CLARIFICATION

It was mischaracterized last week of WMI rusher **SEAN MIZZER**'s approaching 2,000 rushing yards in the Big South. While his career rushing total is 1,947, just 1,437 have come during VMI's one-plus year as a Conference member. Of Liberty's **DRE BARNES**' 3,385 career rushing yards, 2,731 have come since the Big South began football in 2002. Meanwhile, Liberty's **EUGENE GOODMAN** is 343 yards away from the Big South's 2,000-rushing mark. Coastal Carolina sophomore RB **AUNDRES PERKINS**, who surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in Week Two, stands 352 away from 1,500 in his brief collegiate career.

GARDNER-WEBB UPSETS NO. 25 WESTERN CAROLINA

The Bulldogs defeated No. 25 ranked Western Carolina in overtime Saturday, 26-20, the squad's first win over a ranked Division I-AA opponent since defeating No. 23 New Hampshire in 2000, and marking the Big South's first win against a ranked Division I-AA team. The win also snapped the Conference's six-game losing streak to the Southern Conference. GWU had the last win, a 23-13 win over Chattanooga last season.

GETTING IT DONE IN OVERTIME

Gardner-Webb's 26-20 overtime win over Western Carolina was the fourth overtime game in Conference history. The Big South is 3-1 in overtime games: Gardner-Webb (2-0) and Liberty (1-1) are the lone schools to play past regulation in the Big South.

HOKE KICKS SINGLE-GAME SCORING RECORD

Coastal Carolina PK **JOSH HOKE** set a single-game Conference scoring record for kickers with 16 points (7-7 PATs, 3-3 FGs) against North Greenville Saturday. The previous mark was 15 points by Liberty's **SCOTT KIOVSKY** (9-9 PATs, 2-2 FGs) against Norfolk State last season.

GOOD STARTS

Coastal Carolina is the first squad in Big South football history to open the season at 2-0, and is just the second Big South school to post a 3-1 record after four games. Gardner-Webb was the first Big South squad to go 3-1, accomplished in both '02 and '03. In '02, the Bulldogs strung an eight-game win streak together to finish the year at 9-1. Charleston Southern's 2-1 record marks the fifth 2-1 start in Big South history. The Buccaneers join CCU ('04), GWU ('02, '03) and Elon ('02).

SEE YOU NEXT SEPTEMBER

The Big South finished 8-11 in the month of September, just one win shy of equaling its best of nine wins during the month, which was accomplished the last two seasons. Below is an updated tally of the Big South clubs in September:

GOING COAST-AL TO COAST-AL

Coastal Carolina recorded a Conference-high 384 rushing yards against North Greenville, the fourth-most in a game in League history. **PATRICK HALL** (93), **CARL ROBINSON** (79), **REN MCKINNON** (65) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (49) accounted for 286 of those yards.

HARPER VALLEY PTA

Charleston Southern RB **KENNY HARPER** rushed for 128 yards Saturday against Charleston (W.Va.), helping the Buccaneers win two straight games for the first time since the 2002 campaign. Harper also recorded the second-longest run from scrimmage this season with a 55-yard scamper, good for his second touchdown of the game, and the longest CSU run since 2000.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

Charleston Southern ranks 14th nationally in scoring defense with a 14.3 average, while Coastal Carolina is 16th at 14.8 points allowed. The Big South record is 20.4 points allowed, set by Gardner-Webb in 2002. CSU and CCU do not meet until the final weekend of the season, Nov. 20, in Charleston, S.C., which will be televised on Comcast Sports Southeast.

FIFTY IS NIFTY

Coastal Carolina's 58 points against North Greenville Saturday are the second-most points scored in Big South history, trailing only Liberty's 69 against Norfolk State last season. It also marked the third 50-point game by a Big South school this year, one behind the season record of four set in 2003. Earlier this season, Liberty opened the season with 55 points against West Virginia Tech, while Gardner-Webb posted 56 points against Morgan State in Week Two.

ON THE CALL

Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** became the first Big South player to pass for 3,000 career yards when he reached the milestone Saturday against Western Carolina. Roberts' total stands at 3,128. Charleston Southern QB **COLLIN DRAFTS** is lurking with 2,545 career passing yards, 455 away from 3,000. Meanwhile, Drafts' 63.2 completion percentage this season is ahead of Roberts' Big South season record of 60.1, established in 2003.

GOOD-N-PLENTY

Liberty RB **EUGENE GOODMAN** rushed for 109 yards against Youngstown State Saturday, his seventh-straight 100-rushing game (dating back to last season), extending both his school and Big South records. Goodman is eighth in the nation in rushing with 124.25 yards per game, and is still on pace for a Big South record 1,367 rushing yards. His 497 yards rushing are 212 ahead of his closest Conference competitor, CCU's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (285 yards).

PIONEERING

The Big South Conference is guaranteed a winning record against the Pioneer League this season, as the Conference is 3-0 against Pioneer clubs with one game remaining. Last season, the Big South was 3-2 against the Pioneer League, and is 6-3 overall since starting football in 2002. Meanwhile, the Big South is undefeated against Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference schools at 4-0, with two more match-ups scheduled for later this season.

RECORD SETTER

Charleston Southern redshirt freshman WR **EDDIE GADSON** caught 13 passes against Presbyterian Sept. 18, a Big South single-game record. The old record of 10 was shared by **RODNEY BURGESS** (CCU) and **AARON DUNKLIN** (CSU), both accomplished last season, and VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN** (this year). Gadson's 24 receptions through three games rank first in the Big South and he is ninth in NCAA Division I-AA with 8.0 receptions per game. A CSU receiver has tied or led the Conference in receptions in both years of Big South football.

BIG SOUTH IN THE NFL - MAXWELL MAKES NFL DEBUT

Former standout Gardner-Webb LB **JIM MAXWELL** made his NFL debut Sept. 19 with the New York Giants against the Redskins to become the first "official" Big South Conference football player to play in the NFL. Against Washington, Maxwell started on the Giants' kickoff coverage and return units, and recorded his first career tackle. The 2003 First-team All-Big South performer signed with the club as a free agent in May. Meanwhile, former Liberty players **DWAYNE CARSWELL** and **JAMES MCKNIGHT** are in their 11th and 10th NFL season, respectively. Carswell has played his entire career with the Broncos, while McKnight was placed on the Giants' IR on Aug. 23.

- CSU posted their most balanced effort offensively of the season against Charleston (W.Va.), rushing for 226 yards and passing for 186 yards.
- Sophomore QB **COLLIN DRAFTS** completed 15-of-22 passes and had two touchdowns, raising his season completion percentage to a league best 63.2 percent on the season.

- Redshirt freshman **EDDIE GADSON** caught six passes for 70 yards, giving him 24 receptions in three games.

- The three GWU wins have each been decided by 11 points or less, including a 10-point win in Lynchburg two seasons ago in what was the first ever Big South Conference football con-

- test. GWU holds an overall series lead of 6-3-1, including last year's 28-17 win in Boiling Springs.
- Senior CB **ALLEN DAVIS** continues to impress, ranking third nationally in interceptions (4) and staking his place among the nation's best with 10 pass break-ups. Davis' interception in overtime sealed Saturday's win for GWU against WCU.

- Saturday's announced attendance of 6,311 was the most ever for a GWU home football game, with renovated Ernest W. Spangler Stadium (7,200) near capacity for the second-straight week.
- QB **NICK ROBERTS** moved into 7th place in GWU history in passing yardage, and now has 3,128 yards.
