OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

STAN DOOLITTLE • QB • Sophomore
 Gardner-Webb • Ninety-Six, S.C.

Doolittle came off the bench at Mississippi State and tossed a career-high 191 yards and a personal-best 19 completions against MSU, which played its first-team defense most of the game. Doolittle helped spark GWU to more total offensive yards (332) against the SEC's fifth-best defense than either Auburn or Tulane, led the Bulldogs to an effective 4-of-5 in the red zone as Gardner-Webb outscored Mississippi State in the second-half (15-3), and was responsible for 19 of Gardner-Webb's 20 first downs on the night. Doolittle directed GWU's four scoring drives, which averaged 72 yards in length and were nine plays-or-longer. He added 19 rushing yards and finished the night with 210 yards of total offense.

NEW BALANCE
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MARIO E. BROWN • LB • Junior
 Gardner-Webb • Greenville, S.C.

Brown recorded eight tackles (four solo, four assisted), 1.5 tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and a quarterback hurry Saturday at Mississippi State. He helped hold Mississippi State to just 108 yards and six first downs in the second half, allowing Gardner-Webb's offense to get on the field more often - which pulled the 'Dogs to within just two scores by game's end. He also recovered a fumble late in the first quarter to end a Mississippi State drive.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

EVAN KAY • K • Freshman
 Gardner-Webb • Jonesboro, Ga.

Kay converted all three of his field goal attempts at Mississippi State and accounted for nine of Gardner-Webb's 15 points himself. He hit from distances of 33, 20 and 28 yards in front of a crowd of 42,272 as well as swirling winds on his final kick of the night. Kay became the sixth different kicker in Big South history to make three field goals in a game, and is just the fifth in League history with a perfect 3-of-3 performance.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

JEFFREY WILLIAMS • LB
 Gardner-Webb • Frisco City, Ala.

Williams led Gardner-Webb with 11 tackles in his third collegiate game and playing just two hours from his hometown. He had five solo stops and played a major role in helping thwart MSU's rushing attack in the second half. MSU finished with 108 total yards and six first downs in the second half, with no touchdowns. Williams now has 21 total tackles in Gardner-Webb's two road games - both against FBS foes, and now leads the squad with 28 stops.

JADA KNIGHT

Charleston Southern senior linebacker **JADA ROSS** became the Big South's all-time leading tackler Saturday during the Buccaneers' game with Hawai'i. Ross entered the night with 357 tackles and finished the night with 10 stops, giving him 367 and the career record, which broke the previous mark of 364 established last season by Coastal Carolina's **JAMAR LEATH**.

"MAY-PRAY, MAY-PRAY"

VMI slotback **TIM MAYPRAY** set a school record for all-purpose yards in a game when he piled up 245 this past Saturday at Lehigh, topping the previous high of 233 by **SEAN MIZZER** against Davidson on Sept. 6, 2003. Against Lehigh, Maypray rushed for 45 yards on nine carries, caught three passes for 53 yards, returned five kickoffs for 126 yards and notched one punt return for 21 yards. Maypray's effort Saturday ties him for third all-time for most all-purpose yards in a game in Big South history, joining **RASHAUD PALMER** (Elon) in 2002 and **ANDRE COPELAND** (Charleston Southern) in 2005.

MAY WE CONTINUE WITH THIS THEME...

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is first in the Big South with 140.3 all-purpose yards per game, and ranks 37th nationally. If Maypray can continue his current clip, he would finish with 1,543 all-purpose yards this season, which would break the Big South single-season record of 1,539, set by Liberty's **DRE BARNES** in 2002. Maypray's 140.3 per game average is just below **SAM GADO**'s League record of 140.6, set in 2004. Maypray has 427 all-purpose yards (213.5 average) in his past two games, and his 31.6 kickoff return average is 12th in the country.

FERG-A-LICIOUS

Charleston Southern running back **ALEXIUS FERGUSON** also surpassed 200 all-purpose yards Saturday, as he finished with 225 at Hawai'i and tied for the ninth-highest output in Big South history. Of his 225 yards, Ferguson totaled 179 on a Big South single-game record nine kickoff returns. He also added 27 rushing yards and 19 receiving yards. Ferguson's 179 kickoff return yards are second-most in a game in League annals.

