Maypray scored two of VMI's three touchdowns Saturday against future Big South member Presbyterian. He hauled in a 14-yard halfback option pass to give the Keydets a 7-0 first quarter lead, and later scored on a 32-yard touchdown catch to pull VMI within six points at 20-14 midway through the third quarter. Maypray also rushed seven times for 56 yards (8.0 average), including a long of 38, and finished the day with 116 all-purpose yards, his fourth consecutive game over 100 and fifth of the season.

Middleton helped Coastal Carolina record the second shutout in program history with a team-high 2.5 quarterback sacks -- second-most in school history -- in the Chanticleers' 51-0 win over Chowan. He led the Chanticleers to six sacks on the night and also notched a quarterback hurry in his one-and-a-half quarters of action. Middleton helped the CCU defense hold the Hawks to just 87 yards of total offense and eight yards of rushing, also school records for fewest total yards allowed and fewest rushing yards allowed, respectively.

LET THE CONFERENCE SEASON BEGIN

The Conference portion of the 2007 season begins this Saturday, Oct. 20, which marks the latest the League season has begun in the six years of Big South football. Preseason Big South favorite Liberty is at Charleston Southern, while VMI hosts Gardner-Webb. Coastal Carolina's Big South season begins next week, Oct. 27, at home vs. VMI. Below is a breakdown of how each team has fared in its Big South opener, as well as some additional notes:

Charleston Southern, which has won its last four Big South home games, is NOT opening the League season against VMI for the first time since 2002 ... Gardner-Webb is beginning the Conference season on the road for the sixth-straight year ... Liberty is opening its League schedule vs. Charleston Southern for the first time. The Flames are 0-5 in its first Big South road game of the season since 2002 ... VMI is opening the Big South schedule at home for the second consecutive year, and is 2-2 in its first home Conference game since joining the Big South in 2003.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN GOING FOR BIG SOUTH HOME WIN STREAK RECORD

Charleston Southern is looking to break the Big South record for consecutive home wins this Saturday, Oct. 27 vs. Liberty at Buccaneer Field. CSU blanked Savannah State, 28-0, in Week 6 for its 12th consecutive home win, which tied the Big South record set by Coastal Carolina from 2004-05. CSU won its final four home games of 2005 (beginning with its 63-42 victory over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15), continued with a perfect 6-0 mark at home last year, and is 2-0 at home this season.

BENNETT, PATTON ON CUSP OF 100 COLLEGIATE WINS

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** and Gardner-Webb's **STEVE PATTON** each have amassed 99 wins at the collegiate level. Bennett recorded victory No. 99 with Saturday's 51-0 win over Chowan, and is 99-32 in his career, including a 36-15 mark at Coastal. Patton is 99-69-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 69-46 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. Bennett's first attempt at 100 wins will be Saturday vs. his alma mater, Presbyterian College. Patton will try for 100 for the third time this weekend when the Bulldogs visit VMI.

PRESBYTERIAN STANDS 1-0 VS. FUTURE BIG SOUTH FOES

Future Big South member Presbyterian College opened a three-week stretch of playing future Conference opponents with a 45-21 victory at VMI this past Saturday. The Blue Hose used a balanced attack (280 rushing yards, 273 passing yards) to knock off the Keydets in Lexington. It was PC's third-straight win and pushed the Blue Hose to 4-3 on the season. Presbyterian will play four of the five Big South football members this year, all on the road. The lone foe PC will not face is Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings and statistics, nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

TOUGHEST SCHEDULE EVER?

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as 17 of the League's 18 non-Conference losses have all come against the nation's top programs (four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision [FBS] opponents). Excluding Presbyterian, the current combined record of the FCS opponents the Big South has faced is 39-18 (= .684 percent). Six losses have been against Top 25 FCS teams, three have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel), and the remaining four defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (Georgia Southern, William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

Coastal Carolina became the first Big South team in history to post a 50-point game in five consecutive seasons with Saturday's 51-0 win over Chowan. The Chanticleers shared the record with Gardner-Webb, which posted four-straight years with a 50-point game from 2002-05. Coastal also recorded its eighth 50-point game in history, establishing a Big South mark and breaking its tie with Gardner-Webb for the previous most 50-point games (seven).

ELLIS, McKINNON AMONG DRADDY TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced last week that Charleston Southern's **NICK ELLIS** and Coastal Carolina's **REN McKINNON** are among 153 semifinalists for the 2007 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth, and the candidates for the NFF 2007 National Scholar-Athlete Awards. One of college football's most sought after and competitive awards, the Draddy Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary community leadership. Semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

COASTAL SETS SEVERAL RECORDS IN 51-0 WIN OVER CHOWAN

Coastal Carolina enjoyed some record-breaking performances in Saturday's 51-0 win over Chowan. The Chanticleers rushed 67 times for a Big South single-game team record 490 yards. The old mark was held by Liberty (459, vs. Norfolk State in 2003). Coastal also notched a record 23 rushing first downs, bettering the previous record of 21 (set by Coastal vs. Charleston Southern in 2004). The Chants' 592 yards of total offense against Chowan was the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. Meanwhile, Coastal returned a Big South single-game best eight punts Saturday, breaking the old mark of seven (Liberty vs. Kentucky Wesleyan in 2003).

