LORENZO TALIAFERRO • RB • Senior

Taliaferro rushed for 151 yards and tied the Big South single-game record with four rushing touchdowns in Coastal Carolina's 55-52 double-overtime win at Liberty. He averaged 5.8 yards per carry and finished the game with 175 all-purpose yards. Taliaferro amassed 100 rushing yards in the second half and overtime with three scores to help the Chants erase a 19-point deficit. He accounted for either a first down or touchdown on seven of his 11 touches in the second half and his seven-yard rush in the second overtime put Coastal well into field goal range.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

QUINN BACKUS • LB • Junior
 Coastal Carolina • Greenwood, S.C.

Backus tallied 10 tackles (seven solo, two assisted) and two tackles-for-loss at Liberty. He tallied five fourth quarter stops, including a TFL, and seven total tackles in the second half. With Liberty ahead 42-30 and facing a 3rd-and-1 situation in the fourth quarter, Backus came through with a one-yard tackle-for-loss to force a punt. The Chanticleers scored on the ensuing drive to make it a five-point game.

Hawthorne blocked a field goal for the second time this season, as he came off the left edge and got a hand on Liberty's 40-yard attempt that would have tied the game and forced a third overtime. Hawthorne's deflection forced the kick well short and left, and preserved Coastal's 55-52 double-overtime win over the Flames.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

HEYS McMATH • QB • Freshman
 Presbyterian College • Greenwood, S.C.

McMath was 21-of-33 passing for 322 yards and two touchdowns against VMI in his collegiate debut. He added a 1-yard scoring run in the third quarter and finished with 25 rushing yards en route to 347 yards of total offense. McMath's passing yardage ranks seventh in Presbyterian's Division I history and he helped the Blue Hose start 1-0 in Big South play for the first time.

ANOTHER ONE FOR THE AGES

Coastal Carolina won for just the second time in Lynchburg with its 55-52 double-overtime victory over Liberty this past Saturday, ending the Flames' Big South-record 18-game home Conference win streak. The Chanticleers' previous win at Liberty was a 27-21 triple-overtime affair on Oct. 22, 2005. Coastal now leads the series with Liberty, 6-5. It will have to wait to be seen if Coastal's victory transcends into another Big South title, as the winner of this head-to-head meeting has gone onto win/share the Conference Championship eight previous times. Here is a closer look:

RECORD COMBOS

Coastal Carolina (554) and Liberty (615) combined for 1,169 yards of offense this past Saturday, a record for a Big South game and the second-highest overall total in League history. The previous high in a League contest was 1,143 yards by Coastal (596) and Gardner-Webb (547) on Nov. 3, 2012. Coastal and Liberty tied the Big South single-game record for most combined points with 107, the third time the combined total has been reached (Gardner-Webb at VMI in 2005, and Liberty vs. VMI in 2007).

REAL ESTATE VALUATION

For the first time in Big South history, two Conference games surpassed 1,000 combined yards of offense in the same week. As mentioned above with the Coastal Carolina and Liberty total of 1,169, Presbyterian College (535) and VMI (540) combined for 1,075 offensive yards this past Saturday, which is the third-highest total in a Big South game.

CEASE FIRE

Liberty saw its Big South-record 18-game Conference home win streak end this past Saturday against Coastal Carolina, as it was the Flames' first home loss to a Conference opponent in almost exactly seven years. Liberty's previous home Big South loss was Oct. 21, 2006, a 27-24 defeat at the hands of Gardner-Webb. During their record streak, the Flames scored 777 points (43.2 points per game), scored more than 30 points in 15 contests, and held its League brethren to 335 points (18.6).

START ME UP

Coastal Carolina is 2-0 in Big South play for the first time since 2006 and the fourth time overall. The Chants are looking for their fourth-ever 3-0 start this week (the last occurred in '06). Charleston Southern and Presbyterian College are 1-0 in League action. The Buccaneers are 1-0 for the first time since 2008 and last started 2-0 in 2006. PC is 1-0 for the first time as Big South members.

THE UNDEFEATEDS

Coastal Carolina is the third team in Big South history to open the season 7-0, joining Charleston Southern in 2006 (9-0) and this season (7-0). The Chanticleers are one of just four FCS teams still undefeated, joining Fordham (8-0), North Dakota State (7-0) and Harvard (5-0).