CSU LUAU

Charleston Southern turned in a good first-half effort at Hawai'i Saturday, as the Bucs were down by just 11 points at halftime. First-half highlights for Charleston Southern included DB **JOSH WARRIOR**'s interception on UH's first play of the game, followed by the Buccaneers tying the game at 7-7 in the first quarter on a 57-yard touchdown pass from **ELI BYRD** to **DEE BROWN**. In the closing moments of the first half, CSU kicker **NICK ELLIS** nailed a career-best 48-yard field goal to make the score 21-10 at the break. In the first 30 minutes, both teams had 10 first downs, with Hawai'i holding just a 249-194 edge in total offense.

ZACH ATTACK

Liberty junior RB **ZACH TERRELL** scored on a two-yard touchdown run Saturday at Elon, giving him a rushing touchdown in all four games this season and in 10 consecutive games, dating back to 2006. He has scored 14 touchdowns in that span, increasing his career total to 19, which is tied for third all-time in Big South history with **EUGENE GOODMAN** (Liberty) and **NICK ROBERTS** (Gardner-Webb). VMI's **SEAN MIZZER** holds second-place with 22 rushing touchdowns, while Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** owns the record of 46. Meanwhile, Terrell is the Big South's leading active rusher with 1,685 career rushing yards, and stands 315 rushing yards shy of becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 2,000 rushing yards.

FLAMES' THIRTY-POINT STREAK ENDS

The Liberty Flames' five-game streak with at least 30 points scored ended Saturday at Elon. Liberty tallied 34, 38, 38, 35, 41 points in five-straight games, dating back to last season, which tied the Big South record for most consecutive games with at least 30 points. Coastal Carolina established the record in 2004, and Charleston Southern equaled the mark in 2005. It was the Flames' longest such streak since reeling of seven-straight 30-point games from the end of the 1994 season (40, 40, 59) and the first four games of 1995 (76-30-48-48).

WHAT A RUSH!

VMI continues to lead the Big South with 244.0 rushing yards per game, ranking ninth in the country. The Conference record for rushing offense is 278.0 (Coastal Carolina, 2004). VMI's current clip is second-highest in Big South history, and the Keydets are looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past five games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

CONTINUING THE TRADITION

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** leads the Big South with 24 receptions through four games, three more than his closest competitor (21 by Liberty's **BRANDON TURNER**). Brown, who is averaging 6.00 receptions per game, is looking to continue a Charleston Southern tradition, as a Bucs receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. In Week 2 at Wofford, Brown caught 13 passes against the Terriers, falling one reception short of the Big South single-game record of 14, set by Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** against Wofford in 2005.

NOT A MEMORABLE FIRST

For the first time in its young football history, Coastal Carolina has dropped three consecutive road games. The Chanticleers lost at Appalachian State in last year's playoffs, fell at Delaware State in this year's season opener, and was defeated Saturday at James Madison.

BIG SOUTH 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB

In addition to Liberty's **ZACH TERRELL**, the Big South has three additional active 1,000-yard career rushers, two of which joined the club earlier this season (VMI's **NAT JACKSON** and Coastal's **MIKE TOLBERT**). Below is a look at the four active rushers and where they rank in League history.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 49 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Gardner-Webb has scored in each of its last 43 contests, followed by VMI (31), Charleston Southern (24) and Liberty (20).

PAT ON THE BACK

Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS** became the third kicker in Big South history with 100 career PAT kicks with his two PATs vs. The Citadel in Week 1. Ellis is now 109-116 in his career (=94.0) and needs nine PATs to move into second-place. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** is the League's career PAT leader with 177. Meanwhile, Ellis has been perfect on all his kicking attempts this season (14 total). He is 11-of-11 on PATs and 3-of-3 on FGs.

FLAG(LER) ON THE PLAY

Gardner-Webb wide receiver **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** is approaching the No. 2 spot on the Big South's career reception chart. He is currently third all-time with 146 receptions, and needs five catches to tie **ZOHN BURDEN** (VMI) for second at 151. Flagler is now third all-time in receiving yards at 1,990 after moving into the No. 3 spot Saturday at Mississippi State and surpassing Burden's total of 1,936. Flagler is just 10 yards shy of becoming the third player in League history with 2,000 receiving yards.

