MIKE TOLBERT • FB • Senior

Tolbert led the Chanticleers in a dramatic, come-from-behind win against VMI, posting a CCU record 244 rushing yards on just 13 carries for a Big South-record 18.8 yards per carry and two touchdowns. In the first quarter, he had a 39-yard scamper to set up Coastal's first score, as well as a 29-yard run that set up the second CCU touchdown. He had a 57-yard run that put Coastal at VMI's 5-yard line and set up his first score of the night that tied the game at 28. Then with 3:08 remaining and the game tied at 35, Tolbert busted three VMI tackles in the first five yards, picked up a key block at the VMI 25 and rumbled home with a Big South-record 86-yard touchdown run to lead the Chanticleers to the win. His 244 rushing yards missed the Conference single-game record by one yard.

NEW BALANCE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

BRANDON AUTRY • S • R-Sophomore
Coastal Carolina • Charlotte, N.C.

Autry recorded a career-best 12 tackles, including 10 solo shots, against VMI. Autry, who posted his second-straight game with 10-plus tackles, also had an interception, forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and added one pass break-up. The interception sealed the win for the Chants, as VMI had moved to the CCU 37-yard line, but Autry picked off Kyle Hughes with less than a minute remaining to end the final threat.

Sitton was a key piece in Coastal's win over VMI. He had two kickoff returns for 132 yards (66.0 average), with his first return going for 47 yards in the second quarter. After VMI took a 35-28 lead with just under seven minutes left in the game, Sitton returned the ensuing kickoff a school-record 85 yards for a game-tying touchdown. It was the first-ever kickoff return for a touchdown in Coastal history and tied for the eighth-longest in Big South history.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

PATRICK HALL • RB

Hall totaled a career-high 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns on just 13 carries in leading Gardner-Webb to a 29-25 Conference win over Charleston Southern. Hall gave Gardner-Webb its first lead of the night with his first career touchdown, a 9-yard run in the first quarter. Later in the third quarter, he scampered 46 yards for a score that helped the Bulldogs regain the lead at 22-18. Hall also caught a 21-yard pass and averaged 7.7 yards per rush against the Buccaneers.

BIG SOUTH TO MAKE TELEVISION DEBUT ON MASN THIS SATURDAY

The Big South will make its television debut on new TV partner Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN) this Saturday when the Liberty Flames host defending Big South champion Coastal Carolina at 3:30pm. This will be the first of two live games on MASN (Liberty at Gardner-Webb is the second), while a third (VMI at Liberty) will air on tape-delay Nov. 10 at 11:00pm. **JIM HUNTER** and **WALLY WILLIAMS** will call the action.

COASTAL CAROLINA OPENS TITLE DEFENSE WITH WIN; BENNETT NOTCHES 100TH VICTORY

Coastal Carolina posted a dramatic, come-from-behind win over VMI Saturday, 42-35, to open Big South play 1-0 for the fourth consecutive season. The win was head coach **DAVID BENNETT's** 100th coaching victory, as he is now 100-33 in his career, including a 37-16 mark at Coastal. The Chanticleers also won their fifth consecutive Big South game, which is tied for the third-longest Conference games win streak in Big South history. Coastal will look to start 2-0 in League play for the fourth-straight season as well Saturday at Liberty.

GOING FOR TWO

Gardner-Webb is 2-0 in Big South play for the second-straight season and fourth time overall. Coastal has started 2-0 the previous three years (2004, 2005, 2006). Liberty has never started 2-0 in Big South play.

CONFERENCE GAME WIN STREAKS

Coastal Carolina and Liberty are the lone squads currently with extensive League win streaks. The Chanticleers have the longest current Big South game win streak at five games, and have won 12 of their last 13 Big South football contests. Liberty is second to Coastal with a three-game Big South win streak.

SIX PACK

Liberty extended its Big South-leading home winning streak to six games with Saturday's 48-14 win over future Big South member Presbyterian. It is Liberty's longest home winning streak since the Flames won seven-straight from Sept. 26, 1998 to Oct. 2, 1999. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 40.7 points and holding opponents to 12.0 points per game.

