Maypray had five catches for 209 yards and two touchdowns Saturday against Charleston Southern. The 209 receiving yards are second-most in Big South history, while his 41.80 catch average set a Conference single-game mark. Maypray scored on touchdowns of 34 and 87 yards, the latter setting the Big South record for longest pass completion. He also rushed for 36 yards on seven carries (5.1 average) and returned four kickoffs for 102 yards (25.5 average) - setting the VMI and Big South single-game record for all-purpose yards with 346. His record output pushed his season all-purpose total to 1,542, establishing the Big South season record with two games remaining.

**NEW BALANCE  
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**VINCE REDD • LB • R-Senior  
Liberty • Elizabethton, Tenn.**

Redd tied for the team lead with a career-high 11 tackles in Liberty's 37-24 win over Coastal Carolina. He finished the game with a personal-best 2.5 sacks for a loss of 21 yards, in addition to a forced fumble and three quarterback hurries. Redd marked his third multiple tackle-for-loss game of the season, and took over the Big South lead in sacks over the weekend.

**LIBERTY KNOCKS OFF COASTAL CAROLINA TO MOVE TO 2-0**

Preseason Big South favorite Liberty defeated defending Big South champion Coastal Carolina Saturday, 37-24, to move to 2-0 in the Big South for the first time. Liberty and Gardner-Webb are the lone 2-0 teams in the Conference. Gardner-Webb visits Coastal Carolina Saturday and is looking for its first 3-0 Big South start since 2003 and third overall. Liberty hosts VMI this weekend and will look to extend its overall Conference win streak to five.

**CONFERENCE GAME WIN STREAKS**

With its win over the Chanticleers, Liberty snapped Coastal's five-game Conference win streak en route to its fourth-straight Big South win, now the longest streak in the Big South. Gardner-Webb has a two-game win streak against Conference foes. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern ended its four-game Big South losing streak with a 37-28 come-from-behind win at VMI this past Saturday. CSU's win extended VMI's skid in Big South games to nine.

**SIX PACK**

Liberty extended its Big South-leading home winning streak to seven games with Saturday's 37-24 win over Coastal Carolina. It is Liberty's longest home winning streak since the Flames won seven-straight from Sept. 26, 1998 to Oct. 2, 1999. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 40.1 points and holding opponents to 13.7 points per game. Liberty will try for its second-record eighth consecutive home win Saturday vs. VMI.

**ALL FOR ONE**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** established a VMI and Big South single-game record with 346 all-purpose yards this past Saturday vs. Charleston Southern. He tallied 209 receiving yards, gained 36 on the ground, totaled 102 on kickoff returns and lost one yard on a punt return for his record-setting total. Maypray shattered the old single-game mark of 270 yards, set by Liberty's **SAMKON GADO** in 2004. In addition, Maypray's record output pushed his season total to 1,542 all-purpose yards, breaking the Big South single-season record of 1,539, held by Liberty's **DRE BARNES** in 2002. On the season, Maypray is averaging 171.3 yards per game, and in his last seven appearances, he has collected 1,408 yards (201.1 per game). He has surpassed 200 all-purpose yards in a game three times this season.

**RAISE THE FLAG**

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** caught four passes Saturday vs. Savannah State, pushing his season total to 51 and becoming the first player in Big South history with three consecutive 50-catch seasons. The senior wideout hauled in 64 passes as a junior in 2006 and caught 55 balls in 2005.

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** has a League-high nine TD catches this season, and is looking to become the first player in Conference history with two 10-touchdown reception campaigns. Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON**, who set the Big South record with 16 touchdown grabs in 2006, is nearing the mark as well and is two TD catches away from double-figure TD catches for the second-straight year. The two teams meet Saturday in Conway, S.C.

**THREE'S COMPANY**

Gardner-Webb won its fourth consecutive home contest with Saturday's 66-0 win over Savannah State, its longest win streak since winning 15 in-a-row at home from Oct. 6, 2001 to Nov. 15, 2003. The Runnin' Bulldogs' next home game is the season finale, Nov. 17 vs. Liberty.

