**PHILIP PEOPLES • RB • Junior**  
 Gardner-Webb • Atlanta, Ga.

Peoples rushed for a career-high 176 yards on 15 carries (11.7 yards per carry) to pace Gardner-Webb's 47-21 win over Presbyterian. His seven-yard score opened the game's scoring in the first quarter, and his career-long 67-yard run in the fourth quarter set up another touchdown. He also had a 33-yard rush that led to a Gardner-Webb field goal in the third stanza. Peoples also had a 20-yard kickoff return to finish the day with 196 all-purpose yards. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game and he bettered his previous rushing high by 91 yards.

**NEW BALANCE**

**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**JEFFREY WILLIAMS • LB • Sophomore**  
 Gardner-Webb • Frisco City, Ala.

Williams posted a career-high 18 total tackles (11 solo, 7 assisted), had a pair of second quarter interceptions and 24 return yards, and posted one tackle-for-loss (minus-2 yards) in Gardner-Webb's victory over Presbyterian. Williams' first interception stopped Presbyterian's drive at the Bulldog 27-yard line, and his 24-yard return eventually led to a Gardner-Webb field goal. His second pick came on PC's very next drive with seconds remaining in the first half. Williams recorded his first double-digit tackle game of the year, as his previous high this season was nine at Charleston Southern.

**SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**LUKE GADDIS • K • Senior**  
 Stony Brook • East Patchogue, N.Y.

Gaddis was perfect in the kicking game for Stony Brook and led the team with a season-high eight points. He was 2-of-2 on field goals, connecting from 37 yards in the second quarter and from 25 yards in the third period. His first field goal gave Stony Brook its first lead in a game since the first game of the season, while the second kick tied the game against CSU at 13-13. Gaddis' final PAT with 1:06 remaining proved to be the winning margin for the Seawolves. Gaddis is now second all-time in SBU history with 21 career field goals.

**FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

**EDWIN GOWNS • RB**  
 Stony Brook • Bellport, N.Y.

Gowins broke out of a recent slump with 97 rushing yards on 10 carries to help Stony Brook come back and defeat Charleston Southern for its first Big South win. He was a key offensive component on a pair of scoring drives for the Seawolves. His 57-yard run on 3rd-and-1 early in the third quarter was the key play on a drive that ended with Gaddis' field goal that tied the game at 13-13. On the game-winning drive, Gowins twice ran for first downs to keep the drive alive. Five of his 10 rushes on the day resulted in first downs, while his 9.7 yards per carry made the top-10 single-game list at Stony Brook.

**THREE LIBERTY WIN STREAKS END**

Liberty had three of its five win streaks snapped by Lafayette this past Saturday. The Flames' nation's-leading 11-game win streak came to end, as well as their 11-game home winning streak. In addition, LU's six-game in-season win streak also was snapped. The 11-game overall win streak was second-longest in Big South history and three wins shy of Charleston Southern's record of 14. The 11-game home win streak was tied with Gardner-Webb for second-longest in that category -- just one win away from matching the Big South mark of 12, set by Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern. And the six-game in-season win streak was the fourth-longest in Big South history. The two win streaks still intact appear below:

**SIX SHOOTERS**

Liberty was just the second team in Big South history to start the season 6-0, joining the 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers, which opened that year with a 9-0 record. Liberty opened 6-0 for the second time in program history, matching the 1989 squad for best start in school history.

**GOING FOR TWO**

Liberty is 2-0 in the Big South for the just the second time. The Flames opened the 2007 League slate 2-0 en route to a perfect 4-0 Conference record. VMI is looking to start 2-0 in League play for the first time since 2005 and the second time ever. Six of the previous seven Big South football champions all started League play 2-0 (2005 co-champion Charleston Southern opened 0-1), and a total of 10 teams started Conference play 2-0 prior to this season. The other four squads finished 2-2.

