CHOICE HOTELS CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Collin Drafts • Quarterback • Sophomore
 Charleston Southern • Beaufort, S.C.

Drafts completed 29-of-42 passes for 330 yards and two touchdowns in the Bucs' 25-24 comeback victory against VMI. Drafts was at his best in the final quarter, hitting on 15-of-18 passes for 167 yards. His 29 completions tied a Big South record, while his 330 yards set a personal-best and is the third-most in a game in League history. The victory marked the Buccaneer's first-ever Conference win.

Sam Gado • Running Back • Senior
 Liberty • Columbia, S.C.

Gado posted the 11th-best rushing performance in school history and the third-best in Big South Conference history as the senior rushed for 219 yards on 24 carries on Saturday vs. Gardner-Webb. He scored both the Flames' rushing touchdowns to help the Flames hand the Runnin' Bulldogs their first-ever Conference loss. Gado posted runs of 79 and 50 yards, his longest and third-longest ever. The 79-yard touchdown run marked the second-longest touchdown run in school history.

NEW BALANCE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Manny Rojas • Linebacker • R-Sophomore
 Liberty • Oakdale, Pa.

Rojas nearly missed posting his second-consecutive double-figure tackle game, as the linebacker tied for game-high nine stops against Gardner-Webb on Saturday. He also tied for the team lead with two tackles for a loss of -1, marking a new career-high. Rojas also set a career mark with two quarterback hurries. His nine tackles allowed him to take over the team lead in total tackles this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Noah Crouch • Punter • R-Junior

Crouch posted his fifth-career best punting average as he averaged 43.5 yards per punt in helping Liberty in the battle for field position against Gardner-Webb on Saturday. This also marked the eighth time in his career that Crouch has averaged 40 or more yards per punt in a game. He had two punts of 50 or more yards and one inside the 20. His 261 punting yards tied for third-best in his career.

FRESHMAN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Price caught six passes for 87 yards and a touchdown, both career highs, in CSU's first Big South victory. He caught the TD pass with :28 left in the game to bring CSU to within a point of the Keydets. CSU converted the two-point conversion for the win.

GARDNER-WEBB'S CONFERENCE WIN STREAK ENDS

The two-time Big South Champion Gardner-Webb Bulldogs suffered their first Conference loss ever Saturday, falling to Liberty, 17-9. GWU entered the game with a spotless 7-0 record in Big South play. For Liberty, it is the school's first win over Gardner-Webb since the 2000 season, ending a three-game losing streak to the Bulldogs. The Flames are also 1-0 in Big South play for the second straight year.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN CAPTURES FIRST LEAGUE WIN

The Buccaneers' 25-24 come-from-behind victory against VMI Saturday was their first-ever Big South win. CSU is 3-1 for the first time in its history, and has won three straight games for the first time since the 2002 season.

BIG SOUTH BOASTS TWO 3-1 SQUADS FOR FIRST TIME

Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina are both 3-1, the first time in League history that two clubs were at the mark in the same year. The two schools join the '02 and '03 Gardner-Webb programs as the only 3-1 starts in the Big South. The '02 Bulldogs are the lone school to open 4-1, which was part of an eight-game win streak to close out the season.

GADO HITS 200-YARD RUSHING PLATEAU

Liberty RB **SAM GADO** rushed for a career-high 219 yards Saturday against Gardner-Webb, the third-most in a game in Conference history. It marked the fifth 200-yard effort by a Big South back, and the Flames have recorded four of those games. The exception - **RASHAUD PALMER**'s single-game record of 245 yards for Elon in '02, set against Liberty. Meanwhile, Gado's 79-yard touchdown run against GWU was the second-longest in Big South history, missing the record by one yard. Gado's season total of 336 yards is one shy of his total for all of 2003.

DRAFTS

Charleston Southern sophomore QB **COLLIN DRAFTS** tied a Big South record of 29 pass completions in CSU's win against VMI. Drafts now shares the top two spots on the record chart, as he tallied 28 completions in CSU's opener against Presbyterian. Drafts' 330 yards against the Keydets set a personal-best and is the third-most in a game in League history. He also owns the fourth spot with 318 yards in a game, established last season. Drafts has not thrown an interception since the season opener. His 65.1 completion percentage (84-129) is ahead of the single-season record of 60.1, set by GWU's **NICK ROBERTS** last season.

MIZZER'S MILESTONE

VMI rusher **SEAN MIZZER** surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards with his 127-yard effort against Charleston Southern Saturday, which was his first 100-yard game of the year and 11th of his career. Mizzer now stands at 2,074, of which 1,564 have come during VMI's one-plus year as a Big South member.

ANOTHER GOOD DAY

Liberty RB **EUGENE GOODMAN** quietly rushed for 112 yards against Gardner-Webb, extending his school and Big South record of consecutive 100-yard rushing games to eight, dating back to last season. Goodman leads the Big South with 609 rushing yards, and his 121.8 per game average is 8th in the nation. He is challenging the League's single-season record of 1,347 rushing yards, as he is on pace to total 1,340. Meanwhile, he needs just 231 rushing yards to reach 2,000 in the Big South.

MR. 3000

Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** became the first Big South player to pass for 3,000 career yards when he reached the milestone against Western Carolina in Week Four. Roberts' total stands at 3,404. Charleston Southern QB **COLLIN DRAFTS** is lurking with 2,875 career passing yards, 125 away from 3,000.

A NICE CATCH

Charleston Southern redshirt-freshman **EDDIE GADSON** hauled in 10 receptions against VMI, his second 10-reception game of the year. He snared a Big South-record 13 passes against Presbyterian Sept. 18. Gadson leads the league with 34 receptions, and his 8.5 receptions per game rank 4th in NCAA Division I-AA. The Big South record for receptions in a season is 79, while the per-game record is 6.58, both set by CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** in 2003. A CSU receiver has tied or led the Conference in receptions in both years of Big South football.
