JOSH WOODRUM • QB • R-Junior

Woodrum led Liberty to a 55-48 overtime win at FBS Appalachian State, the Big South's fourth-ever victory over an FBS program. He was 24-of-37 passing for a season-high 356 yards with three touchdowns, and added a 13-yard rushing score to lead the Flames. Woodrum completed his first 13 pass attempts, finished with 367 yards of offense and posted a 167.04 passing efficiency rating.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

RAYSHAUD SHIELDS • LB • Junior

Shields, who had just 12 career tackles in eight career games, made his first career start and responded with a team-high 15 tackles, including 12 solo stops, in a victory over Presbyterian College. Starting in place of the injured **QUINN BACKUS**, Shields added two tackles-for-loss and a pass breakup in the Chants' Big South opener. He had eight first half tackles, while his TFLs caused two second-and-long situations.

Mathis blocked a Vanderbilt punt in the final minute of the first half and raced to the end zone from 17 yards out to give the Bucs their first touchdown of the night. His play cut CSU's deficit to eight in the opening half.

LIBERTY COLLECTS BIG SOUTH'S FOURTH-EVER FBS WIN

The Big South Conference notched its fourth-ever win over an FBS opponent with Liberty's 55-48 overtime win at Appalachian State this past Saturday. The Big South's four wins have all come since 2010, and the Flames own two of those victories.

BIG SOUTH SETS RECORD FOR MOST FCS WINS FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR

The Big South is 20-5 through 25 games against FCS opponents, extending the Conference record for most wins against non-conference FCS foes. Last season, the Big South was an all-time best 16-9 in regular-season competition and 18-10 through the postseason. The Big South has two remaining non-conference FCS games in 2014 until the Playoffs.

ALL HANDS ON DECK

For the first time in League history, every football member is at or above .500 after seven weeks of the season, extending the Conference record for the second consecutive week. The previous best for most teams at or above .500 was four, which occurred after six weeks -- first in 2006 (five team membership) and matched in 2013 (six teams).

THE UNDEFEATEDS

Coastal Carolina is the first team in Big South history to open the season 7-0 in back-to-back seasons, and is the fourth overall team to start the year 7-0. The Chanticleers join the 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers (9-0), 2013 Chanticleers (9-0) and 2013 Buccaneers. Coastal Carolina is the lone Division I program at 7-0 (FBS or FCS), as well as one of the five remaining undefeated FCS programs.

PITCH-AND-CATCH COMBO

Monmouth RB **LAVON CHANEY** is the first non-quarterback in Big South history to throw two touchdown passes in a game, as he accomplished the feat this past Saturday against Columbia. Chaney's first TD pass was to Hawks QB **BRANDON HILL** -- who became the first Big South QB with a TD reception since Liberty's **KYLE PAINTER** in 2002, and the second overall.

HOLIDAY ROAD

Coastal Carolina won its fifth consecutive road game this past Saturday with its 40-28 win at Presbyterian, tying the Big South record for longest road win streak. The Chants matched the record first set by Liberty (Oct. 20, 2007 - Oct. 4, 2008) and equalled by Charleston Southern last year from Aug. 31 - Oct. 12, 2013. Coastal's next road game is Nov. 1 at Gardner-Webb.

BASILE NAMED TO JERRY RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

Monmouth freshman safety **MIKE BASILE** is among the initial candidates for the 2014 Jerry Rice Award, which is awarded to the top freshman player in the country. Basile is the second Big South player to be an official candidate for the Rice Award, joining Liberty QB **JOSH WOODRUM** (2012).

THIS THE CONFERENCE SEASON

Coastal Carolina is 1-0 in the Big South for the ninth time in program history. Charleston Southern plays its Big South opener this weekend, while Gardner-Webb, Liberty and Monmouth open League action next Saturday. Below is a breakdown of how the remaining squads have fared in their respective Conference opener, as well as some additional notes:

SEVENTH HEAVEN

Liberty QB **JOSH WOODRUM** is now the Big South's all-time leader for 300-yard passing games after he recorded his seventh career effort with 356 this past Saturday at Appalachian State. He moved past Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** and Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** for the top spot. Woodrum has a League-high four 300-yard passing games this season, one shy of the Big South single-season mark of five established by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006.

MONMOUTH'S MONUMENTAL PASSING

Monmouth tied the Big South single-game record with six passing touchdowns this past Saturday vs. Columbia. The Hawks join Charleston Southern (vs. North Greenville, 10-23-04) and Liberty (vs. St. Francis, Pa., 9-4-10) as the only Big South teams with six TDs passing in a game.

