### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**PATRICK HALL • RB • Junior**  
Gardner-Webb • Gastonia, N.C.

Hall stepped in for injured starter **Philip Peoples** and responded with a career-high 118 rushing yards and three touchdowns in Gardner-Webb's 27-20 win over Charleston Southern. He averaged 6.9 yards on 17 carries and scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns, including the game-winner from 16 yards out with just 22 seconds remaining. Hall also scored from 21 yards out early in the fourth quarter to give Gardner-Webb a 20-13 lead, and scored the game's first touchdown with a 2-yard scamper on GWU's initial drive. In the fourth quarter, Hall carried three times for 45 yards, and also had a 12-yard catch on the game-winning drive.

**MICHAEL COULTER • QB • Sophomore**  
Stony Brook • Yorba Linda, Calif.

Coulter put together his second 300-yard passing game in his last three games to lead Stony Brook past VMI, 27-20, for its first road win of the season. Coulter completed 28-of-44 passes (=63.6 percent) for 316 yards and two touchdowns, and engineered the Seawolves' game-winning drive. Twelve of his completions were good for 10-or-more yards and his 28 completions are the second-most in school history. After VMI took a 20-19 lead with 2:56 remaining, Coulter completed four of five passes for 32 yards, including three-straight and one on a third-down conversion to set up the game-winning score. Coulter later threw a completion for a successful two-point conversion.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**LIBERTY DEFENSE**

Liberty's defense banded together to intercept four passes, record a season-high nine tackles for loss of 46 yards and three sacks for a loss of 29 yards in its 45-point victory over Coastal Carolina. The Flames held the Chanticleers to 175 total offensive yards -- Coastal's second-lowest total ever, and just 40 rushing yards. Liberty's starting unit held Coastal Carolina to 137 yards of offense, as the remaining 38 yards were against the Flames' reserves. The 175 yards allowed is Liberty's lowest total against a Division I program since before 2002.

### FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**ALDREAKIS ALLEN • RB**  
Liberty • Colbert, Ga.

Allen rushed for 106 yards and three touchdowns against Coastal Carolina and finished the day with 203 all-purpose yards. He posted his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game and scored half of Liberty's six touchdowns. Allen scored the game's first touchdown with a 1-yard run in the first quarter, then added a 14-yard scamper in the third stanza that jump started Liberty's 42-straight second-half points. He reached the end zone again from 13 yards out early in the fourth period. Allen also was Liberty's top receiver with 6 receptions for 83 yards, and added a 14-yard kickoff return.

Bevins finished with a career-high 14 points against Coastal Carolina with a perfect kicking day. He knocked down three field goals in the first half (24, 31, 42) to gave Liberty a 16-3 lead with 54 seconds left in the first half, and was 5-of-5 on PATs. His 42-yarder was his fourth-straight successful field goal from 40 yards-or-longer, and he has now connected on six consecutive field goal attempts. The 14 points pushed his career total to 102.

**BIG SOUTH'S TELEVISION PACKAGE CONTINUES SATURDAY**

The 2009 Big South Television package continues this Saturday and features Coastal Carolina's first-ever trip to Stony Brook live on the Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN) and WWMB-TV 21 in Conway/Myrtle Beach at 3:30pm ET. **MATT HOGUE** (play-by-play) and **JAMES BUFORD** (analyst) will call the action. It is the second of three Big South "Royal Purple Game of the Week" broadcasts this season. MASN also will air the Nov. 7 VMI at Liberty tilt.

**2-0 BIG SOUTH TEAMS**

Gardner-Webb is 2-0 in League play for the first time since 2007 and fifth time overall, and is looking to improve to 3-0 in Big South games for the first time since 2003. Stony Brook is 2-0 for the first time since beginning its Big South affiliation last year.

**BLAZING THE TRAIL**

Liberty opened League play this past weekend with a 58-13 victory over Coastal Carolina to extend its Conference win streak to 12 games (7 home, 5 road), the longest Conference win streak in Big South history and the fourth-longest active League winning streak among FCS programs. During the run, Liberty has scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 42.3 points, while holding its Big South brethren to 17.3 points. Below is a closer look at the Flames' hot streak.

**SOMETHING'S GOTTA GIVE**

Charleston Southern will put its seven-game home winning streak on the line this weekend when the Liberty Flames -- winners of 12 consecutive Conference games -- come to town on Saturday afternoon. Charleston Southern is averaging 27.9 points during its seven-game home win streak (195 total points), while holding its opponents to an average of 9.3 points (65 total), including two shutouts. The Bucs' streak is the third-longest home winning streak in Big South history. The second-longest home win streak is 11, while the League record is 12 consecutive home wins, accomplished by both Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern.

