### CHOICE HOTELS CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**SIDNEY BRYANT • QB • R-Junior**  
 Charleston Southern • Tampa, Fla.

Bryant was 30-of-48 for 382 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions in leading the Buccaneers to a 28-24, come-from-behind win over future Big South member Presbyterian. With CSU down 21-7 in the second quarter, Bryant hit **Vernon Huger** with a four-yard TD pass with :28 seconds left to move within seven points at intermission. In the fourth quarter, Bryant's 53-yard TD pass to **Dee Brown** tied the game at 21-21, and with the Bucs trailing 24-21 with one minute left, Bryant found Brown for an 18-yard TD with :07.3 seconds on the clock. Bryant, who is 2-0 as CSU's starting quarterback, finished with 389 yards of total offense -- the sixth-highest single-game total in Big South history.

**BROCK SMITH • QB • Junior**  
 Liberty • Hershey, Pa.

Smith was responsible for four of Liberty's 10 touchdowns against VMI Saturday. He was 11-of-14 passing (78.8 percent) for 246 yards with three touchdown passes and no interceptions, marking his third-straight game over 245 passing yards, as well as his third game with at least three touchdown passes. Smith also had a nine-yard TD run in the first quarter -- his first touchdown run of the season, and helped Liberty average 8.8 yards per play against the Keydets.

### NEW BALANCE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**SANTINI WASHINGTON • CB • Senior**  
 Coastal Carolina • Jonesboro, Ga.

Washington moved from his regular wide receiver spot to cornerback and started at the position in the Chanticleers' 17-14 win over Gardner-Webb. In his first action at cornerback since high school, Washington recorded four solo tackles, one tackle for loss and an interception. In the first half with GWU leading 7-0, he intercepted a pass at the Coastal 14-yard line and returned it 20 yards to end a threat. Later in the fourth quarter with GWU leading 14-10, Washington tackled Gardner-Webb's punter on fourth down for an 18-yard loss, setting up Coastal at the Bulldogs' 18-yard line en route to the Chanticleers' winning touchdown drive.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**LIBERTY FLAMES Special Teams**

Liberty's entire special teams unit played a deciding factor in the Flames' 73-34 win over VMI, accounting for 25 points. **Dominic Bolden** returned three kickoffs for a Big South single-game record 198 yards, including an 83-yarder for a score in addition to a 78-yard return to open the game. In the third quarter, **Jonathan Crawford** returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown, marking the first time that LU returned a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in the same game since late last year. Placekicker **Noah Greenbaum** set a Big South record for PATS, going 10-for-10 on the day, and finished with 13 points, his Conference-record fifth 10-point kicking game of the season. Furthermore, the Flames blocked an extra point attempt, and held VMI to an average of 15.2 yards on kickoff returns.

### FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Stevenson returned two kickoffs for 83 yards (41.5 average). He had a long return of 48 yards, which set CSU up at Presbyterian's 32-yard line en route to the Bucs' first touchdown of the game. Stevenson also had three receptions for 10 yards.

**LIBERTY CLINCHES AT LEAST A SHARE OF BIG SOUTH REGULAR-SEASON TITLE**

Preseason Big South favorite Liberty enjoyed a record-setting, 73-34 win over VMI this past Saturday to move to 3-0 in League action and clinching at least a share of the 2007 Conference crown. The Flames need to win at Gardner-Webb Saturday for the outright title. If Gardner-Webb wins, LU and GWU would be co-champions. Furthermore, the Big South could potentially have tri-champions, as a Gardner-Webb win over Liberty, coupled with a Coastal Carolina victory at Charleston Southern, would give the Conference three teams at 3-1 in League play

**WHERE'S MY TV GUIDE?!**

All three games involving the Big South this weekend will be televised. CSTV will televise the "Military Classic of the South" game between VMI and The Citadel at 12:00pm. Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern will air on SportSouth at noon, while Liberty's game at Gardner-Webb will be broadcast live on MASN at 3:30pm.

**CONFERENCE GAME WIN STREAKS**

With its win over the Keydets, Liberty has won five-straight Big South games, currently the longest streak in the Conference. The Big South record for consecutive League wins is eight, held by Coastal Carolina from 2003-05.