KING OF THE HILL

Monmouth QB **BRANDON HILL** has tied the Big South record for most consecutive multi-TD pass games at six, as he has thrown 15 TD strikes in that span. Hill is the fourth different QB to achieve this, joining Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** (2009 - 12 TDs), Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** (2011 - 13 TDs) and Stony Brook's **KYLE ESSINGTON** (2011-12 - 13 TDs). Meanwhile, Hill's 390 passing yards in Week 5 at Lehigh were the most by a Big South quarterback since Charleston Southern's **RICHARD MOUNCE** had 397 vs. Coastal Carolina on Nov. 12, 2011. Hill leads the Big South with 285.50 passing yards per game and has eclipsed 200 passing yards in each contest -- including the last three over 300.

30 FOR 30

What if I told you that four of the Big South's six teams are averaging 30.0 points a game this season -- Monmouth (39.0), Liberty (36.1), Coastal Carolina (35.4) and Charleston Southern (33.0). If the four teams can maintain their scoring production, it would be the most teams to average 30.0 points in Big South history. The current record is three teams set in 2010 -- Liberty (36.5), Stony Brook (31.2) and Coastal Carolina (31.1).

CAN'T FUMBLE THIS NOTE

Big South football members have already returned six fumbles for touchdowns this year, setting the Big South single-season record for most fumble return scores. The previous record was four in 2002, 2004, 2007, 2009 and 2011. A record four different teams -- Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina (2), Liberty (2), and Presbyterian -- have fumble return TDs this season. The previous best was three.

WOODRUM'S THREE-PEAT

Liberty QB **JOSH WOODRUM** has thrown three touchdowns in back-to-back games for the second time in his career. He is just the third quarterback in Big South history to accomplish the dual feat, joining Stony Brook's **KYLE ESSINGTON** (three times) and Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (two). The record for most consecutive 3 TD pass games is three, set by Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** from Oct. 2-16, 2010.

BIG SOUTH'S STREAK WITH NATIONALLY-RANKED PROGRAM CONTINUES

The Big South has had a football squad ranked for 44 consecutive weeks, dating back to Week 9 of the 2011 campaign (Oct. 24). The Conference has had a Top 5 team in 11 of the last 16 rankings. Coastal Carolina is ranked No. 3 in this week's FCS Coaches poll and No. 4 in *The Sports Network* ranking -- tied for the highest spot in Big South and school history.

Charleston Southern returned to the Top 25 in Week 5, as the Buccaneers were No. 25 in the FCS Coaches poll. CSU, which was No. 22/24 in the final 2013 polls and ranked the final nine weeks last year, is No. 22 in this week's Coaches ranking and No. 23 in *The Sports Network* poll. The Big South has two nationally-ranked teams in the same week for the third time in four seasons. In fact, the League has had two teams ranked at the same time 17 of the last 24 weeks. The Conference had its earliest duo-ranking ever the week of Sept. 15 when Liberty joined Coastal Carolina in *The Sports Network* Top 25.

RECORD-TYING ROAD WARRIORS

The Big South has won eight of its 20 non-conference FCS games on the road -- matching the League's regular-season record for most non-conference road victories set last year. The overall record is nine, which includes postseason wins. Coastal Carolina has four of the eight wins.

PROTECTING THEIR HOUSE

The Big South is 17-1 at home against non-conference opponents this season. Coastal Carolina has the League's longest active home win streak at 11, tied for the third-longest home win streak in Big South history. It is the Chanticleers' longest home win streak since winning 12 consecutive home games from Sept. 11, 2004 - Nov. 12, 2005. Gardner-Webb's home win streak stands at five, followed by Charleston Southern (4) and Monmouth (3).

THE HUBBARD IS NOT BARE

Gardner-Webb kick returner **J.J. HUBBARD** returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in Week 6 against Charlotte, his third career kickoff return TD. Hubbard now shares the Big South's all-time kickoff return record, joining Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2005-08), Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (2007-10) and the Flames' **KEVIN FOGG** (2009-13). Hubbard is three kickoff return yards shy of becoming the third Big South player with 2,000 in a career.

SOLO ARTIST

Coastal Carolina senior LB **QUINN BACKUS** is the Big South's all-time leader for solo tackles with 207. He broke the record during the Elon game in Week 5 with eight solo stops -- vaulting ahead of both Charleston Southern's **JADA ROSS** (195) and previous record holder **JUSTIN BETHEL** (Presbyterian - 199) for the top spot.

BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL "GAME OF THE WEEK" ON ESPN3 CONTINUES THIS SATURDAY

The Big South Conference's exclusive "Game of the Week" on ESPN3 continues this week with the Presbyterian College at Charleston Southern game live at 3:00pm with **MIKE HOGWOOD** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) on the call from Charleston. The season package features eight games, which will again utilize instant replay assistance from DVSPORT.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 104, while the second-longest active streak belongs to Coastal Carolina (38). Meanwhile, Liberty is the Big South's record holder for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 48, breaking its old mark of 45 (Sept. 23, 2006 - Sept. 18, 2010) in Week 5.

HE CRAN CATCH

Gardner-Webb TE **SETH CRANFILL** became the Big South's all-time receptions leader among tight ends in Week 5 during The Citadel game, and his career total stands at 74. He broke the old mark of 65 that was established by former Coastal Carolina TE **DAVID DURAN** (2009-12). Cranfill's 719 career receiving yards are second-most among tight ends in League history behind Duran's 910. Cranfill caught two touchdown passes against Wofford in Week 4, which tied the Big South single-game record for TD receptions by a tight end.

INSIDE THE TACKLE BOX

Coastal Carolina senior LB **QUINN BACKUS** is the active leading tackler in FCS with 371 career stops, which is a school record and second-most in League history. He is 29 away from becoming just the second player in Big South annals with 400. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College's **DONELLE WILLIAMS** is 23rd with 252, while Charleston Southern's **DEMARIS FREEMAN** (211) and Liberty's **NICK SIGMON** (200) joined the Big South's 200-tackle club during Week 5. Liberty's **JACOB HAGEN** is five stops away from entering the list. Meanwhile, Backus and Williams are two of 11 players in Big South history to average 8.00 tackles per game in their career. Backus' average is 8.43 (371 in 44 games) while Williams sits at 8.13 (252 in 31).

THIS IS SERGEANT PETERSON

Liberty WR **DARRIN PETERSON** leads the Big South and is second in the nation with 773 receiving yards for an average of 110.4 receiving yards per game (fourth nationally). He is pacing ahead of the Conference single-season per game record of 108.1, which was established by **CHRIS SUMMERS** in 2010. Peterson is on pace to finish with 1,325 receiving yards this season, which is just shy of the Big South single-season mark of 1,388 by Stony Brook's **KEVIN NORRELL** in 2012. Meanwhile, Peterson had 12 catches at Indiana State in Week 4 and 11 against Richmond in Week 5 to become the first Big South player with back-to-back 10 reception games since Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE** in 2006.

MOVING THE CHAINS

Monmouth RB **LAVON CHANEY** is tops in the Big South with 165.3 all-purpose yards per game, and already has two games with 200+ yards -- tied for seventh-most in a career in League history. Chaney is looking to become the first newcomer to lead the Conference in all-purpose yards since Stony Brook's **BROCK JACKOLSKI** in 2010.

CAKE ROSS

Coastal Carolina QB **ALEX ROSS** became the seventh quarterback in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 6 at Furman. He is currently seventh among the League's all-time quarterbacks with 1,031 rushing yards. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** is sixth with 1,182. Meanwhile, Ross set a school-record with 426 yards of offense in Week 5 against Elon, the fourth-highest single-game total in Big South history. Ross now has two career 400-yard games -- tied for second-most in League history, and eight career games with at least 300, which ranks fourth all-time.

QUADRUPLE FOR QUINN

Coastal Carolina LB and Buck Buchanan Award candidate **QUINN BACKUS** has forced four fumbles this season, tied for second-most in a season in League history. The record is five, established by Gardner-Webb's **MARIO WILLIAMS** in 2003 and tied by Coastal Carolina's **D.J. RICE** in 2007. Backus has a CCU-record seven career forced fumbles, tied with Liberty's **MANNY ROJAS** (2003-06) for second-most in the Conference record book. That record is eight by Williams and Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** (2004-07).

HIGH RATE OF RETURN

Coastal is 22-1 in its last 23 games when rushing for more than 200 yards, including 6-0 this season. The Chanticleers have rushed for more than 200 yards 67 times in their history, and are 62-5 (=92.5) when reaching the 200-yard plateau. Carolina has rushed for 200-plus yards in 24 of Head Coach **JOE MOGLIA**'s 35 games as CCU's head coach, posting an 23-1 record in such games.

BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL DEBUTS ON AMERICAN SPORTS NETWORK

The Big South Conference made its season debut on the new American Sports Network (ASN) in Week 5 with the Elon at Coastal Carolina game. The next broadcast is the Oct. 25 Charleston Southern at Coastal Carolina contest live from Conway at 3:30pm. Big South football will appear on ASN six times in 2014 -- five of them between Conference members, on affiliates and stations owned by Sinclair Broadcast Group. The six broadcasts push the League's overall package to a Big South-record 14 this season (12 League games). In addition, the final five weeks of the 2014 regular-season will now feature two televised games each week.

HOME COOKED MEAL

Gardner-Webb WR **KENNY COOK**, who missed two full games and 11 consecutive quarters earlier this season with an injury, has returned to form as he has 23 catches for 247 yards and two scores since returning to action in Week 4. Cook is now 10th all-time on the Big South's career receptions with 149, and needs three to move into ninth. With 1,934 career receiving yards, he is three yards away from cracking the Top 10 in that category and 66 shy from becoming the 10th player in League history with 2,000 in a career. Cook is two TD grabs away from becoming the eighth player in the League record books with 20 in a career.

WOODWORKING

Liberty QB **JOSH WOODRUM** is seventh in League history with 44 career touchdown passes and is sixth with 6,447 career passing yards. He needs six TD scoring strikes to become the fourth player with 50. Meanwhile, he has rushed for a touchdown and passed for a score in the same game eight times in his career -- including a League-high four times this season -- and the Flames are 5-3 in such contests (3-1 in 2014).

BEATTY OR NOT, HERE HE COMES

Gardner-Webb QB **LUCAS BEATTY** is second in Big South history with 617 career completions. He is also third with 6,794 passing yards and needs 243 to surpass Liberty's **BROCK SMITH** (7,036) for second all-time in that category. Beatty, who is fourth in the Conference record books for attempts (993), ranks fifth nationally among FCS active career leaders in completions, attempts and yardage. Meanwhile, he ranks among the Big South's all-time leaders in total offense yardage (8th - 6,509) and plays (4th - 1,178).

HENDERSON HOPING TO HOP TOWARDS HISTORY

Coastal Carolina RB **DE'ANGELO HENDERSON** rushed for 498 yards through the Chanticleers' first four games, matching the school record for most rushing yards through Coastal's first four contests of a season that was established by **AUNDRES PERKINS** in the program's inaugural season of 2003. Henderson's season total stands at 845, but has fallen behind former All-American teammate and current Baltimore Raven **LORENZO TALIAFERRO**'s school record pace, as Taliaferro had 986 yards after seven games in 2013 en route to a school-record 1,729. Below is a chart featuring Henderson, Taliaferro and Big South single-season rushing record holder **MIGUEL MAYSONET** after seven and eight games. Henderson is currently on pace for 1,449 rushing yards, which would be fifth-most in a single-season in Big South history.

BLOUNT FORCE

Gardner-Webb RB **JUANNE BLOUNT** moved into the Big South's all-time Top 10 rushing leaders in Week 6 during the Charlotte game, and he is 10th with 2,358 career yards. The only GWU player among the Conference's Top 10 all-time rushers, Blount is 90 yards from surpassing Stony Brook's **BROCK JACK-OLSKI** (2,447) for ninth-place.

BIG JOHN STUD

Liberty kicker **JOHN LUNSFORD** kicked a Big-South-record 60-yard field goal at the end of regulation to force overtime against nationally-ranked Richmond in Week 6. The first player in League history to attempt a field goal from that distance, Lunsford is the ninth different kicker in FCS history to make a field goal from 60+ yards, and the first in 14 years. His 60-yarder matched the third-longest made in terms of distance, behind 63 (three kickers) and 62 (two). Three other kickers have converted from 60 yards. Meanwhile, Lunsford's memorable kick gave him a Big South-record five career field goals from 50+ yards.

BLUE HOSE SWARM

Presbyterian College returned two of its four interceptions for touchdowns in Week 6 against Western Carolina, tying the Big South single-game record. The Blue Hose are just the second team in League history with two INT scores in a game, matching the record first set by Liberty at Charleston Southern on Oct. 22, 2011. PC's four picks against WCU was its most since joining the Big South in 2008.

