for 88 yards and both scores in the first quarter.