**LIBERTY SETS NUMEROUS BIG SOUTH SCORING RECORDS (PART ONE)**

Liberty's 73 points against VMI Saturday set a Big South single-game mark, breaking the old record of 71 points, held by Coastal Carolina vs. Mansfield (Pa.) in 2005. The Flames also bested the record for most points scored in a Conference game, which was 57 by Gardner-Webb at Charleston Southern in 2002. In addition, Liberty became the first team in Conference history with two 50-point games against Big South opponents in the same season, and have already set the Big South mark for most points scored in a League slate (160 points) with a game to spare. The old record was 148 points by Gardner-Webb in four Conference games in 2003.

**LIBERTY SETS NUMEROUS BIG SCORING SCORING RECORDS (PART TWO)**

Continuing on with Liberty's record-setting scoring season, the Flames broke the Big South single-season scoring record of 413 points (Coastal Carolina, 2004) during their win over VMI. Liberty enters the regular-season finale with 438 points for a Big South-record average of 43.8 per game. Liberty has scored at least 30 points in a Big South-record nine games (breaking the old mark of eight), and has five games with at least 40 points -- tying the Conference record set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. In addition, the Flames have broken the Big South record for most touchdowns scored with 57 (49 on offense), eclipsing the previous best of 55 touchdowns by Coastal in 2004.

**JENNINGS TIES TD SCORING RECORD, BREAKS RUSHING TD AND OVERALL SCORING MARK**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for three touchdowns Saturday vs. VMI, giving him 15 rushing touchdowns on the season and the Big South single-season record. The old mark was 14, held by Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** and Liberty's **EUGENE GOODMAN** in 2003. Jennings has 16 total touchdowns this year, tying the overall season record, which was set last season by Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON**. Jennings has scored a Big South-record 98 points this season, breaking Simpson's season record of 96 set a year ago.

**2,000-YARD ODYSSEY**

Liberty running back duo **ZACH TERRELL** and **RASHAD JENNINGS** each surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards during Saturday's game against VMI, becoming the fifth and sixth players, respectively, to reach the plateau. Terrell is currently at 2,023, just ahead of Jennings' total of 2,019. Meanwhile, Jennings is just one yard shy of his second-straight 1,000-yard rushing season, which would make him the second player in Big South history with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Former Liberty rusher **DRE BARNES** was the first, rushing for more than 1,300 yards in 2002 and 2003.

**ZACH ATTACK LOOKING FOR UNIQUE RECORD**

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** extended his rushing touchdown scoring streak to 15 games with a 3-yard run vs. VMI Saturday. He has scored 20 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 25 and good for a tie for second all-time in Big South history with teammate **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Terrell is looking to become the first player in League history to score a TD in all of his team's games in a single-season.

**GREEN MACHINE**

Liberty kicker **NOAH GREENBAUM** broke three Big South kick scoring records Saturday vs. VMI. He set a League mark for most PATs and attempts, going a perfect 10-for-10 on the day. In addition, he finished with 13 points, marking his fifth 10-point kicking game of the year -- a single-season Big South record. Lastly, Greenbaum increased his kick scoring total to 94 points, breaking the season record of 91 points, held by VMI's **MATT SHARPE** in 2003.

**BOLDEN OPPORTUNITY**

Liberty kick returner **DOMINIC BOLDEN** set a Big South single-game record with 198 kickoff return yards on just three attempts Saturday vs. VMI (66.0 average). The old yardage record was 187, set by Charleston Southern's **MIKE WASHINGTON** at South Florida in 2002. Washington returned eight kickoffs that afternoon. The previous best yardage on just three returns was 142, accomplished by CSU's **KIJANA THOMAS** vs. Liberty in 2003.

**JENNINGS' JAUNTS**

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** saw his consecutive 100-yard rushing games streak end at five Saturday vs. VMI, as he finished with 77 yards against the Keydets. The streak tied the Big South single-season record, and was two away from the overall record of seven. In 19 career games with the Flames, Jennings has rushed for 100 yards 11 times, including seven games over 160. He needs one more 100-yard rushing game to tie the Big South single-season record of seven, set by former Flames RB **DRE BARNES** (2002) and VMI's **SEAN MIZZER** (2003).

**RUN, RUN RASHAD**

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** did extend his multi-TD streak to five-straight games, tying the Big South record for most consecutive multi-TD games. He has scored 12 TDs in that span. Coastal's **PATRICK HALL** first set the League record in 2004 in the final five games of the year.

**MANY HAPPY RETURNS**

The Big South has recorded 17 return touchdowns this season. The breakdown is as follows: interceptions (5), punt returns (4), fumble returns (4), kickoff returns (3) and a blocked field goal return (1). Liberty has returned a Big South-record four punt returns for touchdowns, and has tied the Conference record with three INT scores. Charleston Southern's three fumble return touchdowns are a Big South record as well.