THE 20/20 EXPERIENCE

Defending Big South co-champion Coastal Carolina has won its last seven Big South games, the longest active streak in the Conference and tied for the fourth-longest in League history. The Chanticleers won the first six League tilts in the current streak by at least 20 points -- a Big South record.

RECORD ROAD WARRIORS

Charleston Southern's five road wins this season are the most in the regular-season in League history and ties the Conference record for most road victories in a single-season. That record was established last season by Coastal Carolina, which included a road playoff win. The Buccaneers also matched the Big South record for longest road winning streak (5). Liberty first set the mark with its five consecutive road wins from Oct. 20, 2007 - Oct. 4, 2008. Meanwhile, CSU's 25-17 win at VMI in Week 7 was its first Big South road victory since a 46-32 win at Presbyterian on Nov. 7, 2009 -- snapping a streak of 9-straight road losses in Conference games.

McKIE'S BACK IN TOWN

Presbyterian College's **JEREMIAH McKIE** returned a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown this past Saturday against VMI, tied for the fourth-longest kickoff return in Big South history. He had a 50-yard punt return for a score in Week 2 vs. Brevard, and is now the first player in League annals with a kickoff return touchdown and punt return touchdown in the same season.

"LO-REND-ZONE"

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO**, the first player in League history to score 10 touchdowns in his team's first five games, is second nationally with 17 rushing touchdowns and has 18 overall this season. His rushing total is tied for second-most in a single-season in League history, and he is two TDs away from becoming the third Big South player with 20 in a season. Meanwhile, Taliaferro is the first player in Big South history with four 3-TD games in a campaign. He has scored a touchdown in every game this season, the second-straight year a Big South player has reached the end zone in each of his team's first seven contests (Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET**). Taliaferro owns a streak of five consecutive multi-TD games, the longest in the Big South since Maysonet's League-record streak of six consecutive games with at least two scores in 2012.

KEEPING TALLIES ON TALIAFERRO

Coastal Carolina RB **LORENZO TALIAFERRO** has rushed for 986 yards through the Chanticleers' seven games and is 122 rushing yards shy of breaking the school single-season record of 1,107 that was established by **PATRICK HALL** in 2004. Taliaferro has a school-record five 100-yard rushing games this season, and needs one more to equal the school's career leader (Hall with six from 2003-05).

REYES OF SUNSHINE

Charleston Southern RB **CHRISTIAN REYES** is second in the Big South with 772 rushing yards, and he needs three rushing yards to break the CSU single-season rushing record of 774 set by **VINSON BLAIR** in 1998. Reyes is the first Buccaneer to rush for more than 700 yards in a season since **ANDRE COPELAND** in 2005 (721).

HOME RUNS

Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina have the League's top two longest active home win streaks. The Bucs have won six consecutive games at Buccaneer Field, which is CSU's longest since winning seven consecutive home games from Sept. 27, 2008 to Oct. 3, 2009. The Chanticleers' run stands at five-straight, which is their longest since winning five consecutive home games from Sept. 12-Nov. 14, 2009. Coastal last won six-straight at home from Sept. 23, 2006 - Sept. 8, 2007.

HIGH TIDE ALONG THE COAST

Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 3 this week in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 6 in *The Sports Network* ranking. It is the highest-ever ranking for the Big South in League history and the Conference's first entry in the Top 3. In addition, Coastal Carolina is now the second team in Big South history to be ranked in BOTH polls each of the first nine weeks of the regular-season (including preseason). The Chanticleers join former member Stony Brook, which was ranked in the Top 25 every week of the 2012 campaign. The Big South has had a football squad nationally-ranked for 29 consecutive weeks, dating back to Week 9 of the 2011 campaign (Oct. 24).

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 92, while the second-longest active streak belongs to Coastal Carolina (23). Meanwhile, Liberty is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 36, the third-longest streak in Big South history. That record is 45 games, established by the Flames from Sept. 23, 2006 - Sept. 18, 2010.

DOUBLED UP

Liberty owns the Conference record for most consecutive Big South games scoring in double figures at 41. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored in all 53 of their Conference games since 2002, while VMI has tallied points in all 51 of its League contests since joining the Big South in 2003. Presbyterian College is the final Conference member to have not been shut out in a League contest (25 games).

