Jennings was personally responsible for 20 of Liberty's 41 points in the Flames' 48-41 double overtime loss at William & Mary. In his first game of the season, Jennings finished the contest with three total touchdowns and a 2-point conversion. He posted his sixth career 100-yard game, rushing for 114 yards on 28 carries (4.1 average). Jennings scored on a two-yard TD run to give Liberty a 7-0 lead, caught a 12-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter to put the Flames within five points at 31-26, then later caught a screen pass from Brock Smith on a two-point conversion with :16 seconds remaining in regulation to send the game into overtime at 34-34. On the second play of the first overtime, Jennings broke free for a 25-yard touchdown run to put Liberty ahead, 41-34.

NEW BALANCE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Ashley shined in multiple facets of Charleston Southern's 44-20 win over Johnson C. Smith Saturday. He recorded five tackles, a half-tackle for loss, one pass break-up and 22 return yards on Jon Carmon's interception and lateral. Ashley's main highlight of the day was a 68-yard touchdown return of a blocked field goal attempt to end the first half that gave the Buccaneers a 24-7 halftime lead. J.C. Smith was threatening to cut CSU's lead to 17-10, but its 42-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Gerald Stevenson, which was scooped up by Ashley.

Greenbaum posted his best day as a Flame, scoring nine points and converting all five kick attempts at William & Mary. He was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, hitting from distances of 31 and 37 yards, and also was a perfect 3-for-3 on PAT attempts. The 37-yard field goal tied the longest field goal by a Flames' kicker over the past two seasons. Last year against the Tribe, Liberty missed three field goal attempts and had an extra point blocked in a heartbreaking 14-13 loss.

Moon rushed for 74 yards and a touchdown in CSU's win over Johnson C. Smith. CORRECTION

The first three Big South weekly football reports, as well as the Conference media guide, incorrectly stated Charleston Southern's home win streak at nine wins entering the 2007 season. The win streak was in fact 10 consecutive victories, as CSU won its final four home games of 2005 and went 6-0 at home last year. The Bucs extended the streak to 11 games with their 44-20 win over Johnson C. Smith Saturday. The streak is now tied for second-longest in Big South history and one shy of tying the record of 12, set by Coastal Carolina.

TWO WIN STREAKS END SATURDAY

Liberty's five-game win streak was snapped Saturday in a double-overtime loss at William & Mary, 48-41. It was the program's third five-game win streak since 2003. The Flames were looking for their first six-game win streak since 1992-93. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina saw its six-game home streak end with its 42-34 loss to Georgia Southern, which was the fourth-longest home winning streak in Big South history.

THREE-AND-OH-MOST

The Big South will have to wait another season for a League member to start 3-0, as Liberty's chance was thwarted by William & Mary. Just one Big South team has started a season 3-0 since the League began football in 2002 -- last year's Charleston Southern Buccaneers, which reeled off a record nine-straight wins to open a campaign. Liberty was the third Big South member to start a season 2-0 twice and the seventh overall. Coastal Carolina opened 2003 and 2004 with two wins, as did Gardner-Webb in 2005 and 2006.

WHO'S THE ROSS?

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** finished with seven tackles vs. Johnson C. Smith Saturday, and now needs eight stops to become the all-time leader in Big South history. Ross' career total stands at 357 and second-place all-time. Coastal Carolina's **JAMAR LEATH** established the record of 364 career tackles last season.

BLOCK PARTY

Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** returned a blocked field goal 68 yards for a touchdown Saturday vs. Johnson C. Smith, the third such return in Big South history. VMI's **ROBERT MASON** was the first in 2003 against Austin Peay (69-yard return), and Liberty's **JORDAN ALFORD** posted a 59-yard FG return for a touchdown vs. Elon in 2004.

THIRTY-SOMETHING

The Liberty Flames have scored at least 30 points in five consecutive ballgames (34, 38, 38, 35, 41), dating back to last season, tying the Big South record for most consecutive games with at least 30 points. Coastal Carolina established the record in 2004, and Charleston Southern equaled the mark in 2005. It is the Flames' longest such streak since reeling of seven-straight 30-point games from the end of the 1994 season (40, 40, 59) and the first four games of 1995 (76-30-48-48).

