**LORENZO TALIAFERRO • RB • Senior**

Taliaferro rushed for 144 yards and three touchdowns in Coastal's 42-7 win over Gardner-Webb. He also caught four passes for 23 yards to finish with 167 all-purpose yards. Taliaferro averaged 6.0 yards per rush and seven of his carries went for either a score or a first down. He scored on runs of 4, 2 and 13 yards to tie the Big South single-season record with his third 3-touchdown game of the season.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**QUINN BACKUS • LB • Junior**  
 Coastal Carolina • Greenwood, S.C.

Backus tallied 11 tackles (five solo, six assisted) with an assisted tackle-for-loss, an interception return for a touchdown and two additional pass break-ups in leading the Chanticleer defense. His pick-six was a 73-yard return that gave Coastal a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, while eight of his stops came in the second half as CCU shutout Gardner-Webb the final 30 minutes. Backus also assisted on a one-yard tackle-for-loss on a third-and-goal situation.

Burns averaged 39.0 yards on his four punts at VMI with a long of 48, and he pinned the Keydets inside their 20-yard line three times, causing VMI to start drives at the 1, 11 and 15-yard lines.

Croghan was 18-of-27 passing for 245 yards and two touchdowns in his second career start at quarterback. He also rushed for 30 yards to finish the day with 275 yards of offense. He connected on a 27-yard pass to **KEVIN GLEARS** to give the Bucs an early 7-0 lead, and later found **LARRY JONES III** for 48 yards and the go-ahead score late in the third quarter to put CSU back ahead, 22-17. Croghan's yardage was the most by a CSU quarterback since November 2011.

**THE WAIT IS OVER**

No. 4/6 Coastal Carolina travels to Liberty this Saturday in the most anticipated Big South game of the season, and it will air on ESPN3. It is the 11th meeting between the schools and the series is tied at 5-5. The winner of this match-up has won or shared the Big South football Championship eight times. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the title in 2012 as well as 2010.

**A CLOSER LOOK AT COASTAL-LIBERTY**

The Chanticleers lead the League in scoring offense and is fifth in the nation at 43.0 points, while Liberty tops the Conference in scoring defense at 16.7 points allowed to rank sixth nationally.

**BURNING UP THE HOUSE**

Liberty carries its Big South-record 18-game Conference home win streak into Saturday's game against Coastal Carolina, and has swept its home Big South schedule six consecutive seasons. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 777 points (43.2 points per game), scored more than 30 points in 15 contests, and has held its League brethren to 335 points (18.6). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

**START ME UP**

Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina are 1-0 in Big South play. The Buccaneers are 1-0 for the first time since 2008 and the fourth time overall. The Chanticleers are 1-0 for the first time since 2011 and the eighth time in school history. Looking ahead to this week, Coastal is looking for its first 2-0 League start since 2006.

**SECOND-AND-TWO**

Saturday will be the second and final week featuring Conference openers, as Liberty begins its Big South slate at home against Coastal Carolina, while Presbyterian College opens League play at home vs. VMI. The Flames are 8-3 all-time in Big South openers and have won their last six Conference lid-lifters -- with an average of 45.3 points in those six contests. PC is looking for its first-ever 1-0 start in League action (0-4).

**THE UNDEFEATEDS**

Charleston Southern is the second team in Big South history to open the season 7-0, joining the 2006 Buccaneers (9-0). Coastal Carolina (6-0) is the fourth to open at least 6-0, and the Big South is the only FCS Conference with two undefeated teams. In addition, CSU first-year head coach **JAMEY CHADWELL** is the first head coach to start 7-0 in his first season in the Big South.

**THE 20/20 EXPERIENCE**

Defending Big South co-champion Coastal Carolina has won its last six Big South games, the longest active streak in the Conference. The Chanticleers have won each of those six League tilts by at least 20 points -- extending their Big South record, with a 31.2 average margin of victory in the six wins.