**JENNINGS' JAUNTS**

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for 172 yards and three touchdowns vs. Coastal Carolina Saturday, his 11th 100-yard rushing game in 18 appearances for the Flames -- seven of which have been games with 160 yards-or-more. He also rushed for more than one TD in a game for the eighth time in his career and fifth this season. Jennings has rushed for more than 100 yards in five-straight games (760 total, 152.0 per game), tying the Big South in-season record held by former Flame **EUGENE GOODMAN** (2004). Goodman owns the League record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games with seven, accomplished the final two games of the 2003 and the first five games of the 2004 season.

**RUN, RUN RASHAD**

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS'** six 100-yard rushing games this season is one shy of the Big South single-season mark of seven, set by former Flames RB **DRE BARNES** (2002) and VMI's **SEAN MIZZER** (2003). In addition, Jennings needs two more rushing TDs to tie the Big South single-season record of 14, set by Coastal's **AUNDRES PERKINS** and Liberty's **EUGENE GOODMAN** in 2003. Jennings has four consecutive multi-TD games, one shy of the Conference record of five, set by Coastal's **PATRICK HALL** in the final five games of the 2004 season.

Charleston Southern has set a Big South record with three fumble return touchdowns this season, breaking the old record of two, which had been accomplished several times. The Bucs have returned a fumble for a score in their last two games -- another Big South first.

**HUGHES EFFORT**

VMI sophomore QB **KYLE HUGHES** has recorded back-to-back games with 300 total offense yards, the first Big South player since former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** strung together three-straight 300 total offense games to end the 2006 season. Hughes finished with 308 yards of total offense Saturday vs. Charleston Southern (261 passing yards, 47 rush yards), one week after compiling 317 yards vs. Coastal Carolina (229 pass, 88 rush). In his past five games, Hughes has rushed for 385 yards (77.0 per game) and five touchdowns. In the pocket, Hughes has thrown for 823 yards in that span with nine TD passes, and his efficiency rating is 171.21. On the season, Hughes has rushed for 436 yards -- fourth-highest in a season by a QB. He needs 64 rushing yards to become the third QB in Big South history with 500 in a season.

**SIMPSON CATCHES MORE RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCES**

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the second player in Big South history with 40 career touchdowns he surpassed the mark with two TD grabs Saturday at Liberty. Simpson has a Big South-record 41 career touchdown receptions, and is six shy of the Conference's all-time career mark of 47, held by former teammate **AUNDRES PERKINS**. Simpson also moved into third-place all-time in Big South history in career receptions over the weekend (152), passing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN** (151). Simpson became the Big South's all-time record holder in receiving yards in Week 8 vs. Presbyterian (his record now stands at 2,545 yards), and he has caught 27.0 percent of his career receptions for touchdowns.

**BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE**

Liberty has scored at least 30 points in eight of its nine games this season, tying the Big South record for most 30-point games in a season, joining Coastal Carolina (2004). The Flames are averaging a Big South-best 40.6 points per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference record of 37.5, set by Coastal Carolina in '04. Liberty is 49 points shy of breaking Coastal's Big South record of 413 points, as the Flames are at 365. The Flames have already scored 47 touchdowns this season (41 on offense), and RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** leads the Big South with 13 TDs (12 rushing, one receiving). Liberty has never led the Big South in scoring offense, and Jennings is looking to become just the second Liberty player to lead the League in touchdowns scored (**EUGENE GOODMAN** with 14 in 2003).

**JADA, COMIN' ATTYA**

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** returned a fumble 77-yards for a touchdown at Gardner-Webb in Week 9, the third-longest fumble return in Big South history. Meanwhile, Ross, who became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, became the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles in Week 8 vs. Liberty, and his record total stands at 426 with two games remaining.