THREE'S COMPANY

Gardner-Webb won its third consecutive home contest with Saturday's 29-25 Big South win over Charleston Southern, matching its longest win streak since winning three-straight home games in 2004-05, when the Bulldogs won the season finale in 2004 and their first two home games of 2005. The last time GWU won four consecutive home games was during a 15-game home win streak from Oct. 6, 2001 to Nov. 15, 2003. Gardner-Webb is home Saturday against Savannah State.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

Liberty has scored at least 30 points in seven of its eight games this season, one game shy of tying the Big South record for most 30-point games in a season (8 - Coastal Carolina, 2004). The Flames are averaging a Big South-best 41.0 points per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference record of 37.5, set by Coastal Carolina in '04. Liberty is 86 points shy of breaking Coastal's Big South record of 413 points, as the Flames are at 328. The Flames have already scored 42 touchdowns this season (36 on offense), and RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** leads the Big South with 10 TDs (nine rushing, one receiving). Liberty has never led the Big South in scoring offense, and Jennings is looking to become just the second Liberty player to lead the League in touchdowns scored (**EUGENE GOODMAN** with 14 in 2003).

BATTERING RAM

Coastal Carolina senior FB **MIKE TOLBERT** rushed for a school-record 244 yards on 13 carries vs. VMI Saturday, the second-highest single-game rushing total in Big South history and one yard short of the all-time record (245 by Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** in 2002). The last Big South player to rush for 200 yards in a game was Charleston Southern's **ANDRE COPELAND**, who had 226 against West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005. Tolbert's 18.8 average yards per carry set a Conference mark, and his 86-yard TD run in the fourth quarter is now the longest rush from scrimmage in Big South annals.

FOUR SCORES AND 80 YARDS AGO

Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** became the first and only player in Big South history with two rushes of 80-plus yards Saturday, as he recorded an 80-yard TD run at VMI in 2006 prior to Saturday's recording-breaking 86-yard run. In his career against the Keydets, Tolbert has 493 rushing yards on 41 carries (12.0 average) and four touchdowns.

50-50 RAFFLE

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is two catches away from becoming the first player in Big South history with three consecutive 50-catch seasons. The senior wideout, who has 48 receptions this season, hauled in 64 passes as a junior in 2006 and caught 55 balls in 2005. Flagler is one of three players in League history with two seasons with 50 receptions (Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**, VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN**).

SITT-ON IT POTSIE

Coastal Carolina junior **ARTHUR SITTON** returned the first kickoff for a touchdown in school history when he returned a kickoff 85-yards for a score Saturday vs. VMI. It tied for the eighth-longest in Big South history. Sitton also posted a 47-yard return earlier in the game and finished with two returns for 132 yards, a 66.0 return average.

JADA, COMIN' ATTYA

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** returned a fumble 77-yards for a touchdown Saturday at Gardner-Webb, the third-longest fumble return in Big South history. Meanwhile, Ross, who became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, became the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles in Week 8 vs. Liberty, and his record total stands at 411 with three games remaining.

HUGHES EFFORT

VMI sophomore QB **KYLE HUGHES** became the first Big South player this season to surpass 300 total offense yards when he accumulated 317 this past Saturday at Coastal Carolina. Hughes passed for a season-high 229 yards and rushed for 88 yards. In his past four games, he has rushed for 338 yards (84.5 per game) and five touchdowns, while averaging 5.0 yards per carry. In the pocket, Hughes has thrown for 562 yards in that span with six TD passes, and his efficiency rating is 153.46. On the season, Hughes has rushed for 389 yards -- fifth-highest in a season by a QB, and his five TD runs are tied for fourth-most in a campaign.

JENNINGS' JAUNTS

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for a career-high 196 yards and two touchdowns vs. Presbyterian Saturday, his 10th 100-yard rushing game in 17 appearances for the Flames -- six of which have been games with 160 yards-or-more. He also rushed for more than one TD in a game for the seventh time. Jennings has rushed for more than 100 yards in four-straight games (588 total, 147.0 per game), and is one shy of the Big South season record of five games, held by former Flame **EUGENE GOODMAN** (2004). Goodman owns the League record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games with seven, accomplished the final two games of the 2003 and the first five games of the 2004 season.

WHAT A RUSH!