**RECORD ROAD WARRIORS**


Charleston Southern's five road wins this season are the most in the regular-season in League history and ties the Conference record for most road victories in a single-season. That record was established last season by Coastal Carolina, which included a road playoff win. The Buccaneers have also matched the Big South record for longest road winning streak (5). Liberty first set the mark with its five consecutive road wins from Oct. 20, 2007 - Oct. 4, 2008. Meanwhile, CSU's 25-17 win at VMI this past Saturday was its first Big South road victory since a 46-32 win at Presbyterian on Nov. 7, 2009 -- snapping a streak of 9-straight road losses in Conference games.

**SECOND HALF SHUTDOWN**

Coastal Carolina has allowed just 53 points in the second half this season -- an average of 8.8 points. In the third quarter, the Chants have permitted just 17 markers for an average of 2.8 points allowed. Coastal has held its last two opponents (Elon, Gardner-Webb) scoreless in the second half.

**BLUE SWARM**

Charleston Southern is nationally-ranked for the second consecutive week, as the Buccaneers are No. 24 in this week's FCS Coaches poll. CSU is ranked in the Top 25 this season for the first time since the week of Nov. 6, 2006, following the Bucs' 9-0 start to the season (No. 24 - *Sports Network*, No. 25 - *Coaches*). Charleston Southern's entry marks the third Big South program to be ranked this year -- the second time in League history that three teams were nationally-ranked at any point of the season.

**HIGH TIDE ALONG THE COAST**

Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 4 this week in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 6 in *The Sports Network* ranking. It is the highest-ever ranking for the Big South in League history and the Conference's first entry inside the Top 5. In addition, Coastal Carolina is now the second team in Big South history to be ranked in BOTH polls each of the first eight weeks of the regular-season (including preseason). The Chanticleers join former member Stony Brook, which was ranked in the Top 25 every week of the 2012 campaign. The Big South has had a football squad nationally-ranked for 28 consecutive weeks, dating back to Week 9 of the 2011 campaign (Oct. 24).

**REYES OF SUNSHINE**

Charleston Southern RB **CHRISTIAN REYES** is second in the Big South with 729 rushing yards, and he needs 46 rushing yards to break the CSU single-season rushing record of 774 set by **VINSON BLAIR** in 1998. Reyes is the first Buccaneer to rush for more than 700 yards in a season since **ANDRE COPELAND** in 2005 (721).

**HOME RUNS**

Liberty and Charleston Southern have the League's top two longest active home win streaks. Liberty has won seven consecutive games at Williams Stadium, which is the Flames' longest since winning 10-straight home games from Oct. 3, 2009 to Sept. 17, 2011. The Buccaneers' run stands at six-straight, which is their longest since winning seven consecutive home games from Sept. 27, 2008 to Oct. 3, 2009.

**BACK TO THE BEACH**

Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS** returned an interception 73 yards for a touchdown this past Saturday against Gardner-Webb, the second-longest interception return in Coastal history and the longest returned for a TD in CCU annals. Backus' pick-six is the seventh-longest in Big South history and the longest INT return by a linebacker.

**"LO-REND-ZONE"**

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO**, the first player in League history to score 10 touchdowns in his team's first five games, has tied the Big South single-season record with his three 3-TD games this season. He joins Liberty's **EUGENE GOODMAN** (2003), Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** (2007) and Stony Brook teammates **MIGUEL MAYSONET** and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (2011) as the only players to score three touchdowns in a game three times in a season. Taliaferro has scored a touchdown in every game this season, the second-straight year a Big South player has reached the end zone in each of his team's first six contests (Maysonet). Taliaferro owns a streak of four consecutive multi-TD games, the longest in the Big South since Maysonet's League-record streak of six consecutive games with at least two scores in 2012. Meanwhile, Taliaferro has 13 rushing TDs this year -- tied for eighth-most in a single-season, while his 14 total touchdowns are tied for ninth-most.

