**KYLE HUGHES • QB • Sophomore  
VMI • Williamsburg, Va.**

Hughes rushed for 136 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns (scoring on runs of 71 and four yards) and threw for 108 yards and two touchdowns in leading VMI to its 40-13 win at Robert Morris, the Keydets' first road win in 12 games, dating back to 2005. Hughes became the fourth different QB in Big South history with 100 rushing yards and 100 passing yards in the same game, and his 136 rushing output is the third-most by a quarterback in League annals. Hughes completed touchdown strikes of 49 and 32 yards, with the 32-yarder coming on 4th-and-8 to help quell a Robert Morris rally, as the Colonials had closed within 20-13. Hughes also engineered back-to-back 80-yard scoring drives as VMI pulled away in the second half.

**NEW BALANCE  
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**BRIAN JOHNSTON • DE • Senior  
Gardner-Webb • San Diego, Calif.**

Johnston earns his second weekly award of the season after recording a career-high 14 tackles, 3.0 TFL (minus-6 yards), and a pair of half sacks, one pass break-up, a school-record seven quarterback hurries and five QB knockdowns in Gardner-Webb's 20-13 win over Austin Peay. Three of his pressures came on Austin Peay's final drive of the game. With the Governors' offense inside the GWU red zone and less than a minute left, Johnston pressured bad throws on Austin Peay's final two plays from scrimmage. Johnston also helped the Bulldogs' defense hold All-America back Chris Fletcher under 100 yards for the first time in 10 games and limit the nation's 21st-ranked rushing offense to just 93 yards.

**SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**WYNTON JACKSON • RS • R-Senior  
Liberty • Jacksonville, Fla.**

Jackson paced the Flames' special teams return game in Saturday's 68-10 win against St. Francis. He finished the contest with five punt returns for 60 yards (12.0 average), including a long return of 18 yards, and in the process became the Big South's all-time leader with 503 career punt return yards. Jackson tacked on three kickoff returns for 83 yards (27.7 average), and his eight total returns led to four LU touchdowns and one field goal. He finished the game with 267 all-purpose yards - second-highest in Big South history, 143 of which came on kick returns.

**FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

**BRYAN BARNSON • WR  
VMI • Chesapeake, Va.**

Barnson caught two touchdown passes in VMI's 40-13 win at Robert Morris. He notched his first career TD with a career-long 49-yard score with 4:17 left in the first quarter to give the Keydets a 7-0 lead. With VMI leading 20-13 and facing a 4th-and-8, Barnson's 32-yard touchdown catch capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive that helped VMI pull away from the Colonials. Barnson finished the day with two catches for 81 yards, becoming the first Keydet with two receiving touchdowns in a game since Mike Maleski in 2005.

**VMI's TRIPLE HEADER**

VMI became the first team in Big South football history to have three players rush for 100 yards in the same game this past Saturday at Robert Morris. FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** led VMI in rushing for the fifth consecutive game with 157 yards, followed by QB **KYLE HUGHES'** 136. RB **JOEY ROBINSON** hit the century mark on his final carry, a six-yard TD run that gave him exactly 100 for the contest. The Keydets finished with 443 rushing yards against the Colonials, the second-highest team rushing total in Big South history. Liberty owns the record at 459, set against Norfolk State in 2003.

**A HUGHES EFFORT**

VMI sophomore QB **KYLE HUGHES** recorded the fifth 100-yard rushing, 100-yard passing game for a Big South quarterback and the fourth different signal-caller to do so with his 136-rushing, 108-passing yard output at Robert Morris. Of the five occurrences, Hughes is the first to have more rushing yards than passing yards. Below is a look at the other members of the Big South's 100 rush/100 pass games:

**MORE ON HUGHES**

Keydet QB **KYLE HUGHES'** 136 rushing yards at Robert Morris are the third-most by a quarterback in League history, falling just four yards short of the single-game record of 140, set by Elon's **C.W. SINGLETARY** at North Carolina A&T in 2002. Hughes' 71-yard TD run Saturday was the third-longest rush of scrimmage by a quarterback in Big South history, and the 10th-longest overall.