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 293.4 rushing yards per game, ranking fourth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,227 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past nine games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

SIMPSON CATCHES SECOND BIG SOUTH CAREER RECORD

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON**, already the League's career leader with 39 touchdown receptions, became the Big South's all-time record holder in receiving yards in Week 8 vs. Presbyterian. Simpson finished the night with 56 receiving yards, giving him 2,430 and breaking the record of 2,429 held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Simpson, whose career receiving record now stands at 2,491 yards, is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (146), and has caught 26.7 percent of his career receptions for touchdowns. He needs one more TD to become the second player in Conference history with 40 career touchdowns.

PASSING GRADES

Coastal Carolina continues to lead the nation in pass defense, holding opponents to 132.9 passing yards per game. The Chanticleers have held opponents to under 100 yards passing in five of its eight games. The Big South season record for passing defense is 131.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2004.

ZACH ATTACK

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** extended his rushing touchdown scoring streak to 13 games with a 3-yard run vs. Presbyterian Saturday. He has scored 18 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 23 and good for second all-time in Big South history. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** is the record holder with 46. Terrell is sixth all-time in the Conference in rushing yards with 1,895, and stands 105 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB SET TO GROW

The Big South's 1,000-yard career rushing list will likely increase to 20 by season's end, as Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** is 82 yards shy of the milestone and Coastal Carolina's **JAMIE FORDHAM** is 94 yards from the mark. VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** needs 117 rushing yards for 1,000 this season and his career. The Big South has four active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). HONEST ABEGESAH

VMI sophomore FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** leads the Big South with 883 rushing yards and has posted back-to-back rushing games after gaining 116 at Coastal Carolina Saturday. He has led his team in rushing all eight games (the lone rusher in the Conference to do so), and is second in rushing yards per game at 110.4. He needs 117 rushing yards to record just the seventh 1,000-rushing yard season in Big South history.

SACK IT TO ME

For the first time in four weeks, the race for the Big South's career quarterback sack record has NOT changed hands. Following this past weekend's action, Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** remains the all-time leader with 19.5 career sacks, just ahead of Coastal Carolina's **ADRIN GRADY** (19.0). Johnston regained the lead in Week 8 at VMI after first passing Grady in Week 6 at Appalachian State. Grady reclaimed the title in Week 7 vs. Chowan.

AT A LOSS FOR WORDS

Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** also is the Big South's career leader in tackles-for-loss at 47.0 following his second-straight game with 4.0 TFL this past Saturday vs. Charleston Southern. Johnston has 17.5 TFL this season, second-highest in Big South history and five away from the season record of 22.5, set by former teammate **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004.

200-POINT CONVERSION

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker and fifth player overall with 200 career points, surpassing the milestone Saturday at Gardner-Webb. Ellis is fifth all-time in scoring with 203 points, behind K **JOSH HOKE** (297), RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286), WR **JEROME SIMPSON** (234) and K **HUNTER SMITH** (228). Following Ellis, the next closest player to the 200-point plateau is Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** with 182 career points.

"MAYPRAY, MAYPRAY"

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** totaled 225 all-purpose yards Saturday at Coastal Carolina, his sixth consecutive game with 100 and his seventh this season. In his last six games, Maypray has gained 1,062 all-purpose yards (177.0 per game). Maypray is leading the Big South with 1,196 all-purpose yards and a 149.5 per game average. He needs 344 more yards to break the Big South single-season record of 1,539, set by Liberty's **DRE BARNES** in 2002. Maypray needs to average 114.7 yards per game over the next three games to break the record.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 53 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 48 contests, followed by VMI (35), Charleston Southern (28) and Liberty (24).

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** became the the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards this past Saturday vs. Presbyterian. Jackson is fourth all-time at 3,042, behind Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (3,404). Jackson is currently second in the Big South this season with 1,027 all-purpose yards and third with a 128.4 per game average. In Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, Jackson totaled 267 all-purpose yards, the second-highest single-game total in Big South history. Jackson posted 115 receiving yards, 83 kickoff return yards, 60 punt return yards and nine rushing yards, and missed the Big South single-game record by three yards.

GREEN MACHINE

Liberty kicker **NOAH GREENBAUM** leads the Big South in scoring with 74 points and is on pace to break both the Conference's overall scoring record (96 points - **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006) and the kick scoring mark (91 points - **MATT SHARPE** in 2003). Greenbaum is averaging 9.2 points, and if he can maintain the clip the final three games, he would end the 2007 season with 101.6 points. Greenbaum has posted four consecutive 10-point kicking games, a Big South first, and has tied the record for most 10-point kicking games in one season (four), joining **MATT SHARPE** (2003) and **JOSH HOKE** (2004).

