Charleston Southern • Beaufort, S.C.

Drafts helped the Buccaneers to their first win of the season with a 24-of-40, two touchdown passing performance in CSU's 16-10 victory over Jacksonville. He completed 60.0 percent of his passes and tallied 194 yards through the air, becoming the second quarterback in Big South history to surpass 5,000 career yards. On the Bucs' first scoring drive, Drafts accounted for the team's entire total offense during the 10-play, 75-yard drive to close out the second quarter. He was 8-of-9 passing for 64 yards and added an 11-yard rush as CSU took a 7-3 lead.

NEW BALANCE

Huggard led VMI with 10 tackles (3 solo, 7 assists) in the Keydets' loss at Duke. He also had one tackle for loss for one yard. Late in the second quarter, Huggard had a hand on a key third-down tackle at VMI's 11-yard line that kept the Blue Devils out of the end zone. Duke, which started the drive at the VMI 14, missed the ensuing field goal attempt as well.

COASTAL CAROLINA'S 10-GAME WIN STREAK HALTED AT APPALACHIAN STATE

Coastal Carolina's League-record 10-game win streak ended this past Saturday at Appalachian State, as the Chants lost to the Mountaineers, 30-3. The win streak was the second-longest in the nation entering the game. Gardner-Webb currently owns the League's longest win streak at four games, which is currently the fourth-longest in I-AA. Coastal Carolina still has won 12 of its last 14 ball-games.

GARDNER-WEBB LOOKING FOR HISTORIC START

At 2-0, Gardner-Webb is looking to become the first Big South team ever to start 3-0. The Runnin' Bulldogs host Tennessee-Martin Saturday afternoon, their third-straight home game. The last time Gardner-Webb opened 3-0 was in 1997.

NATION'S TOP I-AA OFFENSE RESIDES IN BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.

After three weeks, the top offense nationally on the I-AA level is Gardner-Webb. The Runnin' Bulldogs lead the country with a balanced 582.5 yards per game, while their 59.5 scoring clip also is tops in the nation.

ROBERTS NOW DRAFTING BEHIND DRAFTS

Charleston Southern quarterback **COLLIN DRAFTS** took advantage of Gardner-Webb's off-week this past weekend to move ahead of Bulldog QB **NICK ROBERTS** on the Big South's record lists. Drafts, the second player in League history to pass for 5,000 yards, is now first all-time in that category, as well as first in attempts and completions. He is tied with Roberts for first in touchdown passes. Below is an updated look at the numbers through Week 3:

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty WR **WYNTON JACKSON** tallied 12 receptions in the Flames' loss to Youngstown State Saturday, the second-most catches in a game in Big South history. He is the sixth different player to have at least 10 catches in a game, and finished one away from the late **EDDIE GADSON**'s record of 13. Jackson, who leads the Conference in receptions with 18, finished Saturday's game with exactly 100 receiving yards, the first such game of his career. He is the 39th player in school history with a 100-yard receiving game, and the first since **LAUREN WILLIAMS** totaled 106 yards against Bowling Green in 2003.

THIS IS SPORTSCENTER

Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON**'s 27-yard, one-handed acrobatic catch in the win over James Madison received some play last week on ESPN. The catch was the No. 1 play on "SportsCenter" Tuesday night as part of its nightly "Top 10 Plays" list. On Sunday night, ESPN anchor **CHRIS BERMAN** included the catch as part of his "Top 10 Plays of the Week."

LIFE BEGINS AT 50

Gardner-Webb has already recorded two 50-plus point games this season, extending its all-time League record to six. The record for most 50-point games in a season is three, set last year by Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers are second behind Gardner-Webb for most 50-point games with four.

GARDNER-WEBB SETS BIG SOUTH RECORD FOR MOST POINTS SCORED IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

The Runnin' Bulldogs have scored 119 points in their first two games, a League record for most points scored in back-to-back games. The previous best was 117 points, also set by Gardner-Webb (52 points vs. Southeastern Louisiana in '04 and 65 vs. Union in Week 1). Gardner-Webb has scored 171 points in its last three appearances, dating back to the Southeastern Louisiana game, also a Big South record. The previous high was 156 points, set by Liberty in 2003. The Flames reeled off 69, 38 and 49 points to close out the '03 campaign, and with the addition of 55 points to open the '04 season, Liberty owns the record for most points scored in four straight games at 211.

12-PACK

Gardner-Webb's offense has scored a point in 12 straight quarters, dating back to last season's finale against Southeastern Louisiana. That last quarter GWU did not score was in the final stanza of its 18-0 win over Charleston Southern last season. All together, the Runnin' Bulldogs have scored in 16 of their last 18 quarters.

BURDEN TURNS 100

VMI receiver **ZOHN BURDEN** became just the third receiver in Big South history to record 100 receptions when he reached the milestone against William & Mary in Week 2. Burden caught five more passes at Duke last Saturday, and now stands at 109 during his Big South tenure. He needs 13 to pass former Gardner-Webb receiver **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** (121) and 16 to displace CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** (124) as the all-time leader. Meanwhile, Burden and teammate **GARY PRICE** have each caught a pass in a school-record 26 straight games. Both streaks began in 2003 against Navy. Price is 22 receptions away from the century mark.

CROUCHING TIGER

Liberty punter and preseason All-Conference selection **NOAH CROUCH** is enjoying a fine redshirt senior season for the Flames. He is currently averaging a career-best 42.2 yards per punt, which would rank as the second-highest in Big South history. Of his 15 kicks this season, seven have traveled more than 45 yards -- including a 60-yarder at UConn -- and another seven have landed inside the opponents' 20-yard line. Liberty is fifth in the nation in net punting with a 39.63 average.