**BIG SOUTH GAMES ON PACE FOR SCORING RECORD**

Through eight Conference games, the Big South membership has combined to score 513 points, an average of 64.1 points per game. The record for most points scored during the League season is 568, set last year, while the highest scoring average is 60.3, set in 2002 during a six-game League slate. Liberty and VMI combined to score 107 points this past Saturday, the most combined points in a regulation game and matching the League record, set by Gardner-Webb (55) and VMI (52) in triple-over-time in 2005.

**FOUR ON THE FLOOR**

Gardner-Webb won its fourth consecutive home contest with its 66-0 win over Savannah State in Week 10, its longest win streak since winning 15 in-a-row at home from Oct. 6, 2001 to Nov. 15, 2003. The Runnin' Bulldogs' next home game is Saturday vs. Liberty.

**50-50 RAFFLE**

Gardner-Webb receiving duo **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (54) and **DOBSON COLLINS** (50) are the second set of teammates in Big South history with at least 50 receptions in the same season. The first group was Charleston Southern's **EDDIE GADSON** (69) and **HARRY SEABROOK** (54) in 2004. Flagler is the first and only player in Conference history with three 50-catch seasons. The senior wideout hauled in 64 passes as a junior in 2006 and caught 55 balls in 2005.

**FIRST AND TEN**

Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** hauled in two touchdown passes Saturday against Gardner-Webb, his third-straight game with two TD grabs. Simpson increased his season total 10, becoming the first player in Big South history with two 10-touchdown catch seasons. He pushed his career total to 43, and is seven receiving touchdowns from **JERRY RICE**'s all-time FCS record.

**ALL FOR ONE**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** owns the Big South single-season all-purpose yards record, standing at 1,751 yards following his fourth game this season with 200 all-purpose yards, collecting 209 at Liberty this past Saturday. On the season, Maypray is averaging 175.1 yards per contest, and in his last eight appearances, he has collected 1,617 yards (202.1 per game). Maypray established a VMI and Big South single-game record with 346 all-purpose yards vs. Charleston Southern in Week 10. He tallied 209 receiving yards, gained 36 on the ground, totaled 102 on kickoff returns and lost one yard on a punt return for his record-setting total. Maypray shattered the old single-game mark of 270 yards, set by Liberty's **SAMKON GADO** in 2004.

**HONEST ABEGESAH**

VMI sophomore FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** became the seventh player in Big South history with a 1,000-yard rushing season, surpassing the plateau this past Saturday at Liberty. Abegesah leads the Big South with 1,077 rushing yards and has led his team in rushing all 10 games this season (the lone rusher in the Conference to do so). Abegesah is currently 18th all-time in the Big South in career rushing yards.

**WHAT A RUSH!**

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 290.8 rushing yards per game, ranking third in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. The Keydets need 151 rushing yards against The Citadel this coming Saturday to break the Big South single-season record of 3,058 rushing yards, set by the Chanticleers in '04. The Keydets, which have rushed the ball 593 times this season and at least 50 times in their past 11 games, need two more rushing attempts to set the Conference record in that category. VMI will finish as the League's leader in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as the Keydets led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game.

**BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING GAINS TWO MEMBERS**

The Big South's 1,000-yard career rushing list added two members this past Saturday, as VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** and Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** reached the milestone. The Big South now has six active 1,000-yard career rushers. Below is a look at the six active rushers and where they rank in League history.

**JADA, COMIN' ATTYA**

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** concludes his career Saturday against Coastal Carolina. He is the Big South's all-time leading tackler with 437, and is looking to become the first player in Conference history to lead the League in tackles in consecutive seasons. He is at 114 this season, and was tops in 2006 with 127 stops. Ross became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i and became the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles in Week 8 vs. Liberty.

**GIANT BRYANT**

Charleston Southern QB **SIDNEY BRYANT** is 2-0 since becoming CSU's starting quarterback, and in his last three outings, is 61-of-97 passing (=62.9 percent) for 781 yards. In that span, he has thrown nine touchdown passes against to just two interceptions. Bryant's quarterback efficiency rating in the last three games is 157.01.

**SACK IT TO ME**

Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** remains the all-time Big South leader in quarterback sacks with 20.5, just ahead of Coastal Carolina's **ADRAIN GRADY** (19.0). Johnston regained the lead in Week 8 at VMI after first passing Grady in Week 6 at Appalachian State. Grady reclaimed the title in Week 7 vs. Chowan.

