**WILLIAM RICHARDSON • QB • R-Junior**  
 Coastal Carolina • Sumter, S.C.

Richardson passed for a career-high 301 yards on 16-of-24 passing (66.7 percent) and one touchdown in leading the Chanticleers in their 28-21 come-from-behind win over Winston-Salem State. In just his second career start, Richardson led four scoring drives of 60 yards-or-more, including the final two scoring drives (69 and 60) that led to the game-winning points. He also led Coastal in converting 7-of-16 third down opportunities, including a 36-yard pass on 3rd-and-30 that eventually turned into Coastal's first points of the game. Of Richardson's 16 pass completions, 13 went for at least 10 yards, including six greater than 25 yards, as he became just the eighth different player in Big South history to pass for 300 yards in a game.

**NEW BALANCE**  
**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**BRIAN JOHNSTON • DE • Senior**  
 Gardner-Webb • San Diego, Calif.

Johnston was the driving force in a dominant performance by the Gardner-Webb defense, helping the unit hold Jacksonville to a mere 12 yards on the ground (on 31 carries), no touchdowns and just 213 total yards overall. He tallied eight tackles (four solo, four assisted), 3.5 tackles for loss (29 yards), one sack for a loss of eight yards, three quarterback hurries and two pass break-ups from his defensive end position. Johnston faced double teams all night and was triple-teamed on occasion.

Jackson set two Big South punt return records Saturday vs. Shippensburg. His 88-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest punt return in League history, breaking the previous mark of 87 yards, established by Coastal Carolina's Greg Williamson in 2003. Jackson also became the first player in Big South history to return a punt for a touchdown in back-to-back games. In addition, he caught three passes for 106 yards in Saturday's win and scored on TD passes of 22 yards and 65 yards following his punt return touchdown, and ended the game with 194 all-purpose yards.

**FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

O'Neal recorded 152 all-purpose yards in Saturday's win over Winston-Salem State. He led the Chanticleers with 77 rushing yards on 17 carries (4.5 per rush) and caught two passes for 44 yards, including a 28-yard reception on 3rd-and-8 that kept alive a drive that led to CCU's second touchdown of the night. O'Neal also returned a kickoff 31 yards.

**LIBERTY MOVES TO 2-0 FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT SEASON, EXTENDS WIN STREAK TO FIVE**

Big South preseason favorite Liberty is 2-0 for the second consecutive year following its 35-14 home win over Shippensburg Saturday. It was the Flames' fifth-straight win, dating back to last season, and the program's third five-game winning streak since 2003. In '03 and '04, Liberty won its final four games of the season plus the season opener the following years ('04 and '05). The last time Liberty won six consecutive games was during the 1992-93 seasons. LU ended the 1992 season with three consecutive wins and then opened the 1993 season at 3-0. The last time Liberty started 3-0 was in 1997 when the Flames opened 4-0.

**BIG SOUTH TO MAKE ITS SEASON TELEVISION PREMIERE SATURDAY ON SPORTSOUTH**

The Big South Conference's first televised game of the season will be this Saturday's Georgia Southern at Coastal Carolina contest live on SportSouth at 7:00pm. **TOM WERME** (play-by-play) and **ROD SMITH** (analyst) will call the action. It will be the first of three televised games on SportSouth this season. The network will also air the Oct. 27 Charleston Southern at Gardner-Webb game and the Nov. 17 regular-season finale between CSU and Coastal Carolina.

**TWO-AND-OH HISTORY**

Liberty is now the third Big South member to start a season 2-0 twice since the League began sponsoring football in 2002, and the seventh overall. Coastal Carolina opened 2003 and 2004 with two wins, as did Gardner-Webb in 2005 and 2006. Just one team has started a season 3-0 -- last year's Charleston Southern Buccaneers, which reeled off a record nine-straight wins to open a campaign. Liberty will have a tough task this weekend as the Flames visit William & Mary Saturday.

**TWO HOME STREAKS REMAIN INTACT**

Coastal Carolina won its sixth consecutive home game with Saturday's 28-21 come-from-behind victory over Winston-Salem State at Brooks Stadium. The string is the fourth-longest home winning streak in Big South history. Liberty captured its fourth consecutive home win Saturday as well, its longest home win streak since winning five-straight at Williams Stadium from Oct. 4, 2003-Sept. 4, 2004. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern puts its nine-game home win streak on the line this Saturday with its home opener vs. Johnson C. Smith.

