CHOICE HOTELS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JOAB JEROME • F Sr. • Winthrop Marietta, Ga.

Jerome scored 20 points on 7-for-9 shooting, including 2-for-3 behind the arc, to help Winthrop pick up just its second victory alltime against Appalachian State. In addition to his 20 points, Jerome had five rebounds, two assists, two blocks and an assist in 22 minutes of action. He connected on a three-pointer with 2:55 to play in the game after Appalachian State pulled to within one point. He then collected a steal on the other end that resulted in points for the Eagles. Jerome also made two free throws with 46 seconds left to push Winthrop's lead to seven points. He scored eight of his points in the paint, six behind the arc and four at the foul line. Jerome tallied seven points during a 13-2 run in the first

DAVID ROBERTSON • G Fr. • UNC Asheville Cary, N.C.

Robertson began the week with 10 points and a career-best six assists in Asheville's 92-56 victory over Bluefield College Thursday night. He then scored a career-high 18 points in the Bulldogs' 73-63 victory at USC Upstate Sunday afternoon. For the week, he was 11-of-20 from the field (=55.0 percent), 6-of-13 from long distance (=46.2) and averaged 3.5 assists in the two wins.

BACK IN FAMILIAR TERRITORY

VMI now leads the Big South in scoring with 89.0 points per game, its highest average since 2008-09 when the Keydets scored a League- and NCAA-leading 93.8 a contest. VMI, which has led the Big South in scoring six out of the last seven years -- including last season, is second all-time for most times leading the Conference in scoring offense at six. Radford owns that record with nine times.

DO THE CHARLESTON

Charleston Southern is averaging 86.2 points this season, its first time averaging more than 80 points since 1993-94 when the Buccaneers scored 83.3 points per contest.

WHAT IS YOUR Q SCORE?

VMI freshman **QJ PETERSON** leads the Big South with 21.5 points per game, the highest individual scoring average in the Big South since VMI's **STAN OKOYE** averaged the same amount in 2012-13. Peterson is looking to become the first freshman ever to lead the Big South in scoring, as well as just the second freshman in Big South history to average 20 points a game. His current scoring average is ahead of the League's freshman record of 20.2 points that was set by Liberty's **SETH CURRY** in 2008-09. Meanwhile, Peterson is the second-highest scoring freshman in the nation behind Duke's **JABARI PARKER** (22.1) -- and the two are the lone freshmen nationwide averaging more than 20.0 points per contest.

TAKE COVER

VMI forward/center **D.J. COVINGTON** leads the Big South with 3.00 blocked shots this season, and if he can maintain his average, he would become just the third player in League history to average at least 3.0 rejections two different seasons. UMBC's **PASCAL FLUERY** was the first in 1993-94 (3.20) and 1994-95 (4.59) and Liberty's **PETER ALUMA** was the second in 1994-95 (3.46), 1995-96 (3.90) and 1996-97 (3.03). Covington has blocked a shot in 39 of his last 41 appearances, and since the start of the 2012-13 campaign (41 games), he has recorded 123 of his 196 career blocks in that span (=62.8 percent) for an average of 3.00 per contest.

D.J. - PART 1

UNC Asheville's **D.J. CUNNINGHAM**, who missed three games from Nov. 25-Dec. 1, is sixth all-time in Big South history with 197 career blocked shots and is three away from joining the 200-blocked shot club. He is also 42nd on the Big South's career rebounding list with 611. Cunningham is looking to become the fifth player in Big South history with 600 rebounds and 200 blocks in 2013-14.

D.J. - PART 2

VMI's **D.J. COVINGTON** is seventh in Big South history with 196 career blocked shots. He needs one rebound for 500 in his career and is on the verge of becoming just the sixth player in League history with 500 boards and 200 rejections.

BURRUS' BOARDS AND BLOCKS

Liberty redshirt-senior **ANTWAN BURRUS**, who missed all of 2012-13 with an injury, became the 19th member of the Big South's 500-rebound, 100-blocked shot club when he surpassed the rebounding milestone Dec. 7 against Greensboro College -- becoming the 70th Big South player to grab 500 caroms. Burrus has tallied 111 rejections in his career -- 27th in League annals, and is just the second Liberty player on the list. He joins Big South Hall of Famer **PETER ALUMA**, who had 682 rebounds and 366 blocked shots from 1994-97.

GREEN MACHINE

Radford junior **JAVONTE GREEN** became the 69th member of the Big South's 500-rebound club when he eclipsed the milestone Nov. 25 at Cornell. Now with 522, he is the first Highlander with 500 career boards since **ART PARAKHOUSKI** and **JOEY LYNCH-FLOHR** in 2009-10. Meanwhile, Green is approaching 1,000 career points as he enters the week 78 points shy of that milestone.