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** became the No. 2 all-time leading receiver in Big South history in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, surpassing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN**. Flagler has 176 career receptions, just 26 catches from tying the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler, who is averaging 5.88 receptions per game this season, needs to average 8.67 per game over the final three contests to break the mark. Meanwhile, Flagler is third all-time in Big South history with 2,347 receiving yards, behind Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** (2,491) and Price (2,429), and is second in career touchdown receptions with 29.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** moved back atop the Big South leaderboard in receptions, as he hauled in six passes at Gardner-Webb to increase his League-leading total to 49 -- just two ahead of Bulldogs WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (47 receptions). Brown is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. The lone "shared" year was in 2002, when CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** and Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** co-led the Big South with 45 receptions.

PLAYING CATCH-UP

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** ranks fifth all-time in receptions (139), fifth in receiving yards (1,867) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches. He needs 69 receiving yards to move into fourth-place, as well as 133 yards to become the fourth player with 2,000 career receiving yards. Meanwhile, teammate **BRANDON TURNER** moved into a tie for sixth-place in history with 127 receptions, and holds the ninth spot with 1,651 receiving yards.

PATTON SCORES 100TH COLLEGIATE COACHING WIN

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** achieved his 100th career collegiate coaching win during Week 8 in the Bulldogs' 36-22 victory at VMI. It was Patton's third attempt at the century mark. Following this past Saturday's win over Charleston Southern, Patton is now 101-69-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 71-46 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. His record in Big South games now stands at 15-6 (=.714 percent).

PRESBYTERIAN 2-1 VS. FUTURE BIG SOUTH FOES

Future Big South member Presbyterian College is 2-1 against future Conference members following its 48-14 loss at Liberty this past Saturday. In Week 8, PC rallied from a 24-0 first half deficit to defeat Coastal Carolina in overtime, 41-34. The Blue Hose also defeated VMI in Week 7, 45-21. Presbyterian is playing four of the five Big South football members this year, all on the road. The lone foe PC will not face is Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings and statistics, nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

NORM!!

Coastal Carolina DB **MARRIO NORMAN** tied a Big South single-game record with three interceptions in Week 8 vs. Presbyterian. Norman shares the record with VMI's **CHRISTIAN KELLY**, who intercepted three passes last season at Charleston Southern. Norman now has nine career INTs, moving into third-place all-time in Big South history, behind former teammates **QUINTON TEAL** (17) and **DEWITT MYERS** (10).

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** moved into second-place all-time in career PATs Saturday at Gardner-Webb. He was successful on both attempts to push his career total to 119-126 (=94.4) and surpassed Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH**, who had 118 point-after-touchdown kicks from 2003-06. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he is sixth all-time in attempts (475), completions (269), passing yards (3,701), and TD passes (24).

BIRDS OF PREY

In addition to **MARRIO NORMAN**'s record-tying night, the Coastal Carolina defense finished with six interceptions against the Blue Hose in Week 8, breaking its Big South single-game record for most interceptions in a game. The Chanticleers first set the mark of five vs. Savannah State in 2004, and equalled the mark last season at Gardner-Webb.

TOUGHEST SCHEDULE EVER?

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as 17 of the League's 19 non-Conference losses have all come against the nation's top programs (four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision [FBS] opponents). Excluding Presbyterian, the current combined record of the FCS opponents the Big South has faced is 54-27 (=.667 percent). Six losses have been against Top 25 FCS teams, four have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel, Georgia Southern), and the remaining three defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

ROLL CALL

Through four home games, Liberty is averaging 14,114 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 143,989 fans through 19 home dates, an average of 7,578. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK MOVES TO 5-4 FOLLOWING SHUTOUT OF BRYANT

Stony Brook snuffed out an early Bryant scoring chance with an interception and scored touchdowns on its first two possessions as the Seawolves blanked the Bulldogs, 30-0. Stony Brook rolled up 458 yards of total offense, 280 on the ground, and limited its opponent to 224 as it remained perfect at home and 5-4 overall. Of the Seawolves' four losses, three have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra, Richmond), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). Earlier this season, the Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll for three-straight weeks, and were ranked in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll as well.
