NEW BALANCE FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Kelli Darden Center • Radford Chesapeake, Va.

Darden was instrumental in helping the Highs continue their winning ways last week. She blocked a career- and game-high seven shots, to go along with seven points and an assist, against Coastal Carolina. Darden followed with a career-high 12 points on 6-of-7 shooting, four rebounds, three blocks and two assists vs. Birmingham-Southern. For the week, she posted 9.5 points, 5.0 blocks, 2.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists, while shooting 69.2 percent from the field (9-of-13).

CHOICE HOTELS CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Taryn Causey • Senior G • Radford Collierville, Tenn.

Causey led Radford to a pair of Conference victories over Coastal Carolina and Birmingham-Southern last week, averaging 17.0 points, 5.5 steals, 5.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per contest. She shot .500 percent from both the field and three-point range and was 13-for-15 from the free-throw line. Against Coastal Carolina, Causey netted a gamehigh 19 points, to go along with seven rebounds, five steals and three assists, while going 9-for-11 from the charity stripe. She continued with a game-high 15 points, six assists and six steals against Birmingham-Southern.

Katie Feenstra • Senior C • Liberty Grand Rapids, Mich.

Feenstra averaged points, 10.3 rebounds and 2.7 blocks in three games, while shooting a blazing 80.0 percent (24-of-30) from the field. She started the week tallying 17 points, eight rebounds, three blocks and a steal in a home win Charleston Southern. Feenstra then poured in 22 points, grabbed 15 rebounds and had four blocks against Longwood, while shooting .846 (11-of-13) from the floor. Against UNC Asheville, Feenstra scored 13 points and gathered eight rebounds in just 14 minutes of action, while shooting a perfect 5-of-5 from the floor. In the CSU game, Feenstra became just the third Big South women's player ever to reach the 1,500point, 800-rebound plateau and now has 1,537 career points and 840 career rebounds.

AND WE'RE UNDER WAY

With two teams currently undefeated in the Conference, several key meetings will take place this week around the Big South. Liberty (3-0) will enjoy the confines of the Vines Center this week, taking on Birmingham-Southern (0-2) Monday and Radford (3-0) Saturday. RU will face UNC Asheville (2-1) on Wednesday before heading to Lynchburg. Both Liberty and Radford could potentially enter the match-up at 4-0, the first time the teams have faced each other with an unblemished Conference mark. Saturday's match-up featuring UNCA at High Point will be broadcast throughout the Carolinas on C-SET at 4:00pm ET.

FLYING HIGH

With its two Conference wins last week, Radford pushed its winning streak to eight for the first time since they won nine-consecutive games during the 1992-93 season. The Highlanders are currently tied for first in the Conference with Liberty, and have not started Conference play at 3-0 since the 1998-99 season. After playing seven of their last eight at the Dedmon Center, RU will face a tough road test, playing at UNC Asheville Wednesday and Liberty Saturday.

BALANCED ATTACK

Liberty's offense has been getting help from every angle over the past few weeks, with as many as 11 players scoring in one game. Against Coastal Carolina, 10 Lady Flames saw the bucket, with four players tallying at least eight points. Versus Charleston Southern, Liberty had 11 players score, four in double-figures, and five with eight or more points. Perhaps LU's most impressive performance to date was at UNC Asheville, as three scored in double-figures, while five had eight or more points, while holding the Bulldogs to a season-low .185 shooting percentage from the floor. On the defensive side, Radford has held its opponents to 45 points or less in the last four games (41 ppg) and to 33 percent or less from the field (27.7%). RU has also not allowed a team to score more than 26 points in the last eight halves.

STATING HER CAUSE

Radford's TARYN CAUSEY has been lighting up the scoreboard as of late for the Highlanders, especially when it comes to taking on Big South opponents. She is the top Big South scorer in Conference play at 18.0 points per game, almost four points above next-in-line KATIE FEENSTRA, and is the third-leading scorer in all games played this season (14.7 ppg). In the Highlander's first eight games, she averaged 12.5 points and shot just .326 from the field. However, in her last eight games, Causey has tallied 16.9 points, 5.1 rebounds, 4.6 assists and 3.4 steals per contest, while shooting .449 from the floor and .455 from beyond the arc. Causey has put up 15 or more points in six of RU's last seven games, including four 20+ point performances.

FEENSTRA-HUNDRED

After scoring 17 points against Charleston Southern last Monday, Liberty senior All-American KATIE FEENSTRA became just the third Big South women's player to amass 1,500 points and 800 rebounds in her career. Feenstra accomplished the second half of that feat in Week Six. Feenstra now has 1,537 career points and 840 career rebounds. So far this season, Feenstra is first in the Big South in scoring (17.4), rebounding (10.0), FG percentage (.705) and blocks (2.73). She has also tallied six double-doubles, while scoring double figures in 13 of 15 contests.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK

Highlander head coach **JERI PORTER** is just three wins from reaching the 100-victory mark in her seventh season as a head coach. Her current record stands at 97-82. Coastal Carolina's **ALAN LEFORCE** became just the fifth Big South coach to reach the 100-win mark early this season.

KATIE WHO?

Don't think that Liberty's **KATIE FEENSTRA** is the only Katie making an impact on Big South hoops this season. High Point's **KATIE O'DELL** is pouring in 16.4 points and 9.2 rebounds a game through 13 contests. She is currently 2nd in the League in scoring and rebounding, 10th in free-throw percentage and tied for seventh in three-point field goals per game. O'Dell has scored double figures in 11 of 13 games played this season and is credited with six double-doubles, with her latest coming against Charleston Southern (11 points, 15 rebounds).