WINNING COMBINATION

Charleston Southern junior guards **SAAH NIMLEY** and **ARLON HARPER** have scored 15 points in the same game 15 times in their career (nine times last season including three consecutive), and the Buccaneers are 12-3 in those games. The duo has surpassed 20 points in the same contest in four of those 15 outings, and CSU is 3-1 when they both score 20 in the same game.

TREASURE CHEST

Charleston Southern is averaging a League-leading 10.50 three-pointers per game this season, and is looking to become the first Big South team other than VMI to average at least 10 triples a game in a single-season. CSU's average of 10.50 threes is fourth nationally and the highest in the Big South since VMI averaged 11.32 in 2010-11. The Buccaneers' current per game tally would be sixth-highest in the League record book.

WATCH YOUR P'S AND Q'S

In addition to leading the Conference in scoring, VMI freshman QJ PETERSON is pacing the League in steals with 2.60 per game. It is the highest per game average since 2008-09, when Keydet twins CHAVIS and TRAVIS HOLMES averaged 3.39 and 3.22, respectively. Peterson is looking to become the first freshman to lead the League in steals per game. The last player to lead the Big South in scoring AND steals was Chavis Holmes in 2008-09 (22.0 ppg, 3.39 spg).

CLIMBING THE VICTORY LADDER

VMI's DUGGAR BAUCOM and Charleston Southern's BARCLAY RADEBAUGH are the longest-tenured Big South coaches, as each is in his ninth year. Baucom's Big South tenure will end after this season with VMI's departure to the Southern Conference on July 1, 2014. Meanwhile, Baucom is sixth alltime in Big South history with 124 victories at the Institute, while Coastal Carolina's CLIFF ELLIS is in seventh-place with his 118 wins at Coastal Carolina. Radebaugh sits in ninth-place all-time in League annals with 110 victories. Here is a look at the Big South's Top 10 winningest coaches:

BAND OF BROTHERS

Liberty senior JOHN CALEB SANDERS and his brother and former teammate JESSE have combined to score 2,360 points during their respective careers with the Flames -- the third-highest scoring brother combination in Big South history. Jesse had 1,235 of the total from 2008-12, while John Caleb is at 1,125 since joining the program as a freshman in 2010-11. Below are the Brothers Sanders with the top two combos:

BIG SOUTH'S 1,000-POINT CLUB

GLASS IS HALF FULL

VMI senior **RODNEY GLASGOW** has 372 career assists and is 28 away from becoming the 23rd player in Big South history with 400. Once he reaches the milestone, he will be the first Keydet to join the League's 400-assist club.

IN WILLIAM WE TRUSS

Presbyterian College junior WILLIAM TRUSS leads the Big South with 10.0 rebounds per game. He is looking to become the first Big South player to average double-digit rebounds since Liberty's JOHN BROWN (10.8) in 2010-11. If Truss can maintain his top position, he would become the first Blue Hose player to lead the League in rebounds.

DOUBLE DRIBBLES

Five Big South players have scored in double-figures in every game this season. Presbyterian College's **JORDAN DOWNING** (11), Longwood's **TRISTAN CAREY** (10), VMI's **RODNEY GLASGOW** (10) and freshmen **QJ PETERSON** of VMI (10) and **ELIJAH WILSON** of Coastal Carolina (10) make up the quintet. Dating back to last season, Glasgow has the longest active double-figure scoring streak at 14 games, followed by Carey (13) and Downing (12).

CLIFF NOTES

Coastal Carolina head coach **CLIFF ELLIS** is one of two coaches in NCAA history with 100 wins at four different Division I programs, joining **LEFTY DRIESELL**. Ellis recorded his 100th win as Coastal Carolina's head coach with the Chanticleers' 2012-13 season-opening 74-70 overtime victory over Akron. His school-by-school breakdown: South Alabama - 171, Clemson - 177, Auburn - 186, Coastal Carolina - 118. Ellis is 10th among all active coaches with 652 Division I wins and is 32nd all-time in Division I victories. LONGWOOD SCORES BIG SOUTH'S FIRST BIG 12 WIN IN 15 SEASONS

Longwood's 82-79 win at TCU on Nov. 12 was the Big South's first win over a member of the Big 12 Conference since the 1999-00 season. That year, Winthrop defeated Missouri, 51-46.