SIMP-LE EQUATION

Coastal Carolina senior WR **JEROME SIMPSON** ended his two-game touchdown drought with a six-yard TD grab Saturday at James Madison, his 35th career touchdown catch. The last time Simpson went two games without a TD reception was in the final two games of the 2005 season. He is fourth all-time in the Big South in career receptions (133) and second in receiving yards at 2,269 -- 160 yards shy of the all-time mark of 2,429. Simpson has caught 26.3 percent of his receptions for touchdowns.

PLAYING CATCH UP

Liberty wide receivers **BRANDON TURNER** and **WYNTON JACKSON** became the 10th and 11th players, respectively, with 100 career receptions in Week 1, and also became the 9th and 10th players to surpass 1,500 career receiving yards during the same game this past Saturday at Elon. The duo have posted nearly identical career receiving totals. Below is a look at their career receiving totals, and respective ranks in Big South history:

BENNETT, PATTON APPROACHING CENTURY MARK

Coastal Carolina's **DAVID BENNETT** and Gardner-Webb's **STEVE PATTON** both are approaching the 100 career victory milestone, as each has amassed 98 wins at the collegiate level. Bennett is 98-31, including a 35-14 mark at Coastal. Patton is 98-67-1 in his collegiate head coaching career, including a 68-44 record at the helm of the Bulldogs.

BROCK OF LOVE

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** completed 25-of-37 passes at William & Mary in Week 3, setting career highs in both categories. He equaled his personal-high for attempts Saturday at Elon. Smith is quietly climbing the Big South record book in four passing categories, as he has moved into sixth all-time in attempts (399), completions (221) and passing yards (2,930), and seventh in TD passes (16). Smith needs 70 passing yards to become the sixth QB in Big South history with 3,000.

KICK START

VMI slotback **TIM MAYPRAY** returned a kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown at James Madison in Week 3, becoming the sixth different player in Big South history to return a kickoff for a TD, and the first for VMI since **KEVIN SOLOMON** in 2001. Maypray's 86-yard return is tied for sixth-longest in Conference history, while his 52.5 average for his two returns against the Dukes is the third-highest single-game average, based on two returns. Maypray is averaging 31.6 yards per kick return, and is on pace to set the Big South single-season record should he average 1.2 kickoff returns this year.

CSU APPROACHING BIG SOUTH HOME WIN STREAK RECORD

Charleston Southern has won 11 consecutive home games, which is tied for second-longest in Big South history and one shy of tying the record of 12, set by Coastal Carolina. CSU won its final four home games of 2005 (beginning with its 63-42 victory over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15), continued with a perfect 6-0 mark at home last year, and reached 11-straight with its 44-20 win over Johnson C. Smith in Week 3. The Bucs next home game is set for Saturday, Oct. 6 vs. Savannah State.

JACKSON FIVE

Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** has already tallied 145 punt return yards this season, which is 12th in a single-season in Conference history. Jackson set the season punt return yardage record last year with 298. Meanwhile, Jackson is rapidly climbing the League's career punt return records. He is now tied for third all-time with 34 career punt returns and second with 443 yards. Coastal Carolina's **DAVID PARKER** is the all-time leader with 42 returns, while Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** is the record-holder in yardage at 484. Alston also holds the career punt return TD mark with three.

ACTION JACKSON

Liberty return specialist **WYNTON JACKSON** set two Big South punt return records in Week 2 vs. Shippensburg. Jackson's 88-yard punt return for a touchdown was the longest punt return in League history, breaking the previous mark of 87 yards, established by Coastal Carolina's **GREG WILLIAMSON** at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. Jackson also became the first player in Big South history to return a punt for a touchdown in back-to-back games, and his two punt return touchdowns this season ties the League's single-season record, now shared by four players. Coupled with his 65-yard punt return TD in Week 1 vs. Tusculum, Jackson now owns two of the five-longest punt returns in Conference history.

BIG SOUTH LANDS TWO ON NATIONAL FCS AWARD WATCH LISTS

Big South preseason players of the year **JEROME SIMPSON** and **BRIAN JOHNSTON** have been named to the initial Watch Lists for the FCS Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. Simpson is among the 16 candidates for the Walter Payton Award, while Johnston is one of 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award. Simpson's former teammate, **TYLER THIGPEN**, was a finalist for the Payton Award in 2006. Former Gardner-Webb defensive standout **MARIO WILLIAMS** was a Buchanan Award candidate back in 2004.

