Fasnacht helped the Lady Flames to a pair of victories over William & Mary and American last week. Against the Tribe, she posted a career-high 10 points, while adding three rebounds and three assists. Fasnacht also chipped in two points against the Eagles. On the week, she averaged 6.0 points and 1.5 steals per game, while shooting .439 from the floor and 83.3 percent from the free throw line.



#### **DECEMBER MAKERS**

The end of 2004 proved to be good for several Big South Squads, with UNC Asheville closing the month of December with a mark 6-1, including wins over Southern Conference foes Wofford and Western Carolina and intrastate rival North Carolina A&T. Liberty wrapped up December at 5-2 and grabbed significant wins over then-No. 17 Kansas State, Tennessee State and William & Mary. Radford and High Point have began the New Year with a bang as both teams have gotten back on the winning track. The Highs notched their first road win of the season at Norfolk State and the Panthers toppled Appalachian State, both on Jan. 2.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

Liberty is once again clogging up the lane as the Lady Flames are averaging a Big South best 4.7 blocks per game, led by all-American KATIE FEENSTRA's 2.8 blocks per game. At American, the Lady Flames recorded a season-high 11 blocks, with Feenstra collecting seven. Following Feenstra is Charleston Southern's SHAUNTE SMALL, who is collecting 1.56 blocks per game, while Coastal Carolina's KIM TURNER has 1.5 per contest.

#### A ROUND OF APPLAUSE

UNC Asheville recently got a boost back in its line-up as **ANDREA CLAPP** returned from an injury to scored double-figures in all four games back. In the last four games, Clapp is averaging 12.2 points and is shooting 48.8 percent from the floor, including 9-of-11 from the charity stripe. On Monday, Clapp was one rebound shy of her first double-double of the season, as she collected 10 points and nine rebounds at Tennessee State.

#### **FEENSTRA WATCH**

Liberty senior All-American **KATIE FEENSTRA** is quickly climbing the Big South record books this season, and could become just the third Big South women's player to amass 1,500 points and 800 rebounds in her career, having tallied 1,276 points and 702 rebounds. So far this season, Feenstra is first in FG percentage (.687), second in rebounding (9.1) and second in scoring (16.1). She has also tallied two double-doubles, while scoring in double-digits on seven occasions.

#### KATIE WHO?

Don't think that Liberty's **KATIE FEENSTRA** is the only Katie making an impact on Big South hoops this season. High Point's **KATIE O'DELL** is the only League player average a double-double, pouring out 18.5 points and 10.2 rebounds through eight contests. She is 1st in the League in scoring, rebounding and free-throw percentage, while 8th in 3FG percentage and 10th in FG percentage. She has scored double figures in seven of eight games played this season.

#### **3-POINT OUEENS**

Winthrop's **GENE'T MOORE** has connected on a League-leading 26 treys in nine games for the Eagles this season, putting WU in the 35th spot nationally in three-pointers per contest. Not too far behind Moore are Birmingham-Southern's **STACY ANTHONY** with 22 and Liberty's **KRISTAL THARP** with 18. Anthony currently ranks 29th nationally with 2.44 3-point FG per game. The Big South record for three-pointers in a season is 91, set by Elon's **LORETTA LAWSON** during the 1999-00 season.

#### **TAG TEAM**

In what might be the trend for High Point women's hoops this season, KATIE O'DELL and CHARLENA MARTIN have scored in double figures in the same game five times this season, with the feat happening twice in Week Three. Martin had 11 points, while O'Dell added 10 vs. UT-Chattanooga Dec. 6, while they both tallied 17 points against Longwood Dec. 9. The duo also became the first pair of teammates to score 20 or more points in the same game, with O'Dell pouring in 27 points and Martin 24 against Western Carolina, Dec 1. O'Dell and Martin have combined to make up 46 percent (293 points) of the Panthers' offense this season.

#### DEJA VU?

When the Lady Flames fell to the Hokies of Virginia Tech Dec. 7, it marked the second time in school history that Liberty beat a Top-25 team and then lost to Virginia Tech the next home game, as Liberty defeated No. 17 Kansas State, 77-56, prior to facing to the Hokies. The first time it happened came back on November 26, 2002, as the Lady Flames beat No. 25 Virginia, 77-69, in overtime and then fell to the Hokies, 50-53, in the Vines Center.

#### 100+

Coastal Carolina head coach **ALAN LEFORCE** earned his 100th victory at Coastal Carolina with a 51-47 win over UNC Wilmington, Nov. 30. He is just the fifth Big South coach to reach the century mark, and is the only coach in Division I to win 100 games in both men's and women's basketball. LeForce is the winningest head coach in Coastal women's basketball history with a record of 101-107, surpassing former Chanticleer head coach **GINA MARKLAND** last season.

