Lightbourne netted a career-high 18 points to lead Liberty to a two-point victory over preseason favorite Birmingham-Southern last Monday, then bettered the performance with a career-best 27 points in a Conference road victory at Coastal Carolina Saturday. Lightbourne tallied six rebounds while hitting 7-of-10 from the line against the Panthers, then went 9-of-13 from the floor (=.692), hauled in eight boards and blocked three shots against the Chants, helping LU win its first two Big South games of the year. For the week, Lightbourne averaged 22.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, .609 FG (14-of-23), .750 3FG (3-of-4) and .636 from the line (14-of-22).

Gaynor was Winthrop's floor general in the Eagles' two Big South wins last week. He scored eight points, handed out seven assists and had four steals in Winthrop's 78-70 win at UNC Asheville, then posted eight points, eight assists, five rebounds and three steals in the Eagles' 74-54 win over Radford Saturday. For the week, Gaynor finished at 8.0 points, 7.5 assists, 3.5 steals and 3.0 rebounds, while shooting .571 from three-point range (4-of-7) and .429 from the field overall (6-of-14).

FOUR-AND-OH-MY

Charleston Southern, which was predicted to finish last in the Big South's preseason poll, has jumped out to a 4-0 start in Conference play and sole possession of first place in the League. The Bucs are off to their best Big South start since 1986-87, when CSU opened 10-0 in League play before finishing 12-2. Charleston Southern, at 7-7 for the season, has already surpassed last year's win total in both the Big South (3) and overall (6). The last Big South team to open 4-0 was UNC Asheville in 2001-02, when the Bulldogs started the Conference slate 5-0.

KURTIS RICE SPARKING BUCS' RISE TO THE TOP

In the Bucs' first four Conference games, senior forward **KURTIS RICE** is averaging 16.8 points (4th in Conference games), 8.0 rebounds (1st), .703 from the floor on 26-of-37 FG (1st) and .800 from the line. He has led the Bucs in scoring and rebounding in three of those games, including 23 points and nine rebounds in CSU's 76-74 win over High Point this past Saturday. Overall, Rice has dramatically improved upon his season averages from a year ago, as he is hitting .537 FG (up from .528 in '03-04), .750 FT (up from .642), 7.1 rebounds (up from 5.1) and 13.9 points (up from 13.1). Furthermore, in his last seven appearances, Rice is averaging 17.3 points (121), 7.4 rebounds (52), .649 FG (48-of-74), .857 3FG (6-of-7) and .792 FT (19-of-24).

LAST WEEKEND FEATURED THIRD SUCH 3-0 MATCH-UP

When 3-0 High Point visited 3-0 Charleston Southern this past Saturday, it marked the first time since 2000-01 and third time in Conference history that two teams at least 3-0 in League play faced each other. In '00-01, UNC Asheville and Radford were both 3-0 when they went head-to-head, while UNCA (5-0) faced 3-0 Coastal Carolina in 1996-97. UNCA won both affairs and started 5-0 and 7-0, respectively, in the Conference.

Coastal Carolina guard **PELE PAELAY** is one of eight players nationally to rank in his Conference's top 10 in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. The chart below details the rankings and season averages through games of Jan. 16:

GATHINGS TRACKER

High Point senior **DANNY GATHINGS** is the lone active member of the Big South's 1,000-point, 500-rebound club, and 33rd member overall. His 538 boards in a High Point uniform are 29th in Conference history and is four caroms away from supplanting **RON SHELburne** (Radford) for 28th place. Gathings' 1,162 points in the Big South are 45th and trail **STEPHEN BARBER** (Radford) by eight points for the 44th spot. Meanwhile, Gathings is looking to become the 25th player to record 600 rebounds and 11th player to score 1,300 points and grab 600 rebounds in the Big South.

GROUND GAYN-OR

Winthrop freshman guard **CHRIS GAYNOR** leads the League with 6.25 assists in Conference games, and is second with 4.65 overall for the 2004-05 season. Gaynor has been Winthrop's assist leader in 12 games (a League-high), averaging 5.8 helpers in such contests, while WU has gone 9-3 when he leads the team in that category. In addition, Gaynor has recorded at least six assists in a game a Big South-best six times, and the Eagles are 6-0 when reaches that benchmark.

MILESTONE WATCH

Coastal's **PELE PAELAY** surpassed 500 career points and 200 career rebounds in CCU's 79-68 win at VMI last Monday. Paelay scored 38 points against the Keydets, which was the sixth-highest single-game scoring output in school history. In Saturday's game against Coastal Carolina, Liberty sophomore **LARRY BLAIR** scored 15 points to reach 700 in his career. Meanwhile, Radford's **WHIT HOL-COMB-FAYE** is 15 assists away from 300, while WU's **BILLY HOUSTON** is nine blocked shots from 100.

HIGH POINTS

High Point has won all eight games this season by at least 13 points, while its +11.8 scoring margin in Conference games is tops in the Big South. The Panthers are averaging 81.0 points in Big South contests, and their 92 points last week against UNC Asheville set a school record for most points scored against a Division I opponent in a non-overtime game since HPU joined the League in 1998.

MARSHALL PLAN

With his 12 wins already this season, Winthrop head coach **GREGG MARSHALL** has 127 career wins and is one victory away from tying **BILLY LEE** (128) for fourth on the Big South's all-time win list. Marshall, who is the only coach to lead his team to five-straight, 10-win seasons in Conference play, owns a 127-69 (=.648) overall record and 65-21 (=.756) mark in Big South games. Marshall is also one of four Big South coaches to string together at least 10 wins in seven straight campaigns.

STILL GOING

Birmingham-Southern 6-9 junior forward **THOMAS VIGLIANCO** continues to lead the Big South in three-point field goal percentage (.500), and is 0.1 off the rebounding lead at 7.0 per game. If he continues his shooting prowess, Viglianco will be the first Big South player since Liberty's **MATT HILDEBRAND** in 1991-92 to connect on .500-or-better from the beyond the arc.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-POINT SCORERS

UNC Asheville's **BRYAN McCULLOUGH** became the latest member of the Big South's 1,000-point club when he reached the milestone this past Saturday against VMI. The Conference now has three active 1,000-point scorers as League members, and four overall when Birmingham-Southern's **JAKOB SIGURDARSON** is added to the mix. FRESHMAN 15??

VMI freshman forward **REGGIE WILLIAMS** and Coastal frosh **JACK LEASURE** -- the top two scoring freshman in the Big South -- went head-to-head last week, and both showed why they've each earned New Balance Freshman of the Week honors three times this season. Williams paced VMI with 23 points and eight rebounds, while Leasure scored 15 points and drained three 3-pointers. To date, Williams is fourth in the Conference with 15.7 points per game, and has scored 20 points in a game three times this season. Leasure is 13th in scoring at 13.0, is fifth in three-point shooting at .436 (44-of-101) and was 29th nationally in the latter through games of Jan. 10.

WINTHROP FLYING HIGH, FIRST TEAM TO REACH 10 WINS

Winthrop's 75-73 overtime win over Liberty Jan. 8 was its 10th win in 15 games, the best start during head coach **GREGG MARSHALL**'s seven seasons and the best by a WU squad since the 1989-90 team opened 10-3. Winthrop also is the third-fastest Big South member to reach 10 wins in the last 10 years. The 1999-00 Liberty Flames reached 10 wins after 13 games, while the 1996-97 Flames and 2003-04 Birmingham-Southern and High Point squads each won its 10th game after 14 dates.
