Maypray rushed for a career-high 155 yards -- a Big South single-game record by a quarterback -- and scored one touchdown in helping the Keydets defeat Coastal Carolina, 47-20 and snap their 10-game Conference losing streak. Maypray also threw a 19-yard touchdown pass and caught three passes for 59 yards to finish the day with 214 all-purpose yards. His 33-yard pass reception in VMI's opening drive set up the Keydets' first touchdown. He also had a long run of 40 yards that set up VMI's second score of the third quarter. Maypray also broke the Big South single-season rushing record by a quarterback during the game, as his season total of 696 surpasses the previous best of 656.

NEW BALANCE

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Gross led VMI with 13 tackles (six solo, seven assisted) in the Keydets' win over Coastal Carolina. He tied the Big South single-game record with 5.0 tackles-for-loss (minus-27 yards) and recorded 3.0 sacks on the day for minus-20 yards. Gross' three sacks came in the second half when VMI blanked the Chanticleers 28-0, and his play helped limit Coastal Carolina to 20 yards of total offense in the third quarter.

Hanna averaged 45.8 yards on 10 punts in Gardner-Webb's 10-7 loss at FBS member Georgia Tech. His career-high 10 punts helped the Bulldogs maintain solid field position much of the day. His long came from 61 yards and he pinned Georgia Tech inside its 20-yard line three times. Hanna also had punts of 53, 55 and 50 yards on the day.

Bevins added punting duties to his placekicking responsibilities Saturday against new League member Stony Brook. Bevins also was a perfect 2-of-2 on his field goals (22 and 27 yards) and 3-of-3 on his PAT kicks to finish with nine points for the Flames.

LIBERTY CONTINUES WINNING WAYS

Liberty extended its nation's-leading win streak to a school-record 11 games following its 33-0 win over new League member Stony Brook. The Flames' previous best was 10 consecutive wins spanning the 1988 and 1989 seasons. Liberty also tied the Big South record for longest Conference Game win streak with its eighth-straight League win. Here is a look at Liberty's many win streaks:

VMI SNAPS SKID, OPENS CONFERENCE SEASON 1-0

VMI defeated Coastal Carolina Saturday, 47-20, to end its 10-game Conference game losing streak and open the Big South season 1-0 for the first time since 2005 and the second time during its League membership. The 47 points were the Keydets' second-most scored in a Big South game and most since scoring 52 against Gardner-Webb in 2005.

GOING FOR TWO

Liberty is 2-0 in the Big South for the just the second time. The Flames opened the 2007 League slate 2-0 en route to a perfect 4-0 Conference record. Charleston Southern is looking to start 2-0 in Conference action for the first time since 2006. VMI's last 2-0 League record was in 2005. Six of the previous seven Big South football champions all started League play 2-0 (2005 co-champion Charleston Southern opened 0-1), and a total of 10 teams have started Conference play 2-0. The other four squads finished 2-2.

SIX SHOOTERS

Liberty is the second team in Big South history to start the season 6-0, joining the 2006 Charleston Southern Buccaneers, which opened that year with a 9-0 record. Liberty is 6-0 for the first time since 1989 when the Flames started 6-0.

BEWARE OF DOG

Gardner-Webb extended its Big South record for most consecutive games holding an opponent under 100 yards rushing to six this past Saturday, allowing just 79 rushing yards to FBS member Georgia Tech. The Bulldogs permitted just 199 total offensive yards to the Yellow Jackets, while the 79 rushing yards was 210 yards *BELOW* Georgia Tech's season average. This season, Gardner-Webb has permitted 63, 6, 98, 24, 37 and 79 rushing yards in its six games, respectively, and is allowing an average of 51.2 rushing yards per game -- 2nd in the nation. The Big South's season record for rushing defense is 108.8, set by Charleston Southern in 2006. Gardner-Webb also is 7th nationally in total defense, holding opponents to 265.33 yards per game.

V-M-HIGH SCORING

VMI has scored at least 40 points in a game three times this season (49 vs. St. Francis, Pa., 69 vs. Chowan and 47 vs. Coastal Carolina). The last time the Keydets had three games with at least 40 points scored was in their first Big South season in 2003. That year, VMI tallied 42 against Georgetown, 50 vs. Charleston Southern and 48 vs. Austin Peay.

