ZACH MacDOWALL • QB • R-Sophomore

In just his second collegiate start, MacDowall was solid in leading the Chanticleers to their first win of the season, going 17-of-26 passing (=65.4 percent) for 233 yards and one touchdown at Monmouth. He added seven rushes for 29 yards and finished with 262 yards of total offense, as well as an average of 8.96 yards per pass attempt. MacDowall led Coastal Carolina to scores on three of its first four possessions for an eventual 20-0 half-time advantage, and also directed the offense to a season-high 416 yards of total offense for the game.

NEW BALANCE
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CHAD BROWN • LB • R-Sophomore
 Liberty • Melbourne, Fla.

Brown tied for the team lead with seven tackles at Western Carolina, recording three solo hits and four assisted stops in Liberty's three-point win. He led the Flames with 2.5 tackles for loss of 14 total yards, one of which was a nine-yard sack late in the fourth quarter when the Catamounts had the ball on the Liberty seven-yard line - keeping WCU out of the end zone and forcing a field goal. Brown also recovered a fumble in the third quarter to give Liberty the ball back, which eventually led to the Flames' final touchdown of the game. Brown's seven tackles tied a career-high, while the 2.5 tackles for loss set a new personal best.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MIKE LARSSON • P • Freshman

Larsson recorded his best punting average of the season, booting four punts for 158 yards for an average of 39.5 yards per punt. His season-long 42-yard punt with 3:34 left to play in the game pinned Western Carolina at its own 10-yard line and kept the Catamounts out of Liberty territory the remainder of the contest. Larsson also booted punts of 37, 40 and 39 yards, and WCU managed just three punt returns for nine yards on the day.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Kuzdale, who entered the game with five tackles in his first two appearances of the year, was second on the Buccaneers with five tackles, all solo stops, at Miami (Ohio). He also made a key play late in the first quarter with Charleston Southern leading the RedHawks, 7-0. Kuzdale thwarted a Miami drive in the red zone when he forced and recovered a fumble at the CSU 15-yard line, allowing the Bucs to capitalize and later score off his takeaway.

LIBERTY MOVES TO 3-0

For the first time in head coach **DANNY ROCCO**'s three seasons, the Liberty Flames are 3-0. Liberty is 3-0 for the first time since opening the 1997 season at 4-0. The last time a Big South member started 3-0 was Charleston Southern in 2006 when the Bucs jumped out to a 9-0 record. The Flames are idle this week and return to action Sept. 27 at traditional FCS power Youngstown State.

LIBERTY CRACKS TOP 25

The Liberty Flames entered the national Top 25 last week for the first time since 1998, claiming the No. 25 position in *The Sports Network* poll. This week, the Flames moved up two spots to No. 23 in the TSN ranking and entered the FCS Coaches Poll at No. 25 as well. Liberty's previous national ranking came in the Aug. 31, 1998 preseason ESPN/*USA Today* Division I-AA poll, as the Flames were ranked tied for No. 24 with Troy State. Last week's ranking marked the fifth-straight season the Big South has had a nationally-ranked team.

I DID NOT KNOW THAT

Coastal Carolina picked up its first win of the year with a 26-7 win at Monmouth on Saturday. Not only did the victory help the Chanticleers avoid their first-ever 0-3 start, it was their first win during the third week of the season in the program's six-year history.

"ALL THE WAY" MAYPRAY

VMI all-everything back **TIM MAYPRAY** is on the cusp of Big South history, as he is close to becoming the first player with 1,000 career rushing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards. The junior has rushed for 921 yards in his career, and has 871 receiving yards to his credit.

RUNNIN' AWAY FROM HOME

Gardner-Webb's 31-15 victory at Austin Peay Saturday was its first non-Conference road win since Sept. 2, 2006 at Jacksonville, when the Runnin' Bulldogs defeated the Dolphins, 49-14 in the season opener. In addition, GWU has scored 30 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2006, when the Bulldogs scored 49 against Jacksonville and 30 vs. Tennessee Tech the following week on Sept. 9.