SUPPORTING CAST

We're hearing all about Causey, Feenstra and O'Dell, but let's not forget about several other Big South players who have stepped it up recently. Charleston Southern's **KEENA WICKER** shot a blazing .800 (12-of-15) from the floor Saturday for a career-high 27 points against High Point. She is currently ninth in the Big South in scoring at 10.8 points a game and is also pulling down 5.1 rebounds a contest. Coastal Carolina's **KIM TURNER** averaged 15.0 points and 6.0 rebounds, while shooting .538 from the floor in the Chanticleers' first two Conference games. UNC Asheville's **ANDREA CLAPP** has scored double-digits in three of the Bulldog's last four games and is averaging a solid 10.7 points and 6.7 rebounds in Conference action.

NON-CONFERENCE SLIP

For the first time in three seasons, the Big South will not finish with a winning non-conference mark, as the League is currently 42-57 (.424) against other conferences. Last season, the Big South held a non-conference mark of 52-50 (.509) and 49-47 (.510) during the 2002-03 season. The Big South can improve that percentage with three teams still facing non-conference opponents in the coming weeks. The League has recorded wins over nine different leagues so far this season, plus a 10-1 mark against non-Division I opponents.

For the third year in a row, the Big South Conference will be changing up the format for the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Women's Basketball Championship, this time to accommodate television coverage. This year, the four first-round games will be played on the campus of the higher-seeded teams. The teams that advance will play the two Semifinal games and Championship game at the site of the Big South regular-season champion. The opening round of this year's Conference tournament will be held on Tuesday, March 8, with the Semifinals following on Friday, March 11. The Championship Game will be played on Saturday, March 12 at 2:00pm. Last season, each round of the Conference tournament was played at the campus of the higher-seeded team, while in 2003, the first rounds were played on campus sites, with a "final four" played in Lynchburg, Va.

BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN

The Panthers split last week, defeating non-conference rival Savannah State at home, 82-36, and losing to Big South foe Radford on the road, 67-45. Against Savannah State, freshman **REBA ROSS** recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds, both career-highs. Sophomore **MUNECA OLIVER** and freshman **MORGAN TALBOT** also tied their career-highs with 10 and eight points, respectively. Junior **STACEY ANTHONY** was the only player in double-digits against Radford with 10 points.

Despite a tough road game at Liberty, Junior ERICA MCCOY continued to be strong inside scoring 12 points and pulling down nine rebounds for the Lady Bucs. In the victory at home against High Point, sophomore KEENA WICKER was the bright spot, dropping 27 points and grabbing seven rebounds. Senior LAKESHIA BRYANT has been a solid performer all year for CSU and continued to be just that, scoring seven points at Liberty and 10 points against High Point.

COASTAL CAROLINA

Coastal Carolina starts a string of four home games in the next five contests against High Point. Coastal 4-2 at Kimbel Arena and is averaging 66.8 points a game, compared to a season total of 58.6 points a game. Coastal also is shooting 43.8 percent from the field at Kimbel. Coastal had a season-high 45 rebounds in the 55-41 loss to Radford Jan. 17. Senior COURTNEY BROWN and junior KIM TURNER had seven rebounds apiece, while sophomore VANESSA LAUG had six rebounds, all in the first half. The Lady Chants outrebounded the Highlanders 45-39 and it was the first time in the last eight contests that Radford has been outrebounded.

HIGH POINT

After two wins over Winthrop and Gardner-Webb last week, the Panthers lost to Charleston Southern on the road Saturday to sufffer their first Conference loss of the season.

LIBERTY

Liberty outscored its opponents by an average of 28.3 point per game this past week. Saturday's game against UNC Asheville featured the League's top two scoring teams; however, the Lady Flames' defense held the Bulldogs to just 43 points. The Lady Flames also dominated the boards this past week as they outrebounded their opponents by 20.0 rebounds (51.3-31.3). Liberty entered the week ranked 15th in the nation in rebounding margin at 8.2 more boards per game, and currently are averaging a plus 10.1 rebounding differential. Liberty held UNCA to a season low 18.5 shooting percent from the floor on Saturday. It make the sixth time this season that the Lady Flames have held an opponent to below 30.0 percent from the field and the second time that they have not allowed an opponent to shoot over 20.0 percent.

RADFORD

Radford has won eight-straight games for the first time since winning nine consecutive contests during the 1992-93 season. The Highlanders have been stingy on the defensive end, holding their opponents to 45 points or less in the last four games (41 ppg) and to 33 percent or less from the field (27.7%). Also, RU has not allowed a team to score more than 26 points in the last eight halves. RU has been struggling with three-point shooting during it winning streak. In the last four games, it has shot just 23.1 percent (15-65), compared to the 40.8 percent (29-71) it shot in the four previous to the slump.

UNC ASHEVILLE

UNC Asheville saw its five-game win streak end at the hands of Liberty on Saturday. The Bulldogs had won nine of 10 before the Liberty game with its defense leading the way in Conference play. Asheville held Birmingham-Southern and Winthrop to a total of 79 points before giving up 70 to the Lady Flames. The Bulldogs are still only allowing Conference opponents 49.7 ppg over the first three games.

WINTHROP

The Lady Eagles have struggled on offense since starting Conference play. They are averaging only 43.7 ppg and shooting 34 percent in their first three games, and turning the ball over 23 times game as well. The defense has been solid, however, by holding teams to 53 points a game and .343 from the floor. Winthrop entered Conference play as the top three-point shooting team in the Big South, but have struggled from beyond the arc (28 percent) in its first thee contests. **GENET MOORE** and **JESSICA DUKES** have started to find some offense, as each is averaging 11.0 points in League play. Dukes is also averaging 7.3 rebounds and 1.7 blocks a game in Conference action.