**KEEPING TALLIES ON TALIAFERRO**

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO** has rushed for 835 yards through the Chanticleers' six games and is 277 rushing yards shy of breaking the school single-season record of 1,107 that was established by **PATRICK HALL** in 2004. Taliaferro has four 100-yard rushing games this season -- matching the Coastal season record, and needs two more to equal the school's career leader (Hall with six from 2003-05).

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 91, while the second-longest active streak belongs to Coastal Carolina (22). Meanwhile, Liberty is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 35, the third-longest streak in Big South history. That record is 45 games, established by the Flames from Sept. 23, 2006 -- Sept. 18, 2010.

**DOUBLED UP**

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 40. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 52 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 50 of its League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (24 games).

**HIGH RATE OF RETURN**

Coastal Carolina rushed for more than 300 yards in three consecutive games during Weeks 3-5 (358.7 average in that span), the first Big South member since Stony Brook in 2011 to surpass the threshold in three-straight contests, and the fourth time overall. The Chanticleers' 18 all-time 300-yard rushing games are a Big South record. Meanwhile, Coastal is 11-1 in its last 12 games when rushing for more than 200 yards, including 5-0 this season. The Chanticleers have rushed for more than 200 yards 55 times in its history, and are 50-5 ( =.909) when reaching 200 rushing yards.

**BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL "GAME OF THE WEEK" CONTINUES THIS SATURDAY**

The Big South Conference is televising nine football games exclusively on ESPN3 this season as part of its "Game of the Week" package. The next broadcast is Saturday's Coastal Carolina at Liberty game live from Lynchburg, with **JASON BENETTI** (play-by-play) and **RAY JONES** (analyst) on the call from Williams Stadium. Overall, the Big South will appear on television every week of the season for the second consecutive year as a total of 25 games will be televised. The nine-game ESPN3 package included two televised non-Conference match-ups for the first time.

**AFTER FURTHER REVIEW**

The Big South is one of three FCS conferences utilizing video instant replay, as the League will use the technology during its final eight ESPN3 broadcasts.

**BACKUS ADDED TO BUCHANAN LIST**

Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS** was added to the 2013 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Oct. 1, becoming the first Big South candidate for the FCS Defensive Player of the Year award since 2011 (Coastal's **JOSH NORMAN** and Presbyterian's **JUSTIN BETHEL**). Backus is the seventh overall Big South student-athlete to be an official candidate for the Buchanan Award.

**BIG TIME RUSH**

Charleston Southern has rushed for more than 200 yards in a game in five consecutive games and 10 times since the start of the 2012 season, and has gone 9-1 in those contests. CSU rushed for 298 yards at Appalachian State in Week 5, the first time the Buccaneers gained 200 yards on the ground in three consecutive games against non-Conference FCS opponents since the Big South began football in 2002.

**BEATTY ON IT**

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** needs 299 passing yards to become the 11th quarterback in Big South history with 5,000 career passing yards. With 416 career completions, he is just four away from entering the League's all-time Top 10 in that category.

**SPEAKING OF BEATTY...**

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** was 35-of-52 passing for 389 yards and four touchdowns at Charlotte in Week 6. It is tied for the second-most completions in a single-game in Big South history, and it was Beatty's fifth career 300-yard passing game -- tied for second-most in the Conference record book. In Week 5 against Point, Beatty was 21-of-25 passing, and the 84.0 completion percentage is the second-highest in a single-game in Big South history based on 20-29 completions. Beatty owns the record with his 84.4 percentage on 27-of-32 passing at Liberty last season on Oct. 6.

**KORDENBROCK IS LOCKED IN**

VMI senior QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** became the seventh quarterback in Big South history with 6,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday against Charleston Southern. He is seventh all-time with 6,001 and needs 72 yards to move past Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** (6,072) for sixth-place. Meanwhile, Kordenbrock is third all-time in the Conference record book with 562 completions and second with 1,038 attempts, and is chasing former Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** (597) for second in completions. Kordenbrock entered the League's Top 10 for career touchdown passes this past weekend and is tied for 10th with 32.