CAMPBELL FIGHTING CAMELS

Campbell looks to snap a 3-game slide Wednesday at defending NEC regular-season champion Robert Morris. The Camels round out their pre-Christmas slate Saturday at home vs. Johnson & Wales ... CU canned a season-high 12 three-pointers (coming from 8 different players) in an 80-68 loss at Loyola-Chicago. LUKE MOYER came off the bench to score a career-high 12 points vs. the Ramblers ... A 67-65 loss to Chowan snapped Campbell's 8-game win streak in overtime that dated to January 2008. Last year, the Camels went 4-0 in OT games before a 75-73 OT victory Nov. 30 at Georgia Southern ... In Robert Morris, the Camels take on the team that defeated Kentucky in the 2013 NIT first round. Last year at Buies Creek, the Colonials defeated CU, 61-58, despite a career-high 21-point performance from MARVELLE HARRIS. When CU plays Wednesday at Moon Township, Pa., Campbell returns to the home state of Moyer (Souderton), head coach KEVIN McGEEHAN (Maple Glen), assistant coaches CHRIS CLARK (Philadelphia) and DAN GERIOT (Darby) and assistant director of operations GREG ROBBINS (Philadelphia) ... Camel freshman KYRE' HAMER has scored in double digits 3 times in the last 4 games.

HIGH POINT PANTHERS

High Point had season-high 19 assists with a season-low five turnovers against James Madison on Saturday ... LORENZO CUGINI tied his career-high with five assists and ADAM WEARY had a season-high four assists against James Madison. Both players had no turnovers ... JOHN BROWN led the team in scoring for the fifth time this season with 17 points against James Madison. His four steals were a season high.

LIBERTY FLAMES

Despite a career-high 27-point performance from **ANTWAN BURRUS**, the Flames were unable to withstand late scoring bursts from Austin Peay in the 77-71 defeat. Liberty fell to 4-6 on the year, while Austin Peay improved to 5-5, tying the head-to-head series at 1-1. Along with Burrus, **JOHN CALEB SANDERS** finished with a season-high 16 points, followed by **DAVON MARSHALL**, who had 11 ... With his point total, Burrus now has 902 points for his Liberty career, needing 98 more to join Sanders as the 24th member of the program's 1,000-point club ... Liberty has won the rebounding battle the last five games, out-rebounding its opponents 200-138 and averaging 40.0 rebounds during the span ... Burrus' last bucket versus Austin Peay was a three-pointer, his first made trey since hitting a 30-foot buzzer-beating shot at Charleston Southern during the 2011-12 season (Feb. 9, 2012) ... Burrus needs two more blocks to surpass **JULIUS NWOSU** for the No. 2 spot on the program's all-time list.

LONGWOOD LANCERS

Longwood (4-7) returned from semester exams with a 99-73 home win past Bluefield State on Saturday. TRISTAN CAREY led the Lancers against the Big Blues with his team-high 22 points (9-18 FGs, 2-3 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), adding a game-high 14 rebounds for his seventh career double-double, along with a game-high three steals. Carey now totals 1,129 career points to rank 15th all-time in school history, and ranks fourth with 168 career three-pointers ... KARL ZIEGLER had 21 points (8-8 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 4-6 FTs), seven rebounds and matched his career high with five assists. LUCAS WOODHOUSE finished with his fifth career double-double, contributing 13 points and a game-high 11 assists ... Longwood shot a season-high 61% (35-57) from the field, including 70% (21-30) in the second half, 55% (6-11) on three-pointers and 74% (23-31) at the free throw line ... Longwood will host Virginia Intermont College on Tuesday before playing at Dartmouth on Saturday.

RADFORD HIGHLANDERS

The Highlanders are 6-2 for the first time in two decades (1993-94) ... Radford is 4-0 at home, which pushes head coach **MIKE JONES** above the .500 mark at the Dedmon Center (17-16) ... Radford was off last week for final exams, and begins play Monday at Santa Clara as part of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic.

VMI KEYDETS

RODNEY GLASGOW scored a career-high 33 points against VA-Lynchburg on Dec. 9, breaking his previous career-high of 31 points against CSU in Big South Semifinals last year. He had 21 second-half points and seven 3-pointers, and his two free throws helped fuel a 23-4 run that broke the game open in the second half ... PHILLIP ANGLADE finished with 13 points, 13 rebounds and eight blocked shots against VUL, just two blocks shy of a triple-double. The eight blocks were the second-most single-game total in VMI history ... With 20 points and 10 rebounds against VUL, D.J. COVINGTON has posted double-doubles in three consecutive games ... The 110 points against Virginia University-Lynchburg marked the third time that VMI has scored 100 or more points in a game this season ... VMI is averaging 32 three-point shots a game and has led the nation in that category for most of the season.