**AT A LOSS FOR WORDS**

Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** also is the Big South's career leader in tackles-for-loss at 50.0 following his fourth-straight game with a TFL. Johnston has 20.5 TFL this season, second-highest in Big South history and two away from the season record of 22.5, set by former teammate **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004.

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 55 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 50 contests, followed by VMI (37), Charleston Southern (30) and Liberty (26).

**SIMPSON CATCHES MORE RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCES**

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the second player in Big South history with 40 career touchdowns he surpassed the mark with two TD grabs at Liberty in Week 10. Simpson has a Big South-record 43 career touchdown receptions, and is four shy of the Conference's all-time career mark of 47, held by former teammate **AUNDRES PERKINS**. Meanwhile, Simpson is the Big South's career leader in receiving yards (2,636), is third all-time in receptions (157) and has caught 27.4 percent of his career receptions for touchdowns.

**FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY**

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is the second-leading receiver in Big South history in the three major categories (receptions, yardage and touchdowns). Flagler, who moved into second in career receptions in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, currently has 183 career catches, 19 shy of the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler surpassed Price (2,429) in Week 10 for second all-time in career yardage, and is at 2,490 in his career. Flagler became the second player in Big South history with 30 career TD catches (31) in Week 10 as well.

**CATCH ME IF YOU CAN**

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** continues to distance himself on the Big South leaderboard in receptions, as he hauled in five passes vs. Presbyterian to increase his League-leading total to 63 -- nine ahead of Bulldogs WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (54 receptions). Brown is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. The lone "shared" year was in 2002, when CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** and Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** co-led the Big South with 45 receptions.

**PLAYING CATCH-UP**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** ranks fifth all-time in receptions (140), fifth in receiving yards (1,905) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches. He needs 32 receiving yards to move into fourth-place, as well as 95 yards to become the fourth player with 2,000 career receiving yards. Meanwhile, teammate **BRANDON TURNER** is in sole possession of sixth-place in history with 134 receptions, and holds the sixth spot with 1,838 receiving yards.

**EIGHT IS NOT ENOUGH**

Liberty extended its Big South-leading home winning streak to a school-record eight games with Saturday's 73-34 win over VMI. The Flames posted its first 6-0 home season, its most wins at Williams Stadium in school history. In its current streak, Liberty is averaging 44.3 points and holding opponents to 16.3 points per game. Liberty's next home game is in 2008.

**THE BEST DEFENSE IS A GOOD OFFENSE**

Coastal Carolina's **SANTINI WASHINGTON** played both wide receiver and defensive back against Gardner-Webb Saturday, becoming the first player in school history to play on both sides of the ball. Washington caught a pass, and recorded four tackles, a TFL and an interception. Last week, Gardner-Webb DE **BRIAN JOHNSTON** caught a 3-yard touchdown pass vs. Savannah State, becoming the first defensive player in the Big South to score an offensive touchdown since Gardner-Webb DL **HAROLD WELLS** recorded eight rushing TDs for the Bulldogs in 2004.

**THREE-PEAT**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** and WR **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each scored three touchdowns Saturday vs. VMI, becoming the third set of teammates in Big South history to score three TDs in the same game. Liberty's **DRE BARNES** and **EUGENE GOODMAN** were the first to accomplish the feat in 2003 vs. Norfolk State (three rushing touchdowns each). Last season, Coastal Carolina backs **MIKE TOLBERT** (three rushing TDs) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (two rush, one receiving) each scored three touchdowns at Gardner-Webb on Nov. 11.

**200-POINT CONVERSION**

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is looking to become the sixth player in Big South history with 200 career points, as he stands at 194 entering the final week of the season. Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker and fifth player overall with 200 career points during Week 9 at Gardner-Webb, and is fifth all-time in scoring with 214 points, behind K **JOSH HOKE** (297), RB **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286), WR **JEROME SIMPSON** (258) and K **HUNTER SMITH** (228).

**BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE**

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the fifth QB in Big South history with 4,000 career passing yards, reaching the milestone Saturday vs. VMI. He is currently at 4,212 and sits 884 yards from the fourth spot. Smith continues to climb the Big South passing record book, as he is tied for fourth in touchdown passes (28), fifth in completions (291) and sixth in attempts (504).