**BEWARE OF DOG**

Gardner-Webb's Big South record for most consecutive games holding an opponent under 100 yards rushing ended at six this past Saturday, as Presbyterian tallied 110 rushing yards against the Runnin' Bulldogs. Gardner-Webb permitted 63, 6, 98, 24, 37 and 79 rushing yards in the six-game span, respectively, and is allowing an average of 59.6 rushing yards per game this season -- 4th in the nation. The Big South's season record for rushing defense is 108.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2006. Gardner-Webb also is 15th nationally in total defense.

**STONY BROOK SCORES FIRST CONFERENCE WIN**

New Big South football member Stony Brook University won its first Big South game this past Saturday with a 20-19 win over Charleston Southern. The victory over the Buccaneers snapped a five-game losing streak for SBU, and was the first Conference win of any kind for the Seawolves since defeating Wagner on Nov. 4, 2006 as members of the Northeast Conference.

**MIDSEASON HONORS**

*The Sports Network* released its mid-season Walter Payton Award Watch List late last week and Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** remained among the 16 candidates who are up for the award's consideration at the halfway point of the year. Jennings was one of 13 holdovers from the original 16 preseason watch list members released on Aug. 29. *The Sports Network* will revise the Walter Payton Award Watch List two more times before voting commences. The list of 16 candidates will be reviewed early in November, before the finalized list will be handed over to the voting panel at the conclusion of the regular season. The top three finalists will be announced on Dec. 1.

**MR. 3000**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** became the third player in Big South history with 3,000 career rushing yards when he eclipsed the milestone vs. Lafayette this past Saturday. He is third all-time in Big South history with 3,006 career rushing yards, and needs 218 yards to surpass **SEAN MIZZER** for second-place (3,223). Jennings is averaging 145.5 rushing yards a game, and if he can maintain his average the remainder of the season, he will finish with both the single season and career rushing records. Jennings is on pace for 1,601 rushing yards in 2008, and 3,733 for his career. **DRE BARNES** currently holds both the Big South season rushing record (1,347 in 2003) and the career mark (3,409 from 2002-04).

**OF THE PEOPLES, BY THE PEOPLES, FOR THE PEOPLES**

Gardner-Webb RB **PHILIP PEOPLES** rushed for a career-high 176 yards against Presbyterian this past Saturday, marking his first career 100-yard rushing game. His previous best was 85 yards earlier this season at Austin Peay in Week 3. Peoples bettered his previous rushing high by 91 yards, and is now just four yards away from becoming the 22nd player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards.

**FLAMES DROP IN THE POLLS, SIT AT NO. 20/21**

With their 35-21 loss to Lafayette this past Saturday, the Liberty Flames fell in the two Top 25 national polls. Liberty is No. 20 in this week's *The Sports Network* poll, and No. 21 in the FCS Coaches Poll. Still, it is the seventh-straight week that Liberty has been ranked, extending its school record. Liberty entered the national Top 25 the week of Sept. 8 for the first time since 1998, when the Flames were ranked tied for No. 24 with Troy State in the Aug. 31, 1998 preseason ESPN/*USA Today* Division I-AA poll.

**THREE-PEAT**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** is 127 rushing yards shy of 1,000 for the season, which would make him the first player in Big South history with three 1,000-yard rushing campaigns.

**CENTURY MAN**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** has rushed for 100 yards in seven consecutive games, dating back to last season, tying the Big South record set by Liberty's **EUGENE GOODMAN** from Nov. 15, 2003 to Oct. 2, 2004. Jennings recorded his 18th career 100-yard rushing game with the Flames this past Saturday against Lafayette, breaking **DRE BARNES'** all-time Conference record for most career 100-yard rushing games (17).

**EVEN STEVEN(SON)**

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON** hauled in seven passes for 143 yards and three touchdowns at Stony Brook this past Saturday. He is just the fifth player in Big South history to tally three touchdowns catches in a game, and the first player in the League with three TD receptions since Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** had three against Wofford on Nov. 19, 2005. Stevenson is just the second player to have three touchdown catches in a Big South game, joining Gardner-Webb's **WILLIAM ANDREWS JR.**, who hauled in three TD receptions at VMI on Oct. 18, 2003.