END OF THE LINE

Liberty senior RB **ZACH TERRELL** saw his Big South-record for consecutive games with a rushing touchdown end Saturday at 18 games. He scored 23 touchdowns during his streak and moved into second all-time in Big South history with 28 rushing TDs. Terrell started his streak Oct. 14, 2006 with two scores vs. William & Mary.

MURRY HITS CENTURY MARK(US)

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** caught six passes at Miami (Ohio) Saturday to increase his career total to 102 and becoming the 12th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions. Murry needs seven catches to tie VMI's **GARY PRICE** for 11th place with 109. Meanwhile, Murry stands 35 receiving yards away from 1,500 and needs 134 yards to reach the League's all-time top 10.

FLAMES BURNING IT UP

Liberty's win at Western Carolina was its first non-Conference road win since winning 28-0 at Savannah State on Sept. 23, 2006. It also was the Flames' eighth consecutive victory, dating back to last season, and is the second-longest winning streak among FCS programs. Dayton is the current FCS leader with nine-straight wins. The Flames' eight-game winning streak is the program's longest since reeling off 10 consecutive wins during the 1988-89 seasons.

BO KNOWS DEFENSIVE RETURNS

One week after recording the fifth-longest interception return in Big South history (67 yards vs. Fayetteville State), Presbyterian's **BO TRIBBLE** entered the League's record books again this past weekend against No. 18 Elon. Tribble returned a fumble 75 yards for a touchdown vs. the Phoenix, which is the fifth-longest fumble return in Conference annals.

DOG DAYS

Gardner-Webb is just the second team in Big South history to hold three-straight opponents under 100 yards rushing, as the Bulldogs have permitted 63, 6 and 98 rushing yards in their first three games, respectively. In 2005, Coastal Carolina held three consecutive opponents (VMI, Savannah State, Mansfield) to less than 100 rushing yards. The Bulldogs rank first in the Big South in rush defense at 55.7, good for ninth in the nation.

MORE ON MAYPRAY

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** became the fifth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards when he eclipsed the milestone this past Saturday at William & Mary. Maypray stands at 3,107, and needs 55 yards to surpass Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** (3,161) for fourth-place.

USHERING IN A NEW SKILL

Coastal Carolina redshirt-senior **TRENT USHER** has asserted himself as one of the Chanticleers' primary receivers after three games. He has team highs of 12 receptions for 200 yards and one touchdown on the year, including career bests of five catches and 80 yards in Saturday's win at Monmouth. Not bad for a player who has been at three positions (wide receiver, defensive back and quarterback) during his time at Coastal Carolina.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

No. 23 Liberty's three-point win over Western Carolina was its smallest margin of victory since Nov. 13, 2004, when the Flames defeated Chattanooga, 43-40. Prior to Saturday's win at Western, Liberty's average margin of victory in its last 18 wins since the Chattanooga game was 25.4 points. Just one victory in that span was decided by single digits -- a six-point win at VMI on Nov. 18, 2006 (38-32).

A GOOD OPTION

After running out of the slotback position his first two years at VMI, **TIM MAYPRAY** has started VMI's two games at quarterback, and has already posted two 100-yard rushing games this season from the QB position -- a League first. He opened the year with 116 rushing yards vs. St. Francis (Pa.) and netted a career-high 134 yards Saturday at William & Mary. Maypray also scored on a 64-yard run against the Tribe to extend his overall touchdown scoring streak to nine games.

THE BUTLER DID IT

Presbyterian WR **TERRANCE BUTLER** has caught a TD pass in all three games this season -- the lone Big South player to do so, and leads the Conference with four touchdown catches. Butler also is tops with 18 receptions and 255 receiving yards.

