Jennings rushed for a game-high 131 yards on 20 carries and scored two touchdowns in Liberty's 50-10 Big South Conference win at Charleston Southern. He averaged 6.6 yards per rushing attempt, recorded his third consecutive 100-yard rushing game and his second-straight multi-touchdown game. Jennings scored the Flames' second touchdown of the contest at 10:59 of the second quarter to give Liberty the lead for good at 17-10. He then set-up a field goal with a career-long 64-yard reception late in the first half, and added a two-yard scoring plunge in the third quarter. Jennings caught two passes for 80 yards and finished the day with 211 all-purpose yards.

**NEW BALANCE
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Johnston was a force on Saturday with 11 total tackles (six solo), a career-high 4.0 TFL (minus-26 yards), plus two sacks (minus-13 yards) in Gardner-Webb's 36-22 Big South win at VMI. He came up with perhaps the game's biggest defensive play in the fourth quarter. With GWU clinging to a 29-22 lead late in the game, Johnston broke through to stop a fake punt attempt by the Keydets and ran down VMI's punter for a 12-yard loss. The play set-up the Bulldogs' game-clinching score and the final 36-22 margin. His pass rush helped Gardner-Webb to a 68.53 pass defense efficiency rating, holding VMI to 9-of-24 passing and two interceptions.

BIG SOUTH TV GAME OF THE WEEK RETURNS SATURDAY

The Big South football TV Game of the Week returns Saturday, as SportSouth will televise Charleston Southern at Gardner-Webb live at 6:30pm from Spangler Stadium. The game will be the second of three Big South games airing on SportSouth this season. **MATT DEVLIN** and **ROD SMITH** will call the action. Gardner-Webb is making its third appearance on television this season, as the Bulldogs appeared on ESPN GamePlan and CSS earlier in September. Charleston Southern is making its first appearance on TV this year.

COASTAL CAROLINA SET TO BEGIN TITLE DEFENSE

The Chanticleers' quest for an unprecedented fourth consecutive Big South football title begins Saturday night when CCU opens its Big South schedule at home vs. VMI. Coastal is 3-1 in its Big South openers, winning the last three-straight. Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** will make his second attempt at 100 career wins as well. He is 99-33 in his career, including a 36-16 mark at Coastal, and holds a 3-1 advantage over the Keydets.

LIBERTY, GARDNER-WEBB OPEN BIG SOUTH SEASON WITH WINS

Liberty and Gardner-Webb each opened the Conference season Saturday with road wins. The pre-season favorite Flames won convincingly at Charleston Southern, 50-10, for its third 1-0 Big South start and first since 2004. Gardner-Webb rallied in the fourth quarter to win at VMI, 36-22, and is 1-0 in Conference play for the fourth time in six seasons.

GOING FOR TWO

Liberty has never started 2-0 in Big South play, and will have to wait until Nov. 3 for its chance at starting undefeated. Gardner-Webb has started 2-0 its previous three times (2002, 2003 and 2006).

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN'S HOME WIN STREAK ENDS

Liberty's 50-10 win at Charleston Southern Saturday snapped the Buccaneers' 12-game home winning streak, which tied the Big South record first established by Coastal Carolina from 2004-05. CSU's streak was the third-longest in the nation and began Oct. 15, 2005 with a 63-42 victory over West Virginia Wesleyan. The Flames take over the Conference's current longest home win streak at five games, and puts the string on the line Saturday at home vs. future Big South member Presbyterian.

CONFERENCE GAME WIN STREAKS

Coastal Carolina and Liberty are the lone squads currently with extensive League win streaks. The Chanticleers have the longest current Big South game win streak at four games, and have won 11 of its last 12 Big South football contests. Liberty is second to Coastal with a three-game Big South win streak.

PATTON SCORES 100TH COLLEGIATE COACHING WIN

Gardner-Webb head coach **STEVE PATTON** achieved his 100th career collegiate coaching win Saturday in the Bulldogs' 36-22 victory at VMI. It was Patton's third attempt at the century mark. He is now 100-69-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 70-46 record at the helm of the Bulldogs.