THREE-FOR-ALL

For the first time in Big South history, three players scored three touchdowns in the same weekend. Charleston Southern's **MICHAEL JEFFERSON** scored three rushing touchdowns vs. Johnson C. Smith, while Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** scored three times vs. Georgia Southern. Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** rounded out the trifecta with three TDs (two rushing, one receiving) at William & Mary. The previous League high was two players with three touchdowns each on the same day, which occurred three times.

MAY-PRAY, MAY-PRAY

VMI slotback **TIM MAYPRAY** returned a kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown Saturday at James Madison, becoming the sixth different player in Big South history to return a kickoff for a TD, and the first for VMI since **KEVIN SOLOMON** in 2001. Maypray's 86-yard return is tied for sixth-longest in Conference history, while his 52.5 average for his two returns against the Dukes is the third-highest single-game average, based on two returns.

MOVIN' ON UP

Charleston Southern redshirt-sophomore RB **MICHAEL JEFFERSON** rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries (6.9 average) vs. Johnson C. Smith, the first CSU rusher to cross the century mark since **ANDRE COPELAND** gained 122 yards on the ground at Gardner-Webb on Nov. 5, 2005. Jefferson helped the Bucs total exactly 200 rushing yards vs. the Golden Bulls, marking CSU's first 200-yard rushing game since rushing for exactly 200 yards in that same game vs. GWU two years ago. Charleston Southern had rushed for a combined 62 yards prior to Saturday's game.

A GOOD DAY FOR A RUN

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 266.0 rushing yards per game, ranking seventh in the country. The Conference record for rushing offense is 278.0 (Coastal Carolina, 2004). The Keydets are looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

The Flames' seven-point, double-overtime loss at William & Mary was the program's first overtime game since falling in triple-overtime to then-No. 14 Coastal Carolina in 2005. Meanwhile, Liberty has now seen 10 of its last 13 losses decided by seven points-or-less. The Flames suffered four setbacks by that margin last season, and five losses in 2005 were by six points-or-less.

CONTINUING THE TRADITION

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** leads the Big South with 20 receptions through three games, four more than his closest competitor (16 by Liberty's **BRANDON TURNER**). Brown, who is averaging 6.67 receptions per game, is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. In Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** against Wofford in 2005.

HEAD RUSH

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** is the Big South's leading active rusher with 1,681 career rushing yards, and is now seventh all-time in League history after passing Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (1,638) this past Saturday. Terrell stands 319 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000 rushing yards. Meanwhile, Terrell has scored a rushing touchdown in his last nine games (dating back to 2006) and has 13 in that span.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB

In addition to Liberty's **ZACH TERRELL**, the Big South has three additional active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). Below is a look at the four active rushers and where they rank in League history.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 48 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 42 contests, followed by VMI (30), Charleston Southern (23) and Liberty (21).

BENNETT, PATTON APPROACHING CENTURY MARK

Coastal Carolina's **DAVID BENNETT** and Gardner-Webb's **STEVE PATTON** both are approaching the 100 career victory milestone, as each has amassed 98 wins at the collegiate level. Bennett is 98-30, including a 35-13 mark at Coastal. Patton is 98-66-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 68-43 record at the helm of the Bulldogs.

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 108-115 in his career (=93.9) and needs 10 PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

BROCK OF LOVE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** completed 25-of-37 passes Saturday at William & Mary, setting career highs in both categories. He is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he has moved into sixth all-time in attempts (362), completions (204) and passing yards (2,708), and seventh in TD passes (17).

BIG SOUTH LANDS TWO ON NATIONAL FCS AWARD WATCH LISTS

Big South preseason players of the year **JEROME SIMPSON** and **BRIAN JOHNSTON** have been named to the initial Watch Lists for the FCS Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. Simpson is among the 16 candidates for the Walter Payton Award, while Johnston is one of 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award. Simpson's former teammate, **TYLER THIGPEN**, was a finalist for the Payton Award in 2006. Former Gardner-Webb defensive standout **MARIO WILLIAMS** was a Buchanan Award candidate back in 2004.

MMM, GOOD

Gardner-Webb quarterback **DEVIN CAMPBELL** has passed for more than 200 yards in his last three games and in six of his last seven appearances. Campbell became just the fifth Big South player with 3,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone at Ohio in Week 1, and became just the fifth QB in League history with 25 career TD passes when he reached the mark in Week 2 vs. Jacksonville. Campbell needs three passing TDs to move into fourth all-time with VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON**.