**ACTION JACKSON**

Liberty return specialist **WYNTON JACKSON** set two Big South punt return records Saturday vs. Shippensburg. Jackson's 88-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest punt return in League history, breaking the previous mark of 87 yards, established by Coastal Carolina's **GREG WILLIAMSON** at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. Jackson also became the first player in Big South history to return a punt for a touchdown in back-to-back games, and his two punt return touchdowns this season ties the League's single-season record, now shared by four players. Coupled with last week's 65-yard punt return TD, Jackson now owns two of the five-longest punt returns in Conference history.

**COASTAL'S TOLBERT JOINS 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB**

Coastal Carolina fullback **MIKE TOLBERT** became the 17th player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards Saturday vs. Winston-Salem State. He stands exactly at 1,000 following his 5-carry, 26-yard effort vs. the Rams. Tolbert is now the fourth Coastal Carolina player with 1,000 career rushing yards, joining **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343), **PATRICK HALL** (2,214) and **TYLER THIGPEN** (1,638).

**FULL MONT-Y**

Gardner-Webb sophomore RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 11 carries Saturday vs. Jacksonville, including touchdown runs of 29 and 74 yards against the Dolphins. He is now just the third player in Big South history with two runs over 70 (he had a 73-yarder last year at Southeastern Louisiana) in his career, joining Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (2) and **MIKE TOLBERT** (2). Montgomery's 74-yard scamper is the seventh-longest rush from scrimmage in Big South history, and he now owns two of the top eight longest runs in League history. Meanwhile, his average yards per carry of 13.18 against Jacksonville is now the second-best single-game per carry average in the Big South, based on the minimum of 10 rushes.

**MMM, GOOD**

Gardner-Webb quarterback **DEVIN CAMPBELL** has passed for more than 200 yards in his last three games and in six of his last seven appearances. Campbell became just the fifth Big South player with 3,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone at Ohio in Week 1, and became just the fifth QB in League history with 25 career TD passes this past Saturday vs. Jacksonville. Campbell needs three passing TDs to move into fourth all-time with VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON**.

**BIG SOUTH LANDS TWO ON NATIONAL FCS AWARD WATCH LISTS**

Big South preseason players of the year **JEROME SIMPSON** and **BRIAN JOHNSTON** have been named to the initial Watch Lists for the FCS Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. Simpson is among the 16 candidates for the Walter Payton Award, while Johnston is one of 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award. Simpson's former teammate, **TYLER THIGPEN**, was a finalist for the Payton Award in 2006. Former Gardner-Webb defensive standout **MARIO WILLIAMS** was a Buchanan Award candidate back in 2004.

**BENNETT, PATTON APPROACHING CENTURY MARK**

Coastal Carolina's **DAVID BENNETT** and Gardner-Webb's **STEVE PATTON** both are approaching the 100 career victory milestone, as each has amassed 98 wins at the collegiate level. Bennett is 98-29, including a 35-12 mark at Coastal. Patton is 98-66-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 68-43 record at the helm of the Bulldogs.

**BAKER'S DOZEN**

Charleston Southern junior WR **DEE BROWN** caught 13 passes Saturday at Wofford, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** against Wofford in 2005.

**THIRTY-SOMETHING**

In addition to its current five-game win streak, the Liberty Flames have scored at least 30 points in four consecutive ballgames, dating back to last season. The last time LU accomplished the feat was in the final three games of the 2003 season (69, 38, 49), plus the 2004 opener (55). The Big South record for most consecutive games with at least 30 points is five, shared by Coastal Carolina (2004) and Charleston Southern (2005).

**JACKSON FIVE**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** has already tallied 143 punt return yards this season, which is tied for 13th in a single-season in Conference history. Jackson set the season punt return yardage record last year with 298. Meanwhile, Jackson is rapidly climbing the League's career punt return records. He is now fourth all-time with 33 career punt returns and second with 441 yards. Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER** is the all-time leader with 42 returns, while Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** is the record-holder in yardage at 484. Alston also holds the career punt return TD mark with three.

**KICK START**

Coastal Carolina true freshman **JUSTIN DURHAM** made three field goals Saturday vs. Winston-Salem State, pushing his season total to five through two games. He is 5-of-7 ( =71.4) with a long of 44. He needs just four more FGs to move into the League's all-time season Top 10.

