#### WINTHROP CAPTURES BIG SOUTH TOURNAMENT TITLE, NCAA AUTOMATIC BID

The Winthrop Eagles defeated No. 8 seed Coastal Carolina in the quarterfinals, No. 4 seed Birmingham-Southern in the semifinals and No. 7 seed Charleston Southern in the title game to win the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Men's Basketball Championship and receive the Big South's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. It is Winthrop's fifth Tournament title in seven years -- all under head coach **GREGG MARSHALL**'s tenure. The Eagles, which will make their first NCAA appearance since 2002, extended their Conference record for Tournament Championships to six. It also is the third time that Winthrop has won the outright regular-season crown and Tournament title in the same season (1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons).

### WINTHROP SETS BIG SOUTH WIN RECORD; OWNS 2ND LONGEST WIN STREAK IN NATION

The Winthrop Eagles enter the 2005 NCAA Tournament with a Big South-record 27-5 won/loss mark. The 27 wins surpassed the League's previous high of 24, set by Coastal Carolina in 1990-91. Winthrop, which already is the first Big South team to post five 20-win seasons, will carry an 18-game winning streak into the NCAAs, currently the second-longest behind Pacific's 21-game winning streak.

#### PAELAY, LEASURE, MARSHALL RECEIVE TOP LEAGUE AWARDS

Coastal Carolina junior guard PELE PAELAY was voted Big South Player of the Year by the League's head coaches, sports information directors and media panel. The panel also voted Chanticleer guard JACK LEASURE Freshman of the Year and GREGG MARSHALL as Coach of the Year. Paelay is the first Coastal player since TORREY BUTLER in 2002-03 to be named Player of the Year, marking the eighth time a CCU player has won the award. Leasure is the first CCU frosh since STEVE MILES in 1998-99 to win the rookie/freshman honor and is the fourth Chanticleer overall. Marshall captured his third Coach of the Year honor, tying RUSS BERGMAN's Big South record. Meanwhile, it is just the second time in Conference history that one school won Player and Rookie/Freshman of the Year honors in the same season. Coastal Carolina and Big South Hall of Famer TONY DUNKIN was honored as both League Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year in 1989-90.

### WINTHROP RECEIVES VOTES IN ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK

Following the conclusion of the regular-season Feb. 26, Winthrop received one vote in the Feb. 28-March 6 Associated Press poll, its first vote ever in the AP's weekly poll. This week, the Eagles have garnered two votes in the AP poll. Meanwhile, Winthrop remains in the No. 9 spot in Collegeinsider.com's Mid-Major Top 25 poll. The news agency also named Winthrop's JAMES SHULER and head coach GREGG MARSHALL as its choices for Big South Player and Coach of the Year. ### CHARLESTON SOUTHERN'S MEMORABLE RUN

The Buccaneers, predicted to finish last in the Big South standings in 2004-05, made a surprise run to the title game of the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Basketball Championship as a No. 7 seed. CSU, which tied for fourth place in the League at 7-9, more than doubled its Conference win total from '03-04. In the Tournament, the Bucs upset No. 2 seed Liberty, 66-60 in Lynchburg, followed by a 58-55 win at No. 6 seed High Point in the semifinals. The magic ran out against Winthrop in the Championship game. Charleston Southern ends the season with 13 wins, its second-most in eight years. **KURTIS RICE** averaged 20.0 points and .649 from the field in the three Tournament games to earn a spot on the All-Tournament team.

#### VMI REASSIGNS HEAD COACH BART BELLAIRS

VMI announced Feb. 28 that head basketball coach **BART BELLAIRS** has been reassigned to other duties within the athletic department. The Keydets concluded the regular season with a 9-18 overall record and failed to qualify for the Big South Tournament after posting a 3-13 mark in Conference play. Bellairs directed the VMI basketball program for 11 years and compiled a 116-191 record. He held the post longer than all but one previous head basketball coach at the Institute and attained more career wins than any other hoops coach. The Big South's last coaching change occurred after the 2002-03 season (High Point).

#### **BIG SOUTH NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY**

The Big South Conference first secured an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament in 1992, sending its postseason tournament champion to the Big Dance every year, with the exception of 1995.