**CATCH US IF YOU CAN**

Liberty receiving duo **DOMINIC BOLDEN** and **JONATHAN CRAWFORD** each surpassed 100 receiving yards this past Saturday vs. Lafayette. Bolden finished with a team-high 150 receiving yards on eight catches, while Crawford gained 106 yards on seven receptions. They are the first Big South teammates to post 100 receiving yards in a game since Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** and **DOBSON COLLINS** did it against Austin Peay last season on Sept. 29. Flagler had 153 receiving yards while Collins had 102. The last time two Liberty players had 100 receiving yards in the same game was 2001, and Bolden and Crawford are the 15th pair in school history to accomplish the feat.

**ASH BROWNS**

Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** recorded an interception in three-straight games from Sept. 27-Oct. 11, and is tied for the League-lead with three picks this season. He is CSU's career interception leader with eight, and is tied for fourth all-time in Big South history with Gardner-Webb's **MARIO WILLIAMS**, who had eight interceptions from 2002-04.

**SECOND-AND-TEN**

Walter Payton Award candidate **RASHAD JENNINGS** has scored 11 touchdowns this season (nine rushing and two receiving), the second player in Big South history with three 10-touchdown seasons. Jennings scored 10 touchdowns in 2006 and a Conference-record 17 a year ago. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** was the first player to accomplish the feat, scoring 14 in 2003 and 12 each in 2004 and 2005. Meanwhile, Jennings -- the only player in Big South history to score three touchdowns in consecutive games twice -- is third all-time in League history with 38 touchdowns scored. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** is the career leader with 47, followed by **JEROME SIMPSON** with 44.

**CUTTING THROUGH THE CLUTTER**

Stony Brook junior **CONTE CUTTINO** surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards on his third carry of the game this past Saturday vs. Charleston Southern. His season-best 107 rushing yards moved him into fourth-place all-time at Stony Brook with 2,091. Cuttino recorded his second 100-yard rushing game of the season and eighth of his career. He is fifth in the Big South with 476 rushing yards this season.

**NOTHING WRONG WITH BEING IN A RUSH**

VMI's season rush average of 356.5 yards per game leads the nation and is more than 70 yards ahead of its Big South record of 283.2 rushing yards per game set last season. The Keydets are on pace to gain more than 3,900 rushing yards at their current clip, which would shatter their League record of 3,115 yards established in 2007.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 64 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Charleston Southern has not been shutout in its last 38 games, while VMI (44) and Liberty (34) also have extended their respective streaks. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 26 games.

**A CLOSER LOOK AT VMI'S SCORING STREAK**

VMI's 44-game scoring streak is the longest run in the 118-year history of the program. The previous record was a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924. Earlier this year, the Keydets scored 30 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2003.

**JENNINGS CLIMBING SCORING LADDER**

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS**, who became the sixth player in League history with 200 career points when he surpassed the milestone in Week 6 at Coastal Carolina, is now fourth all-time in career scoring with 230 points. Jennings' total is third-most by a non-kicker, trailing Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286) and **JEROME SIMPSON** (264).

**FLAMES BURNING THROUGH BIG SOUTH FOES**

Liberty has won eight consecutive Big South games, tied for the longest Conference winning streak in League history. Coastal Carolina first established the standard from Nov. 22, 2003 to Oct. 29, 2005. During its streak, Liberty has scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 42.4 points, while holding its League brethren to 19.8 points. The Flames also have won four of those eight games on the road.

**RUNNING THE PLANK**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** leads the Big South with 668 kickoff return yards, which is already the sixth-highest single season total in League history and surpasses his total from last year (551). Stevenson has vaulted into a tie for second-place in the Conference record books with 1,219 career kickoff return yards, matching former record holder **ADRIAN HALL** of Liberty. Current Flames' senior **DOMINIC BOLDEN** is the all-time leader with 1,303 career kickoff return yards.

