Jennings led the Flames to a 43-38 Big South win at Coastal Carolina with 195 rushing yards on 35 carries (5.6 average), in addition to three touchdowns and a career-high 228 all-purpose yards. He scored the game's first touchdown on a 23-yard reception, and added a 2-yard touchdown catch mid-way through the second quarter to help Liberty re-take the lead. He later scored on a 35-yard run in the fourth quarter for his sixth career three-touchdown game. Jennings could have recorded his first career four-touchdown game, but pulled up just before the end zone on the game's final drive to allow the game clock to wind down to zero and seal the victory. The 195 rushing yards was his third-highest single-game rushing performance and 16th career 100-yard game, moving him into second-place in Big South history.

Umu helped the Buccaneers defeat Gardner-Webb, 13-10 with five total tackles on CSU's interior line. He also intercepted a pass and recorded a quarterback hurry in the victory. Early in the game, Umu stopped a fourth-and-inches attempt that gave Charleston Southern good field position that led to a field goal. In the third quarter, Umu recorded his first career interception that halted Gardner-Webb's 10-play drive at the CSU 35-yard line.

Brown averaged 45.1 yards on seven punts and pinned five kicks inside the GWU 20-yard line - including four inside the 10. He did not have a touchback on any of his punts, and Gardner-Webb's average starting field position in the second half was its own 14-yard line. Brown boomed four of his kicks longer than 47 yards, including two 50-yarders (54 and 53).

Bevins finished the Coastal Carolina game scoring a career-high 13 points. In addition to four PATs, he connected on all three of his field goal attempts, bettering his season total as he came into the game with just two field goals in four games. **LIBERTY, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN OPEN CONFERENCE SEASON 1-0**

Liberty and Charleston Southern opened their Conference seasons this past Saturday with wins to take control of the Big South standings at 1-0. Liberty is 1-0 in League play for the second-straight year and fourth time overall, while Charleston Southern is 1-0 in Conference for the third time in school history and first since 2006.

**LIBERTY RECORDS MILESTONE VICTORIES, ROAD GAME STANDARD**

Liberty's 43-38 win at Coastal Carolina Saturday was its nation's-leading 10th consecutive win -- equalling the school record for longest winning streak and tied for the second-longest in Big South history. The Flames won 10-straight over the 1988 and 1989 seasons. The win also was the Flames' fifth-straight road victory, establishing a Big South record for longest road winning streak.

**FLAMES BURNING THROUGH BIG SOUTH FOES**

Liberty has now won seven consecutive Big South games, which is tied for the second-longest Conference winning streak in League history. During the streak, Liberty has scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 43.7 points, while holding its League brethren to 22.6 points. The Flames also have won four of those seven games on the road. Liberty is one Conference win away from tying the record of eight-straight Big South wins, which was set by Coastal Carolina from Nov. 22, 2003 to Oct. 29, 2005.

**"FIVE, FIVE, FIVE DOLLAR FOOT LONGS"**

Liberty is the second team in Big South history to start the season 5-0, joining the 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers, which opened that year with a 9-0 record. Liberty is 5-0 for the first time since 1989 when the Flames started 6-0.

**VMI, STONY BROOK TO BEGIN CONFERENCE ACTION THIS WEEKEND**

VMI and Stony Brook open their respective Conference seasons this Saturday. The Keydets will host Coastal Carolina, and will open the League slate against the Chanticleers for the second time. VMI is 1-4 in Big South openers, with the lone win coming in 2005 at Liberty on (W, 10-7). Stony Brook will play its inaugural Big South game on the road at No. 15 Liberty.

**TIDAL WAVE**

Despite its 43-38 loss to Liberty, Coastal Carolina scored the second-most points against the Flames in a Big South game. Former member Elon posted 56 points in a 56-35 victory over Liberty on Nov. 9, 2002. The Chanticleers also gained 534 yards against the Flames, the most ever by a Conference opponent since Big South football began in 2002, and the most allowed by Liberty since William & Mary tallied 635 total yards in a 56-0 win on Sept. 24, 2005.