PASSING GRADES

Coastal Carolina continues to lead the nation in pass defense, holding opponents to just 73.0 passing yards per game. The Chanticleers have limited foes to 41-of-87 passing (=47.1 percent) and 438 yards, an average of 5.0 yards per attempt. Coastal has held opponents to under 100 yards passing in five of its six games. The Big South season record for passing defense is 131.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2004.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

Liberty has scored at least 30 points in five of its six games this season and is averaging a Big South-best 38.3 points per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference record of 37.5, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. The Flames have already scored 30 touchdowns this season (24 on offense), and WR **WYNTON JACKSON** leads the Big South with eight TDs. Liberty has never led the Big South in scoring offense, and Jackson is looking to become just the second Liberty player to lead the League in touchdowns scored (**EUGENE GOODMAN** with 14 in 2003).

WHAT A RUSH!

VMI leads the Big South with 283.2 rushing yards per game, ranking sixth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,115 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past seven games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

SACK LUNCH

One week after losing his grip on the Big South's all-time sack record, Coastal Carolina's **ADRAIN GRADY** reclaimed the title over the weekend with 2.0 sacks vs. Chowan to push his career total to 19.0 sacks. Grady moves back ahead of Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON**, who broke Grady's mark of 17.0 in Week 6 at Appalachian State. Johnston stands in second place with 17.5 career sacks. Meanwhile, Johnston remains the Big South's career leader in tackles-for-loss at 37.5. He passed Coastal Carolina's **MAURICE SIMPKINS** (36.0) during the Appalachian State game as well.

GIMME FIVE...HUNDRED

VMI has recorded more than 500 yards of total offense in back-to-back games, the lone Big South squad to accomplish the feat this season. The Keydets tallied 551 yards at Robert Morris in Week 5 and 504 this past Saturday against Presbyterian. The last Big South team to produce more than 500 total yards in consecutive games was Gardner-Webb in 2005, when the Bulldogs opened the season with three-straight games over 500 (597, 568 and 503).

ANDERSON TIES PUNT RETURN RECORD

Coastal Carolina sophomore **JAMAR ANDERSON** tied a Big South single-game record with six punt returns Saturday vs. Chowan -- his first career punt returns. Anderson equalled the mark held by two other players (VMI's **JOHN PUVOGEL** vs. Austin Peay in 2003 and Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** vs. St. Paul's in 2006). Anderson totaled 78 punt return yards Saturday, which is the eighth-highest single-game yardage total in Big South history.

200-POINT CONVERSION

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** is six points away from becoming the third kicker and fifth player overall with 200 career points. He is currently at 194 points and is looking to join K **JOSH HOKE** (297), RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286), K **HUNTER SMITH** (228) and WR **JEROME SIMPSON** (222) in the Big South's 200-point club. Following Ellis, the next closest player to the 200-point plateau is Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** with 170 career points.

JADA KNIGHT

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS**, who became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, needs 11 stops to become the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles. Ross' record total stands at 389 following his 13 tackles in Week 6 vs. Savannah State.

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** needs 135 all-purpose yards to become the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 in a career. He is currently at 2,865 and is leading the Conference this season with 850 all-purpose yards and a 141.7 per game average. In Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, Jackson totaled 267 all-purpose yards, the second-highest single-game total in Big South history. Jackson posted 115 receiving yards, 83 kickoff return yards, 60 punt return yards and nine rushing yards, and missed the Big South single-game record by three yards. Former Liberty standout **SAM GADO** set the record of 270 all-purpose yards against Gardner-Webb in 2004. Jackson's current per game clip of 141.7 is pacing ahead of the Big South record of 140.6, set by Gado in '04.

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** became the No. 2 all-time leading receiver in Big South history in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, surpassing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN**. Flagler has 168 career receptions, just 34 catches from the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler, who is averaging 6.50 receptions per game this season, needs to average 6.80 per game over the final five contests to break the mark. Meanwhile, Flagler is third all-time in Big South history with 2,237 receiving yards, behind Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** (2,374) and Price (2,429).

SIMP-LE EQUATION

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** extended his Big South touchdown reception record Saturday vs. Chowan, hauling in his 37th career TD catch to remain the active FCS career leader. He is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (138) and second in receiving yards at 2,374 - 55 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson, who has caught 26.8 percent of his receptions for touchdowns, ranks second on the League's career touchdown list at 37 and has caught a TD pass in 15 of his last 18 games.

BREAKING OUT

After catching 10 passes in his first three games, Liberty WR **WYNTON JACKSON** has caught 18 passes for 296 yards and four TDs in his last three outings, while totalling 484 all-purpose yards. He also has moved up on the Big South's career receiving charts during the same span. Jackson is now seventh all-time in receptions (125), seventh in receiving yards (1,738 -- 10 away from fifth-place) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** took advantage of CSU's open week and moved passed **DEE BROWN** atop the Big South leaderboard in receptions. Flagler is first in the League with 39 catches, three ahead of Brown's 36. Brown is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. The lone "shared" year was in 2002, when CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** and Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** co-lead the Big South with 45 receptions. Meanwhile, in Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Flagler against Wofford in 2005.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 51 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 46 contests, followed by VMI (33), Charleston Southern (26) and Liberty (22).

BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he has moved into sixth all-time in attempts (428), completions (239), passing yards (3,225), and TD passes (20).

CALLING AN AUDIBLE

QBs **ELI BYRD** (Charleston Southern), **WILLIAM RICHARDSON** (Coastal Carolina) and **STAN DOOLITTLE** (Gardner-Webb) are on the verge of cracking the League's all-time Top 10 in several statistical categories. Byrd, who is already tied for ninth with 10 career TD passes, has 201 career attempts and is four shy of 10th place. Doolittle has 116 completions and is two away from the 10th spot in that category. Richardson's 1,259 career passing yards paces the three QBs, and he needs 231 to move into 10th on that list.

CAR CHASE

Charleston Southern DB **JONATHAN CARMON** has recorded two of his three interceptions in back-to-back games, and his 99 interception return yards this year are third-most in a single-season in Big South history. He needs four INT yards for second-highest. The Big South single-season record for interception return yards is 168, held by Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** in 2003.

ZACH ATTACK MOMENTARILY SHUT DOWN

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** missed the first game of his Liberty career at Toledo in Week 6 due to injury, ending a streak of 27-straight games he has seen playing time. Terrell's 11-game rushing touchdown scoring streak remains intact. He has scored 15 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 20, which is third all-time in Big South history and two away from second-place (VMI's **SEAN MIZZER**, 22). Terrell is sixth all-time in the Conference in rushing yards with even 1,800, and stands 200 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000.

JENNINGS' JAUNTS

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for 160 yards and two touchdowns at Toledo during Week 6, his eighth 100-yard rushing game in 15 appearances for the Flames -- five of which have been games with 160 yards-or-more. He also rushed for more than one TD in a game for the fifth time. Jennings' 160 yards moved him into the Top 10 on the League's career rushing chart, as he now owns the 10th spot at 1,443. He needs 112 yards for ninth-place.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB

NICK CAN KICK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** tied a Big South single-game record with four field goals made against Savannah State during Week 6. Ellis is the third different kicker on the list, joining VMI's **MATT SHARPE**, who made four FG in a game twice, and Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE**. Meanwhile, Ellis is just the second kicker to post a 4-4 field goal performance. Sharpe was the first, connecting on all four field goal attempts vs. Gardner-Webb on Oct. 18, 2003. Ellis is tied for the Big South lead with eight field goals, hitting 8-of-10 on the year.

EXTINGUISHERS

Liberty DB **RYAN GREISER** returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown at Toledo in Week 6, giving Liberty three returned INTs for scores this year, tying the Big South single-season record. Gardner-Webb returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2004.

MURRY REACHES THE 1,000 YARD MARK

Charleston Southern junior WR **MARKUS MURRY** became the 15th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 at North Greenville. He returned from a two-game injury to catch six passes for 88 yards. Murry, now at 1,047 yards, is the fourth CSU player with 1,000 receiving yards in Big South history, matching Gardner-Webb for the most players in the category.

LIBERTY EXTENDS HOME WIN STREAK TO FIVE GAMES

Liberty pushed its home win streak to five games with its 68-10 rout of Saint Francis in Week 5. The last time the Flames won six consecutive home games was in 1998-99, when Liberty won seven-straight from Sept. 26, 1998 to Oct. 2, 1999. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 39.2 points and holding opponents to 11.6 points per game. The Flames' next home game is Oct. 27 against future Big South member Presbyterian College.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Liberty recorded a blocked punt return for a touchdown in Week 5 against Saint Francis, its third punt return TD of the season, tying the Big South single-season record. The 2004 Liberty Flames also returned three punts for touchdowns.

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 116-123 in his career (=94.3) and needs two PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177. Meanwhile, Ellis saw his perfect kick streak end at 15 in Week 5 when he missed a 44-yard field goal at 6:10 of the first quarter at North Greenville. He is still a perfect 18-of-18 on PAT kicks this season.

THE LATE, LATE SHOW

The Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN) will re-air the Flames Television Network's Nov. 10 VMI-Liberty game at 11:00pm that same evening. MASN also is producing two live Big South broadcasts this year -- the Nov. 3 Coastal Carolina-Liberty game and the No. 17 Liberty-Gardner-Webb tilt.

ROLL CALL

Through three home games, Liberty is averaging 13,716 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 98,064 fans through 13 home dates, an average of 7,543. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK DROPS TO 3-4 FOLLOWING LOSS AT NATIONALLY-RANKED RICHMOND

Stony Brook held a Richmond offense that was averaging 465 yards per game to just 89 in the first half, but the No. 20 Spiders scored 21 third-quarter points to break the game open as they took a 42-0 win over the Seawolves, marking SBU's third-straight defeat. Of the Seawolves' four losses this season, three have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra, Richmond), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). Earlier this season, the Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll for three-straight weeks in September, and were ranked in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll as well.