**COLLINS CATCHES UP**

Gardner-Webb WR **DOBSON COLLINS**, who became the 13th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions in Week 7 at Georgia Tech, is now 11th in Conference annals with 111. In his last four games, Collins is averaging 7.25 receptions a contest and 89.5 receiving yards to move into first among the League leaders with 44 receptions and second with 519 yards.

**TAKING THEIR TREASURE**

Charleston Southern's run of producing the top wide receiver in the Big South is in jeopardy this season, as leading receiver **GERALD STEVENSON** is currently 20 receptions away from the top spot. Stevenson's 24 catches this season rank ninth in the League. A Charleston Southern receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football.

**WIDE OUTS**

Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yard mark in Week 5. Collins' 1,327 career yards rank 13th all-time and is ahead of Bolden's career total of 1,326, which is 14th in League history. Former Liberty receiver **LAUREN WILLIAMS** is ahead of both players, sitting in 12th place with 1,391 career yards.

**MURRY MAKING HIS MARK(US)**

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** needs 53 receiving yards to reach the League's all-time top 10. He is currently 11th at 1,546, ranking just behind Gardner-Webb's **AUSTIN GAINES** (1,599). Murry's 107 career receptions are currently 13th in Big South history.

**SUGG FEST**

Stony Brook WR **LYNELL SUGGS** first catch at Liberty in Week 7 put him over the 2,000-yard mark in receiving yards. He now has 2,049 receiving yards in his career, third all-time at Stony Brook. He owns 142 receptions for his career, making him the third Stony Brook receiver to reach 140 career receptions.

**THIRD BROCK FROM THE SUN**

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH** needs 172 passing yards to become the fourth QB in League history with 6,000 in his career. He ranks fourth all-time with 5,828 passing yards after throwing for a career-high 344 against Lafayette. He also in one of four players with 40 career touchdown passes (42). Smith ranks fifth all-time in pass attempts (687), fifth in completions (411), fourth in TD passes (42) and fourth in total offense (5,930).

**REAL ESTATE BROKERS**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** and Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** are the Big South's active players with more than 3,000 all-purpose yards. Maypray is fourth all-time in Big South history with 3,612 career all-purpose yards, and needs just three yards to pass **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** for third-place at 3,614. Jennings eclipsed 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 6 at Coastal Carolina and now stands fifth all-time at 3,439. Meanwhile, **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2,907) and **ZACH TERRELL** (2,755) are approaching the milestone.

**HAVE YOU DRIVEN A FORD LATELY?**

Coastal Carolina senior RB **JAMIE FORDHAM** became the 20th player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in the Chanticleers' win over Towson in Week 4. Fordham's career total stands at 1,227 yards, and he is the fifth player in school history over the 1,000-yard rushing mark, joining **TYLER THIGPEN** (1,638), **MIKE TOLBERT** (1,670), **PATRICK HALL** (2,214) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343).

**USAIN BOLDEN?**

With 237 punt return yards this season, Liberty return specialist **DOMINIC BOLDEN** needs 62 more yards to break the Big South's single season record. Former teammate **WYNTON JACKSON** set the mark of 298 in 2006. Bolden's 16.9 punt return average is pacing just ahead of the single-season League record of 16.5, which was established by Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** in 2005.

**GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE**

Gardner-Webb freshman kicker **RYAN GATES** leads the Big South with 11 field goals made, which is tied for fifth-most in a single-season in Big South history. Gates is the third Gardner-Webb kicker with at least 11 field goals since 2002, joining **ANDREW HARMON** (11 in 2002) and **EVAN KAY** (11 in 2007). The Big South single-season field goal record is 17, set by VMI's **MATT SHARPE** in 2003.