**HONEST ABEGESAH**

VMI sophomore FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** leads the Big South with 957 rushing yards, slightly ahead of Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** (922). Abegesah has led his team in rushing all nine games (the lone rusher in the Conference to do so), and is second in rushing yards per game at 106.3. He needs 43 rushing yards to record just the seventh 1,000-rushing yard season in Big South history, while Jennings is 78 yards away from his second consecutive 1,000-rushing yard campaign. The teams face each other Saturday afternoon in Lynchburg, Va.

**WHAT A RUSH!**

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 288.8 rushing yards per game, ranking fourth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,177 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past 10 games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

**ZACH ATTACK**

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** extended his rushing touchdown scoring streak to 14 games with a 4-yard run vs. Coastal Carolina Saturday. He has scored 19 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 24 and good for second all-time in Big South history. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** is the record holder with 46. Terrell dropped to seventh all-time in Conference history in rushing yards with 1,940, as teammate **RASHAD JENNINGS** surpassed him over the weekend. Jennings (58 yards) and Terrell (60) are on the cusp of the Big South's 2,000-rushing yard club.

**BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB SET TO GROW**

The Big South's 1,000-yard career rushing list will likely increase to 20 by season's end, as Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** is 10 yards shy of the milestone and VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** needs 43 rushing yards for 1,000 this season and his career. Coastal Carolina's **JAMIE FORDHAM** is 94 yards away from the mark. The Big South has four active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). Below is a look at the four active rushers and where they rank in League history.

**THE BEST DEFENSE IS A GOOD OFFENSE**

Gardner-Webb DE **BRIAN JOHNSTON** caught a 3-yard touchdown pass from **STAN DOOLITTLE** Saturday vs. Savannah State, becoming the first defensive player in the Big South to score an offensive touchdown since Gardner-Webb DL **HAROLD WELLS** recorded eight rushing TDs for the Bulldogs in 2004. Johnston has taken six total snaps this season as a short-yardage tight end, and was inserted twice against Savannah State. All six times Johnston has entered at TE, the Bulldogs have converted a third down.

**THREE-FOR-ALL**

VMI QB **KYLE HUGHES** and Charleston Southern signal-caller **SIDNEY BRYANT** each threw three touchdown passes during CSU's 37-28 win over the Keydets Saturday. It was the second time in Big South history that each quarterback threw three TD passes in the same Conference game. The first time was Oct. 22, 2005, when VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON** tallied four scoring strikes and Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** had three touchdown passes in the same game, which was won by GWU in triple-overtime, 55-52.

**GIMME FIVE...HUNDRED**

VMI has recorded four games of 500 total yards, one game from tying the Big South season record. Gardner-Webb set the mark with five 500-yard total offense games in 2005. VMI and Gardner-Webb are the lone Big South squads to have recorded at least four games of 500 total yards in one season.

**BIG SOUTH TO APPEAR ON MASN FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT WEEK**

One week after making its television debut on new TV partner Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN), the RSN will air Saturday's VMI-Liberty game on tape-delay at 11:00pm. The game will air live on Flames Television Network and video streamed on The Big South EDGE presented by State Farm at 1:00pm. Next week, MASN will broadcast live the Liberty at Gardner-Webb season finale beginning at 3:30pm.

**SACK IT TO ME**

Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** remains the all-time Big South leader in quarterback sacks with 19.5, just ahead of Coastal Carolina's **ADRAIN GRADY** (19.0). Johnston regained the lead in Week 8 at VMI after first passing Grady in Week 6 at Appalachian State. Grady reclaimed the title in Week 7 vs. Chowan.

**AT A LOSS FOR WORDS**

Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** also is the Big South's career leader in tackles-for-loss at 49.0 following his third-straight game multi-TFL game this past Saturday vs. Savannah State. Johnston has 19.5 TFL this season, second-highest in Big South history and three away from the season record of 22.5, set by former teammate **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 54 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 49 contests, followed by VMI (36), Charleston Southern (29) and Liberty (25).

