HIGH POINT'S JOHN BROWN VOTED 2015-16 PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

For the third consecutive year, High Point redshirt-senior JOHN BROWN has been voted the Big South Conference Men's Basketball Preseason Player of the Year by the League's head coaches and media panel. He is the first men's player in Big South history to be named Preseason Player of the Year in three consecutive seasons. Named to the Lou Henson Preseason Player of the Year Watch List, Brown is one of 20 initial preseason candidates for the Julius Erving Award, which is given annually to the top small forward in men's college basketball. He is the only player from a mid-major program on the watch list. Brown enters the 2015-16 season as the nation's No. 3 returning scorer (1.680 career points) and the NCAA Division I active leader in field goals made (646). He is just one of two returning players nationally to have posted 1,500 points and 600 rebounds in a career. A 2014 Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American and the 2014 Big South Player of the Year, Brown was named to the NABC All-District Team in 2015 for the second-straight season, and was named a finalist for the 2015 Lou Henson Award, given to the nation's top mid-major player. Brown proved to be one of the most consistent scorers in the nation in 2014-15, as he posted at least 20 points in 15 contests, ranked ninth in the country in field goals made (242), was 26th nationally in scoring (19.3 ppg) and 32nd in field goal percentage (.550). He averaged 26.3 points, 8.3 rebounds and shot 57.4 percent in High Point's three postseason contests a year ago, and is looking to become just the second player in Big South history with FOUR First-Team All-Conference selections.

ESPNU GOING WILD FOR THE BIG SOUTH

For the third consecutive season, four regular-season Big South games will appear in ESPNU in 2015-16. The 24-hour college sports network will televise one January game and three February contests, which will be "Wildcard" selections 21 days in advance. Those four telecasts will be Thursday, Jan. 14 at 7:00pm; Thursday, Feb. 11 at 9:00pm; Thursday, Feb. 18 at 7:00pm, and Thursday, Feb. 25 at 9:00pm.

BIG SOUTH'S POWER FIVE

The Big South had six combined wins over the ACC (3), SEC (2) and Big Ten (1) in 2014-15, the first time since 2011-12 that the Big South recorded victories over the three leagues in the same season. The Big South posted three of the six wins during the opening week of the 2014-15 regular season -- a league first. Meanwhile, the Big South recorded multiple wins over both the ACC and SEC for the first time since 2010-11 when Big South programs had three SEC wins and two ACC victories. The Big South's three ACC wins last season were its most ever in a campaign.

BIG SOUTH'S 1,000-POINT CLUB

The Big South had six players surpass 1,000 career points last season, but just one active 1,000-point scorer returns in 2015-16—High Point's **JOHN BROWN** at 1,680. He is 320 points away from becoming the ninth player in league history with 2,000 career points. Meanwhile, below is a look at the current returning players closing in on the milestone:

CLIFF NOTES

Coastal Carolina head coach **CLIFF ELLIS** enters the 2015-16 season as the third-active winningest coach in Division I with 770 career victories. Ellis, who is eight wins shy of 700 Division I wins, is 19th all-time in NCAA history for career wins (regardless of affiliation with a minimum 10 head coaching seasons at NCAA schools), and is the seventh-active winningest coach across all NCAA classifications. He became the first head coach in NCAA history with 150 wins at four different Division I programs with the Chanticleers' 68-56 victory over UNC Asheville on Feb. 3, 2015. His Division I school-by-school breakdown is as follows: South Alabama - 171, Clemson - 177, Auburn - 186, Coastal Carolina - 158, in addition to 78 wins during his three seasons leading Cumberland College from 1972-75.

BIG BROWN

High Point redshirt-junior JOHN BROWN is the fourth player in Big South history with 1,600 points (1,680), 600 rebounds (602), 100 blocked shots (118), 100 steals (134) and 100 assists (118). He will likely become just the second player with 2,000 points, 800 rebounds, 150 steals, 100 blocked shots and 100 assists by the end of the 2015-16 campaign. VMI's STAN OKOYE is the only Big South player with those benchmarks.