**LIBERTY EXTENDS HOME WIN STREAK TO FIVE GAMES**

Liberty pushed its home win streak to five games with Saturday's 68-10 rout of Saint Francis. The last time the Flames won six consecutive home games was in 1998-99, when Liberty won seven-straight from Sept. 26, 1998 to Oct. 2, 1999. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 39.2 points and holding opponents to 11.6 points per game. The Flames' next home game is Oct. 27 against future Big South member Presbyterian College.

**PATTON, BENNETT APPROACHING CENTURY MARK**

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** has amassed 99 wins at the collegiate level, while Coastal Carolina's **DAVID BENNETT** owns 98 career coaching victories. Patton is 99-67-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 69-44 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. Bennett is 98-31, including a 35-14 mark at Coastal. Patton's first chance at 100 wins is Saturday at No. 5 Appalachian State.

**ZACH ATTACK**

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** scored on a 75-yard touchdown run Saturday vs. Saint Francis, giving him a rushing touchdown in all five games this season and in 11 consecutive games, dating back to 2006. He has scored 15 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 20, which is third all-time in Big South history and two away from second-place (VMI's **SEAN MIZZER**, 22). Meanwhile, Terrell rushed for 115 yards on just five carries Saturday to push his career total to an even 1,800, which is sixth all-time in Big South history. He stands 200 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000 rushing yards.

**GROUND GAINERS**

The Big South has already had four runs of 70 yards-or-longer this season, matching the League's single-season record set in 2006. This year's four runs each have cracked the League's all-time Top 10 for longest rushes from scrimmage. The updated Top 10 listing is as follows:

**TOUCH SCHEDULE**

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as the League's 13 non-Conference losses have all come against Top 50 competition in the nation. Three of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents; four have been against Top 25 FCS teams, two have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon), and the remaining four defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (The Citadel, Georgia Southern, William & Mary, Lehigh).

**TURNING 60**

Liberty became the second team in Big South football history to score more than 60 points in a game with its 68-point output Saturday vs. Saint Francis, joining Coastal Carolina in that category. The Flames' total was the most since Coastal Carolina scored 71 points against Mansfield in 2005, and the third-highest single-game scoring total in League annals. The 2003 Liberty squad scored 69 points against Norfolk State. The Flames' nine touchdowns against the Red Flashes are tied for second-most in a game in Big South history.

**ROAD WORK**

VMI's 40-13 win at Robert Morris Saturday was its first road win since a 10-7 victory at Liberty on Oct. 1, 2005, ending a 12-game winless streak away from home. It marked the first time that the Keydets scored 40 points in a game since scoring 52 points in a triple-overtime loss to Gardner-Webb on Oct. 22, 2005. It also was the first time VMI scored 40 points on the road since scoring 47 vs. William & Mary at the Oyster Bowl in Norfolk, Va. in 1990. The last time VMI scored 40 points in a road win was in 1986, when the Keydets won 47-30 at The Citadel.

**MAN WITH A PURPOSE**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** totaled 267 all-purpose yards Saturday vs. Saint Francis, the second-highest single-game total in Big South history. Jackson posted 115 receiving yards, 83 kickoff return yards, 60 punt return yards and nine rushing yards, and missed the Big South single-game record by three yards. Former Liberty standout **SAM GADO** set the record of 270 all-purpose yards against Gardner-Webb in 2004.

**ELI-ELI-O**

Charleston Southern QB **ELI BYRD** set two Big South single-game records in Saturday's 46-33 comeback win at North Greenville. Byrd set League marks with 34 completions and 54 attempts, breaking the old records of 31 completions (**COLLIN DRAFTS** - Nov. 4, 2006) and 50 attempts (**DARREN SWIGGETT** - Nov. 21, 2002). Byrd finished the night with 398 passing yards, third-most in a game in Big South history, and 423 yards of total offense, which is the fourth-highest single-game output in League annals. He also tossed a career-high four TD passes.