**PRESS ON**

Gardner-Webb senior DE **PRESTON PEMASA** is second in Big South history with 43.0 career tackles-for-loss -- the second player in League history with at least 40 career stops behind the line of scrimmage. Pemasa, who has recorded a TFL in all seven games this season, is also tied for sixth in the Conference record book with 14.0 quarterback sacks and is 3.5 sacks shy of moving into second in that category. Former Gardner-Webb All-American **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the Big South's all-time leader in both categories with 53.5 TFL and 20.5 sacks.

**BUYING STOCK IN KORDENBROCK**

VMI quarterback **ERIC KORDENBROCK** tallied his third 300-yard passing game of the season with 359 against Robert Morris in Week 5. It is the most 300-yard passing games in a season since Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** had four last year. Kordenbrock now has four career 300-yard passing games, third-most in League history. Meanwhile, Kordenbrock's efforts this season include back-to-back 300-yard passing games -- the first Keydet QB with two-straight 300-yard passing games since 1986 when **DAVE BROWN** threw for 422 yards against Appalachian State and followed with 390 yards the next week at East Tennessee State.

**WE JINXED THE STREAK**

VMI QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK**'s streak of 155 pass attempts without an interception came to an end on his first pass play against Charleston Southern this past weekend. His streak covered four games and was the longest streak in the Big South since Coastal Carolina's **ARAMIS HILLARY** threw 190 passes without an interception last season.

**BIG SOUTH SCORES RECORD NON-LEAGUE FCS WINS**

The Big South is 14-7 through 21 games against FCS opponents -- the most victories against non-Conference FCS foes in the League's 12-year football history. The previous best was 13 wins in 2006. The Big South has won eight of its 14 FCS games on the road this season -- also a League record. The Conference has also assured itself of its first winning record against out-of-conference FCS members, as four non-Conference FCS games remain in the regular-season. The Big South is 6-2 against the SoCon this season, another all-time win mark and bests the previous high of four in 2006.

**50 SHADES OF GREY**

The Big South has six 50-point games this season, with Coastal Carolina owning half of the total. Gardner-Webb has recorded two 50-point games -- both back-to-back affairs accomplished for the first time since GWU's first two games of the 2005 campaign. It is the most 50-point games in the League since seven in 2009, and two away from matching the all-time record of eight in 2004.

**THE 20/20 EXPERIENCE - 2 OF 2**

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 20 points in 14 consecutive games, dating back to last season -- the longest current streak in the Big South and the Chanticleers' longest such streak since scoring 20 points in 20 consecutive contests from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 25, 2006. Coastal's 53 points at Elon in Week 5 was its most scored against a non-Conference FCS foe since scoring 66 points vs. Savannah State on Nov. 4, 2006.

**BLOUNT FORCE**

Gardner-Webb RB **JUANNE BLOUNT**'s 35 rushing attempts at Wofford in Week 4 is tied for the third-most in a single-game in Big South history. It was the most rushing carries by a Big South player since Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** had 35 at Coastal Carolina on Oct. 4, 2008. Blount had 32 rushes at Charlotte in Week 6, becoming the fourth Big South player with two 30-carry games in the same season. Jennings was the last to do so in 2008. Meanwhile, Blount is 210 rushing yards away from becoming the 15th player in League annals with 2,000 in a career.

**INSIDE THE TACKLE BOX**

Coastal Carolina junior LB **QUINN BACKUS** became the 39th player in Big South history with 200 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. His career total now stands at 226, which includes 119 solo stops, and he needs 34 tackles to enter the League's all-time Top 20. Presbyterian College junior LB **DONELLE WILLIAMS** became the 38th player in the 200-tackle club during Week 2, and his career numbers stand at 209 tackles and 110 solo hits. Gardner-Webb junior LB **TANNER BURCH** is seven tackles away from becoming the 40th member of the club.

**MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE**

Coastal Carolina senior **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the Big South's all-time leader for punt returns (71) and punt return yards (606). He is the third player in Big South history with at least 100 combined kickoff/punt returns in a career, as he is third all-time with 117 (47 KR, 71 PR). He needs 10 returns to break the Conference record of 127, which is held by former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY**. Maypray returned 98 kickoffs and 29 punts in his career from 2006-09. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is the only player in the Conference record books with two punt returns of at least 80 yards.

**FOGG ALERT**

Liberty redshirt-senior **KEVIN FOGG** recorded a 29-yard pick-6 against Monmouth in Week 2 -- his sixth career return touchdown and first interception return TD. He is the first player in Big South history with return touchdowns on an interception (1), fumble (1), punt (1) and kickoff (3). Fogg is tied as the Big South's all-time leader for most kickoff return touchdowns, and coupled with his one career punt return score, he is second in League history with four kick return TDs. He needs one to tie the all-time mark of five, set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3 KR, 2 PR) from 2005-08.

**DAY'S BIG DAY**

Gardner-Webb PK **JORDAN DAY** tied the Big South single-game record with his four field goals against No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3, as he scored all 12 points in the Runnin' Bulldogs' 12-10 victory. Day is the eighth different kicker in League history to make four field goals in a game, and the first since former GWU kicker **TREVER AUSTIN** on Oct. 22, 2011 against Coastal Carolina.

**EYES ON HAZEL**

Coastal Carolina senior WR and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **MATT HAZEL** is the Big South's active career leader with 130 receptions (12th in League history), 1,798 receiving yards (12th) and 20 touchdowns (tied for 5th). He has also been named to the 2014 Senior Bowl Watch List as well as the South Carolina Football Hall of Fame College Player of the Year Award Watch List.

**THE NEW 40**

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 40 points in four consecutive games, the second-longest streak in Big South history. That record is seven games, established by former member Stony Brook during the 2011 season from Oct. 8-Nov. 19. Coastal has also scored at least 40 points in four-straight Big South games, also the second-longest streak in the Conference record book. Stony Brook holds that record as well, which is also seven games spanning two seasons (Oct. 8, 2011 - Oct. 13, 2012).

**TRIPLE OPTION OFFENSE**

Coastal Carolina became the first team in Big South history to score 50 points, rush for more than 300 yards and gain more than 500 yards of offense in three consecutive games, as the Chanticleers surpassed all three benchmarks during Weeks 3-5. The Chants' achievement also tied the Big South records in each category separately. Meanwhile, Coastal's season average of 486.2 yards of offense is pacing ahead of the Big South single-season record of 468.1 established by the Chanticleers in 2006.

**THREE-AND-IN**

Gardner-Webb's 3-0 victory over No. 8/10 Wofford established the Big South record for lowest scoring game. It was the Conference's first shutout of a non-League FCS opponent since 2008 when VMI defeated St. Francis (Pa.), 49-0 in the season opener. It was Gardner-Webb's first shutout since a 65-0 victory over Southern Virginia in 2009 (a span of 41 games) and its first shutout of an FCS opponent since blanking Savannah State, 66-0, in 2007. The shutout of Wofford was Gardner-Webb's seventh as a Big South member -- tied with Liberty for the most in League annals.

**GARDNER-WEBB SCORES LEAGUE FIRST -- BACK-TO-BACK WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS**

Gardner-Webb blanked No. 8/10 Wofford, 3-0, in Week 4 -- becoming the first team in Big South history to defeat nationally-ranked opponents in consecutive weeks. The Runnin' Bulldogs knocked off then-No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3 (12-10), also without a touchdown. The Wofford win gave the Big South a League-record three wins over ranked teams in 2013. Meanwhile, GWU won its first road game against a non-Conference foe since Sept. 12, 2009 at Western Carolina, and the Wofford win was Gardner-Webb's first over a ranked team on the road since a 38-35 win at No. 23 New Hampshire on Nov. 11, 2000.