FLAMES BURNING THROUGH BIG SOUTH FOES

Liberty has now won eight consecutive Big South games, tied for the longest Conference winning streak in League history. Coastal Carolina first established the standard from Nov. 22, 2003 to Oct. 29, 2005. During its streak, Liberty has scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 42.4 points, while holding its League brethren to 19.8 points. The Flames also have won four of those eight games on the road.

MAYPRAY BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON QUARTERBACK RUSHING RECORD

VMI quarterback **TIM MAYPRAY** rushed for a career-high 155 yards Saturday vs. Coastal Carolina to increase his season rushing total to 696 yards -- breaking the Big South single-season record for most rushing yards by a quarterback. Former Coastal Carolina QB **TYLER THIGPEN** previously held the record of 656 yards, set in 2006. Maypray is second in the Big South in rushing, and should he surpass current rushing leader **RASHAD JENNINGS**, he would become the first quarterback to lead the League in rushing.

MAYPRAY LOOKING FOR ANOTHER BIG SOUTH RECORD

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** needs 70 receiving yards to become the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.

FLAMES MOVE UP IN THE POLLS

The Liberty Flames, which entered the national Top 25 the week of Sept. 8 for the first time since 1998, are No. 14 in this week's *The Sports Network* poll, and No. 15 in the FCS Coaches Poll. It is the sixth-straight week that Liberty has been ranked, a first in school history. Prior to this season, Liberty's previous national ranking came in the Aug. 31, 1998 preseason ESPN/*USA Today* Division I-AA poll, as the Flames were ranked tied for No. 24 with Troy State.

HALL PASS

VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** and **ZACH COLLINS** hooked up for a 90-yard touchdown pass Saturday vs. Coastal Carolina, the longest play from scrimmage in Big South history. The previous long play was an 87-yard pass from Hughes to **TIM MAYPRAY** last year vs. Charleston Southern on Nov. 3.

ASH BROWNS

Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** has recorded an interception in three-straight games, and is tied for the League-lead with three picks this season. He is now CSU's career interception leader with eight, and is now tied for fourth all-time in Big South history with Gardner-Webb's **MARIO WILLIAMS**, who had eight interceptions from 2002-04.

SECOND-AND-TEN

Walter Payton Award candidate **RASHAD JENNINGS** has scored 10 touchdowns this season (eight rushing and two receiving), the second player in Big South history with three 10-touchdown seasons. Jennings scored 10 touchdowns in 2006 and a Conference-record 17 a year ago. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** was the first player to accomplish the feat, scoring 14 in 2003 and 12 each in 2004 and 2005. Meanwhile, Jennings -- the only player in Big South history to score three touchdowns in consecutive games twice -- is third all-time in League history with 37 touchdowns scored. Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** is the career leader with 47, followed by **JEROME SIMPSON** with 44.

NOTHING WRONG WITH BEING IN A RUSH

VMI's season rush average of 356.5 yards per game leads the nation and is more than 70 yards ahead of its Big South record of 283.2 rushing yards per game set last season. The Keydets are on pace to gain more than 3,900 rushing yards at their current clip, which would shatter their League record of 3,115 yards established in 2007.

JENNINGS' JAUNTS

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS**, who is third all-time in Big South history with 2,858 career rushing yards, is 142 yards away from becoming the third player with 3,000. Jennings is averaging 145.0 rushing yards a game, and if he maintains his average the remainder of the season, he will finish the season with both the single season and career rushing records. Jennings is on pace for 1,595 rushing yards in 2008, and 3,728 for his career. **DRE BARNES** currently holds both the Big South season rushing record (1,347 in 2003) and the career mark (3,409 from 2002-04).

POINT OF ORDER

Coastal Carolina has scored a point in all 63 games in its history, extending its Big South record for consecutive games with a point. Charleston Southern has not been shutout in its last 37 games, while VMI (44) and Liberty (33) also have extended their respective streaks. Meanwhile, Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 25 games.

A CLOSER LOOK AT VMI'S SCORING STREAK

VMI's 44-game scoring streak is the longest run in the 118-year history of the program. The previous record was a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924. Earlier this year, the Keydets scored 30 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2003.

