Jennings rushed for a season-high 160 yards on 24 carries in Liberty's 35-34 loss at Toledo, finishing the game with two touchdowns. Jennings capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive with a 2-yard TD to give Liberty a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. After Toledo moved ahead 10-7 in the second quarter, Jennings scored on a 63-yard touchdown run on the ensuing drive to push the Flames back ahead, 14-10. He averaged 6.7 yards per carry, and his 160 yards marked the third-highest rushing performance of his Liberty career.

**NEW BALANCE
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Charleston Southern • Orange Park, Fla.

Warrior had eight tackles, including five solo, in the Bucs' 28-0 win over Savannah State. He posted three tackles for loss of 22 yards and a fourth quarter interception at the CSU 7-yard line that ended SSU's last scoring threat. Warrior helped the Bucs defense hold Savannah State to 66 total yards (40 rushing, 26 passing) and 1.1 yards per play. Savannah State entered the game averaging 259 yards of total offense and 163 rushing yards.

Ellis tied a Big South single-game record with four field goals in Saturday's 28-0 win over Savannah State. He hit from 28, 29, 37 and 43 yards to become the second kicker in League history with a perfect 4-4 field goal performance. Ellis also nailed both extra points of the day and finished with a career-high 14 points. As a punter, he averaged 43.2 yards on three kicks, including a 50-yarder.

Frasier recorded a career-high 12 tackles in his first career start at Furman to lead the Chanticleer defense. On the opening drive, Frasier had a pair of tackles on second and third down to force the Paladins to try to convert a fourth down, which failed. He also had one other drive-ending tackle in the game and helped the defense give up a season-low total in rushing yards and passing yards by an opponent.

LIBERTY FALLS ONE POINT SHY OF BIG SOUTH HISTORY

The Liberty Flames concluded the Big South's four-game schedule against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents this season with a 35-34 loss Saturday at Toledo, falling short of becoming the first Big South team since the League started football in 2002 to defeat an FBS program. Liberty's 34 points are the most by a Big South member against an FBS squad, bettering the 21 points the Flames scored against Akron in 2002.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN TIES BIG SOUTH HOME WIN STREAK RECORD

Charleston Southern blanked Savannah State at home Saturday, 28-0, for its 12th consecutive home win, which ties the Big South record set by Coastal Carolina from 2004-05. CSU won its final four home games of 2005 (beginning with its 63-42 victory over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15), continued with a perfect 6-0 mark at home last year, and is 2-0 at home this season. The Buccaneers' next home game is their Big South opener on Saturday, Oct. 20 vs. Liberty.

TOUGHEST SCHEDULE

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as the League's 16 non-Conference losses have all come against top competition in the nation. Four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents; five have been against Top 25 FCS teams, three have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel), and the remaining four defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (Georgia Southern, William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

JENNINGS' JAUNTS

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for 160 yards and two touchdowns Saturday at Toledo, his eighth 100-yard rushing game in 15 appearances for the Flames -- five of which have been games with 160 yards-or-more. He also rushed for more than one TD in a game for the fifth time. Jennings' 160 yards moved him into the Top 10 on the League's career rushing chart, as he now owns the 10th spot at 1,443. He needs 112 yards for ninth-place.

CAR CHASE

Charleston Southern DB **JONATHAN CARMON** has recorded two of his three interceptions in back-to-back games, and his 99 interception return yards this year are third-most in a single-season in Big South history. He needs four INT yards for second-highest. The Big South single-season record for interception return yards is 168, held by Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** in 2003.

EXTINGUISHERS

Liberty DB **RYAN GREISER** returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown Saturday at Toledo, giving Liberty three returned INTs for scores this year, tying the Big South single-season record. Gardner-Webb returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2004.

PASSING GRADES

Coastal Carolina continues to lead the nation in pass defense, holding opponents to just 71.8 passing yards per game. The Chanticleers have limited foes to 32-of-66 passing (=48.5 percent) and 359 yards, an average of 5.4 yards per catch. Coastal has held opponents to under 100 yards passing in four of its five games. The Big South season record for passing defense is 131.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2004.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

Liberty has scored at least 30 points in five of its six games this season and is averaging a Big South-best 38.3 points per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference record of 37.5, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. The Flames have already scored 30 touchdowns this season (24 on offense), and WR **WYNTON JACKSON** leads the Big South with eight TDs. Liberty has never led the Big South in scoring offense, and Jackson is looking to become just the second Liberty player to lead the League in touchdowns scored (**EUGENE GOODMAN** with 14 in 2003).

NICK CAN KICK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** tied a Big South single-game record with four field goals made against Savannah State this past Saturday. Ellis is the third different kicker on the list, joining VMI's **MATT SHARPE**, who made four FG in a game twice, and Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE**. Meanwhile, Ellis is just the second kicker to post a 4-4 field goal performance. Sharpe was the first, connecting on all four field goal attempts vs. Gardner-Webb on Oct. 18, 2003. Ellis leads the Big South with eight field goals, hitting 8-of-10 on the year.