**BEWARE OF DOG**

Gardner-Webb extended its Big South record for most consecutive games holding an opponent under 100 yards rushing to five on Saturday, allowing just 37 rushing yards to Charleston Southern. The Bulldogs have permitted 63, 6, 98, 24 and 37 rushing yards in their first five games, respectively, and are allowing an average of 45.6 rushing yards per game -- 3rd in the nation. The Big South's season record for rushing defense is 108.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2006. Gardner-Webb also is 11th nationally in total defense, holding opponents to 278.60 yards per game.

**JENNINGS SURPASSES 200 CAREER POINTS**

With this three touchdown performance Saturday at Coastal Carolina, Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** became the sixth player in League history with 200 career points. Jennings stands at 212 points, behind former Charleston Southern kicker **NICK ELLIS**, who is fifth all-time with 214 points. Meanwhile, Jennings is in sole possession of third-place in League history with 35 touchdowns scored. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** is the career leader with 47, followed by **JEROME SIMPSON** with 44.

**BIG MAC ATTACK**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** threw for a school-record 382 yards against Liberty this past Saturday, which is tied for the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. MacDowall bettered former Chanticleers QB and current Kansas City Chief **TYLER THIGPEN**'s previous school record of 351 yards, set against Appalachian State in the 2006 FCS Playoffs.

**SUPER SIZED**

Coastal Carolina set a Big South single-game record with 20 passing first downs Saturday against Liberty. The Chanticleers finished the game with 32 overall first downs, the most in a Big South game and the second-highest overall total in Big South history.

**COMBO MEAL**

Coastal Carolina (534 yards) and Liberty (531) combined for 1,065 yards of total offense in Saturday's match-up, a record for a Conference game. The previous best for a Big South contest was 1,060 combined yards between Gardner-Webb (533) and VMI (527) in the Bulldogs' 55-52, triple-overtime win in Lexington. Coincidentally, both contests were televised games, and **MATT HOGUE** handled the call for both.

**FLAMES MOVE UP IN THE POLLS**

The Liberty Flames, which entered the national Top 25 the week of Sept. 8 for the first time since 1998, are No. 15 in this week's *The Sports Network* poll, and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches Poll. It is the fifth-straight week that Liberty has been ranked, a first in school history. Prior to this season, Liberty's previous national ranking came in the Aug. 31, 1998 preseason ESPN/*USA Today* Division I-AA poll, as the Flames were ranked tied for No. 24 with Troy State.

**JENNINGS' JAUNTS**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS**, who is third all-time in Big South history with 2,764 career rushing yards, is 236 yards away from becoming the third player with 3,000. Jennings is averaging 157.8 rushing yards a game, and if he maintains his average the remainder of the season, he will finish the season with both the single season and career rushing records. Jennings is on pace for 1,736 rushing yards in 2008, and 3,869 for his career. **DRE BARNES** currently holds both the Big South season rushing record (1,347 in 2003) and the career mark (3,409 from 2002-04).

**JENNINGS JUMPS AHEAD**

Walter Payton Award candidate **RASHAD JENNINGS** has scored three touchdowns in two-straight games for the second time in his Liberty career, becoming the first player in Big South history to accomplish this feat. Last year, he scored three touchdowns against Coastal Carolina on Nov. 3 and three a week later vs. VMI. Jennings took sole possession of second-place in League history with his 16th career 100-yard rushing game this past Saturday, and needs one more to tie **DRE BARNES'** all-time Conference record of 17. Jennings has rushed for 100 yards in five consecutive games, the second-longest streak in Big South history and two away from matching **EUGENE GOODMAN's** record of seven from Nov. 15, 2003 to Oct. 2, 2004.