HALL PASS

Gardner-Webb sophomore RB **PATRICK HALL** is the first Bulldogs' player to score two rushing touchdowns in consecutive games since **JERMAINE BOSTON** in 2005. Boston rushed for two scores in the 2005 season opener against Union, Sept. 3, then scored three rushing touchdowns the next game against Belhaven, Sept. 10. Hall leads the Big South with four rushing touchdowns, already surpassing his total from last year (3).

A FRESH FACE

Stony Brook freshman RB **EDWIN GOWINS** became the first freshman in Big South history to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games when he totaled 147 rushing yards in the season opener vs. Colgate and gained 122 yards in Week 2 vs. Elon. In addition, Gowins is the first player in Big South history with 100 rushing yards in each of this first two games to start a career. He currently leads the Big South in rushing with 300 yards in three games.

FROM COAST TO COAST

Coastal Carolina's 26-7 win Monmouth on Saturday was its first non-Conference road victory since winning at Winston-Salem State on Sept. 30, 2006, snapping a five-game losing streak in non-Conference away games.

THIRD BROCK FROM THE SUN

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH**'s streak of nine-straight games with a TD pass ended Saturday at Western Carolina. In that span he threw 20 touchdown passes and posted four-straight multi-TD games. Meanwhile, Smith is fifth all-time in Big South history with 4,937 passing yards, and needs 63 to become the fifth QB in League history with 5,000. He also ranks fifth in pass attempts (582), fifth in completions (342), fourth in TD passes (36) and fifth in total offense (5,032).

REESE'S PIECES

In his last two games, Charleston Southern QB **TRIBBLE REESE** is 56-of-85 passing (=65.9 percent) for 507 yards and five touchdown passes. He threw four TD strikes at Miami (Ohio) this past Saturday, becoming the ninth different quarterback in Big South history to throw four touchdown passes in one game. The last player with four TD passes in a game was CSU's **SIDNEY BRYANT** against Presbyterian on Nov. 10, 2007.

ONE SCORING STREAK ENDS, ANOTHER SCORING STREAK CONTINUES

Liberty's Big South record of nine-straight games with at least 30 points scored ended Saturday at Western Carolina. The streak began Sept. 29, 2007 against St. Francis (Pa.), and during that nine-game span, the Flames surpassed 40 points five times. Meanwhile, Liberty has cracked the scoreboard in the first quarter in 10 consecutive games.

A GAME OF LEAP FROG

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** has moved into third-place all-time in Big South history in career rushing, jumping back ahead of teammate **ZACH TERRELL** and also passing Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS**. Jennings owns sole possession of third-place with 2,349 career rushing yards, just ahead of Perkins' 2,343. Terrell fell back into fifth-place with 2,335 yards and is eight yards away from Perkins. Jennings needs 651 yards to become the third player in Big South history with 3,000.

BIG SOUTH HONORED NATIONALLY IN WEEK 2 BY THE SPORTS NETWORK

The Sports Network named Coastal Carolina DB **DOMINIQUE DAVENPORT** its National Defensive Player of the Week and Charleston Southern KR **GERALD STEVENSON** its National Special Team Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 8. Davenport was the Conference's first national defensive honoree since Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** on Oct. 1, 2007, and fifth overall. The last Big South player to earned the outlet's special teams honor was Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** on Nov. 15, 2004.

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 59 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Charleston Southern has not been shutout in its last 34 games, while VMI (40) and Liberty (30) also have extended their respective streaks. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 21 games, while Stony Brook has cracked the scoreboard in its last seven contests.

NORM!!

Coastal Carolina redshirt-senior **MARRIO NORMAN** intercepted his 11th career pass Saturday at Monmouth and moved into sole possession of second-place on the Big South's all-time interception list. He was tied with former teammate **DEWITT MYERS** at 10. The League's career record is 17, held by current Carolina Panther and former Chanticleer **QUINTON TEAL**.