HIGH RATE OF RETURN

Coastal is 12-1 in its last 13 games when rushing for more than 200 yards, including 6-0 this season. The Chanticleers have rushed for more than 200 yards 56 times in their history, and are 51-5 (=911) when reaching 200 rushing yards. Earlier this season Coastal rushed for more than 300 yards in three consecutive games during Weeks 3-5 (358.7 average in that span), the first Big South member since Stony Brook in 2011 to surpass the threshold in three-straight contests, and the fourth time overall. The Chanticleers' 18 all-time 300-yard rushing games are a Big South record.

BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL "GAME OF THE WEEK" CONTINUES THIS SATURDAY

The Big South Conference is televising nine football games exclusively on ESPN3 this season as part of its "Game of the Week" package. The next broadcast is Saturday's Liberty at Gardner-Webb game live from Boiling Springs, with **EVAN LEPLER** (play-by-play) and **RALPH PATTERSON** (analyst) on the call from Spangler Stadium. Overall, the Big South will appear on television every week of the season for the second consecutive year as a total of 25 games will be televised. The nine-game ESPN3 package included two televised non-Conference match-ups for the first time.

AFTER FURTHER REVIEW

The Big South is one of three FCS conferences utilizing video instant replay, as the League is using the technology during its final eight ESPN3 broadcasts.

50 SHADES OF GREY

The Big South has eight 50-point games this season, which ties the single-season record first reached in 2004. Coastal Carolina owns half of the total and has matched the single-season League record of four first set by Liberty in 2009. The Flames and Gardner-Webb have recorded two 50-point games, with GWU's efforts coming in back-to-back games -- accomplished for the first time since Gardner-Webb's first two games of the 2005 campaign.

APON TOP THE OF WORLD

Liberty TE **BRANDON APON** is the Big South's career leader for most touchdown receptions by a tight end with seven, as he broke the all-time mark of six this past Saturday in the Coastal Carolina game. He surpassed former Charleston Southern tight ends **BRYAN MEERS** (2004-05) and **CLAYTON COFFMAN** (2006-09) for the touchdown record. Apon has caught seven of his 17 career receptions for scores -- 41.2 percent.

BIG TIME RUSH

Charleston Southern rushed for more than 200 yards in five consecutive games during Weeks 3-7 and 10 times since the start of the 2012 season. The Bucs have gone 9-1 in those contests. CSU rushed for 298 yards at Appalachian State in Week 5, the first time the Buccaneers gained 200 yards on the ground in three consecutive games against non-Conference FCS opponents since the Big South began football in 2002.

FIRE HYDRANT

Liberty has lost each its four games by single digits and by a combined total of 23 points, an average of 5.75 points.

BEATTY ON IT

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** needs 299 passing yards to become the 11th quarterback in Big South history with 5,000 career passing yards. With 416 career completions, he is just four away from entering the League's all-time Top 10 in that category.

SPEAKING OF BEATTY...

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** was 35-of-52 passing for 389 yards and four touchdowns at Charlotte in Week 6. It is tied for the second-most completions in a single-game in Big South history, and it was Beatty's fifth career 300-yard passing game -- tied for second-most in the Conference record book. In Week 5 against Point, Beatty was 21-of-25 passing, and the 84.0 completion percentage is the second-highest in a single-game in Big South history based on 20-29 completions. Beatty owns the record with his 84.4 percentage on 27-of-32 passing at Liberty last season on Oct. 6.

KORDENBROCK IS LOCKED IN

VMI senior QB **ERIC KORDENBROCK** became the seventh quarterback in Big South history with 6,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone against Charleston Southern in Week 7. He is now sixth all-time with 6,142 and needs 219 yards to move past Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MacDOWALL** (6,360) for fifth-place. Meanwhile, Kordenbrock is third all-time in the Conference record book with 567 completions and second with 1,052 attempts, and is chasing former Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** (597) for second in completions. Kordenbrock entered the League's Top 10 for career touchdown passes in Week 7 and is tied for 10th with 32.

PRESS ON

Gardner-Webb senior DE **PRESTON PEMASA** is second in Big South history with 43.0 career tackles-for-loss -- the second player in League history with at least 40 career stops behind the line of scrimmage. Pemasa, who has recorded a TFL in all seven games this season, is also tied for sixth in the Conference record book with 14.0 quarterback sacks and is 3.5 sacks shy of moving into second in that category. Former Gardner-Webb All-American **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the Big South's all-time leader in both categories with 53.5 TFL and 20.5 sacks.