HE'S CRAFTY

Gardner-Webb third-year head coach TIM CRAFT won 38 games in his first two seasons in Boiling Springs, tied for the third-most wins by a Big South head coach in his first two seasons in the league, joining JEFF MEYER (Liberty) and MIKE DEMENT (UNC Greensboro) with that total. The record is 42 (TOMMY GAITHER - Charleston Southern and GREGG MARSHALL - Winthrop), followed by 39 wins (TERRY TRUAX - Towson State and RITCHIE McKAY - Liberty).

BIG SOUTH'S POSTSEASON PARADE FEATURED RECORD FIVE BERTHS

A record five Big South men's basketball teams played in the postseason in 2015 -- the second consecutive year the league was represented in the four national postseason events. COASTAL CARO-LINA received the Big South's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, while CHARLESTON SOUTHERN made the conference's sixth NIT appearance. HIGH POINT accepted an invitation to participate in the Collegeinsider.com Tournament (CIT), marking the sixth time the Big South played in that event. GARDNER-WEBB and RADFORD were the league's second and third entrants into the College Basketball Invitational (CBI). It was the Highlanders' second-straight postseason berth, as RU went 1-1 in the CBI in 2014. The Buccaneers and Runnin' Bulldogs were in the postseason for the second time in three seasons. Overall, it was the third consecutive season that the Big South had at least four postseason participants and eighth-straight year with multiple berths.

RADFORD MAKES HISTORY AS LEAGUE PICKS UP TWO POSTSEASON WINS

Radford became the first program in Big South history with wins in back-to-back postseason appearances following the Highlanders' 78-57 win at Delaware State in the first round of the 2015 CBI. Meanwhile, High Point collected its first-ever Division I postseason victory with its 70-64 win over Maryland-Eastern Shore in the first round of the CIT. The Panthers' victory marked the third time the Big South advanced to the CIT second round in six all-time appearances.

HIGH MARKS FOR HIGH POINT

High Point was just the third Big South program to win 12 conference games in three consecutive seasons in 2014-15. The first was Winthrop from 2004-07, followed by Coastal Carolina from 2009-12. Meanwhile, the Panthers have made three consecutive postseason appearances -- the first Big South member with the trifecta since Coastal Carolina in 2010-11-12, and the fourth overall time a league program has appeared in the postseason three straight years.

COASTAL CAROLINA WENT DANCING FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR

Two-time defending Big South champion Coastal Carolina made its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and fourth overall trip to the Big Dance in 2015, which is second-most in Big South history. The Chanticleers were the league's first back-to-back auto bid recipients since UNC Asheville in 2011 and 2012, and just the third different Big South program with consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, joining Asheville and Winthrop (1999-02 and 2005-08). Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina embarked on its fifth postseason berth in six seasons, as CCU participated in the NIT in 2010 and 2011, the CIT in 2012 and the NCAAs in 2014.

4 X 20

The Big South Conference had four 20-win teams last season for the second time in league history, which first occurred in 2013-14. It was also the first time four teams had 20 wins following the Conference Tournament and entering NCAA postseason play. Three of the squads (HPU, RAD, CCU) won 20 regular-season games -- a first in league history. Coastal Carolina finished with a league-high 24 victories -- the most in the Big South since UNC Asheville had the same total in 2011-12. High Point ended at 23 wins, its most at the Division I level, while Radford won 22-- giving the Highlanders back-to-back 20win seasons for the first time since 1997-99. GWU concluded the season with 20 victories, its second 20-win campaign in three years.

HISTORY MADE IN 2015 BIG SOUTH TOURNAMENT

Last March, Longwood was the first No. 9 seed to defeat the No. 1 seed in the Big South Tournament as well as the first No. 9 seed to reach the Semifinals. The No. 1 seed lost in the Quarterfinals for just the third time in the 30-year history of the Big South Tournament, and the No. 1 and 2 seeds were eliminated in the Quarterfinals for the first time ever. Winthrop was just the second No. 5 seed to appear in the Championship game, while Coastal Carolina was the first No. 3 seed to win the title since 2011.