JOHNSTON SACKS DEFENSIVE RECORDS

Gardner-Webb DL **BRIAN JOHNSTON** became the Big South's all-time leader in tackles-for-loss and quarterback sacks Saturday at Appalachian State. He registered 2.0 TFL and a sack against the Mountaineers, pushing his career totals to 37.5 TFL and 17.5 QB sacks, respectively. Johnston surpassed Coastal Carolina's **MAURICE SIMPKINS** on the TFL list (36.0), and jumped ahead of current Chanticleer **ADRAIN GRADY** on the sacks list. Grady has 17.0 career QB sacks, but has yet to record one this season.

BOLDEN CHILD

Liberty kick returner **DOMINIC BOLDEN** returned five kickoffs for 141 yards Saturday at Toledo, the seventh-highest single-game kickoff return yardage in Big South history. One of his returns went for 72 yards, which is the 10th-longest return in Conference annals. Bolden's career kickoff return yardage total now stands at 693, which ranks seventh all-time in the Big South. He has returned 26 kickoffs in his career for an average of 26.65 yards.

JADA KNIGHT

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS**, who became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, needs 11 stops to become the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles. Ross' record total stands at 389 following his 13 tackles Saturday vs. Savannah State.

WHAT A RUSH!

VMI leads the Big South with 283.8 rushing yards per game, ranking fifth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI's maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,122 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past six games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

PRESBYTERIAN TO FACE FUTURE BIG SOUTH BRETHEN THE NEXT THREE WEEKS

Future Big South member Presbyterian College will begin a three-week stretch of playing future Conference opponents beginning Saturday, Oct. 13 at VMI. The Blue Hose will play four of the five Big South football members this year, all on the road. The lone foe PC will not face is Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** needs 135 all-purpose yards to become the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 in a career. He is currently at 2,865 and is leading the Conference this season with 850 all-purpose yards and a 141.7 per game average. In Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, Jackson totaled 267 all-purpose yards, the second-highest single-game total in Big South history. Jackson posted 115 receiving yards, 83 kickoff return yards, 60 punt return yards and nine rushing yards, and missed the Big South single-game record by three yards. Former Liberty standout **SAM GADO** set the record of 270 all-purpose yards against Gardner-Webb in 2004. Jackson's current per game clip of 141.7 is pacing ahead of the Big South record of 140.6, set by Gado in '04.

PATTON, BENNETT APPROACHING CENTURY MARK

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** has amassed 99 wins at the collegiate level, while Coastal Carolina's **DAVID BENNETT** owns 98 career coaching victories. Patton is 99-68-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 69-45 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. Bennett is 98-32, including a 35-15 mark at Coastal. Patton's second chance at 100 wins is Saturday at No. 8 Wofford.

ZACH ATTACK MOMENTARILY SHUT DOWN

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** missed the first game of his Liberty career Saturday at Toledo due to injury, ending a streak of 27-straight games he has seen playing time. Terrell's 11-game rushing touchdown scoring streak remains intact. He has scored 15 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 20, which is third all-time in Big South history and two away from second-place (VMI's **SEAN MIZZER**, 22). Terrell is sixth all-time in the Conference in rushing yards with even 1,800, and stands 200 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000.

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** became the No. 2 all-time leading receiver in Big South history in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, surpassing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN**. Flagler has 161 career receptions, just 41 catches from the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler, who is averaging 6.60 receptions per game this season, needs to average 6.83 per game over the final six contests to break the mark. Meanwhile, Flagler is third all-time in Big South history with 2,202 receiving yards, behind Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** (2,324) and Price (2,429).

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 50 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 45 contests, followed by VMI (32), Charleston Southern (26) and Liberty (22).

BREAKING OUT

After catching 10 passes in his first three games, Liberty WR **WYNTON JACKSON** has caught 18 passes for 296 yards and four TDs in his last three outings, while totalling 484 all-purpose yards. He also has moved up on the Big South's career receiving charts during the same span. Jackson is now seventh all-time in receptions (125), seventh in receiving yards (1,738 -- 10 away from fifth-place) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB

The Big South has four active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). Below is a look at the four active rushers and where they rank in League history.

SIMP-LE EQUATION

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** extended his Big South touchdown reception record Saturday at Furman, hauling in his 36th career TD catch. He is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (136) and second in receiving yards at 2,324 -- 105 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson, who has caught 26.5 percent of his receptions for touchdowns, ranks second on the League's career touchdown list at 36.

CONTINUING THE TRADITION

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** leads the Big South with 36 receptions through six games, just three ahead of his closest competitor (33 by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**). Brown, who is averaging 6.00 receptions per game, is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. In Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Flagler against Wofford in 2005.

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 116-123 in his career (=94.3) and needs two PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177. Meanwhile, Ellis saw his perfect kick streak end at 15 in Week 5 when he missed a 44-yard field goal at 6:10 of the first quarter at North Greenville. He is still a perfect 18-of-18 on PAT kicks this season.