**BIG SOUTH SCORES LEAGUE FIRST WITH TWO WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS IN SAME WEEK**

For the first time in League history, the Big South defeated two nationally-ranked teams in the same week of the regular-season as Gardner-Webb upset No. 11/15 Richmond and Coastal Carolina won at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. It was the second time overall in the Conference record book, as the Chants and former member Stony Brook achieved the feat in the first round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs. GWU also handed Richmond its first non-conference FCS loss since 2005 -- ending the Spiders' 17-game win streak in such games. Meanwhile, the Chants' win at EKU improved the Big South to 4-7 all-time when a ranked Big South team plays a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent.

**COASTAL CAROLINA SETS BIG SOUTH SCORING RECORDS AGAINST A RANKED TEAM**

Coastal Carolina's 51 points at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky was the most scored by a Big South member against a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent in League history. The previous high was 35 by the Chanticleers in last season's playoff loss at Old Dominion. Coastal's 19-point victory over the Colonels is the Big South's second-largest margin of victory against a ranked non-Conference team, just after Liberty's 23-point win over No. 12 Elon in 2008.

**WEBB TALES**

Gardner-Webb ran 98 plays at Charlotte in Week 6, the second-most in a single-game in Big South history, and the most in a regulation contest. The Runnin' Bulldogs hold the all-time mark of 99, which was set against VMI in three overtimes on Oct. 22, 2005. GWU also amassed a Big South single-game record 22 passing first downs against the 49ers, bettering the old mark of 20 by Coastal Carolina against Liberty on Oct. 4, 2008.

**COMING ATTRACTIONS**

The Big South Conference will welcome **MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2014 and start-up program **KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2015. Monmouth's addition will maintain the League's membership at six squads, while KSU's addition returns the Big South to seven members, which was the total from 2008-12. The Hawks got an early taste of League play with their 45-15 defeat at Liberty in Week 2. The Big South is 3-0 against Monmouth, with Coastal Carolina also earning wins in 2008 and 2009.

**MOVING ON**

VMI is playing its final campaign in the Big South this season, as the Keydets are rejoining the Southern Conference next fall. The Big South bid farewell to Stony Brook following the 2012 campaign with the Seawolves' move to the CAA after five years as an associate member.

\* Charleston Southern meets Colorado for the first time on Saturday. It will be the third of four first-time opponents for CSU this season.

\* The Bucs piled up 456 yards of offense at VMI and **LARRY JONES III** had five catches for 103 yards and the go-ahead 48-yard TD in the third quarter to lead the attack.

\* CSU QB **DANNY CROGHAN III** was 18-of-27 passing for 245 yards and two TDs in the Bucs' best passing day by a quarterback since November 2011.

\* CSU is 7-0 for just the second time in school history. The Bucs started 9-0 in 2006 and finished 9-2, a single-season record for wins. Charleston Southern has clinched its first winning season since 2006.

\* CSU had two interceptions in the VMI win, coming from **MATT HARDY** and **CORBIN JACKSON**, and did not commit a turnover. The Bucs are tied for 8th nationally in turnover margin at +1.3 per game.

\* The Bucs lead the nation in 3rd Down conversion defense -- holding teams to 25.3 percent on third down. CSU held VMI to 3-of-11 on Saturday.

\* Charleston Southern is one of five remaining undefeated teams in FCS. CSU and Fordham are the only two 7-0 teams, while North Dakota State (6-0), Coastal Carolina (6-0) and Harvard (4-0) are also unbeaten.

\* The Buccaneers held VMI to 44 rushing yards, the third time this season CSU held an opponent to less than 100 yards on the ground.

\* The Chanticleers are looking for their first win at Liberty since 2005 -- a 27-21 triple-overtime victory on Oct. 22. CCU has lost three-straight inside Williams Stadium.

\* When playing its first Big South road game, Coastal Carolina is 6-4. All four losses have come at Liberty.

\* In seven career starts at quarterback, **ALEX ROSS** has led CCU to three of the program's top five, single-game total offensive efforts. He is also 7-0 in that span.

\* Coastal held Gardner-Webb to its fewest points in the history of the series (seven points).