SOUTH DIVISION

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN BUCCANEERS

Charleston Southern returned from an 11-day layoff from game action with a 59-45 loss at Alabama on Saturday. The Bucs led by as many as eight in the first half, moving ahead of the Crimson Tide, 15-7, with 10:47 left following back-to-back threes by **SAAH NIMLEY** and **ARLON HARPER**. CSU trailed by one at halftime and was still within 33-32 after a Nimley three at the 11:20 mark ... CSU held the Tide to 59 points and 35 percent shooting. The totals are the lowest for any of CSU's Division I opponents, and are also the lowest for Alabama in its nine games to date. **PAUL GOMBWER** led the way with a career-high 15 rebounds ... CSU plays at Western Carolina Wednesday and Central Arkansas on Saturday. The Bucs are 4-9 all-time against Western Carolina, and have never played Central Arkansas.

COASTAL CAROLINA CHANTICLEERS

Following a nine-day break for exams, the Chanticleers picked up a 118-82 victory over Reinhardt University. The 118 points is the third-most in program history behind 125 scored against Thomas More on Dec. 20, 2010, and 122 against Friendship during the 1979-80 season. The Chants also scored 118 points against Morris on Nov. 24, 1984 ... BADOU DIAGNE led the Chants with 26 points and nine rebounds in the Reinhardt win. He was 9-10 from the field, including 3-3 from three, while hitting 5-6 from the free throw line ... Six Chants scored in double figures in the game including Diagne (26), WARREN GILLIS (21), ELIJAH WILSON (16), MICHEL ENANGA (14), JOSH CAMERON (12) and COLTON RAY-ST CYR (10) ... On the season, Wilson leads the Chants with 16.8 points per game ... The Chants travel to South Carolina State on Tuesday and Central Connecticut State on Saturday.

GARDNER-WEBB RUNNIN' BULLDOGS

TYRELL NELSON scored a career-high 20 points in Gardner-Webb's 106-54 rout of NAIA Clearwater Christian Saturday night. It marked the fourth time in the last six games he has reached a new career-high scoring total. Nelson scored 10 points in each half, mostly inside the paint, and pulled down six boards in the win ... Gardner-Webb improved to 4-1 at home with its win over Clearwater Christian GWU shot a season-high 70.8 percent for the game against Clearwater Christian, mostly on layups and dunks ... The Runnin' Bulldogs will play four games in seven days after taking a week off for exams. GWU will play a ranked opponent for the first time this season when it takes on No. 8/___ Duke Monday night.

PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE BLUE HOSE

UT-Martin and PC meet for the first time on Dec. 16. Both teams will be well-rested, having taken the past week off for exams ... PC is 3-8 and is coming off a 15-point loss to Furman, Dec. 7. The Blue Hose led by 10 early in the second half but shooting went cold as the Paladins used a 29-9 run to take the lead and eventual win ... JORDAN DOWNING is seventh in the nation in total points (214) and third in total field goals made (76), as well as total field goal attempts (175) ... WILLIAM TRUSS is third in total rebounds (110.0) and 11th in double-doubles (5) ... Downing averaged 12.8 ppg last season and is up over seven points this season to 19.5 so far, which is third in the Big South ... Truss has gone from 6.8 a game to 11.5 ppg (top 30 in the League).

UNC ASHEVILLE BULLDOGS

UNC Asheville enjoyed a good week with two wins last week ... The Bulldogs finally played a home game as they knocked off Bluefield Thursday night, 92-58. Five players scored in double figures as D.J. CUNNINGHAM led the way with 18 points. Cunningham, who returned from a knee injury that caused him to miss the last three games, also picked up his 600th career rebound ... Asheville picked up a road win with a 73-63 victory at USC Upstate Sunday afternoon. ANDREW ROW-SEY scored 19 points, while freshman DAVID ROBERTSON tallied a career-best 18 points in the win. JARON LANE was a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line in the game ... Asheville begins a four-game homestand with a home game against Virginia Intermont on Friday.

WINTHROP EAGLES

Winthrop is 6-2 for the first time since 2006-07 and is 5-0 at home for the first time since that same season after holding off Appalachian State at home on Sunday ... Winthrop now heads to North Carolina Central for a game on Wednesday in hopes of its first 7-2 start since 2004-05 ... Despite losing at Virginia Tech on Dec. 3, Winthrop received six votes in the *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major Top 25 for the first time in 2013-14 ... The Eagles built a 19-point first half advantage against ASU, and fought off a relentless comeback behind a strong second half effort by **JOAB JEROME**. Jerome scored 13 of his game-high 20 points in the second half, including a three-pointer late in the game after Appalachian State had cut the deficit to a point. For Jerome, it was his third career 20-point game and he has scored in double-figures in 15 of his last 17 games played ... Winthrop is now 9-1 all-time under head coach **PAT KELSEY** when scoring 70 or more points.
