CHOICE HOTELS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Katie Feenstra • Senior C • Liberty Grand Rapids, Mich.

Feenstra led the way this past week for the Lady Flames, as the senior All-American posted back-to-back double-doubles against Lovola (Md.) and No. 9 Ohio State. Against Greyhounds, she posted a season-best 33 points and 17 rebounds, including knocking down 13-of-14 shots from the charity stripe. She then recorded 17 points and 11 boards versus the Buckeyes, while holding OSU's leading score and rebounder, Jessica Davenport who averages 18.0 points and 8.0 rebounds - to just one field goal and six points. For the week, Feenstra averaged 25.0 points, 12.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game, while shooting 65.4 (17-of-26) from the field and 88.9 (16-of-18) from the free throw line.

NEW BALANCE FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Corrie Fertitta Forward • Radford Roanoke, Va.

Fertitta tossed in 12 points, going 3-of-4 from three-point land, grabbed seven boards and had three steals and a block vs. Navy. She also tallied five points, two rebounds, one steal, one block and one assist at Norfolk State. For the week. Fertitta averaged 8.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals, 1.0 blocks and 1.0 assists.

CONFERENCE START-UP

The 2004-05 Big South women's basketball season starts up this weekend, with all eight schools in action on Saturday. High Point (4-8) will travel to Winthrop (2-11) in Bud Childers' first League contest as the head coach of the Eagles. UNC Asheville (7-5) heads to Birmingham-Southern (3-7) riding a three-game winning streak, while the Panthers have won just one of their last four games. Defending League champion Liberty (7-5) will take on Coastal Carolina (4-7) in the Vines Center, while Charleston Southern (5-7) and Radford (4-7) will face off at the Dedmon Center in a rematch of last year's Big South Championship quarterfinal contest.

30-SECOND TIMEOUT

Ten Big South players are averaging double figures in scoring so far this season, with LU's KATIE FEENSTRA (17.9) and HPU's KATIE O'DELL (17.2) at the 1 and 2 spot ... All five preseason all-conference members are among the top-eight in scoring ... UNC Asheville owns a Conference -best 5-1 home record and will look to push it to six victories when Liberty comes to town Jan. 22 ... Liberty is the lone Conference team with a winning record on the road at 4-3 ... UNCA's LINDSEY ROCHE is the only Big South player shooting over .400 percent from three-point range, having connected on 12-of-25 (.480) treys in 12 games ... Feenstra has tallied 30 blocks in 11 games. The next closest player is Coastal's KIM TURNER with 15 ... After starting the season at 1-7, Radford has bounced back to win three -straight games and can push it to four with a win tonight against IPFW ... BSC's STACEY ANTHONY currently leads the Conference with 2.40 3-point field goals made per contest. A Birmingham-Southern player has never led the Conference in that category.

DOUBLE VISION

Last week, four double-doubles were recorded last week by three different Big South players. LU's KATIE FEENSTRA tallied two back-to-back double-double performances, grabbing 33 points and 17 rebounds against Loyola (Md.) and followed that up with 17 points and 11 boards at No. 9 Ohio State. High Point's KATIE O'DELL put together 11 points and 12 rebounds at UNLV Saturday, while Charleston Southern's ERICA MCCOY recorded her first double-double of the season (15 points, 10 rebounds) vs. Savannah State. Coastal Carolina's KIM TURNER and Radford's TARYN CAUSEY created their own double-doubles last week, putting together back-to-back 20+ scoring performances. Turner scored 22 points at South Carolina State Jan. 3 and 26 points vs. Coker Jan. 5, while Causey tallied 22 points at Norfolk State Jan. 3 and 26 points against Navy Jan. 5.

PAINT BY NUMBERS

Despite falling on the road to No. 9 Ohio State, 66-51, Liberty managed to become the only OSU opponent to outscore the Buckeyes 28-18 in the paint. The Lady Flames also held Ohio State to a season-low .385 (20-52) from the floor. It was the first time this season the Buckeyes shot below 40 percent from the field. KATIE FEENSTRA was given the difficult task of defending OSU's leading scorer and rebounder, Jessica Davenport, and allowed only one field goal and six points.

FEAT-STRA

Liberty senior All-American **KATIE FEENSTRA** is quickly climbing the Big South record books this season, and could become just the third Big South women's player to amass 1,500 points and 800 rebounds in her career. Feenstra accomplished half of that feat last week as she collected 28 rebounds to push her career total to 809. She is 29 points away from 1,500, as her total stands at 1,471. So far this season, Feenstra is first in the Big South in scoring (17.9) and FG percentage (.687) and second in rebounding (9.1). She has also tallied four double-doubles, while leading the Flames in scoring in seven of 11 contests.

NON-CONFERENCE SLIP

For the first time in three seasons, the Big South will not finish with a winning non-conference mark, as the League is currently 36-57 (.387) against other conferences. Last season, the Big South held a non-conference mark of 52-50 (.509) and 49-47 (.510) during the 2002-03 season. The Big South can improve that percentage with six teams still facing non-conference opponents in the coming weeks. The League has recorded wins over nine different leagues so far this season, plus an 8-1 mark against non-Division I opponents.

KATIE WHO?