EYES ON HAZEL

Coastal Carolina senior WR and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **MATT HAZEL** is the Big South's active career leader with 139 receptions (11th in League history), 1,945 receiving yards (9th) and 22 touchdowns (4th). He is 55 receiving yards away from becoming the ninth player in the Conference record book with 2,000 yards receiving. Hazel is among the 2014 Senior Bowl Watch List candidates as well as the South Carolina Football Hall of Fame College Player of the Year Award Watch List.

BIG MCKIE

Presbyterian College's **JEREMIAH MCKIE** rolled up 283 all-purpose yards this past Saturday against VMI. He totaled 151 yards on kickoff returns, 107 receiving and 19 rushing for the eighth-highest single-game all-purpose total in League history. McKie's effort was the most in the Big South since Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET** gained 298 all-purpose yards against Colgate on Sept. 22, 2012.

BUYING STOCK IN KORDENBROCK

VMI quarterback **ERIC KORDENBROCK** tallied his third 300-yard passing game of the season with 359 against Robert Morris in Week 5. It is the most 300-yard passing games in a season since Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** had four last year. Kordenbrock now has four career 300-yard passing games, third-most in League history. Meanwhile, Kordenbrock's efforts this season include back-to-back 300-yard passing games -- the first Keydet QB with two-straight 300-yard passing games since 1986 when **DAVE BROWN** threw for 422 yards against Appalachian State and followed with 390 yards the next week at East Tennessee State.

THE NEW 40

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 40 points in five consecutive games, the second-longest streak in Big South history. That record is seven games, established by former member Stony Brook during the 2011 season from Oct. 8-Nov. 19. Coastal has also scored at least 40 points in five-straight Big South games, also the second-longest streak in the Conference record book. Stony Brook holds that record as well, which is also seven games spanning two seasons (Oct. 8, 2011 - Oct. 13, 2012).

THE 20/20 EXPERIENCE - 2 OF 2

Coastal Carolina has scored at least 20 points in 15 consecutive games, dating back to last season -- the longest current streak in the Big South and the Chanticleers' longest such streak since scoring 20 points in 20 consecutive contests from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 25, 2006. Coastal's 53 points at Elon in Week 5 was its most scored against a non-Conference FCS foe since scoring 66 points vs. Savannah State on Nov. 4, 2006.

BLOUNT FORCE

Gardner-Webb RB **JUANNE BLOUNT**'s 35 rushing attempts at Wofford in Week 4 is tied for the third-most in a single-game in Big South history. It was the most rushing carries by a Big South player since Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** had 35 at Coastal Carolina on Oct. 4, 2008. Blount had 32 rushes at Charlotte in Week 6, becoming the fourth Big South player with two 30-carry games in the same season. Jennings was the last to do so in 2008. Meanwhile, Blount is 210 rushing yards away from becoming the 15th player in League annals with 2,000 in a career.

INSIDE THE TACKLE BOX

Coastal Carolina junior LB **QUINN BACKUS** became the 39th player in Big South history with 200 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. His career total now stands at 236, which includes 126 solo stops, and he needs 24 tackles to enter the League's all-time Top 20. Presbyterian College junior LB **DONELLE WILLIAMS** became the 38th player in the 200-tackle club during Week 2, and his career numbers stand at 209 tackles and 110 solo hits. Gardner-Webb junior LB **TANNER BURCH** is seven tackles away from becoming the 40th member of the club.

MASTRO OF THE UNIVERSE

Coastal Carolina senior **NICCOLO MASTROMATTEO** is the Big South's all-time leader for punt returns (71) and punt return yards (606). He is the third player in Big South history with at least 100 combined kickoff/punt returns in a career, as he is third all-time with 118 (47 KR, 71 PR). He needs 10 returns to break the Conference record of 127, which is held by former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY**. Maypray returned 98 kickoffs and 29 punts in his career from 2006-09. Meanwhile, Mastromatteo is the only player in the Conference record books with two punt returns of at least 80 yards.

FOGG ALERT

Liberty redshirt-senior **KEVIN FOGG** recorded a 29-yard pick-6 against Monmouth in Week 2 -- his sixth career return touchdown and first interception return TD. He is the first player in Big South history with return touchdowns on an interception (1), fumble (1), punt (1) and kickoff (3). Fogg is tied as the Big South's all-time leader for most kickoff return touchdowns, and coupled with his one career punt return score, he is second in League history with four kick return TDs. He needs one to tie the all-time mark of five, set by former Liberty WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3 KR, 2 PR) from 2005-08.