**CSU APPROACHING BIG SOUTH HOME WIN STREAK RECORD**

Charleston Southern will look to tie the Big South record for consecutive home wins when the Bucs host Savannah State Saturday, Oct. 6. CSU has won 11 consecutive home games, which is tied for second-longest in Big South history and one shy of tying the record of 12, set by Coastal Carolina. CSU won its final four home games of 2005 (beginning with its 63-42 victory over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15), continued with a perfect 6-0 mark at home last year, and reached 11-straight with its 44-20 win over Johnson C. Smith in Week 3.

**JADA KNIGHT**

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, and his record-total stands at 376 following his nine-tackle performance at North Greenville. Ross broke the previous mark of 364, which was established last season by Coastal Carolina's **JAMAR LEATH**.

**WHAT A RUSH!**

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 283.8 rushing yards per game, ranking fifth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI's maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,122 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past six games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 49 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 44 contests, followed by VMI (32), Charleston Southern (25) and Liberty (21).

**FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY**

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** became the No. 2 all-time leading receiver in Big South history Saturday vs. Austin Peay. He hauled in 11 receptions to push his career total to 157, surpassing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN** (151). Flagler is now just 45 catches from the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Meanwhile, Flagler totaled 153 receiving yards against Austin Peay to become the third player in Big South history with 2,000 receiving yards. He is third all-time with 2,143. Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** is second with 2,269 yards, while Price is first with 2,429.

**JACKSON FIVE**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** broke the Big South career record for punt return yardage during Saturday's game vs. Saint Francis, as he totaled 60 punt return yards to push his career total to 503, surpassing Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON**'s career record of 484. Jackson is second all-time in returns with 39, just three shy of Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER**'s all-time mark of 42. Meanwhile, Jackson has already tallied 205 punt return yards this season, which is sixth-most in a single-season in Conference history.

**BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB**

In addition to Liberty's **ZACH TERRELL**, the Big South has three additional active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). Below is a look at the four active rushers and where they rank in League history.

**SIMP-LE EQUATION**

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** ended his two-game touchdown drought with a six-yard TD grab at James Madison in Week 4, which was his 35th career touchdown catch. The last time Simpson went two games without a TD reception was in the final two games of the 2005 season. He is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (133) and second in receiving yards at 2,269 - 160 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson has caught 26.3 percent of his receptions for touchdowns.

**PLAYING CATCH UP**

Liberty wide receivers **BRANDON TURNER** and **WYNTON JACKSON** became the 10th and 11th players, respectively, with 100 career receptions in Week 1, and also became the 9th and 10th players to surpass 1,500 career receiving yards during the same game at Elon in Week 4. The duo has posted nearly identical career receiving totals, but Jackson is beginning to pull away in yardage and touchdowns. Charleston Southern junior WR **MARKUS MURRY** became the 15th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he reached the milestone Saturday at North Greenville. Murry returned from a two-game injury to catch six passes for 88 yards, pushing his career total to 1,039. Murry is the fourth CSU player with 1,000 receiving yards in Big South history, matching Gardner-Webb for the most players in the category.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

Liberty recorded a blocked punt return for a touchdown Saturday against Saint Francis, its third punt return TD of the season, tying the Big South single-season record. The 2004 Liberty Flames also returned three punts for touchdowns.

**CONTINUING THE TRADITION**

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** leads the Big South with 31 receptions through five games, just two ahead of his closest competitor (29 by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**). Brown, who is averaging 6.20 receptions per game, is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. In Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Flagler against Wofford in 2005.

**PAT ON THE BACK**

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 114-121 in his career (=94.2) and needs four PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177. Meanwhile, Ellis saw his perfect kick streak end at 15 when he missed a 44-yard field goal at 6:10 of the first quarter Saturday at North Greenville. He is still a perfect 16-of-16 on PAT kicks this season.