CENTURY MAN

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** has rushed for 100 yards in six consecutive games, dating back to last season, the second-longest streak in Big South history and one away from matching **EUGENE GOODMAN**'s record of seven from Nov. 15, 2003 to Oct. 2, 2004. Jennings recorded his 17th career 100-yard rushing game with the Flames this past Saturday, equalling **DRE BARNES'** all-time Conference record for most career 100-yard rushing games.

JENNINGS CLIMBING SCORING LADDER

Liberty RB **RASHAD JENNINGS**, who became the sixth player in League history with 200 career points when he surpassed the milestone in Week 6 at Coastal Carolina, is now fifth all-time in career scoring with 224 points. Former Gardner-Webb kicker **HUNTER SMITH** is fourth with 228 points. Jennings' total is third-most by a non-kicker, trailing Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (286) and **JEROME SIMPSON** (264).

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE

The Liberty Flames have won 11 consecutive home games, which is currently the second-longest home winning streak in FCS. San Diego has won 28-straight home games to lead the nation. Liberty's 11-game home winning streak is the second-longest in Big South history, and one victory away from tying the record of 12 held by Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern. The Flames first chance at matching the record is this Saturday, Oct. 18 vs. Lafayette.

RUNNING THE PLANK

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** leads the Big South with 590 kickoff return yards, which is already the sixth-highest single season total in League history and surpasses his total from last year (551). Stevenson has vaulted into fifth-place in the Conference record books with 1,141 career kickoff return yards. Former Buccaneer **KIJANA THOMAS** is fourth with 1,163.

THE BUTLER CONTINUES TO DO IT

Presbyterian WR **TERRANCE BUTLER** is looking to end Charleston Southern's run of producing the top wide receiver in the Conference. Butler leads the Big South in the three main receiving categories: receptions (41), receiving yards (519) and TD catches (6). However, he sustained an injury against North Carolina Central and his return is unknown. A Charleston Southern receiver has led or shared the Big South lead in receptions every year of Big South football. No Buccaneer is currently in the League's top 10 thus far.

COLLINS CATCHING UP

Gardner-Webb WR **DOBSON COLLINS** became the 13th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday at Georgia Tech. Collins finished the day with seven receptions and has 105 in his career, one behind Charleston Southern's **MARKUS MURRY** (106). In his last three games, Collins is averaging 7.7 receptions a contest and 87.0 receiving yards to move into second among the League leaders with 38 catches and third with 422 yards.

WIDE OUTS

Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** and Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** each surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yard mark in Week 5. Collins' 1,230 career yards rank 14th all-time and is ahead of Bolden's career total of 1,176, which is 15th in League history. Former VMI receiver **GARY PRICE** is ahead of both players, sitting in 13th place with 1,232 career yards.

MURRY MAKING HIS MARK(US)

Charleston Southern WR **MARKUS MURRY** caught six passes at Miami (Ohio) in Week 3 to become the 12th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions. Murry stands at 106 and needs three catches to tie VMI's **GARY PRICE** for 11th place with 109. Meanwhile, Murry has 1,538 career receiving yards and needs 61 to reach the League's all-time top 10.

SUGG FEST

Stony Brook WR **LYNELL SUGGS** first catch at Liberty last Saturday put him over the 2,000-yard mark in receiving yards. He now has 2,031 receiving yards in his career, third all-time at Stony Brook. His three receptions against the Flames give him 141 for his career, making him the third Stony Brook receiver to reach 140 career receptions.

REAL ESTATE BROKERS

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** and Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS** are the Big South's active players with more than 3,000 all-purpose yards. Maypray is fourth all-time in Big South history with 3,612 career all-purpose yards, and needs just three yards to pass **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** for third-place at 3,614. Jennings eclipsed 3,000 career all-purpose yards at Coastal Carolina in Week 6 and now stands fifth all-time at 3,266. Meanwhile, **ZACH TERRELL** (2,755) and **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2,744) are approaching the milestone.

THIRD BROCK FROM THE SUN

Liberty QB **BROCK SMITH**, who became the fifth QB in League history with 5,000 career passing yards when he surpassed the milestone at No. 23 Youngstown State in Week 5, is now fourth all-time with 5,484. He also is one of four players with 40 career touchdown passes (40). Smith ranks fifth all-time in pass attempts (650), fifth in completions (387), fourth in TD passes (40) and fourth in total offense (5,596).