**WHAT YOU TALKING ABOUT WILLIS?**

Coastal Carolina redshirt-sophomore **MARQUEL WILLIS** enjoyed a career night this past Saturday vs. Liberty, as he hauled in personal bests of seven receptions for 145 yards and two touchdowns. Willis entered the game with two catches for 29 yards. He is the first Chanticleer receiver with more than 100 receiving yards in a game since **JEROME SIMPSON** had 107 in Coastal Carolina's 2006 playoff game at Appalachian State on Nov. 25. Willis' 145 receiving yards are the most by a Chants' receiver since Simpson had 145 against Liberty on Oct. 28, 2006.

**CONSISTENTLY EFFICIENT**

Coastal Carolina leads the Big South in pass efficiency defense with a 115.9 rating, which ranks 33rd in the nation. The Chanticleers have led the Big South in the category the past four seasons, including a Conference-record and national-leading 86.8 rating in 2004.

**NOTHING WRONG WITH BEING IN A RUSH**

VMI's season rush average of 360.6 yards per game leads the nation and is more than 75 yards ahead of its Big South record of 283.2 rushing yards per game set last season. The Keydets are on pace to gain more than 3,900 rushing yards at their current clip, which would shatter their League record of 3,115 yards established in 2007.

**MAYPRAY APPROACHING SINGLE-SEASON QUARTERBACK RUSHING RECORD**

VMI quarterback **TIM MAYPRAY** is 116 rushing yards away from setting the single-season record for most rushing yards by a quarterback. Former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** owns the record of 656 yards, set in 2006. Maypray, who became the 21st player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone at Ohio in Week 5, now has 1,212 yards to his credit - including 541 yards this season. He is second in the Big South in rushing, and should he surpass current rushing leader **RASHAD JENNINGS**, he would become first quarterback to lead the League in rushing.

**BULL DURHAM**

Coastal Carolina redshirt-sophomore **JUSTIN DURHAM** is tied for the League-lead with nine field goals this season. He has three games with at least two field goals, and has increased his career total to 21 -- already fifth all-time in Big South history and more than halfway to the career record of 40, set by former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE**.

**WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE**

The Liberty Flames have won 10 consecutive home games, which is currently the second-longest home winning streak in FCS. San Diego has won 27-straight home games to lead the nation. Liberty's 10-game home winning streak is the third-longest in Big South history, and two victories away from tying the record of 12 held by Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern. The Flames finally return home this weekend after a month-long exodus and host League newcomer Stony Brook.

**RUNNING THE PLANK**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** leads the Big South with 564 kickoff return yards, which is already the seventh-highest single season total and surpasses his total from last year (551). Stevenson has vaulted into fifth-place in League history with 1,115 career kickoff return yards. Former Buccaneer **KIJANA THOMAS** is fourth with 1,163.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 62 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Charleston Southern has not been shutout in its last 36 games, while VMI (43) and Liberty (32) also have extended their respective streaks. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 24 games, while Stony Brook has cracked the scoreboard in its last nine contests.

**A CLOSER LOOK AT VMI'S SCORING STREAK**

VMI's 43-game scoring streak matches the longest run in the 118-year history of the program, as the Keydets scored in a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924. Earlier this year, the Keydets scored 30 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2003.

**USAIN BOLDEN?**

With 238 punt return yards this season, Liberty return specialist **DOMINIC BOLDEN** needs 61 more yards to break the Big South's single season record. Former teammate **WYNTON JACKSON** set the mark of 298 in 2006. Bolden's 19.8 punt return average is pacing ahead of the single-season League record of 16.5, which was established by Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** in 2005. Meanwhile, Bolden has quietly become the Big South's all-time leader in kickoff return yards. His 1,274 career total recently surpassed **ADRIAN HALL**'s previous record of 1,219 from 2002-04.