PRESBYTERIAN STANDS 2-0 VS. FUTURE BIG SOUTH FOES

Future Big South member Presbyterian College rallied from a 24-0 first half deficit to defeat Coastal Carolina in overtime, 41-34, to move to 2-0 against its future Conference brethren this season. The win came on the heels of PC's 45-21 victory at VMI in Week 7, was the Blue Hose's fourth-straight win of the season, and pushed Presbyterian's record to 5-3 on the year. Presbyterian is playing four of the five Big South football members this year, all on the road. The lone foe PC will not face is Gardner-Webb. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and is considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings and statistics, nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12.

SIMPSON CATCHES SECOND BIG SOUTH CAREER RECORD

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON**, already the League's career leader with 37 touchdown receptions, became the Big South's all-time record holder in receiving yards Saturday vs. Presbyterian. Simpson finished the night with 56 receiving yards, giving him 2,430 and breaking the record of 2,429 held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Simpson is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (142), and has caught 26.1 percent of his career receptions for touchdowns.

JADA, COMIN' ATTYA

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS**, who became the Big South's all-time leading tackler during Week 4 at Hawai'i, became the first player in the Conference with 400 career tackles this past Saturday vs. Liberty. Ross finished with 17 hits vs. the Flames, increasing his record total to 406.

THREE'S COMPANY

Gardner-Webb returns home Saturday after three-straight road games, and is looking to win its third consecutive home contest of the year, as the Bulldogs defeated Jacksonville, 27-6 on Sept. 8 and Austin Peay, 20-13 on Sept. 29. The last time Gardner-Webb won three-straight home games was in 2004-05, when the Bulldogs won the season finale in 2004 and their first two home games of 2005.

FANNING THE FIRE

Preseason Big South favorite Liberty opened the Conference season with a 50-10 win at Charleston Southern Saturday, its most points ever in a Big South contest. The previous best was 38, accomplished three times. The 40-point margin of victory was the fourth-largest in a Big South game in League history. It was also the fewest points the Flames allowed a Conference opponent since allowing 10 points to VMI on Oct. 1, 2005.

NORM!!

Coastal Carolina DB **MARRIO NORMAN** tied a Big South single-game record with three interceptions Saturday vs. Presbyterian. Norman shares the record with VMI's **CHRISTIAN KELLY**, who intercepted three passes last season at Charleston Southern. Norman now has nine career INTs, moving into third-place all-time in Big South history, behind former teammates **QUINTON TEAL** (17) and **DEWITT MYERS** (10).

BIRDS OF PREY

In addition to **MARRIO NORMAN**'s record-tying night, the Coastal Carolina defense finished with six interceptions against the Blue Hose, breaking its Big South single-game record for most interceptions in a game. The Chanticleers first set the mark of five vs. Savannah State in 2004, and equalled the mark last season at Gardner-Webb.

BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE

Liberty has scored at least 30 points in six of its seven games this season and is averaging a Big South-best 40.0 points per game, which is pacing ahead of the Conference record of 37.5, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. The Flames have already scored 36 touchdowns this season (30 on offense), and WR **WYNTON JACKSON** leads the Big South with eight TDs, followed by **ZACH TERRELL** and **RASHAD JENNINGS** with seven each. Liberty has never led the Big South in scoring offense, and Jackson is looking to become just the second Liberty player to lead the League in touchdowns scored (**EUGENE GOODMAN** with 14 in 2003).

WHAT A RUSH!

VMI leads the Big South with 293.0 rushing yards per game, ranking fourth in the country and pacing ahead of the Conference record of 278.0, set by Coastal Carolina in 2004. If VMI maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,223 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past eight games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

BUILT FORD TOUGH

Coastal Carolina junior RB **JAMIE FORDHAM** rushed for a career-best 133 yards Saturday vs. Presbyterian, giving the Chanticleers their first 100-yard rushing game of the season and first since former QB **TYLER THIGPEN** rushed for 119 yards at Gardner-Webb last season. Fordham is the first Coastal running back to rush for 100 yards in a game since **MIKE TOLBERT** gained 151 at VMI more than a year ago on Oct. 14, 2006.

HONEST ABEGESAH

VMI sophomore FB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** rushed for a career-high 180 yards Saturday vs. Gardner-Webb, the highest total in the Big South this season and the most in the League since Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** tallied 186 rushing yards vs. William & Mary on Oct. 14, 2006. Abegesah has led his team in rushing all seven games (the lone rusher in the Conference to do so), and leads the Big South with 767 rushing yards and 109.6 yards per game. He needs 233 rushing yards to record just the seventh 1,000-rushing yard season in Big South history.