**THREE-FOR-ALL**

VMI QB **KYLE HUGHES** and Charleston Southern signal-caller **SIDNEY BRYANT** each threw three touchdown passes during CSU's 37-28 win over the Keydets in Week 10. It was the second time in Big South history that each quarterback threw three TD passes in the same Conference game. The first time was Oct. 22, 2005, when VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON** tallied four scoring strikes and Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** had three touchdown passes in the same game, which was won by GWU in triple-overtime, 55-52.

**GIMME FIVE...HUNDRED**

VMI has recorded four games of 500 total yards this season, one game away from tying the Big South season record. Gardner-Webb set the mark with five 500-yard total offense games in 2005. VMI and Gardner-Webb are the lone Big South squads to have recorded at least four games of 500 total yards in one season.

**TWO COACHES REACH 100-WIN MILESTONES WITHIN A WEEK OF EACH OTHER**

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** and Coastal Carolina leader **DAVID BENNETT** each recorded their 100th career coaching win recently. In Week 8, Patton captured his 100th collegiate win in GWU's 36-22 victory at VMI. It was Patton's third attempt at the century mark, and he is now 102-70-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 72-47 record at the helm of the Bulldogs. His record in Big South games stands at 15-7 (=.682 percent).

Bennett notched his 100th win in Week 9 following Coastal's dramatic, come-from-behind win over VMI, 42-35, to open Big South play. It was Bennett's second attempt at the milestone victory. He is now 101-34 in his career, including a 38-17 mark at Coastal.

**ACTION JACKSON**

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** became the the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 9 vs. Presbyterian. Jackson is fourth all-time at 3,143, behind Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (3,547). Jackson became the Big South's all-time leader in punt returns in Week 10 with his 43rd career punt return, breaking the mark held by Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER** (42). Jackson is already the Conference record holder with 525 career punt return yards.

**BATTERING RAM**

Coastal Carolina senior FB **MIKE TOLBERT** rushed for a school-record 244 yards on 13 carries vs. VMI in Week 9, the second-highest single-game rushing total in Big South history and one yard short of the all-time record (245 by Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** in 2002). The last Big South player to rush for 200 yards in a game was Charleston Southern's **ANDRE COPELAND**, who had 226 against West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005. Tolbert's 18.8 average yards per carry set a Conference mark, and his 86-yard TD run in the fourth quarter is the longest rush from scrimmage in Big South annals.

**ROLL CALL**

Liberty averaged 14,190 fans this season, breaking the school and Big South single-season record for average attendance and overall (85,140). As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 190,770 fans through 25 home dates, an average of 7,631. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838 and total attendance of 191,476 in 28 home dates.

**NORM!!**

Coastal Carolina DB **MARRIO NORMAN** tied a Big South single-game record with three interceptions in Week 8 vs. Presbyterian. Norman shares the record with VMI's **CHRISTIAN KELLY**, who intercepted three passes last season at Charleston Southern. Norman has 10 career INTs, tied for second all-time in Big South history with former teammate **DEWITT MYERS**. Former Coastal safety **QUINTON TEAL** is the career leader with 17 interceptions.

**PAT ON THE BACK**

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** is second all-time in Big South history in career PATs, as he is 127-135 (=94.1 percent) in his career. He surpassed Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH** in Week 8, who had 118 point-after-touchdown kicks from 2003-06. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

**PRESBYTERIAN FINISHES FIRST DIVISION I SEASON 6-5, 2-2 VS. FUTURE BIG SOUTH FOES**

Future Big South member Presbyterian College finished its first season at the FCS level with a 28-24 loss at Charleston Southern, ending the 2007 campaign with a 6-5 record. PC went 2-2 against future Conference members and played the four games on the road. The lone League foe PC did not face in 2007 was Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings and statistics, nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

**TOUGHEST SCHEDULE EVER**

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as 17 of the League's 19 non-Conference losses have all come against the nation's top programs (four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision [FBS] opponents). Excluding Presbyterian, the current combined record of the FCS opponents the Big South has faced is 65-36 (=.644 percent). Six losses have been against Top 25 FCS teams, four have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel, Georgia Southern), and the remaining three defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

**BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER**

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

**STONY BROOK (6-4) SHUTS DOWN CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE, 34-7**

Stony Brook defeated Central Connecticut State Saturday 34-7, moving to 6-4 on the year and finishing with a perfect 5-0 record at home. SBU concludes the season at #24 Elon Saturday at 3:30pm. Of the Seawolves' four losses, three have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra, Richmond), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). Earlier this season, the Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll for three-straight weeks, and were ranked in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll as well.