**GREEN MACHINE**

Liberty kicker **NOAH GREENBAUM** leads the Big South in scoring with 81 points and is on pace to break both the Conference's overall scoring record (96 points - **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006) and the kick scoring mark (91 points - **MATT SHARPE** in 2003). Greenbaum is averaging 9.0 points, and if he can maintain the clip the final two games, he would end the 2007 season with 99 points. Greenbaum posted four consecutive 10-point kicking games from Sept. 29-Oct. 27, a Big South first, and has tied the record for most 10-point kicking games in one season (four), joining **MATT SHARPE** (2003) and **JOSH HOKE** (2004).

**JENNINGS ALSO JOCKEYING FOR SCORING RECORD**

Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** is second to teammate **NOAH GREENBAUM** in scoring with 80 total points. He is averaging 11.4 points per game (80 in seven appearances), and if Jennings maintains his average, he will finish with a Big South-record 102 points. No player in Big South history has scored 100 points in a season.

**FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY**

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is now the second-leading receiver in Big South history in the three major categories (receptions, yardage and touchdowns). Flagler, who moved into second in career receptions in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, currently has 180 career catches, 22 from tying the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler surpassed Price (2,429) this past weekend for second all-time in career yardage, as Flagler totaled 106 receiving yards vs. Savannah State to move to 2,453 in his career. Flagler caught two TD passes over the weekend to become the second player in Big South history with 30 career TD catches (31).

**CATCH ME IF YOU CAN**

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** has distance himself on the Big South leaderboard in receptions, as he hauled in nine passes at VMI to increase his League-leading total to 58 -- seven ahead of Bulldogs WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (51 receptions). Brown is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. The lone "shared" year was in 2002, when CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** and Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** co-led the Big South with 45 receptions.

**PLAYING CATCH-UP**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** ranks fifth all-time in receptions (140), fifth in receiving yards (1,905) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches. He needs 32 receiving yards to move into fourth-place, as well as 95 yards to become the fourth player with 2,000 career receiving yards. Meanwhile, teammate **BRANDON TURNER** is in sole possession of sixth-place in history with 129 receptions, and holds the seventh spot with 1,747 receiving yards -- two yards away from sixth.

**200-POINT CONVERSION**

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is looking to become the sixth player in Big South history with 200 career points, as he stands at 194 entering the final two weeks of the season. Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker and fifth player overall with 200 career points during Week 9 at Gardner-Webb, and is fifth all-time in scoring with 210 points, behind K **JOSH HOKE** (297), RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286), WR **JEROME SIMPSON** (246) and K **HUNTER SMITH** (228).

**TWO COACHES REACH 100-WIN MILESTONES WITHIN A WEEK OF EACH OTHER**

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** and Coastal Carolina leader **DAVID BENNETT** each recorded their 100th career coaching win recently. In Week 8, Patton captured his 100th collegiate win in GWU's 36-22 victory at VMI. It was Patton's third attempt at the century mark, and he is now 102-69-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 72-46 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. His record in Big South games stands at 15-6 (=.714 percent).

Bennett notched his 100th win in Week 9 following Coastal's dramatic, come-from-behind win over VMI, 42-35, to open Big South play. It was Bennett's second attempt at the milestone victory. He is now 100-34 in his career, including a 37-17 mark at Coastal.

**BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE**

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, and is 34 yards away from becoming the fifth QB with 4,000 passing yards. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he is sixth all-time in attempts (490), completions (280) and TD passes (25). He moved into fifth in passing yards Saturday vs. Coastal Carolina.

**ACTION JACKSON**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** became the the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 9 vs. Presbyterian. Jackson is fourth all-time at 3,143, behind Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (3,510). Jackson became the Big South's all-time leader in punt returns this past weekend with his 43rd career punt return, breaking the mark held by Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER** (42). Jackson is already the Conference record holder with 525 career punt return yards.