**BROCK OF LOVE**

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone Saturday vs. Saint Francis. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he has moved into sixth all-time in attempts (409), completions (229), passing yards (3,124), and TD passes (19).

**"MAY-PRAY, MAY-PRAY"**

VMI slotback **TIM MAYPRAY** set a school record for all-purpose yards in a game when he piled up 245 at Lehigh in Week 4, topping the previous high of 233 by **SEAN MIZZER** against Davidson on Sept. 6, 2003. Against Lehigh, Maypray rushed for 45 yards on nine carries, caught three passes for 53 yards, returned five kickoffs for 126 yards and notched one punt return for 21 yards. Meanwhile, Maypray is among the national leaders in kickoff and punt returns. He ranks 16th nationally with his 29.1 kickoff return average, and stands 18th in punt return average at 12.3 yards.

**FERG-A-LICIOUS**

Charleston Southern running back **ALEXIUS FERGUSON** surpassed 200 all-purpose yards in Week 4, as he finished with 225 at Hawai'i. Of his 225 yards, Ferguson totaled 179 on a Big South single-game record nine kickoff returns. He also added 27 rushing yards and 19 receiving yards. Ferguson's 179 kickoff return yards are second-most in a game in League annals.

**NOT A MEMORABLE FIRST**

For the first time in its young football history, Coastal Carolina has dropped three consecutive road games. The Chanticleers lost at Appalachian State in last year's playoffs, fell at Delaware State in this year's season opener, and was defeated at James Madison in Week 4.

**KICK START**

VMI slotback **TIM MAYPRAY** returned a kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown at James Madison in Week 3, becoming the sixth different player in Big South history to return a kickoff for a TD, and the first for VMI since **KEVIN SOLOMON** in 2001. Maypray's 86-yard return is tied for sixth-longest in Conference history, while his 52.5 average for his two returns against the Dukes is the third-highest single-game average, based on two returns. Maypray is averaging 29.1 yards per kick return, and is on pace to set the Big South single-season record should he average 1.2 kickoff returns this year.

**ACTION JACKSON**

Liberty return specialist **WYNTON JACKSON** set two Big South punt return records in Week 2 vs. Shippensburg. Jackson's 88-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest punt return in League history, breaking the previous mark of 87 yards, established by Coastal Carolina's **GREG WILLIAMSON** at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. Jackson also became the first player in Big South history to return a punt for a touchdown in back-to-back games, and his two punt return touchdowns this season ties the League's single-season record, now shared by four players. Coupled with his 65-yard punt return TD in Week 1 vs. Tusculum, Jackson now owns two of the five-longest punt returns in Conference history.

**ROLL CALL**

Through three home games, Liberty is averaging 13,716 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 80,961 fans through 10 home dates, an average of 8,096. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

**UPCOMING RECEIVING MILESTONES**

Coastal Carolina WR **SANTINI WASHINGTON** is 131 yards shy of becoming the 16th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards. Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** needs four receptions to move into a tie for 15th all-time with 78 catches.

**BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER**

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

**STONY BROOK PLUGGING ALONG AT 3-2**

The Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 three-straight weeks in September, and are currently ranked No. 10 in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll this week. Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the fourth player in Big South history to score 200 points in a career when he scored on a 33-yard touchdown reception at Delaware State in Week 1. Simpson now has 210 career points. Of the four players in League history with 200 points, three are from Coastal Carolina: Simpson, **JOSH HOKE** (297) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286).

**BIG SOUTH LANDS TWO ON NATIONAL FCS AWARD WATCH LISTS**

Big South preseason players of the year **JEROME SIMPSON** and **BRIAN JOHNSTON** have been named to the initial Watch Lists for the FCS Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. Simpson is among the 16 candidates for the Walter Payton Award, while Johnston is one of 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award. Simpson's former teammate, **TYLER THIGPEN**, was a finalist for the Payton Award in 2006. Former Gardner-Webb defensive standout **MARIO WILLIAMS** was a Buchanan Award candidate back in 2004.