PASSING GRADES

Despite allowing 396 passing yards to Presbyterian Saturday, Coastal Carolina continues to lead the nation in pass defense, holding opponents to 119.1 passing yards per game. The Chanticleers have held opponents to under 100 yards passing in five of its seven games. The Big South season record for passing defense is 131.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2004.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 52 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 47 contests, followed by VMI (34), Charleston Southern (27) and Liberty (23).

SACK IT TO ME

The race for the Big South's career quarterback sack record has changed hands for the third consecutive week, as Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** has regained the all-time lead from Coastal Carolina's **ADRIN GRADY**. Johnston posted 2.0 sacks at VMI Saturday to increase his total to 19.5, vaulting past Grady's career total of 19.0. Johnston first passed Grady in Week 6 at Appalachian State, only to see Grady reclaim the title in Week 7. Meanwhile, Johnston remains the Big South's career leader in tackles-for-loss at 41.5. He passed Coastal Carolina's **MAURICE SIMPKINS** (36.0) during the Appalachian State game as well.

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** became the No. 2 all-time leading receiver in Big South history in Week 5 vs. Austin Peay, surpassing VMI's **ZOHN BURDEN**. Flagler has 172 career receptions, just 30 catches from tying the all-time record of 202 receptions, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**. Flagler, who is averaging 6.14 receptions per game this season, needs to average 7.50 per game over the final four contests to break the mark. Meanwhile, Flagler is third all-time in Big South history with 2,312 receiving yards, behind Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** (2,430) and Price (2,429), and is second in career touchdown receptions with 28.

ZACH ATTACK

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** extended his rushing touchdown scoring streak to 12 games with two scores at Charleston Southern Saturday. He has scored 17 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 22, tied for second in Big South history with VMI's **SEAN MIZZER**. Terrell is sixth all-time in the Conference in rushing yards with 1,872, and stands 128 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000.

JENNINGS' JAUNTS

Liberty junior RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** rushed for 131 yards and two touchdowns at Charleston Southern Saturday, his ninth 100-yard rushing game in 16 appearances for the Flames -- five of which have been games with 160 yards-or-more. He also rushed for more than one TD in a game for the sixth time. Jennings' 131 yards moved him into ninth-place on the League's career rushing chart at 1,574. He needs 64 yards for eighth-place.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB SET TO GROW

The Big South's 1,000-yard career rushing list will likely increase to 20 by season's end, as Coastal Carolina's **JAMIE FORDHAM** is 110 yards from the milestone and Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** is 166 yards shy of the mark. VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** needs 233 rushing yards for 1,000 this season and his career. The Big South has four active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). ACTION JACKSON

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** needs 66 all-purpose yards to become the fourth player in Big South history with 3,000 in a career. He is currently at 2,934 and is second in the Conference this season with 919 all-purpose yards and a 131.3 per game average. In Week 5 vs. Saint Francis, Jackson totaled 267 all-purpose yards, the second-highest single-game total in Big South history. Jackson posted 115 receiving yards, 83 kickoff return yards, 60 punt return yards and nine rushing yards, and missed the Big South single-game record by three yards. Meanwhile, Jackson is now fifth all-time in receptions (129), fifth in receiving yards (1,792) and tied for sixth with 12 TD catches.

DEVIN INTERVENTION

Gardner-Webb QB **DEVIN CAMPBELL** threw his 28th career touchdown pass Saturday at VMI, moving into a fourth-place tie in Big South history with former VMI quarterback **JONATHAN WILSON**. Campbell's former teammate, **NICK ROBERTS**, is third all-time with 48 scoring strikes.

200-POINT CONVERSION

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** is two points away from becoming the third kicker and fifth player overall with 200 career points. He is currently at 198 points and is looking to join **K JOSH HOKE** (297), **RB AUNDRES PERKINS** (286), **K HUNTER SMITH** (228) and **WR JEROME SIMPSON** (222) in the Big South's 200-point club. Following Ellis, the next closest player to the 200-point plateau is Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** with 176 career points.