HAGEN HANGING 10

Liberty All-American safety **JACOB HAGEN** is the ninth player in Big South history with 10 career interceptions, as he reached the milestone with his game-clinching pick in the end zone against Appalachian State this past Saturday. He also has 27 career passes defended (10 INT, 17 PBU), which is tied for 10th in League history as well. Meanwhile, Hagen's 27-yard fumble return for a touchdown at North Carolina in Week 1 was his second career fumble return TD -- the first player in Big South history to return two fumbles for scores.

BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL FIRST -- UNDEFEATED WEEK

The Big South Conference went 6-0 during Week 3, the first time in League history that every Conference member won its respective non-conference match-up in the same week. Four of the wins were against FCS foes -- the same total in Week 3 of the 2013 season. Five Big South members were above .500 after three games -- another League first.

ANOTHER LEAGUE FIRST -- THREE BIG SOUTH TEAMS RANKED

For the first time in Big South history, the Conference had three nationally-ranked programs in the same week, as the Sept. 22 FCS Coaches poll had Coastal Carolina at No. 3, Liberty at No. 23 and Charleston Southern at No. 25. It is the third time in League annals that three different members have been nationally-ranked in the same season.

THREE-AND-OUT

Coastal Carolina became the first team in Big South history to hold three consecutive opponents to three points-or-less, as the Chanticleers limited three opponents to a field goal each during Weeks 3-5 while outscoring the opposition, 109-9. The Chants have matched the League record for most times allowing no more than three points (three times), joining Charleston Southern (2002) and Liberty (2006, 2008).

TREASURE CHEST

Charleston Southern gained 617 yards of offense in Week 5 at Charlotte, its most-ever against an FCS opponent. The Bucs rushed for 333 yards against the 49ers for their second 300-yard rush game of the season and 10th during its Big South era (since 2002). CSU and Charlotte (573) combined for 1,190 yards of offense, the second-highest single-game total in League history and the most in a regular-season contest. The record is 1,212, set by Coastal Carolina (572) and Old Dominion (672) during the 2012 FCS Playoffs.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION!!

Charleston Southern and Presbyterian College both added lights to their football stadiums during the offseason. CSU won its first-ever home night game in Week 1 and finished 4-0 in its home night games this season. PC was victorious in its two night games at Bailey Memorial Stadium this year. The Blue Hose played under the lights at home for the first time since Oct. 27, 1990 against Wingate at Old Bailey Stadium. PC lost that game, 33-22.

RETURN TO SENDER

Coastal Carolina's **DEVIN BROWN** returned a kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown at North Carolina A&T in Week 2, tied for the second-longest kickoff return in League history. It was Brown's second career kickoff return TD, and he is now one of seven players in the Big South record books with multiple kickoff return touchdowns. The record for most career kickoff return TDs is three, held by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2005-08), Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (2007-10) and Liberty's **KEVIN FOGG** (2009-13).

LaQUA MAYES HAYES

Presbyterian RB **LaQUA MAYES** broke through for a 92-yard touchdown run against Bluefield in Week 2, establishing the record for longest rush from scrimmage in Big South football history. The previous record was 86 yards set by former Coastal Carolina FB and current Carolina Panther **MIKE TOLBERT** against VMI on Oct. 27, 2007.

ELIMINATING THE MIDDLE MAN

Charleston Southern LB **GABE MIDDLEBROOK** returned a fumble 85 yards for a touchdown in the Buccaneers' Week 1 win over Point. It is the fourth-longest fumble return in Big South history, and the longest in the League since Presbyterian's **BRANDON LESTON** had a 91-yard fumble return against Georgia Tech in 2012. Middlebrook's fumble return is the longest by a CSU player during the Big South's football era (since 2002). The previous longest was a 77-yard fumble return for a TD by **JADA ROSS** against Gardner-Webb in 2007.

PRESBYTERIAN KNOCKS OFF NATIONALLY-RANKED FURMAN

The Presbyterian College Blue Hose defeated No. 12/12 Furman, 10-7, in Week 3 for their first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2008 when PC downed No. 17 Liberty. Furman is now the highest-ranked team that PC has defeated at the Division I level. Presbyterian's win over the Paladins marked the second-straight season the Big South has recorded a regular-season victory over a nationally-ranked non-conference FCS opponent, and the sixth different season overall in the Big South's 13-year football history.