NOT A MEMORABLE FIRST

For the first time in its young football history, Coastal Carolina has dropped four consecutive road games, and has suffered its first-ever three-game losing streak.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Liberty recorded a blocked punt return for a touchdown in Week 5 against Saint Francis, its third punt return TD of the season, tying the Big South single-season record. The 2004 Liberty Flames also returned three punts for touchdowns.

MURRY REACHES THE 1,000 YARD MARK

Charleston Southern junior WR **MARKUS MURRY** became the 15th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 at North Greenville. He returned from a two-game injury to catch six passes for 88 yards. Murry, now at 1,047 yards, is the fourth CSU player with 1,000 receiving yards in Big South history, matching Gardner-Webb for the most players in the category.

BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he has moved into sixth all-time in attempts (428), completions (239), passing yards (3,225), and TD passes (20).

ROAD WORK

VMI's 40-13 win at Robert Morris in Week 5 was its first road win since a 10-7 victory at Liberty on Oct. 1, 2005, ending a 12-game winless streak away from home. It marked the first time that the Keydets scored 40 points in a game since scoring 52 points in a triple-overtime loss to Gardner-Webb on Oct. 22, 2005. It also was the first time VMI scored 40 points on the road since scoring 47 vs. William & Mary at the Oyster Bowl in Norfolk, Va. in 1990. The last time VMI scored 40 points in a road win was in 1986, when the Keydets won 47-30 at The Citadel.

ELI-ELI-O

Charleston Southern QB **ELI BYRD** set two Big South single-game records in CSU's 46-33 comeback win at North Greenville in Week 5. Byrd set League marks with 34 completions and 54 attempts, breaking the old records of 31 completions (**COLLIN DRAFTS** - Nov. 4, 2006) and 50 attempts (**DARREN SWIGGETT** - Nov. 21, 2002). Byrd finished the night with 398 passing yards, third-most in a game in Big South history, and 423 yards of total offense, which is the fourth-highest single-game output in League annals. He also tossed a career-high four TD passes.

VMI's TRIPLE HEADER

At Robert Morris in Week 5, VMI became the first team in Big South football history to have three players rush for 100 yards in the same game. FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** led VMI in rushing for the fifth consecutive game with 157 yards, followed by QB **KYLE HUGHES'** 136. RB **JOEY ROBINSON** hit the century mark on his final carry, a six-yard TD run that gave him exactly 100 for the contest. The Keydets finished with 443 rushing yards against the Colonials, the second-highest team rushing total in Big South history. Liberty owns the record at 459, set against Norfolk State in 2003.

A HUGHES EFFORT

VMI sophomore QB **KYLE HUGHES** recorded the fifth 100-yard rushing, 100-yard passing game for a Big South quarterback and the fourth different signal-caller to do so with his 136-rushing, 108-passing yard output at Robert Morris in Week 5. Of the five occurrences, Hughes is the first to have more rushing yards than passing yards. Below is a look at the other members of the Big South's 100 rush/100 pass games:

MORE ON HUGHES

Keydet QB **KYLE HUGHES'** 136 rushing yards at Robert Morris in Week 5 are the third-most by a quarterback in League history, falling just four yards short of the single-game record of 140, set by Elon's **C.W. SINGLETARY** at North Carolina A&T in 2002. Hughes' 71-yard TD run against the Colonials was the third-longest rush of scrimmage by a quarterback in Big South history, and the 10th-longest overall.

LIBERTY EXTENDS HOME WIN STREAK TO FIVE GAMES

Liberty pushed its home win streak to five games with its 68-10 rout of Saint Francis in Week 5. The last time the Flames won six consecutive home games was in 1998-99, when Liberty won seven-straight from Sept. 26, 1998 to Oct. 2, 1999. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 39.2 points and holding opponents to 11.6 points per game. The Flames' next home game is Oct. 27 against future Big South member Presbyterian College.

TURNING 60

Liberty became the second team in Big South football history to score more than 60 points in a game twice with its 68-point output in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, joining Coastal Carolina in that category. The Flames' total was the most since Coastal Carolina scored 71 points against Mansfield in 2005, and the third-highest single-game scoring total in League annals. The 2003 Liberty squad scored 69 points against Norfolk State. The Flames' nine touchdowns against the Red Flashes are tied for second-most in a game in Big South history.

JACKSON FIVE

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** broke the Big South career record for punt return yardage in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, as he totaled 60 punt return yards to push his career total to 503, surpassing Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON**'s career record of 484. Jackson is second all-time in returns with 39, just three shy of Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER**'s all-time mark of 42. Meanwhile, Jackson has already tallied 205 punt return yards this season, which is sixth-most in a single-season in Conference history.

ROLL CALL

Through three home games, Liberty is averaging 13,716 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 83,790 fans through 11 home dates, an average of 7,617. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK DROPS TO 3-3 FOLLOWING LOSS AT ALBANY

Stony Brook suffered a one-point loss at intra-state rival Albany this past Saturday to drop to 3-3 on the season. Of the Seawolves' three losses, two have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). The Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 three-straight weeks in September, and were ranked No. 10 in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll last week.