**BYRD IS THE WORD**

Charleston Southern sophomore QB **ELI BYRD** was 28-of-46 passing ( =60.9) for 264 yards with two touchdowns Saturday at Wofford in just his second career start. Byrd's 28 completions tied for third-most in a game by a Big South QB, and his 46 attempts also ranked third in League history. CSU passers finished 31-of-52 against the Terriers. The 31 completions tied for third-most in a game by one team, while the 52 attempts were second-highest in a contest, just one attempt from tying the League record.

**ROSS FOR LESS**

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** is closing in on the Big South record for career tackles, as he is just 15 away from the all-time mark of 364, set by **JAMAR LEATH** (Coastal Carolina), which was established last season. Ross has 27 stops after two games, pushing his career total to 350 and second-place all-time after passing Liberty's **MANNY ROJAS** last Saturday.

**HEAD RUSH**

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** is the Big South's leading active rusher with 1,623 career rushing yards, and is now eighth all-time in League history. He needs 16 yards to surpass **TYLER THIGPEN** (1,638) for seventh and 77 yards for 1,700 in his career. Terrell also stands 377 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000 rushing yards. Meanwhile, Terrell has scored a rushing touchdown in his last eight games (dating back to 2006) and has 12 in that span.

**A GOOD DAY FOR A RUN**

VMI leads the Big South with 323.0 rushing yards per game, ranking third in the country. No Big South member has ever averaged 300.0 rushing yards per game since the League began in 2002, as the Conference record is 278.0 (Coastal Carolina, 2004). The Keydets are looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons.

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 47 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 42 contests, followed by VMI (29), Charleston Southern (22) and Liberty (20).

**WELCOME TO THE CLUB**

VMI running back **NAT JACKSON**, who became the 16th player in Big South history to surpass the 1,000 career rushing yard milestone during Week 1, is 15th in League history at 1,092, just ahead of Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** (1,020 career yards) and Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** (1,000). Jackson needs 52 yards to catch **TRAVIS MAYS** (Charleston Southern) for 14th place (1,144).

**FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY**

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is approaching the No. 2 spot on the Big South's career reception chart. He is currently third all-time with 140 receptions, and needs 11 catches to tie **ZOHN BURDEN** (VMI) for second at 151. Flagler is fourth all-time in receiving yards at 1,933, and needs four yards to pass Burden (1,936) and 67 yards to become the third player in League history with 2,000 receiving yards.

**HE MAKES IT LOOK SO SIMP-LE**

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** saw his nine-game TD reception streak end Saturday vs. Winston-Salem State by one yard. He hauled in a 50-yard grab down the right sideline late in the fourth quarter and was downed at the 1-yard line. He is sixth all-time in the Big South in receptions (126) and needs two catches for sole possession of fourth-place. He is second in receiving yards with 2,181 and is 248 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson is the Big South's career leader with 34 touchdown receptions -- 27.0 percent of his 126 receptions.

**PLAYING CATCH UP**

Liberty wide receivers **BRANDON TURNER** and **WYNTON JACKSON**, who became the 10th and 11th players, respectively, with 100 career receptions in Week 1, have posted nearly identical career receiving totals. Turner has 105 catches and 1,416 yards in his career at Liberty, while Jackson has 103 receptions and 1,401 yards. Turner ranks 10th in League history in receptions and ninth in yardage, while Jackson is 11th in catches and 10th in yards.

**WHO'S NEXT?**

Charleston Southern junior WR **MARKUS MURRY** is on pace to become the 12th player with 1,000 career receiving yards, as he is at 951 after two games this season.

**RUNNING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS**

VMI true freshman **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** recorded the longest rush from scrimmage in Big South history when he scored an 83-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter vs. Lock Haven in Week 1. Rainey-Wiles' effort surpassed the previous long of 80 yards, first set by Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** vs. Liberty in 2002 and equalled last season by Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** vs. VMI. Rainey-Wiles finished with 91 rushing yards on seven carries vs. the Bald Eagles.

**PAT ON THE BACK**

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 103-110 in his career ( =93.6) and needs 15 PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

**200 POINTS**

Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the fourth player in Big South history to score 200 points in a career when he scored on a 33-yard touchdown reception at Delaware State in Week 1. Simpson now has 204 career points. Of the four players in League history with 200 points, three are from Coastal Carolina: Simpson, **JOSH HOKE** (297) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286).

**ROLL CALL**

For the second-straight week, Liberty enjoyed an overflow crowd at Williams Stadium, as 12,331 fans witnessed Saturday's 35-14 win over Shippensburg. Through two games, Liberty is averaging 13,628 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 51,436 fans through six home dates, an average of 8,573. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

**BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER**

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.