#### CAN I HAVE THE UPSET SPECIAL?

Liberty snapped No. 17 Kansas State's 35-game home winning streak Dec. 4 and picked up the biggest win in the history of the program, downing the Wildcats, 77-56, to win the 10th Annual Commerce Bank Wildcat Tournament over the weekend. The win marked just the second time in school history that the Lady Flames' have knocked off a ranked opponent, as LU defeated No. 25 Virginia, 77-69, in overtime at the Vines Center during the 2002-03 season.

#### THREE-POINT PLAY

For the third year in a row, the Big South Conference will be changing up the format for the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Women's Basketball Championship, this time to accommodate television coverage. This year, the four first-round games will be played on the campus of the higher-seeded teams. The teams that advance will play the two Semifinal games and Championship game at the site of the Big South regular-season champion. The opening round of this year's Conference tournament will be held on Tuesday, Mar. 8, with the Semifinals following on Friday, Mar. 11. The Championship Game will be played on Saturday, Mar. 12 at 2:00pm. Last season, each round of the Conference tournament was played at the campus of the higher-seeded team, while in 2003, the first rounds were played on campus sites, with a "final four" played in Lynchburg, Va.

#### NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

#### **BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN**

The Panthers played their third-straight road game last week, traveling to take on McNeese State and coming away with their third win of the season. Junior STACEY ANTHONY was key for the BSC victory, pouring in a season-high 21 points on 8-of-15 shooting and leading the squad with eight rebounds. Prior to that game, the Panthers played at South Carolina, Dec. 20. In that game, sophomore MUNECA OLIVER earned her first start of the season and grabbed a career-high seven steals.

#### CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

Junior ERICA MCCOY led the Lady Bucs to victory in the only game this week, scoring 20 points, including a perfect 8-8 from the free throw line. Senior LAKESHIA BRYANT dropped in nine of her own, and led the Lady bucs with eight rebounds. As a team, the Lady Bucs missed only one free throw in 19 attempts in the game.

#### **COASTAL CAROLINA**

Junior JASMINE TYLER has scored in double figures in her last four games, including an 11-point, five-rebound performance against Campbell Dec. 30. Tyler leads the team with six double-figure scoring efforts and had a career-high 15 points against UNC Wilmington Nov. 30. Coastal will have two games this week before taking 10 days off in which it will open the Big South schedule. The Lady Chanticleers host Coker College Wednesday, Jan. 5, at 5 p.m.

#### HIGH POINT

After losing seven-straight games on the road, High Point got back on track with a 63-61 win over in-state rival Appalachian State Sunday afternoon. The Panthers rallied from an eight-point secondhalf deficit to improve to 3-7 on the season. HPU will host Pfeiffer on Tuesday in the Millis Center at 7:00 pm.

#### **LIBERTY**

The Lady Flames have been lighting up the nets as of late, shooting a season-high 56.5 percent (35-62) from the floor against Norfolk State and following that performance up by shooting 55.6 percent (24-45) against William & Mary. DAINA STAUGAITIENE recorded her first career double-double this past week at American University as she collected a career-high 19 points and 10 boards to lead the Lady Flames past the Eagles, 61-49.

#### **RADFORD**

Radford's 72-56 victory over Western Carolina ended a streak of 12 games in which the Highlanders had scored less than 60 points, dating back to last season. RU has not allowed a team to score 70 points this season. It has allowed only three opponents to score 70+ points in its last 27 games, one in the last 19. The Highs have held opponents to under 60 in 13 of those 27 games. Radford shot a school record low 19.3 percent in a loss at Memphis and hit just 11 field goals, tying them for a school low. The Highlanders had seven blocks against Western Carolina, their most since they had nine at Winthrop on Jan. 11, 2003.

## **UNC ASHEVILLE**

The Bulldogs have won six of its last seven games. ANDREA CLAPP returned from a shoulder injury and scored in double-figures in all three games back. In the last three games, Clapp is averaging 13 points and is shooting 50 percent from the floor. KRYSTAL HOOD continues to lead the Bulldogs in scoring at 14.5 points per game. Asheville went 6-1 in December including five straight home wins. The Bulldogs play at Tennessee State on Monday and will then take 12 days off before opening Big South play at Birmingham-Southern on Jan. 15.

#### WINTHROP

Winthrop, the top three-point shooting team in the Big South for most of the season, has struggled from beyond the arc over the past two games. The Lady Eagles have shot a combined 6-24 (.200). Winthrop was only 1-for-9 in the road win at Tennessee State and 5-15 in the loss to Alabama A&M. The win at Tennessee State ended an 18-game road losing streak for the Lady Eagles. The previous road win came at the end of the 2002-03 season at UNC Asheville 64-62.