PICKING UP TWO

VMI freshman **JUAN THRASHER** recorded a defensive extra point Saturday vs. Coastal Carolina. It was the first defensive extra point in the Big South since Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** recorded two points on a PAT return vs. Coastal Carolina last year. The last VMI player to post a defensive extra point was **GRANT HARRIS** against Charleston Southern on Oct. 8, 2005.

USAIN BOLDEN?

With 237 punt return yards this season, Liberty return specialist **DOMINIC BOLDEN** needs 62 more yards to break the Big South's single season record. Former teammate **WYNTON JACKSON** set the mark of 298 in 2006. Bolden's 18.2 punt return average is pacing ahead of the single-season League record of 16.5, which was established by Gardner-Webb's **KORY ALSTON** in 2005. Meanwhile, Bolden has quietly become the Big South's all-time leader in kickoff return yards. His 1,290 career total recently surpassed **ADRIAN HALL**'s previous record of 1,219 from 2002-04.

PAG, YOU'RE IT

Charleston Southern kicker **JOHN PAGLIA** leads the Big South with a 88.9 field goal percentage, as he has nailed 8-of-9 field goals this season. He has made his last five attempts, including the game-winning 26-yarder over Gardner-Webb in Week 6. Paglia opened the year 3-of-3 before missing a 40-yarder against North Greenville in Week 5.

BIG MAC ATTACK

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** threw for a school-record 382 yards against Liberty in Week 6, which is tied for the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. MacDowall bettered former Chanticleers QB and current Kansas City Chief **TYLER THIGPEN**'s previous school record of 351 yards, set against Appalachian State in the 2006 FCS Playoffs.

SUPER SIZED

Coastal Carolina set a Big South single-game record with 20 passing first downs against Liberty in Week 6. The Chanticleers finished the game with 32 overall first downs, the most in a Big South game and the second-highest overall total in Big South history.

Coincidentally, both contests were televised games, and **MATT HOGUE** handled the call for both.

WHAT YOU TALKING ABOUT WILLIS?

Coastal Carolina redshirt-sophomore **MARQUEL WILLIS** enjoyed a career night vs. Liberty in Week 6, as he hauled in personal bests of seven receptions for 145 yards and two touchdowns. Willis entered the game with two catches for 29 yards. He is the first Chanticleer receiver with more than 100 receiving yards in a game since **JEROME SIMPSON** had 107 in Coastal Carolina's 2006 playoff game at Appalachian State on Nov. 25. Willis' 145 receiving yards are the most by a Chants' receiver since Simpson had 145 against Liberty on Oct. 28, 2006.

RECORD CHANTS

With its 20-7 win at North Carolina A&T in Week 5, Coastal Carolina became the first team in Big South history to hold three-straight opponents to less than 10 points. The Chanticleers allowed just 17 points in that span (7 at Monmouth, 3 vs. Towson, 7 vs. North Carolina A&T). Coastal Carolina broke the record of two-straight games that was established by the 2006 Liberty Flames.

PEAKS AND VALLEYS

The Big South has wins this season over members from AQ Conferences the Colonial, Ohio Valley, Missouri Valley, Patriot and Southern. In Week 5, the Big South captured its first-ever win over a Missouri Valley Football Conference opponent (formerly the Gateway Football Conference) with Liberty's 31-28 win at Youngstown State. The Big South was winless in three previous meetings.

HE IS THE BIG SOUTH'S DEVIN HESTER

Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** had a 72-yard punt return touchdown vs. Glenville State in Week 2, his first career punt return TD and Big South record fourth career kick return touchdown. Bolden is the all-time leader with three career kickoff return TDs, and is now just one of three players in Big South history to have returned both a punt and kickoff for touchdowns, joining **WYNTON JACKSON** and **JONATHAN CRAWFORD**.

FB-YES

The Big South football membership played a League-record five games against FBS members in 2008. The list featured two ACC teams, two MAC teams and one Big Ten opponent. Charleston Southern faced two FBS squads -- Miami of both Florida and Ohio. Coastal Carolina opened the season at Penn State -- its first-ever FBS foe, while VMI played at Ohio. Gardner-Webb rounded out the Big South's FBS slate with a visit to Georgia Tech.