THE LATE, LATE SHOW

The Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN) will re-air the Flames Television Network's Nov. 10 VMI-Liberty game at 11:00pm that same evening. MASN also is producing two live Big South broadcasts this year -- the Nov. 3 Coastal Carolina-Liberty game and the No. 17 Liberty-Gardner-Webb tilt.

UPCOMING RECEIVING MILESTONES

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** needs 49 receiving yards for 1,000 in his career, while Coastal Carolina WR **SANTINI WASHINGTON** is 131 yards shy of the same milestone. Three quarterbacks are approaching 100 career completions: Coastal Carolina's **WILLIAM RICHARDSON** (15 shy), Charleston Southern's **ELI BYRD** (22) and Gardner-Webb's **STAN DOOLITTLE** (27). Byrd is 160 passing yards away from 1,000, while Richardson hit the mark this past Saturday at James Madison.

BIG SOUTH ADDS STONY BROOK AS ASSOCIATE MEMBER

On March 20, 2007, the Big South Conference added Stony Brook University as an associate member in football. Stony Brook will begin competing in the Big South in the 2008 season and will immediately be eligible for the League's championship. The addition of Stony Brook will give the Big South six Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) members in 2008. Presbyterian College will officially join the Big South in 2008-09 and will be considered an Independent this season. Next year, PC will be included in Conference scheduling, but as part of its transition to Division I, the Blue Hose will not count in the League standings nor be eligible for the football championship until 2011-12. The Big South will have six core playing members beginning in 2008 and will be eligible to qualify for an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2010.

STONY BROOK OFF TO GREAT START AT 3-1

The Seawolves opened the 2007 campaign with wins over Georgetown and Bucknell, but suffered a setback at nationally-ranked Youngstown State in Week 3. Stony Brook rebounded last week with a 21-15 home win over Monmouth, and hits the road this week at No. 14 Hofstra. The Seawolves have received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 the past three weeks and are ranked No. 8 in the outlet's "Mid-Major" Top 10 poll this week, including one first-place vote. THREE-FOR-ALL

For the first time in Big South history, three players scored three touchdowns in the same weekend. On Sept. 15 (Week 3), Charleston Southern's **MICHAEL JEFFERSON** scored three rushing touchdowns vs. Johnson C. Smith, while Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** scored three times vs. Georgia Southern. Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** rounded out the trifecta with three TDs (two rushing, one receiving) at William & Mary. The previous League high was two players with three touchdowns each on the same day, which occurred three times.

BLOCK PARTY

Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** returned a blocked field goal 68 yards for a touchdown in Week 3 vs. Johnson C. Smith, the third such return in Big South history. VMI's **ROBERT MASON** was the first in 2003 against Austin Peay (69-yard return), and Liberty's **JORDAN ALFORD** posted a 59-yard FG return for a touchdown vs. Elon in 2004.

MOVIN' ON UP

Charleston Southern redshirt-sophomore RB **MICHAEL JEFFERSON** rushed for 104 yards on 15 carries (6.9 average) vs. Johnson C. Smith, the first CSU rusher to cross the century mark since **ANDRE COPELAND** gained 122 yards on the ground at Gardner-Webb on Nov. 5, 2005. Jefferson helped the Bucs total exactly 200 rushing yards vs. the Golden Bulls, marking CSU's first 200-yard rushing game since rushing for exactly 200 yards in that same game vs. GWU two years ago. Charleston Southern had rushed for a combined 62 yards prior to Saturday's game.

200 POINTS

Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** became the fourth player in Big South history to score 200 points in a career when he scored on a 33-yard touchdown reception at Delaware State in Week 1. Simpson now has 210 career points. Of the four players in League history with 200 points, three are from Coastal Carolina: Simpson, **JOSH HOKE** (297) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286).

ROLL CALL

Through two home games, Liberty is averaging 13,628 fans, well above last season's record average of 11,128. As a League, the five Big South football members have already drawn 62,268 fans through eight home dates, an average of 7,784. Last season, the Big South enjoyed a record average of 6,838.