**BATTERING RAM**

Coastal Carolina senior FB **MIKE TOLBERT** rushed for a school-record 244 yards on 13 carries vs. VMI in Week 9, the second-highest single-game rushing total in Big South history and one yard short of the all-time record (245 by Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** in 2002). The last Big South player to rush for 200 yards in a game was Charleston Southern's **ANDRE COPELAND**, who had 226 against West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005. Tolbert's 18.8 average yards per carry set a Conference mark, and his 86-yard TD run in the fourth quarter is the longest rush from scrimmage in Big South annals.

**FOUR SCORES AND 80 YARDS AGO**

Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** became the first and only player in Big South history with two rushes of 80-plus yards during Week 9, as he recorded an 80-yard TD run at VMI in 2006 prior to his recording-breaking 86-yard run at VMI last week. In his career against the Keydets, Tolbert has 493 rushing yards on 41 carries (12.0 average) and four touchdowns.

**PRESBYTERIAN 2-1 VS. FUTURE BIG SOUTH FOES, NETS WINNING SEASON**

Future Big South member Presbyterian College will finish its first season at the FCS level with a winning record, as the Blue Hose picked up its sixth win with a 62-10 victory over Chowan this past Saturday. PC is 2-1 against future Conference members, and plays its final future foe Saturday at Charleston Southern. Presbyterian is playing four of the five Big South football members this year, all on the road. The lone foe PC will not face is Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings and statistics, nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

**NORM!!**

Coastal Carolina DB **MARRIO NORMAN** tied a Big South single-game record with three interceptions in Week 8 vs. Presbyterian. Norman shares the record with VMI's **CHRISTIAN KELLY**, who intercepted three passes last season at Charleston Southern. Norman picked off a pass Saturday at Liberty and now has 10 career INTs, tied for second all-time in Big South history with former teammate **DEWITT MYERS**. Former Coastal safety **QUINTON TEAL** is the career leader with 17 interceptions.

**PAT ON THE BACK**

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** is second all-time in Big South history in career PATs, as he is 123-131 (=93.9 percent) in his career. He surpassed Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH** in Week 8, who had 118 point-after-touchdown kicks from 2003-06. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

**GARDNER-WEBB RECORDS LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY**

Gardner-Webb's 66-0 blanking of Savannah State this past Saturday set the Big South record for largest margin of victory, breaking the old mark of 63 points, held by Coastal Carolina when it defeated Mansfield, 71-8 in 2005. The Bulldogs racked up 607 yards of offense -- the fourth-highest single-game total in the Big South, and **TAYLOR PORTS** was 9-of-9 on PAT attempts, tying the Conference record for most PATs, attempts and success rate. It was Gardner-Webb's eighth game with at least 50 points, matching Coastal Carolina's all-time Conference record.

**GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY**

Coastal Carolina became the first Big South team in history to post a 50-point game in five consecutive seasons with its 51-0 win over Chowan in Week 7. The Chanticleers shared the record with Gardner-Webb, which posted four-straight years with a 50-point game from 2002-05. Coastal also recorded its eighth 50-point game in history, establishing a Big South mark now matched by Gardner-Webb.

**ROLL CALL**

Through five home games, Liberty is averaging 14,173 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 165,826 fans through 22 home dates, an average of 7,538. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

**TOUGHEST SCHEDULE EVER?**

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as 17 of the League's 19 non-Conference losses have all come against the nation's top programs (four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision [FBS] opponents). Excluding Presbyterian, the current combined record of the FCS opponents the Big South has faced is 58-33 (=.637 percent). Six losses have been against Top 25 FCS teams, four have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel, Georgia Southern), and the remaining three defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

**BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER**

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

**STONY BROOK (5-4) RETURNS TO ACTION SATURDAY**

Following its off week, future Big South associate member Stony Brook returns to action Saturday at home vs. Central Connecticut State at 1:00pm. SBU remained perfect at home with its 30-0 blanking of Bryant in Week 9 to move to 5-4 overall. Of the Seawolves' four losses, three have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra, Richmond), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). Earlier this season, the Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll for three-straight weeks, and were ranked in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll as well.
