Making his first college start at quarterback after playing the first two years as a slotback, Maypray rushed for a career-high 116 yards on 10 carries and scored two touchdowns in leading the Keydets to a 49-0 season-opening victory over St. Francis, Pa. He engineered scoring drives on two of VMI's three first quarter possessions, including his career-long 52-yard touchdown run to open the game's scoring. Maypray added a 35-yard touchdown run later in the third quarter, completed his only pass attempt for seven yards, and helped VMI roll up 416 yards rushing on the afternoon.

NEW BALANCE
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DOMINIQUE DAVENPORT • DB • Junior
Coastal Carolina • Bonaire, Ga.

Davenport set a school record with 20 tackles Sunday against Colgate (breaking the old record by five), with 11 solo shots against the Raiders. He had two drive-ending stops in the game, as well as one tackle-for-loss. His 20 tackles ties for the fourth-most in a single game in Big South history and second-most ever by a defensive back. Davenport's 11 solo tackles were also a school record for a single game.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

GERALD STEVENSON • WR/KR • Sophomore
Charleston Southern • Naples, Fla.

Stevenson set a Big South single-game record with 255 kickoff return yards on seven returns Saturday at No. 13 Wofford, averaging 36.4 yards per return. He returned the opening kickoff 47 yards to set up CSU's first touchdown of the game, and later had a 61-yard return that set up another scoring drive. Stevenson gave Charleston Southern great field position all night -- including three starting possessions inside Terrier territory -- with an average start at the Buccaneers' 45-yard line. Five of Stevenson's returns were greater than 30 yards (47, 32, 36, 61, 48). He finished the night with 302 all-purpose yards, the second-most in a game in Big South history.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

EDWIN GOWINS • RB
Stony Brook • Bellport, N.Y.

Gowins rushed 11 times for 122 yards and a touchdown against No. 17 Elon to become the first freshman in Big South history to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games, as well as the first with 100 rushing yards in each of the first two games to start a career. Gowins scored a 72-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter for the longest rush in LaValle Stadium history, and averaged 11.1 yards per rush against the Phoenix (fifth all-time at SBU). He now has two of the top five yards per carry averages in a game at Stony Brook.

LIBERTY CRACKS TOP 25

The Liberty Flames are officially a nationally-ranked program, as the Flames are No. 25 in this week's *The Sports Network* poll. It is Liberty's first national ranking since 1998, when the Flames were ranked tied for No. 24 with Troy State in the preseason ESPN/*USA Today* Division I-AA poll released on Aug. 31, 1998. The ranking marks the fifth-straight season the Big South has had a nationally-ranked team.

TROPICAL STORM HANNA FORCED TWO GAME CHANGES

Last week's Tropical Storm Hanna caused two football game changes to Saturday's schedule. Charleston Southern's home opener vs. No. 13 Wofford was moved to Spartanburg, where the Bucs played tough but fell, 41-23. The second change was Coastal Carolina moving its home opener vs. Colgate to Sunday afternoon. The game featured a near two-hour lightning delay in the fourth quarter and ended at 5:39pm with the Chanticleers suffering a heartbreaking 23-19 loss. CSU's home opener will now be Sept. 27 vs. North Greenville, while the Chanticleers now face a short week of preparations for Saturday's game at Monmouth.

LIBERTY ONLY 2-0 BIG SOUTH TEAM

For the third time in head coach **DANNY ROCCO's** three seasons, the Liberty Flames are 2-0. Liberty travels to Western Carolina this Saturday and is looking for its first 3-0 start since opening the 1997 season 4-0. The last time a Big South member started 3-0 was Charleston Southern in 2006 when the Bucs jumped out to a 9-0 record.

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE

The Liberty Flames have won 10 consecutive home games, which is currently the longest home winning streak in FCS. Liberty's 10-game home winning streak is the third-longest in Big South history, and two victories away from tying the record of 12 held by Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern. The Flames' next home game is more than a month away -- Oct. 11 vs. League newcomer Stony Brook. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has extended its home win streak to six games, a record at the new Bailey Memorial Stadium. Stony Brook had its six-game home win streak snapped this past weekend against No. 17 Elon.