Don't think that Liberty's **KATIE FEENSTRA** is the only Katie making an impact on Big South hoops this season. High Point's **KATIE O'DELL** is the only League player averaging a double-double, pouring in 17.2 points and 10.0 rebounds through 10 contests. She is currently 1st in the League in rebounding and free-throw percentage, 2nd in scoring, 13th in 3FG percentage and 10th in FG percentage. She has scored double figures in nine of 10 games played this season.

CAN I HAVE THE UPSET SPECIAL?

Liberty snapped No. 17 Kansas State's 35-game home winning streak Dec. 4 and picked up the biggest win in the history of the program, downing the Wildcats, 77-56, to win the 10th Annual Commerce Bank Wildcat Tournament over the weekend. The win marked just the second time in school history that the Lady Flames' have knocked off a ranked opponent, as LU defeated No. 25 Virginia, 77-69, in overtime at the Vines Center during the 2002-03 season.

For the third year in a row, the Big South Conference will be changing up the format for the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Women's Basketball Championship, this time to accommodate television coverage. This year, the four first-round games will be played on the campus of the higher-seeded teams. The teams that advance will play the two Semifinal games and Championship game at the site of the Big South regular-season champion. The opening round of this year's Conference tournament will be held on Tuesday, March 8, with the Semifinals following on Friday, March 11. The Championship Game will be played on Saturday, March 12 at 2:00pm. Last season, each round of the Conference tournament was played at the campus of the higher-seeded team, while in 2003, the first rounds were played on campus sites, with a "final four" played in Lynchburg, Va.

NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN

BSC dropped its second-straight game this past weekend, losing on the road to Savannah State, 64-46, after losing at Mississippi State last Monday night, 73-57. The game at Savannah State was the Panthers' fourth-straight road game. BSC returns home for the first time this week since playing at home on Dec. 7, taking on Sewanee for its final non-conference game before beginning Big South play this weekend against UNC Asheville. Junior STACEY ANTHONY leads the Panthers in scoring with 11.3 points per game, while senior MARTINA KNOTKOVA leads in rebounding with 5.8 boards a contest.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

In the only game for the Lady Bucs last week, junior **ERICA MCCOY** led the way, scoring her first double-double for the season with 15 points and 10 rebounds. Sophomore **KEENA WICKER** was close behind, snagging 10 rebounds and scoring nine points. The current two-game winning streak matches the longest of the season for the Lady Bucs. The Lady Bucs will have a break before taking the court again January 15 when they travel to Virginia to take on Big South foe Radford at 7 p.m.

COASTAL CAROLINA

Junior AMBER ROSE had a great week from behind the arc, going 8-of-12 from three-point range against Coker and South Carolina State. Rose was 4-of-5 from three-point range in the win over Coker and had 12 points. Against the Lady Bulldogs, she was 4-of-7 from three and had 14 points. On the year, Rose is 17-of-48 (.354) from behind the line. Coastal opens the Big South schedule on the road at eight-time defending champion Liberty Saturday, Jan. 15, at 7 p.m. in the Vines Center. Coastal is coming off a 10-day layoff after its 79-41 win over Coker Jan. 5. Liberty holds a 28-7 series advantage over Coastal. Coastal won its Big South road opener last season, a 56-52 win over Charleston Southern. This also will be the first time this season Coastal will play on a Saturday.

HIGH POINT

The Panthers started the week off with a win against Division II Pfeiffer, but then lost to UNLV later in the week. The Panthers open Big South Conference play next Saturday afternoon at Winthrop. Tip-off in the Winthrop Coliseum is set for 2:00 pm EST.

LIBERTY

Liberty opens up Big South play Saturday against Coastal Carolina. The Lady Flames enter Conference play on a 46-game winning streak - including postseason games against Conference foesand are looking to capture their ninth-straight title. Against Loyola (Md.), the Lady Flames shot a season-high 87.9 percent from the free throw line as KRISTAL THARP was a perfect 6-of-6, while KATIE FEENSTRA was 13-of-14 and DAINA STAUGAITIENE was 8-of-11 to lead the Lady Flames. Feenstra picked up her 800th career rebound against No. 9 Ohio State as she now ranks seventh all-time in Big South history in rebounds with 809.

RADFORD

The Highs are in the midst of a six-game homestand. It is the longest regular season homestand since the 1985-86 season when the Highlanders played eight-straight games from Nov. 26 through Dec. 17, 1985. RU went 6-2 during that stretch. The Highlanders have finally found the touch from behind the arc in the last three games. They are shooting 43.4 percent (23-53), a far cry from the first eight games when RU was shooting just 27.6 percent (35-127). Radford has outrebounded its opponents in five of its last six games and a total of seven times this season. The Highs are 4-3 in those games. In the last five games, RU has outrebounded its opponent by 6.4 boards.

UNC ASHEVILLE

UNC Asheville, led by a game-high 21 points from **KRISTAL HOOD** placed four players in double figures in a 64-53 victory over Tennessee State in its only action of the week. The Bulldogs head into Big South Conference play winners of three-straight and seven of its last eight games. UNCA has won five-straight home games and picked up its first road win of the season against Tennessee State. Hood is third in the Conference in scoring and leads the League in steals.

WINTHROP

Winthrop fell to 1-5 on the road after falling to No. 4 North Carolina on Thursday. The loss to North Carolina was one of the Lady Eagles worst in history as they fell to 1-9 all-time vs. the Lady Tar Heels. The Lady Eagles are excited to finally get the Conference schedule going as they host High Point at home on Saturday.