**VMI SNAPS SKID, OPENS CONFERENCE SEASON WITH WIN**

VMI snapped its 10-game Conference game losing streak with its 47-20 win over Coastal Carolina in Week 7 to open the Big South season 1-0 for the first time since 2005 and the second time during its League membership. The 47 points were the Keydets' second-most scored in a Big South game and most since scoring 52 against Gardner-Webb in 2005.

**V-M-HIGH SCORING**

VMI has scored at least 40 points in a game three times this season (49 vs. St. Francis, Pa., 69 vs. Chowan and 47 vs. Coastal Carolina). The last time the Keydets had three games with at least 40 points scored was in their first Big South season in 2003. That year, VMI tallied 42 against Georgetown, 50 vs. Charleston Southern and 48 vs. Austin Peay.

**MAYPRAY BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON QUARTERBACK RUSHING RECORD**

VMI quarterback **TIM MAYPRAY** rushed for a career-high 155 yards vs. Coastal Carolina in Week 7 to increase his season rushing total to 696 yards -- breaking the Big South single-season record for most rushing yards by a quarterback. Former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** previously held the record of 656 yards, set in 2006. Maypray is second in the Big South in rushing, and should he surpass current rushing leader **RASHAD JENNINGS**, he would become the first quarterback to lead the League in rushing.

**MAYPRAY LOOKING FOR ANOTHER BIG SOUTH RECORD**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** needs 70 receiving yards to become the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.

**HALL PASS**

VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** and **ZACH COLLINS** hooked up for a 90-yard touchdown pass vs. Coastal Carolina in Week 7, the longest play from scrimmage in Big South history. The previous long play was an 87-yard pass from Hughes to **TIM MAYPRAY** last year vs. Charleston Southern on Nov. 3.

**PICKING UP TWO**

VMI freshman **JUAN THRASHER** recorded a defensive extra point in Week 7 vs. Coastal Carolina. It was the first defensive extra point in the Big South since Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** recorded two points on a PAT return vs. Coastal Carolina last year. The last VMI player to post a defensive extra point was **GRANT HARRIS** against Charleston Southern on Oct. 8, 2005.

**BIG MAC ATTACK**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** threw for a school-record 382 yards against Liberty in Week 6, which is tied for the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. MacDowall bettered former Chanticleers QB and current Kansas City Chief **TYLER THIGPEN's** previous school record of 351 yards, set against Appalachian State in the 2006 FCS Playoffs.

**SUPER SIZED**

Coastal Carolina set a Big South single-game record with 20 passing first downs against Liberty in Week 6. The Chanticleers finished the game with 32 overall first downs, the most in a Big South game and the second-highest overall total in Big South history.

**COMBO MEAL**

Coastal Carolina (534 yards) and Liberty (531) combined for 1,065 yards of total offense in Week 6, a record for a Conference game. The previous best for a Big South contest was 1,060 combined yards between Gardner-Webb (533) and VMI (527) in the Bulldogs' 55-52, triple-overtime win in Lexington. Coincidentally, both contests were televised games, and **MATT HOGUE** handled the call for both.

**WHAT YOU TALKING ABOUT WILLIS?**

Coastal Carolina redshirt-sophomore **MARQUEL WILLIS** enjoyed a career night vs. Liberty in Week 6, as he hauled in personal bests of seven receptions for 145 yards and two touchdowns. Willis entered the game with two catches for 29 yards. He is the first Chanticleer receiver with more than 100 receiving yards in a game since **JEROME SIMPSON** had 107 in Coastal Carolina's 2006 play-off game at Appalachian State on Nov. 25. Willis' 145 receiving yards are the most by a Chants' receiver since Simpson had 145 against Liberty on Oct. 28, 2006.

**RECORD CHANTS**

With its 20-7 win at North Carolina A&T in Week 5, Coastal Carolina became the first team in Big South history to hold three-straight opponents to less than 10 points. The Chanticleers allowed just 17 points in that span (7 at Monmouth, 3 vs. Towson, 7 vs. North Carolina A&T). Coastal Carolina broke the record of two-straight games that was established by the 2006 Liberty Flames.