**THE BUTLER CONTINUES TO DO IT**

Presbyterian WR **TERRANCE BUTLER** is looking to end Charleston Southern's run of producing the top wide receiver in the Conference. Butler leads the Big South in the three main receiving categories: receptions (40), receiving yards (511) and TD catches (6). A Charleston Southern receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. No Buccaneer is currently in the League's top 10 thus far.

**THIRD BROCK FROM THE SUN**

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH**, who became the fifth QB in League history with 5,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone at No. 23 Youngstown State in Week 5, is now fourth all-time with 5,327. He also is one TD throw away from becoming the fourth player with 40 career touchdown passes. Smith ranks fifth all-time in pass attempts (629), fifth in completions (372), fourth in TD passes (39) and fourth in total offense (5,424).

**WIDE OUTS**

Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yard mark in Week 5. Collins' 1,133 career yards rank 14th all-time and is slightly ahead of Bolden's career total of 1,123, which is 16th in League history. Coastal Carolina's **CHRIS NOBLE** is sandwiched between with 1,126 yards.

**REAL ESTATE BROKERS**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** and Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** are the Big South's active players with more than 3,000 all-purpose yards. Maypray is fourth all-time in Big South history with 3,398 career all-purpose yards, and needs 216 to catch **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** for third-place at 3,614. Jennings eclipsed 3,000 career all-purpose yards this past weekend at Coastal Carolina and now stands sixth all-time at 3,146. Meanwhile, **ZACH TERRELL** (2,755) and **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2,661) are approaching the milestone.

**TWO MAYPRAY STREAKS SNAPPED**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** saw two individual streaks end this past Saturday against No. 6 Richmond. His 11-game touchdown scoring streak ended, as did his Big South-record four-game streak with a 50-yard rush. Maypray nearly made it five consecutive games, as he opened the second quarter with a 45-yard run that led to an eventual Keydet field goal.

**ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL YOUNG MAN NAMED GATES**

Gardner-Webb kicker **RYAN GATES** became the first freshman to make four field goals in a game when he tied the Big South single-game field goal record vs. Sam Houston State in Week 5. Gates added three extra point kicks, and his 15 points scored were the second-most in a game by a kicker in League history. Former Coastal Carolina kicker **JOSH HOKE** set the single-game mark of 16 points vs. North Greenville on Sept. 25, 2004.

**A LITTLE GOES A LONG WAY**

Presbyterian's 22-15 win over North Greenville Saturday marked its smallest point output in a victory since defeating Newberry 10-0 on Nov. 11, 2006. PC only had the ball for 61 plays and 25:36 against the Crusaders.

**SMALL VICTORIES**

Charleston Southern and Gardner-Webb's combined 23 points in Saturday's Big South opener was the third-lowest combined point total in a Conference game in League history. It was the lowest since Oct. 1, 2005, when VMI and Liberty combined for the lowest point total on record - 17 points (VMI 10, Liberty 7).

**PAG, YOU'RE IT**

Charleston Southern kicker **JOHN PAGLIA** leads the Big South with a 87.5 field goal percentage, as he has nailed 7-of-8 field goals this season. He kicked a game-winning 26-yarder over Gardner-Webb Saturday, and has made his last four attempts. Paglia opened the year 3-of-3 before missing a 40-yarder against North Greenville in Week 5.

**RECORD CHANTS**

With its 20-7 win at North Carolina A&T in Week 5, Coastal Carolina became the first team in Big South history to hold three-straight opponents to less than 10 points. The Chanticleers allowed just 17 points in that span (7 at Monmouth, 3 vs. Towson, 7 vs. North Carolina A&T). Coastal Carolina broke the record of two-straight games that was established by the 2006 Liberty Flames.

**PEAKS AND VALLEYS**

The Big South has wins this season over members from AQ Conferences the Colonial, Ohio Valley, Missouri Valley, Patriot and Southern. In Week 5, the Big South captured its first-ever win over a Missouri Valley Football Conference opponent (formerly the Gateway Football Conference) with Liberty's 31-28 win at Youngstown State. The Big South was winless in three previous meetings.