FLAMES ON A STREAK

Liberty's win over Glenville State was its seventh consecutive victory, dating back to last season, and is tied with Harvard for the second-longest winning streak among FCS programs. Dayton is the current FCS leader with eight-straight wins. The Flames' seven-game winning streak is the program's longest since reeling off 10 consecutive wins during the 1988-89 seasons.

V-M-OH-MY

For the second-straight season and third time in four years, VMI shut out its season opening opponent. The Keydets blanked St. Francis (Pa.), 49-0 this past Saturday for their largest shutout win since defeating Central Florida, 69-0 on Sept. 25, 1982. It was VMI's most points scored since scoring 52 points in a triple-overtime loss to Gardner-Webb on Oct. 22, 2005, and the most points in a regulation game since a 50-7 victory over Charleston Southern on Oct. 11, 2003.

RUNNING FOR A PURPOSE

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each cracked the Big South's top 10 single-game record chart for all-purpose yards. Stevenson amassed 302 all-purpose yards at No. 13 Wofford (255 kickoff return, 33 receiving, 14 rushing), becoming the second player in League history with 300 in a game and 44 yards shy of the Conference record of 346. Bolden collected 265 all-purpose yards vs. Glenville State for the sixth-highest single-game total. He had 88 receiving yards, 87 kickoff return yards, 82 punt return yards and eight rushing yards Saturday night.

A GOOD OPTION

After running out of the slotback position his first two years at VMI, **TIM MAYPRAY** made his first start at quarterback for the Keydets and rushed for a career-high 116 yards Saturday vs. St. Francis (Pa.), including scoring runs of 52 (career long) and 35. His output is tied for the fifth-most by a Big South quarterback, while both of his TD runs cracked the League's all-time top 10 longest rushes by a quarterback. Maypray also extended his touchdown scoring streak to nine games, and is now 39 yards away from becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 3,000 all-purpose yards in his career.

STUFFING THE RUN

Three Big South teams suffocated their respective opponents' running game this past weekend. VMI held St. Francis (Pa.) to minus-4 yards rushing on 25 attempts -- the third-lowest rushing total allowed in Big South history. The League record is minus-20 yards. Gardner-Webb held Tusculum to six net yards rushing (13 carries), while Stony Brook limited No. 17 Elon to 18 rushing yards on 34 attempts this past Saturday.

THE NEW 40

Liberty is the second team in Big South history to score at least 40 points in its first two games of the season. The Flames opened the year with 49 points vs. North Greenville and followed that up with 44 points vs. Glenville State. Gardner-Webb was the first team to score at least 40 points in each of its first two games in 2005. That year, the Runnin' Bulldogs scored 65 and 54, respectively, to open the season. Meanwhile, the Flames are looking to become the first Big South team to score 40 points in three consecutive games since Gardner-Webb did so in the final game of 2004 and the first two games of 2005. The last team to score 40 points in three consecutive games in one season was Coastal Carolina in 2004, which surpassed the mark in the final three games of the year.

ZACK ATTACK -- PART ONE

VMI running back **ZACK COLLINS** tallied 112 rushing yards on just two carries Saturday vs. St. Francis (Pa.) -- scoring on each carry. His first rush went for a 62-yard touchdown to end the first quarter, and his second and final attempt was a 50-yard TD scamper midway through the second period. Collins is now the fourth player in Big South history to have two 50-yard runs in the same game, joining Elon's **RASHAUD PALMER** (2002 vs. Liberty), Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** (2006 vs. Savannah State) and Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT** (2007 vs. VMI).

ZACH ATTACK -- PART TWO

Liberty senior RB **ZACH TERRELL** extended his Big South-record rushing touchdown streak to 18 consecutive games with his 1-yard first quarter score against Glenville State on Saturday. He has scored 23 touchdowns during his streak, increasing his career total to 28 and second all-time in Big South history. Terrell, who started his streak Oct. 14, 2006 with two scores vs. William & Mary, needs two more touchdowns to become the fourth player in League history with 30 in a career.

EN FUEGO

Liberty has now scored at least 30 points in its last nine games, dating back to last season. In that span, the Flames have surpassed 40 points in five of those contests, including this past Saturday night against Glenville State. In fact, Liberty has scored 30 points now in 14 of its last 15 games. The last time Liberty did not put a 30 spot on the scoreboard was Sept. 22, 2007, when the Flames lost to Elon, 42-14.