WIDE OUTS

Three Big South wide receivers are closing in on 1,000 career receiving yards entering Week 4. Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** stands at 969, Charleston Southern's **DEE BROWN** is at 949, while Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** has 939 to his credit. Whoever reaches the milestone first will be the 16th player in Big South history with 1,000 receiving yards. However, the chase will have to wait another week as all three teams are idle this weekend.

TWO HUNDRED POINT CONVERSION

Liberty teammates **RASHAD JENNINGS** and **ZACH TERRELL** are each approaching 200 career points. Jennings is at 176, while Terrell has 168. The Big South's 200-point club currently stands at five members.

RUNNING FOR A PURPOSE

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each cracked the Big South's top 10 single-game record chart for all-purpose yards during Week 2. Stevenson amassed 302 all-purpose yards at No. 13 Wofford (255 kickoff return, 33 receiving, 14 rushing), becoming the second player in League history with 300 in a game and 44 yards shy of the Conference record of 346. Bolden collected 265 all-purpose yards vs. Glenville State for the sixth-highest single-game total. He had 88 receiving yards, 87 kickoff return yards, 82 punt return yards and eight rushing yards.

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE

The Liberty Flames have won 10 consecutive home games, which is currently the longest home winning streak in FCS. Liberty's 10-game home winning streak is the third-longest in Big South history, and two victories away from tying the record of 12 held by Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern. The Flames' next home game is more than three weeks away -- Oct. 11 vs. League newcomer Stony Brook. Meanwhile, Presbyterian's home win streak is at six games, a record at the new Bailey Memorial Stadium.

HE IS THE BIG SOUTH'S DEVIN HESTER

Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** had a 72-yard punt return touchdown vs. Glenville State in Week 2, his first career punt return TD and Big South record fourth career kick return touchdown. Bolden is the all-time leader with three career kickoff return TDs, and is now just one of three players in Big South history to have returned both a punt and kickoff for touchdowns, joining **WYNTON JACKSON** and **JONATHAN CRAWFORD**.

STEVENSON SETS KICKOFF RETURN RECORDS

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** set a Big South single-game record with 255 kickoff return yards at No. 13 Wofford during Week 2. The previous record was 204, by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** against The Citadel in the season finale last year. Stevenson averaged 36.4 yards on his seven kickoff returns, the highest single-game return average with at least five kickoff returns.

MEET THE CANDIDATES

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** is one of 16 players on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, marking the third consecutive season a Big South student-athlete has been an official candidate for the national Offensive Player of the Year award in FCS. In addition, Gardner-Webb LB **MARIO BROWN** is one of 16 players on the 2008 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, the second-straight season a Big South player has been honored on that list and third overall.

BIG SOUTH SCORES AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams in 2010, the Big South Conference has been granted an automatic bid to the playoffs beginning that same year. In the meantime, Big South members are eligible to receive an at-large berth in 2008 and 2009.

FB-YES

The Big South football membership is playing a League-record five games against FBS members in 2008. The list features two ACC teams, two MAC teams and one Big Ten opponent. Charleston Southern is facing two FBS squads -- Miami of both Florida and Ohio. Coastal Carolina opened the season at Penn State -- its first-ever FBS foe, while Gardner-Webb plays a mid-season contest at Georgia Tech. VMI rounds out the Big South's FBS slate with a visit to Ohio.

BIG SOUTH IS BIGGER IN 2008

The Big South football membership officially stands at seven overall in 2008 with the addition of Stony Brook University as an associate member and Presbyterian College beginning its full-time affiliation as a League member. The addition of SBU gives the League six Division I playing members, marking the first 5-game League slate. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College, which is in the midst of its transition into Division I, is playing five of the six members in 2008, and will officially become a Big South opponent in 2009 when the Blue Hose play their first full Conference schedule, at which time PC will be eligible for the regular-season title. However, Presbyterian is not eligible for the football post-season until the 2011 season.