Winthrop, which extends its Big South record for NCAA Tournament appearances with five, garnered the League's highest seed with a No. 14 seed in 2000. Below is a look at the Conference's NCAA Tournament history:

#### FIT TO BE TIED

For the first time in Conference history, the Big South had five teams tie in the final standings. Birmingham-Southern, Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina, High Point and Radford all finished 7-9 in League play. The League's previous logjam was three teams tied for the same position, which happened in: 1991-92 (6-8), 1995-96 (9-5), 1999-00 (7-7) and 2002-03 (8-6). In addition, the Conference had at least eight teams win seven Conference games for the first time in League history.

#### **HOMEWARD BOUND**

Winthrop finished its entire home schedule a perfect 16-0 -- 13-0 in the regular-season and 3-0 in the Advance Auto Parts Basketball Championship. The Eagles are the first Big South squad since Radford in 2000-01 to go undefeated at home in a single-season, but the Highlanders did not have the task of playing Conference Tournament games at home that season.

#### TRIPLE-DECKER

Coastal Carolina freshman **JACK LEASURE** nailed 5-of-7 three-point attempts in CCU's quarterfinal loss to Winthrop, ending the season with seven games with at least five three-pointers. He also extended his Conference-leading three-point field goal streak to 21 straight games, the longest in the League this season and one that will carry over into the 2005-06 season. Leasure, who recorded a three-point bucket in 28 of his 29 appearances this season, hit 63-of-153 three-point attempts in the 21-game stretch, averaging 3.00 per game.

#### MARSHALL 2ND WINNINGEST COACH IN BIG SOUTH HISTORY

Winthrop coach **GREGG MARSHALL**, who has led his squad to four 20-win seasons during his seven years and is the only Big South coach ever to record seven-straight 15-win seasons, is second on the League's all-time Conference Games win chart with 77 wins. His .786 winning percentage in League contests is a Big South record. Marshall, who is third on the League's all-time overall win chart with 142 overall wins, trails former Radford coach **RON BRADLEY** in Conference wins.

#### EAGLES ON VERGE OF SETTING BIG SOUTH'S DEFENSIVE STANDARD

Winthrop's 59.0 scoring defense average ranks 11th in the country and is well ahead of the Big South record of 61.6 points allowed, set by the 1987-88 Eagles. Winthrop's upcoming NCAA Tournament opponent would have to score 145 points in the next game to push the current 59.0 average to the 61.6 mark. The Eagles have led the Conference in scoring defense every season since **GREGG MAR-SHALL** became coach in 1998-99. In that span, Winthrop's previous lowest average was 61.8 points allowed in 2000-01.

### **HIGH POINTS**

High Point finished the season as the Big South's top scoring team in overall games (74.5) and Conference games (76.7). It is the first time the Panthers led the Big South in scoring offense, and marks the third straight year the reigning team scoring champion failed to lead the next season. Last season, Birmingham-Southern was the Big South's top scoring team at 75.0. Radford was the last squad to lead in scoring in consecutive seasons (2000-01 and 2001-02).

## WINTHROP LOOKING TO STAY ATOP LEAGUE CHARTS IN TWO CATEGORIES

The Eagles enter the NCAA Tournament first in the Big South in field goal percentage (.448) and in three-point field goal percentage (.363). Winthrop is .003 percentage points ahead of Birmingham-Southern in field goal shooting and .003 ahead of Coastal Carolina in three-point accuracy. Winthrop has led the Big South in field goal shooting three previous times, the last coming in 1989-90, but has never been the top three-point shooting team in the Big South. If the Eagles can maintain their averages and finish atop both charts, it would mark the second-straight year that one team led the Big South in field goal shooting and three-point shooting in the same season.

### LEASURE ENTERS COASTAL'S RECORD BOOKS

Coastal Carolina freshman and Big South Freshman of the Year JACK LEASURE finished his first season of college basketball with 420 points, breaking the school record for points scored by a frosh. TONY DUNKIN held the previous mark of 416 points in 1989-90. Leasure also shattered the CCU mark for three-pointers by a freshman with 85. The previous high was 61 by LEE GRANT in 1995-96. His 85 treys also are fifth-most in a season by a Coastal player.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

UNC Asheville's C.J. WALKER led the Big South in blocked shots for the second-straight season, swatting away an average of 2.62 shots per game. He is the first player to lead the League in blocks in consecutive seasons since UNCA's ADAM EARNHARDT. Earnhardt was the Big South's top blocker three straight years from 1998-01. The Bulldogs have had a player lead the Conference in blocked shots per game a record seven times.

### NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

#### **BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN**

The Panthers finished the season with a 16-14 overall record and 7-4 home mark ... JAKOB SIGUR-DARSON finished 5th in the League in overall scoring at 15.3 and was sixth in Conference games only at 15.7. Sigurdarson departs Birmingham-Southern as the school's fourth all-time leading scorer with 1,468 career points, 858 of which came in his two years in the Big South. Sigurdarson was also the Conference's top free throw shooter at .824 percent ... Head coach DUANE REBOUL will enter the 2005-06 season 17 wins shy of 400 in his career.

#### CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

The Buccaneers finished with 13 wins, the second-most since the 1996-97 season and the most since winning 14 in 2002-03 ... **KURTIS RICE** ranked 3rd in the Big South in field goal shooting at .507, and tied for 4th in rebounding with 6.3 per game. He also placed in the League's top 10 in scoring with 12.8 points per night ... **TERRELL BROWN** was second in the Big South with 2.50 three-pointers per game and 5th in three-point percentage at .378 ... The Bucs were 3rd in the Big South in scoring defense in both overall games (63.8) and Conference tilts (63.6).

#### **COASTAL CAROLINA**

**PELE PAELAY** was the first Coastal player to lead the League in overall scoring since **TORREY BUT-LER** in 2000-01. Paelay also finished first in steals (2.41) and became the first player in Big South history to lead the League in scoring and steals in the same season. The last Chanticleer to pace the Big South in steals was **RODNEY DUPRE**' in 1997-98 ... **JACK LEASURE** was 7th in the Big South in scoring at 14.5, but averaged 15.8 points in Conference play ... Coastal Carolina and Liberty were the only schools to have two players finish in the top 10 in scoring in 2004-05.

#### **HIGH POINT**

**DANNY GATHINGS** ends his career 30th on the Big South's all-time scoring chart and 25th on the rebound list with 597. He also ranks 5th all-time in rebounding average at 7.4 ... Freshman **ARIZONA REID** closed out the regular-season averaging 8.9 points, 6.8 rebounds and .528 from the floor (38-of-72) in the Panthers' nine February games ... **ZIONE WHITE**'s steal and dunk in the semifinal game against CSU was among "SportsCenter's" top 10 plays Thursday, March 3.

#### LIBERTY

The Flames fell in the quarterfinal round of the Big South Tournament for the first time during **RANDY DUNTON**'s four seasons as coach ... **DAVID DEES** led the Big South in Conference Games Only scoring at 19.2, while ranking third overall with 16.2 points ... Dees and **LARRY BLAIR** finished No. 2 and No. 3 in the League in scoring, marking the second time in the last three seasons one school placed two players in the top three in scoring ... **LEO LIGHTBOURNE** grabbed a League-high 8.1 rebounds in Conference games.

### **RADFORD**

CHRIS OLIVER tied for the Conference lead in rebounding with 7.0 per game, becoming the first Radford player since AUDREY SAVTCHENKO in 2000-01 and second overall to rank first in the category. Oliver also ranked sixth in the League in scoring at 14.9 ... Radford's .707 free throw percentage was second in the Big South and was the High's highest average since shooting .711 from the line in 1996-97 ... Radford finished 12-16 overall and 7-9 in the Big South for the second-straight year.

## **UNC ASHEVILLE**

The Bulldogs were the Big South's second-highest scoring team this season with a 71.2 per game average. UNCA also averaged a League-high 15.11 assists ... K.J. GARLAND handed out a League-leading 5.19 assists in Conference games ... BRYAN McCULLOUGH finished among the leaders in scoring (8th - 13.5), rebounding (T-17th - 4.6), assists (10th - 2.82) and steals (7th - 1.61) ... CHAD MOHN was 3rd in Conference Games Only rebounding with 6.1 per game.

#### VMI

**REGGIE WILLIAMS** finished as the League's top scoring freshman overall (15.5) and in Conference Games (16.0) ... **MATT COWARD**'s 4.89 assists per game paced the overall leaders, marking the second-straight year VMI has had the top assist person ... The Keydets ended the season on a 4-3 note, and finished as the Conference's top defender against the three-point shot (.313).

#### WINTHROP

Winthrop is currently the Big South's leader in eight statistical categories: scoring defense (59.0), scoring margin (+9.2), field goal percentage (.448), field goal defense (.396), three-point percentage (.363), rebounding margin (+3.4), turnover margin (+1.38) and assist/turnover ratio (1.02).