"MAYPRAY, MAYPRAY"

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** totaled 189 all-purpose yards Saturday vs. Gardner-Webb, his fifth consecutive game with 100 and his sixth this season. In his last five games, Maypray has gained 837 all-purpose yards (167.4 per game). Maypray is leading the Big South with 971 all-purpose yards and a 138.7 per game average. He needs 568 more yards to tie the Big South single-season record of 1,539, set by Liberty's **DRE BARNES** in 2002. Maypray needs to average 142.3 yards per game over the next four games to break the record.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

Gardner-Webb WR **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** and Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** are tied atop the Big South leaderboard in receptions with 43. Brown is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. The lone "shared" year was in 2002, when CSU's **AARON DUNKLIN** and Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.** co-led the Big South with 45 receptions. Meanwhile, in Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Flagler against Wofford in 2005.

BROCK YOU LIKE A HURRICANE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** became the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000 passing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 5 vs. Saint Francis. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he is sixth all-time in attempts (450), completions (250), passing yards (3,420), and TD passes (21).

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 117-124 in his career (=94.4) and needs one PAT to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177.

GREEN MACHINE

Liberty kicker **NOAH GREENBAUM** leads the Big South in scoring with 62 points and is on pace to break both the Conference's overall scoring record (96 points - **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006) and the kick scoring mark (91 points - **MATT SHARPE** in 2003). Greenbaum is averaging 8.9 points, and if he can maintain the clip the remaining four games, he would end the 2007 season with 97.6 points. Greenbaum is the third player in Big South history with three 10-point kicking games in one season.

CALLING AN AUDIBLE

QBs **ELI BYRD** (Charleston Southern), **WILLIAM RICHARDSON** (Coastal Carolina) and **STAN DOOLITTLE** (Gardner-Webb) are beginning to crack into the League's all-time Top 10 in several statistical categories. Byrd is already tied for eighth with 11 career TD passes and moved into 10th place in career attempts (221). Doolittle has 126 completions, good for 10th all-time in that category. Richardson moved into a four-way tie for the 10th spot in career TD passes Saturday vs. Presbyterian, and he needs 43 passing yards to move into 10th on that list.

TOUGHEST SCHEDULE EVER?

The Big South is playing arguably its toughest non-Conference schedule in the League's six-year history this season, as 17 of the League's 19 non-Conference losses have all come against the nation's top programs (four of the losses have been to Football Bowl Subdivision [FBS] opponents). Excluding Presbyterian, the current combined record of the FCS opponents the Big South has faced is 48-23 (=.676 percent). Six losses have been against Top 25 FCS teams, four have come at the hands of programs that later entered the Top 25 (Delaware State, Elon, The Citadel, Georgia Southern), and the remaining three defeats have been against opponents that have received votes in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches Polls (William & Mary, Lehigh, Furman).

ROLL CALL

Through three home games, Liberty is averaging 13,716 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 116,384 fans through 16 home dates, an average of 7,274. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK EVENS RECORD TO 4-4 FOLLOWING 2OT WIN OVER MAINE

Stony Brook kicked a game-tying field goal with two seconds left and then got a nine-yard scoring run from sophomore **CONTE CUTTINO** in the second overtime as the Seawolves took a thrilling 30-23 overtime Homecoming win over Maine on Saturday. SBU came back from a 10-0 deficit to win its fourth game of the year and even its record to 4-4. Of the Seawolves' four losses this season, three have been to ranked teams (Youngstown State, Hofstra, Richmond), and two have been by five points-or-less (Hofstra, Albany). Earlier this season, the Seawolves received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll for three-straight weeks, and were ranked in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll as well. ELLIS, McKINNON AMONG DRADDY TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced recently that Charleston Southern's **NICK ELLIS** and Coastal Carolina's **REN McKINNON** are among 153 semifinalists for the 2007 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth, and the candidates for the NFF 2007 National Scholar-Athlete Awards. One of college football's most sought after and competitive awards, the Draddy Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary community leadership. Semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

Coastal Carolina became the first Big South team in history to post a 50-point game in five consecutive seasons with its 51-0 win over Chowan in Week 7. The Chanticleers shared the record with Gardner-Webb, which posted four-straight years with a 50-point game from 2002-05. Coastal also recorded its eighth 50-point game in history, establishing a Big South mark and breaking its tie with Gardner-Webb for the previous most 50-point games (seven).