BIG SOUTH SCORES RECORD NON-LEAGUE FCS WINS

The Big South is 14-7 through 21 games against FCS opponents -- the most victories against non-Conference FCS foes in the League's 12-year football history. The previous best was 13 wins in 2006. The Big South has won eight of its 14 FCS games on the road this season -- also a League record. The Conference has also assured itself of its first winning record against out-of-conference FCS members, as four non-Conference FCS games remain in the regular-season. The Big South is 6-2 against the SoCon this season, another all-time win mark and bests the previous high of four in 2006.

TRIPLE OPTION OFFENSE

Coastal Carolina's season average of 495.9 yards of offense is pacing ahead of the Big South single-season record of 468.1 established by the Chanticleers in 2006. Meanwhile, the Chants became the first team in Big South history to score 50 points, rush for more than 300 yards and gain more than 500 yards of offense in three consecutive games, as the Chanticleers surpassed all three benchmarks during Weeks 3-5. The Chants' achievement also tied the Big South records in each category separately.

BACKUS ADDED TO BUCHANAN LIST

Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS** was added to the 2013 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Oct. 1, becoming the first Big South candidate for the FCS Defensive Player of the Year award since 2011 (Coastal's **JOSH NORMAN** and Presbyterian's **JUSTIN BETHEL**). Backus is the seventh overall Big South student-athlete to be an official candidate for the Buchanan Award.

BLUE SWARM

Charleston Southern is nationally-ranked for the third consecutive week, as the Buccaneers are No. 24 in this week's FCS Coaches poll. CSU is ranked in the Top 25 this season for the first time since the week of Nov. 6, 2006, following the Bucs' 9-0 start to the season (No. 24 - *Sports Network*, No. 25 - Coaches). Charleston Southern's entry marks the third Big South program to be ranked this year -- the second time in League history that three teams were nationally-ranked at any point of the season.

BACK TO THE BEACH

Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS** returned an interception 73 yards for a touchdown against Gardner-Webb in Week 7, the second-longest interception return in Coastal history and the longest returned for a TD in CCU annals. Backus' pick-six is the seventh-longest in Big South history and the longest INT return by a linebacker.

DAY'S BIG DAY

Gardner-Webb PK **JORDAN DAY** tied the Big South single-game record with his four field goals against No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3, as he scored all 12 points in the Runnin' Bulldogs' 12-10 victory. Day is the eighth different kicker in League history to make four field goals in a game, and the first since former GWU kicker **TREVER AUSTIN** on Oct. 22, 2011 against Coastal Carolina.

RECORD COMBO MEAL

Gardner-Webb and Charlotte combined for 104 points, 187 plays and 1,125 yards of offense in Week 6. The two teams set a Big South single-game record for combined plays, breaking the old mark of 183 that was set by the Runnin' Bulldogs (99) and VMI (84) in a triple-overtime classic on Oct. 22, 2005. The combined yardage is the now the seventh-most in a game while the combined points tied for the third-most in Big South history.

50-50 PROPOSITION

Coastal Carolina is the first team in Big South history to score 50 points in three consecutive games against non-Conference FCS opponents. The streak began with 51 at Eastern Kentucky in Week 3, followed by 50 points against Hampton in Week 4, and 53 at Elon in Week 5. The Chants tied the Big South mark for most consecutive 50-point games, joining Gardner-Webb (Nov. 20, 2004 - Sept. 10, 2005) and Liberty (Oct. 31 - Nov. 14, 2009). The Liberty contest was also Coastal's 15th 50-point game in program history, the second-most in Big South annals. Liberty holds that record with 17.

FREE LONG DISTANCE

Liberty QB **JOSH WOODRUM** and WR **DARRIN PETERSON** connected on an 85-yard touchdown against Monmouth in Week 2, the fifth-longest pass completion in Big South history. It is the longest by the Flames since **BROCK SMITH** and **BRANDON TURNER** teamed up for an 86-yard completion against Coastal Carolina on Nov. 3, 2007.

THAT 70's SHOW

Liberty defeated Kentucky Wesleyan, 73-7 in Week 5, the fourth-straight year a Big South member has lit the scoreboard for 70 points. It is tied for the third-most points in a game in League history, as the Flames also tallied 73 points against VMI on Nov. 10, 2007. Liberty's output was the sixth 70-point game in the Big South record book.

