Taryn Causey • Senior G • Radford Collierville, Tenn.

Causey posted two more 20point games this week and has scored at least 20 points in four of the last five games. She averaged 16.0 points, 3.7 assists and 4.3 rebounds in three games. helping the Highlanders extend their winning streak to six games. Causey shot .500 (12-of-24) from the field and .800 (16of-20) from the free-throw line. She then recorded a game-high 22 points, six assists and three steals vs. IPFW. She also scored her 500th career point at Radford. Against Southern Virginia, she had six points and a game-best five assists. Causey ended the week scoring a gamehigh 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting and grabbed seven rebounds in a Big South opening victory vs. Charleston Southern.

## **NEW BALANCE** Freshman of the Week

Corrie Fertitta Forward • Radford Roanoke, Va.

Fertitta averaged 9.0 points and 9.0 rebounds for the Highlanders in three games last week. She posted her first collegiate double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds against IPFW. She notched 12 points and six boards vs. Southern Virginia. Fertitta then corralled a game-high 10 boards with a game high three assists in Radford's Big South opener vs. Charleston Southern.

#### AND WE'RE UNDER WAY

The 2004-05 Big South women's basketball season tipped-off over the weekend, with all eight teams in action. Radford defeated Charleston Southern, 62-44, for its six-straight victory. High Point and UNC Asheville posted road victories, as the Panthers slipped by Winthrop, 55-52, and the Bulldogs cruised past Birmingham-Southern, 58-46. Liberty continued its Big South winning ways, as the Lady Flames captured their 47th-straight win over a Conference opponent, defeating Coastal Carolina, 59-50. Monday's match-ups feature Charleston Southern at Liberty and Coastal Carolina at Radford. The CSU-LU meeting can be seen on the Flames' Television Network (FTN), while the CCU-RU match-up can be seen on Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS), Fox College Sports (FCS), and the Big South Television Network (BTSN). Liberty holds a 28-5 all-times series advantage over Charleston Southern. The last time the Buccaneers defeated the Flames was a 66-60 victory on Jan. 18, 1999. Meanwhile, the Highlanders own a 30-9 series advantage over the Chanticleers. The teams split last year's meetings with the home team grabbing the victory. However, CCU has won three of the last four meetings.

#### **FLYING HIGH**

The hottest team in the Big South is not at the top of the standings. With its three convincing wins last week, Radford is currently riding a League-best six-game winning streak after starting the season at 1-7. RU is in the midst of its longest winning streak since winning six-straight during the 1995-96 season. The Highs last won seven-straight contests during the 1993-94 season. The Highs have held their opponent under 30-percent shooting in the last two games and 22 points or less in the last four halves.

#### **CAREER CRUSHERS**

Last week proved to be a career week for several Big South players. While Birmingham-Southern crushed visiting Sewanee, the Panthers set a new team record for single-game three-pointers with 14, and several Panthers bested their career bests. Sophomore PAM THORNBORROW poured in a career-high 17 points on perfect 6-of-6 shooting, including 5-of-5 from three-point range. She also posted a career-high six assists, as did sophomore MUNECA OLIVER with five assists and junior CRYSTAL REED with four. Freshman MORGAN TALBOT and sophomore JAMEL GRANDBERRY also posted career-highs in that game with eight and six points, respectively. For the Highlanders, sophomore SHAVON EARP tallied a career high 18 points and CORRIE FERTITTA posted her first double double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Liberty's KATIE FEENSTRA recorded her 37th career double-double with 14 points and a game-high 12 rebounds against Coastal Carolina. AMANDA ELDER led UNC Asheville to a win over BSC with a career-high 16 points. Winthrop's GENE'T MOORE connected on a career-best five three-pointers vs. High Point, tallying a season-high 19 points.

#### STATING HER CAUSE

Radford's **TARYN CAUSEY** has been lighting up the scoreboard as of late for the Highlanders. Causey has put up 20 or more points in four of the last five outings, averaging 18. 6 points in those games. What might be most impressive are her abilities to find the basket. She is shooting .480 (24-of-50) from the field, .500 (12-of-24) from beyond the arc and .846 (33-of-39) from the charity stripe. Causey ranks in the top-five in steals (2nd), assists (3rd), assist/turnover ratio (2nd), and scoring (4th).

#### **FEAT-STRA**

Liberty senior All-American **KATIE FEENSTRA** is quickly climbing the Big South record books this season, and could become just the third Big South women's player to amass 1,500 points and 800 rebounds in her career. Feenstra accomplished half of that feat last week as she collected 28 rebounds to push her career total to 809. She is 15 points away from 1,500, as her total stands at 1,485. So far this season, Feenstra is first in the Big South in scoring (17.4), rebounding (9.9) and FG percentage (.681). She has also tallied five double-doubles, while leading the Flames in scoring in eight of 12 contests.

#### REACHING THE CENTURY MARK

Highlander head coach **JERI PORTER** is just five wins from reaching the 100-victory mark in her seventh season as a head coach. Her current record stands at 95-82. Coastal Carolina's **ALAN LEFORCE** became just the fifth Big South coach to reach the 100-win mark early this season.