FLAMES WIN BIG SOUTH'S MOST RECENT CLASH OF THE TITANS

Then No. 24-Liberty defeated then-No. 25 Bryant, 38-21, in Week 4 to improve the Big South to 7-8 all-time in games involving a ranked Big South member against a ranked non-conference opponent -- including 4-4 during the regular-season. Five of the eight losses have been by seven points-or-less.

HAMMING IT UP

Charleston Southern's **DARIUS HAMMOND** returned a punt 74 yards for a touchdown vs. The Citadel in Week 4. It was the first punt return TD by a Buccaneer since **CHARLES JAMES** did it against Wesley College on Oct. 1, 2011. Hammond's 74-yard return is the longest in school history and is tied for ninth-longest in Big South history.

BIG BLUE

Presbyterian College amassed 678 yards of offense against Bluefield in Week 2, the fifth-highest single-game total in League history. The Blue Hose finished with 523 rushing yards against the Rams -- the second-most single-game total in the Conference record books. PC averaged 9.69 yards per play and 8.44 yards per rush in the victory.

FANNING THE FLAMES

Liberty set a Big South single-game record for yards per play with its 16.03 average against Brevard in Week 3. The Flames gained 625 yards on just 39 offensive plays, smashing the previous record of 10.66 (Stony Brook vs. Pace - Sept. 8, 2012). Liberty averaged 12.96 yards per rush (23 for 298) against the Tornados, breaking the League single-game mark of 11.79 yards per carry that was established by Coastal Carolina in 2006 at VMI (28 for 330).

ROSS, COOK ON INITIAL WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

For the second time in Big South history, two players opened the season as official candidates for the Walter Payton Award, as Coastal Carolina QB **ALEX ROSS** and Gardner-Webb WR **KENNY COOK** are among the initial 20 candidates for the top individual award in FCS. In 2011, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** and Flames' WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** opened the campaign among the initial candidates.

RECORD THREE PLAYERS ON BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

A record three Big South players are among the initial 20 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award, which honors the top defensive player in FCS. Coastal Carolina LB **QUINN BACKUS**, who finished seventh in the voting last year, headlines the Big South's trio. Joining him are Gardner-Webb DL **O.J. MAU** and Liberty DB **JACOB HAGEN**. The Big South is tied with the Big Sky Conference for the most Buchanan Award candidates.

TWO-POINT CONVERSION

The Big South Conference is one of two FCS Conferences (Big Sky) to have two teams -- Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb -- with both a Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Award candidate.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR THIS ONE

Coastal Carolina and Liberty will meet in the season-finale for the first time, as their Nov. 22 match-up in Conway will mark their 12th meeting. Coastal leads the series, 6-5, and the winner of the match-up has won or shared the Big South football Championship nine times. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the title in 2013, as well as 2010 and 2012.

WELCOME MAT

MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY is in its first year as an associate member in 2014. Next season, start-up program **KENNESAW STATE UNIVERSITY** begins play and associate membership in the Big South, returning the League to seven football members.

BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE

Below is the Big South's tiebreaking procedure for multiple ties (more than two teams)...

- i. Composite records between the tying teams shall be evaluated to determine if one team has won more games against the other tying teams.*
- ii. In the event step "i" does not resolve the multiple ties or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.*
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.*
- iv. Point system based on complete schedule and wins using the Sagarin rankings entering the final week of the regular-season as indicated below.*

* Charleston Southern meets Presbyterian College for the 22nd time on Saturday. The Bucs have won seven of the last eight meetings.

* Charleston Southern came up one point short from the biggest win in program history on Saturday night in a 21-20 loss at Vanderbilt. The loss was the first for head coach **JAMEY CHADWELL** in a game decided by eight points or less (9-1).

* The Buccaneers outgained the Commodores, 389-295, had a 19-11 edge in first downs, and controlled the second half.

* CSU has won its last five non-conference FCS road games, as well as its last eight non-conference FCS match-ups. The Buccaneers are 20-7 overall since a 15-game losing streak ended in 2012.

* RB **MIKE HOLLOWAY** had a career day for the Bucs at Vandy with 18 carries for 105 yards (first career 100-yd. game) and three catches for 79 yards.

* CSU outscored Vanderbilt, 7-0, in the third quarter and has now out-scored opponents 46-17 in the third period this season.

* Vanderbilt was the first team to score first against the Bucs this season.

* **LARENZO MATHIS** blocked a punt and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown. It was CSU's first blocked punt since 2011.

* RB **CHRISTIAN REYES** has 1,604 career rushing yards and needs 138 yards to become CSU's all-time leading rusher.