THREE-AND-IN

Gardner-Webb's 3-0 victory over No. 8/10 Wofford established the Big South record for lowest scoring game. It was the Conference's first shutout of a non-League FCS opponent since 2008 when VMI defeated St. Francis (Pa.), 49-0 in the season opener. It was Gardner-Webb's first shutout since a 65-0 victory over Southern Virginia in 2009 (a span of 41 games) and its first shutout of an FCS opponent since blanking Savannah State, 66-0, in 2007. The shutout of Wofford was Gardner-Webb's seventh as a Big South member -- tied with Liberty for the most in League annals.

GARDNER-WEBB SCORES LEAGUE FIRST -- BACK-TO-BACK WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Gardner-Webb blanked No. 8/10 Wofford, 3-0, in Week 4 -- becoming the first team in Big South history to defeat nationally-ranked opponents in consecutive weeks. The Runnin' Bulldogs knocked off then-No. 11/15 Richmond in Week 3 (12-10), also without a touchdown. The Wofford win gave the Big South a League-record three wins over ranked teams in 2013. Meanwhile, GWU won its first road game against a non-Conference foe since Sept. 12, 2009 at Western Carolina, and the Wofford win was Gardner-Webb's first over a ranked team on the road since a 38-35 win at No. 23 New Hampshire on Nov. 11, 2000.

BIG SOUTH SCORES LEAGUE FIRST WITH TWO WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS IN SAME WEEK

For the first time in League history, the Big South defeated two nationally-ranked teams in the same week of the regular-season as Gardner-Webb upset No. 11/15 Richmond and Coastal Carolina won at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky in Week 3. It was the second time overall in the Conference record book, as the Chants and former member Stony Brook achieved the feat in the first round of the 2012 FCS Playoffs. GWU also handed Richmond its first non-conference FCS loss since 2005 -- ending the Spiders' 17-game win streak in such games. Meanwhile, the Chants' win at EKU improved the Big South to 4-7 all-time when a ranked Big South team plays a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent.

COASTAL CAROLINA SETS BIG SOUTH SCORING RECORDS AGAINST A RANKED TEAM

Coastal Carolina's 51 points at No. 25 Eastern Kentucky was the most scored by a Big South member against a nationally-ranked non-Conference opponent in League history. The previous high was 35 by the Chanticleers in last season's playoff loss at Old Dominion. Coastal's 19-point victory over the Colonels is the Big South's second-largest margin of victory against a ranked non-Conference team, just after Liberty's 23-point win over No. 12 Elon in 2008.

WEBB TALES

Gardner-Webb ran 98 plays at Charlotte in Week 6, the second-most in a single-game in Big South history, and the most in a regulation contest. The Runnin' Bulldogs hold the all-time mark of 99, which was set against VMI in three overtimes on Oct. 22, 2005. GWU also amassed a Big South single-game record 22 passing first downs against the 49ers, bettering the old mark of 20 by Coastal Carolina against Liberty on Oct. 4, 2008.

RED STORM RISING

Earlier this season, Gardner-Webb cracked the national rankings for two consecutive weeks, as the Runnin' Bulldogs were No. 24/25 the week of Sept. 30 after first entering the Top 25 on Sept. 23. It was the first time in 11 seasons that GWU appeared in the national polls, as the last time was in the 2003 USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll (No. 25 in preseason/Week 1). It was Gardner-Webb's first appearance in *The Sports Network* Top 25 since the 2002 campaign. Coupled with Coastal Carolina's national ranking, it was the earliest that the Big South had two teams ranked in the same week.

COMING ATTRACTIONS

The Big South Conference will welcome **MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2014 and start-up program **KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY** as an associate member in 2015. Monmouth's addition will maintain the League's membership at six squads, while KSU's addition returns the Big South to seven members, which was the total from 2008-12. The Hawks got an early taste of League play with their 45-15 defeat at Liberty in Week 2. The Big South is 3-0 against Monmouth, with Coastal Carolina also earning wins in 2008 and 2009.

MOVING ON

VMI is playing its final campaign in the Big South this season, as the Keydets are rejoining the Southern Conference next fall. The Big South bid farewell to Stony Brook following the 2012 campaign with the Seawolves' move to the CAA after five years as an associate member.