JACKSON FIVE

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** has already tallied 143 punt return yards this season, which is tied for 13th in a single-season in Conference history. Jackson set the season punt return yardage record last year with 298. Meanwhile, Jackson is rapidly climbing the League's career punt return records. He is now fourth all-time with 33 career punt returns and second with 441 yards. Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER** is the all-time leader with 42 returns, while Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** is the record-holder in yardage at 484. Alston also holds the career punt return TD mark with three.

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is approaching the No. 2 spot on the Big South's career reception chart. He is currently third all-time with 140 receptions, and needs 11 catches to tie **ZOHN BURDEN** (VMI) for second at 151. Flagler is fourth all-time in receiving yards at 1,933, and needs four yards to pass Burden (1,936) and 67 yards to become the third player in League history with 2,000 receiving yards.

SIMP-LE EQUATION

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** saw his nine-game TD reception streak end in Week 2 vs. Winston-Salem State by one yard. He hauled in a 50-yard grab down the right sideline late in the fourth quarter and was downed at the 1-yard line. Meanwhile, he is now fourth all-time in the Big South in receptions (129) and second in receiving yards at 2,230 -- 199 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson is the Big South's career leader with 34 touchdown receptions -- 26.4 percent of his 129 receptions.

PLAYING CATCH UP

Liberty wide receivers **BRANDON TURNER** and **WYNTON JACKSON**, who became the 10th and 11th players, respectively, with 100 career receptions in Week 1, have posted nearly identical career receiving totals. Turner has 113 catches and 1,471 yards in his career at Liberty, while Jackson has 107 receptions and 1,442 yards. Turner ranks ninth in League history in both receptions and yardage, while Jackson is 11th in catches and 10th in yards.

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty return specialist **WYNTON JACKSON** set two Big South punt return records in Week 2 vs. Shippensburg. Jackson's 88-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest punt return in League history, breaking the previous mark of 87 yards, established by Coastal Carolina's **GREG WILLIAMSON** at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. Jackson also became the first player in Big South history to return a punt for a touchdown in back-to-back games, and his two punt return touchdowns this season ties the League's single-season record, now shared by four players. Coupled with his 65-yard punt return TD in Week 1 vs. Tusculum, Jackson now owns two of the five-longest punt returns in Conference history.

THE LATE, LATE SHOW

The Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN) will re-air the Flames Television Network's Nov. 10 VMI-Liberty game at 11:00pm that same evening. MASN also is producing two live Big South broadcasts this year -- the Nov. 3 Coastal Carolina-Liberty game and the No. 17 Liberty-Gardner-Webb tilts.

UPCOMING RECEIVING MILESTONES

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** needs 49 receiving yards for 1,000 in his career, while Coastal Carolina WR **SANTINI WASHINGTON** is 180 yards shy of the same milestone.

FULL MONT-Y

Gardner-Webb sophomore RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 11 carries in Week 2 vs. Jacksonville, including touchdown runs of 29 and 74 yards against the Dolphins. He is now just the third player in Big South history with two runs over 70 (he had a 73-yarder last year at Southeastern Louisiana) in his career, joining Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (2) and **MIKE TOLBERT** (2). Montgomery's 74-yard scamper is the seventh-longest rush from scrimmage in Big South history, and he now owns two of the top eight longest runs in League history. Meanwhile, his average yards per carry of 13.18 against Jacksonville is now the second-best single-game per carry average in the Big South, based on the minimum of 10 rushes.

RUNNING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

VMI true freshman **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** recorded the longest rush from scrimmage in Big South history when he scored an 83-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter vs. Lock Haven in Week 1. Rainey-Wiles' effort surpassed the previous long of 80 yards, first set by Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** vs. Liberty in 2002 and equalled last season by Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** vs. VMI. Rainey-Wiles finished with 91 rushing yards on seven carries vs. the Bald Eagles.

200 POINTS

Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the fourth player in Big South history to score 200 points in a career when he scored on a 33-yard touchdown reception at Delaware State in Week 1. Simpson now has 204 career points. Of the four players in League history with 200 points, three are from Coastal Carolina: Simpson, **JOSH HOKE** (297) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286).

ROLL CALL

Through two home games, Liberty is averaging 13,628 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 62,268 fans through eight home dates, an average of 7,784. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK OFF TO GREAT START

The Seawolves opened the 2007 campaign with wins over Georgetown and Bucknell, but suffered a setback at nationally-ranked Youngstown State last week. Stony Brook has received votes the past two weeks in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll, and returns home Saturday. Below is Stony Brook's 2007 schedule and results.