TERRELL MOVES INTO FOURTH-PLACE ON ALL-TIME RUSHING LIST

Liberty RB **ZACH TERRELL** rushed for 110 yards Saturday vs. Glenville State and moved PAST teammate **RASHAD JENNINGS** for fourth-place all-time in Big South history. Terrell's career total of 2,284 leaped Jennings' 2,233 yards. Jennings missed Saturday's game with an injury to fall back into fifth.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 58 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Charleston Southern has not been shutout in its last 33 games, while VMI (39) and Liberty (29) also have extended their respective streaks. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 20 games, while Stony Brook has cracked the scoreboard in its last six contests.

MEET THE CANDIDATES

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** is one of 16 players on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, marking the third consecutive season a Big South student-athlete has been an official candidate for the national Offensive Player of the Year award in FCS. In addition, Gardner-Webb LB **MARIO BROWN** is one of 16 players on the 2008 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, the second-straight season a Big South player has been honored on that list and third overall.

BIG BROWN

Charleston Southern WR **DEE BROWN** needs 51 receiving yards to become the 16th player in Big South history with 1,000. Once he hits the milestone, the Buccaneers will have five players in the top 16. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each have 913 career receiving yards and could reach the yardage milestone ahead of Brown.

MURRY NEARING CENTURY MARK(US)

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** needs four receptions to become the 12th player in Big South history with 100. He is the League's active leading receiver with 96 receptions and 1,374 receiving yards. Murry needs 626 receiving yards to become the fourth player with 2,000.

TWO HUNDRED POINT CONVERSION

Liberty teammates **RASHAD JENNINGS** and **ZACH TERRELL** are each approaching 200 career points. Jennings is at 176, while Terrell has 168. Whoever hits the milestone first will become the sixth-player in Big South history with 200 career points.

THIRD BROCK FROM THE SUN

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** has thrown a TD pass in his last nine games -- including four-straight multi-TD pass games, and has a total of 20 in that span. Smith is fifth all-time in Big South history with 4,789 passing yards, and he needs 211 to become the fifth QB in League history with 5,000. He also ranks fifth in pass attempts (556), fifth in completions (326), fourth in TD passes (36) and fifth in total offense (4,857).

STEVENSON SETS KICKOFF RETURN RECORDS

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** set a Big South single-game record with 255 kickoff return yards last Saturday at No. 13 Wofford. The previous record was 204, by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** against The Citadel in the season finale last year. Stevenson averaged 36.4 yards on his seven kickoff returns, the highest single-game return average with at least five kickoff returns.

BO KNOWS RETURNS

Presbyterian's **BO TRIBBLE**'s 67-yard interception return vs. Fayetteville State in the first quarter Saturday not only set-up a Blue Hose field goal, it was the fifth-longest interception return in Big South history, and the longest in the League since former Coastal Carolina safety **QUINTON TEAL**'s 74-yard interception return on Nov. 5, 2005 against Savannah State.

TRIBBLE CLEF NOTES

New Charleston Southern QB **TRIBBLE REESE** was 30-of-46 passing for 250 yards at No. 13 Wofford last Saturday, becoming the fifth quarterback in Big South history to have 30 pass completions in a single-game. Reese completed passes to 10 different receivers against the Terriers.

HE IS THE BIG SOUTH'S DEVIN HESTER

Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** had a 72-yard punt return touchdown Saturday vs. Glenville State, his first career punt return TD and Big South-record fourth career TD on a kick return. Bolden is the all-time leader with three career kickoff return TDs, and is now just one of three players in Big South history to have returned both a punt and kickoff for touchdowns, joining **WYNTON JACKSON** and **JONATHAN CRAWFORD**.

ANYONE FEEL A DRAFT?

The Big South had two players selected in the 2008 NFL Draft, a League first. Coastal Carolina WR **JEROME SIMPSON** was selected by the Cincinnati Bengals in the second round with the 46th overall pick, while Gardner-Webb DE **BRIAN JOHNSTON** was selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the seventh round with the 210th overall pick. Overall, seven former Big South football players made NFL opening day rosters in some capacity, including Coastal Carolina's **MIKE TOLBERT**, who made the San Diego Chargers as an undrafted free agent and started the season opener at fullback.