BOSTON MARKET

Gardner-Webb RB **JERMAINE BOSTON** rushed for a career-high 162 yards and three scores in GWU's win against Belhaven in Week 2, the 18th-highest rushing output in Big South history. He also became just the eighth-player in League history to score three rushing touchdowns in a game, and the first since former teammate **HAROLD WELLS** tallied three scores in the '04 season finale against Southeastern Louisiana.

DAYLIGHT HOURS

The Big South's all-time top 10 rushing list has seen some movement following the first three weeks of action. Gardner-Webb's **JERMAINE BOSTON** leaped over Coastal's **AUNDRES PERKINS** for sixth-place, and teammate **GEORGE PRESSLEY** has moved from the 10th position into ninth. Meanwhile, CCU's **PATRICK HALL** is 30 yards away from third-place and Boston is 40 yards from fifth all-time. Here is an updated look at the top 10 (active players in ALL CAPS):

MIZZER REACHES 2,000 RUSHING PLATEAU

VMI rusher **SEAN MIZZER** became the second Big South back to record 2,000 rushing yards, reaching the milestone in Week 1 against Davidson. Three more players have a chance at reaching the plateau this season: Coastal Carolina's **PATRICK HALL** (260 yards away), Gardner-Webb's **JERMAINE BOSTON** (484) and CCU's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (537).

FLEA-FLICKER

Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** also reached the 2,000 barrier this season, in passing yards that is. The fifth Big South QB to surpass the mark, Thigpen passed former GWU quarterback **JEREMY MARTIN** (2,166) Saturday for fourth-place all-time at 2,219 career yards. VMI QB **JONATHAN WILSON** is third with 2,889.

ROBERTS FIRST PLAYER TO PASS FOR 5,000 YARDS; APPROACHING 1,000 ON THE GROUND

Gardner-Webb QB **NICK ROBERTS** became the first player in Big South history to surpass 5,000 career passing yards following his 206 yard output against Belhaven in Week 2. Roberts is 193 rushing yards away from 1,000 in his career, which would make him the first Big South quarterback to reach the rushing milestone. He is currently 12th all-time in League annals, and needs 73 yards to pass Rashaud Palmer (Elon) for 11th place. Roberts' 14 rushing touchdowns are sixth-most in Big South history.

COASTAL LOOKING FOR NEW HIGH TIDE

The Chanticleers' three points at Appalachian State was their lowest scoring output in the program's brief history. Additionally, the 27-point loss was its worst ever. CCU's previous largest margin of defeat was 25 points in a 31-6 loss against Morehead State in 2003.

LIBERTY'S SCORING STREAK COMES TO AN END; NEW LEAGUE LEADER EMERGES

Liberty's 59-0 loss at Connecticut in Week 2 ended a streak of 38-straight games with a point. Of those 38 contests, 35 are as a Big South member, which sets the League record for most consecutive games with a point scored. The active streak now belongs to Coastal Carolina, which has scored in all 25 games in its history. Gardner-Webb owns the second-longest active streak at 20 games.

COASTAL CAROLINA UPSETS NO. 1 JAMES MADISON, 31-27

CCU recorded the biggest win in its and the Big South's football infancy Sept. 10 with a 31-27 win over then-No. 1 James Madison at Brooks Stadium. The Chanticleers were down by 10 at 27-17, but rallied to score two touchdowns in the final 5:54 for the win. Coastal, the first Big South team to play the current No. 1 ranked team, vaulted into the Top 25 in the major national polls following the victory. For the week of Sept. 12, CCU was ranked 15th in the ESPN/USA Today poll, 17th by *The Sports Network*, 18th by Don Hansen's *National Weekly Football Gazette* and 20th by *I-AA.org*.

COASTAL'S BIG WIN GARNERS NATIONAL ATTENTION

SIMPSON BREAKS OUT

Coastal Carolina sophomore and 2004 Big South Freshman of the Year **JEROME SIMPSON** snared 10 passes for 162 yards in CCU's win over James Madison in Week 2, including five for 80 yards in the game-winning drive. He became just the fifth player in League history with 10 receptions in one game, while his 162 receiving yards are the third-highest total in that category. Simpson has 14 receptions this year, more than half the amount he caught in all of 2004.

BIG SOUTH CLOSING IN ON ITS BEST SEPTEMBER

With its 7-7 record thus far, the Big South is looking for its most successful month of September. Last season, Big South teams went 8-11 in the first month. The Conference's most wins in September is nine, set in 2003. The Conference has never had a winning record in the first month of the season.

Charleston Southern QB **COLLIN DRAFTS** became the second player in Big South history to amass 5,000 yards of total offense, surpassing the mark in Week 2 against Presbyterian. He currently stands at 5,221, trailing Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS'** all-time lead of 5,890. Drafts is currently first all-time in total plays with 1,073, while Roberts is second at 1,005.

PERKINS ADDS TO TOTAL

Coastal Carolina RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** scored two touchdowns at Elon in Week 1, increasing his League career record to 28 scores and 168 points. Coastal Carolina RB **PATRICK HALL** is closing in on the 100-point barrier, as he enters this weekend with 96 career points. VMI rusher **SEAN MIZZER** stands 10 points away from the century mark.

BIG SOUTH'S NON-CONFERENCE RECORD IMPROVES YEAR-TO-YEAR

The Big South is looking to build on its 16-18 record in non-conference action last season, and the .470 winning percentage was its best in its three years of football. The mark surpassed the previous percentages of .436 in 2003 and .406 in 2002. The Big South went 3-3 against Southern Conference teams in 2004, and will play eight games against the SoCon this season and five each against the MEAC and Atlantic 10 in 2005.