**SPINNING HIS WEBB**

Presbyterian QB **TIM WEBB**, who left the North Greenville game with an injury, is tops in the Big South in completions (135), attempts (223), yards (1,428) and first in touchdown passes (9). In Week 5 at No. 3 Appalachian State, he attempted 57 passes, breaking his own Big South single-game record of 56, which he established this season in Week 1 at Wofford. Webb completed 35 passes against the Mountaineers -- just two shy of matching his Conference record for completions in a game, and became the first QB in League history with 30 completions in a game twice. He also finished the night with 372 yards passing, which was the sixth-highest single-game total in Big South history at the time.

**TV GUIDE UPDATE**

MASN's broadcast of the Nov. 8 Coastal Carolina at Gardner-Webb at 3:30pm will be aired on same day tape delay on SportSouth beginning at 7:00pm.

**HAVE YOU DRIVEN A FORD LATELY?**

Coastal Carolina senior RB **JAMIE FORDHAM** became the 20th player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in the Chanticleers' win over Towson in Week 4. Fordham's career total stands at 1,155 yards, and he is the fifth player in school history over the 1,000-yard rushing mark, joining **TYLER THIGPEN** (1,638), **MIKE TOLBERT** (1,670), **PATRICK HALL** (2,214) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343).

**SECOND-AND-TEN**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** has scored eight touchdowns this season (six rushing and two receiving) and is two TDs away from becoming the second player in Big South history with three 10-touchdown seasons. Jennings scored 10 touchdowns in 2006 and a Conference-record 17 a year ago. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** was the first player to accomplish the feat, scoring 14 in 2003 and 12 each in 2004 and 2005.

**MURRY PASSES CENTURY MARK(US)**

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** caught six passes at Miami (Ohio) in Week 3 to become the 12th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions. Murry stands at 103 and needs six catches to tie VMI's **GARY PRICE** for 11th place with 109. Meanwhile, Murry stands 24 receiving yards away from 1,500 and needs 123 yards to reach the League's all-time top 10.

**MR. SATURDAY AFTERNOON**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** became the first player in Big South history to throw a 70-yard touchdown pass and score a 60-yard rushing touchdown in the same game when he accomplished the feat in Week 4 vs. Chowan. Maypray opened the game with a 74-yard scoring strike to **DAUD SEMALULU**. At the beginning of the second quarter, Maypray took the snap from center and raced 60 yards for a touchdown -- his 10th straight game with a TD.

**VMI RUNS WILD IN RECORD-BREAKING WIN**

VMI rushed for a Big South single-game record 517 yards in its 69-20 victory over Chowan in Week 4. The Keydets are the first Big South squad to rush for 500 yards in a game, and eclipsed the old record of 490 rushing yards, which was set by Coastal Carolina against Chowan last season on Oct. 13. VMI scored seven rushing touchdowns -- tied for second-most in League history, and amassed 659 total yards of offense, the second-highest total in Big South football history.

**HE IS THE BIG SOUTH'S DEVIN HESTER**

Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** had a 72-yard punt return touchdown vs. Glenville State in Week 2, his first career punt return TD and Big South record fourth career kick return touchdown. Bolden is the all-time leader with three career kickoff return TDs, and is now just one of three players in Big South history to have returned both a punt and kickoff for touchdowns, joining **WYNTON JACKSON** and **JONATHAN CRAWFORD**.

**FB-YES**

The Big South football membership is playing a League-record five games against FBS members in 2008. The list features two ACC teams, two MAC teams and one Big Ten opponent. Charleston Southern faced two FBS squads -- Miami of both Florida and Ohio. Coastal Carolina opened the season at Penn State -- its first-ever FBS foe, while VMI played at Ohio. Gardner-Webb rounds out the Big South's FBS slate with a visit to Georgia Tech this weekend.