#### KATIE WHO?

Don't think that Liberty's **KATIE FEENSTRA** is the only Katie making an impact on Big South hoops this season. High Point's **KATIE O'DELL** is pouring in 16.4 points and 9.4 rebounds a game through 11 contests. She is currently 2nd in the League in scoring and rebounding, 6th in free-throw percentage and seventh in three-point field goals per game. O'Dell has scored double figures in nine

#### NON-CONFERENCE SLIP

For the first time in three seasons, the Big South will not finish with a winning non-conference mark, as the League is currently 39-57 (.406) against other conferences. Last season, the Big South held a non-conference mark of 52-50 (.509) and 49-47 (.510) during the 2002-03 season. The Big South can improve that percentage with six teams still facing non-conference opponents in the coming weeks. The League has recorded wins over nine different leagues so far this season, plus a 9-1 mark against non-Division I opponents.

#### THREE-POINT PLAY

For the third year in a row, the Big South Conference will be changing up the format for the 2005 Advance Auto Parts Women's Basketball Championship, this time to accommodate television coverage. This year, the four first-round games will be played on the campus of the higher-seeded teams. The teams that advance will play the two Semifinal games and Championship game at the site of the Big South regular-season champion. The opening round of this year's Conference tournament will be held on Tuesday, March 8, with the Semifinals following on Friday, March 11. The Championship Game will be played on Saturday, March 12 at 2:00pm. Last season, each round of the Conference tournament was played at the campus of the higher-seeded team, while in 2003, the first rounds were played on campus sites, with a "final four" played in Lynchburg, Va.

#### NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

#### **BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN**

The Panthers split last week in their two home games, defeating Sewanee, 83-46, but losing their Conference opener to UNC Asheville, 58-46. Against UNCA, BSC led for the majority of the game, but the tenacious Bulldogs closed the gap and overcame Birmingham-Southern for the win. Last season, the Panthers also opened their Big South slate against UNCA, and lost on the road, 51-43. In the UNCA game, sophomore MUNECA OLIVER scored a career-high 10 points and grabbed a career-high six rebounds to lead the team. Junior STACEY ANTHONY still leads the Panthers with 11.2 points per game, and junior CRYSTAL REED now leads in rebounding with 5.7 a contest.

#### **CHARLESTON SOUTHERN**

The 10-day break didn't help the Lady Bucs, as they fell 62-44 to Radford in their only contest of the week. Sophomore **KEENA WICKER** was the only Lady Buc to reach double figures, scoring 10 points in the loss. Junior **ERICA MCCOY** continued to be strong inside scoring eight points and grabbing seven rebounds. The Lady Bucs will face Liberty Monday night to complete the two-game road trip.

#### **COASTAL CAROLINA**

Coastal is 3-0 when it makes more free throws than its opponent, compared to 1-8 when it equals or is less than its opponents from the charity stripe. Against Coker Jan. 5, Coastal was 12-of-21 from the line, compared to 4-of-7 for the Cobras. Although Coastal Carolina lost 59-50 in its Big South Conference opener against Liberty, the Lady Chants defense held the Lady Flames to 35.9 percent from the field and 33.3 percent from three-point range. They also held All-America candidate **KATIE FEENSTRA** to just 14 points, more than three below her season average. Last season, Feenstra averaged 26.0 points against Coastal in two games. The big difference of the game was that the Lady Flames had a 29-10 advantage on made free-throw attempts.

#### HIGH POINT

High Point opened the 2004-05 Big South Conference schedule on Saturday afternoon with a 55-52 win over Winthrop. **CHARLENA MARTIN** scored 13 points (including the game-winning free throw with 7.5 seconds left) to lead the Panthers (5-8, 1-0 Big South). **KATIE RALLS** had nine points, three rebounds and two assists, while **KATIE O'DELL** provided eight points and three rebounds. The Panthers return home on Monday night to face Gardner-Webb in their final non-conference game of the regular season. Tip-off is set for 7:00 pm in the Millis Center.

#### LIBERTY

The Lady Flames have enjoyed the comforts of home over the past eight seasons. Since their unprecedented title run began, Liberty has posted an outstanding 64-3 (.955) record against the Big South at home, while going 40-2 (.952) under **CAREY GREEN**. The Lady Flames entered this season on a 29-game home winning streak and pushed it to 30 over the weekend. Liberty has defeated their Conference foes by an average of 19.4 points per game (66.3-46.9) at home since the 1996-97 season.

#### **RADFORD**

The Highlanders are in the midst of its longest winning streak since they won six-straight during 1995-96 season. RU last won seven-straight during the 1993-94 season. Head coach **JERI PORTER** is just five wins from reaching the 100-victory mark in her seventh season as a head coach. With the victory over Charleston Southern, Radford won its first Big South Conference opener since the 2000-01 season when it defeated Coastal Carolina at home.

### **UNC ASHEVILLE**

UNC Asheville used an 11-0 run midway through the second half to overcome a three point halftime deficit on way to its fourth-straight victory, 58-46, over Birmingham-Southern in its Big South Conference opener. **AMANDA ELDER** led the Bulldogs with a career-high 16 points. She was 6-11 from the floor and 4-5 from the free throw line. The Bulldogs will put their winning streak on the line again, as UNCA travels to Winthrop on Tuesday for a 7 p.m. tipoff.

#### WINTHROP