**HE'S NOT PLAYING LIKE A COLT**

Stony Brook QB **MICHAEL COULTER** has thrown for 914 yards in his last three games (304.7 average), going over 275 in each. Stony Brook's season-high last season was 210. Coulter has thrown for more than 300 yards in back-to-back Conference games, the third QB in Big South history to accomplish this feat, joining Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** and Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** (Campbell is the lone player with 300 passing yards in three consecutive Big South games). Meanwhile, Coulter has thrown two TD passes in each of his last four outings and leads the Big South with 10 scoring strikes this season. The last Big South player to throw at least two touchdowns in five-straight games was Liberty's **BROCK SMITH** last season.

**LOW TIDE**

Liberty's 45-point victory over Coastal Carolina was the second-largest margin of victory in a Conference game in Big South history -- and the Chanticleers' worst defeat in a League game in its existence. Coastal also allowed its most-ever points in a Big South game (58), allowed its most offensive yards in a League contest (575), gained its fewest yards rushing (40) in its 74-game history, and had its second-lowest offensive output (175 total yards) in school history.

**BOTH ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM**

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (31.2) and scoring defense (16.7), a feat they accomplished in 2007. If the Flames can maintain its hold on both categories, they would become the first Big South team to lead the Conference in scoring offense and scoring defense twice. Meanwhile, Liberty is looking for its fourth consecutive League scoring defense title.

**CAN'T SAY THEY HAVE**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty are the lone teams to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in Big South games. Gardner-Webb's streak is at 30 games, while Liberty's streak is 29. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 27 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

**30 ROCK**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is fourth all-time in Big South history with 35 career touchdowns and is approaching an elite group. Maypray, who became just the sixth player in Big South annals with 20 career rushing touchdowns this past weekend, needs to reach the end zone five more times to become the fourth member of the Big South's 40-touchdown club. Ahead of him are **JEROME SIMPSON** (44), **RASHAD JENNINGS** (46) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (47).

**CALL HIM TOUCHDOWN TIM**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is the only player in Big South history, and the only active player in FCS, to score a rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown, kickoff return touchdown, punt return touchdown and pass for a touchdown. In addition, he is the only player in League history with at least 20 rushing touchdowns (20) and 10 receiving touchdowns (12). Meanwhile, Maypray became the seventh player in League history to reach the 200-point plateau when he eclipsed the milestone this past weekend against Stony Brook. Maypray now has 210 career points -- which is fourth-most by a non-kicker.

**GO-GO-GOWINS**

Stony Brook sophomore RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has four rushing touchdowns this season, and has scored 12 of his 15 career scores in his last nine outings. His four running TDs in 2009 have gone for an average of 35.5 yards (39-27-44-32), and in his career, Gowins is averaging 35.6 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32). All but two of his 15 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72.

**GROUND GAINER**

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 4 against North Greenville, ranks seventh all-time with 3,499 in his career. He needs 97 yards to pass Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3,595) for sixth-place.

**LOOKS LIKE IT WILL BE A PHOTO FINISH**

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** quietly grabbed two Big South career records this past weekend in the Stony Brook game. He returned seven kicks -- five kickoffs and two punts, giving him 97 combined kickoff/punt returns in his career to break the Conference career record of 94. In addition, Maypray totaled 124 yards on those seven returns vs. the Seawolves and moved past Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** for first-place in Big South history in combined yardage at 1,957. Maypray holds a 13 yard lead over Stevenson, who has 1,944. Stevenson, who originally broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff/punt return yards in Week 2, returned five kickoffs for 107 yards this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb, and remains the career leader for kickoff returns and kickoff return yards. Below is a look a breakdown of each player's combined kick return totals.

**GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE**

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES** is second all-time in Big South history with nine career field goals of 40-yards or longer. The record is 13, held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE**. Gates, who became the eighth kicker in Big South history with 100 career points when he reached the milestone in Week 2 at Western Carolina, is now sixth all-time with 123. He needs 19 points to move into fifth-place. In less than two seasons, Gates is already sixth in League annals with 26 career field goals and tied for third with four career 10-point kicking games.

**WILD WILD WES**

Stony Brook redshirt-freshman **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** is the Big South leader with 11 field goals on the season, which ties the school record that was first set by **BOB BURDEN** in 1986, Stony Brook's second season of varsity football. Skiffington is just six field goals away from tying the Big South single-season record of 17, set by VMI's **MATT SHARPE** in 2003. Skiffington has made at least two field goals in a game four times this season, including a Big South-record tying four against Presbyterian College in Week 5.

**MR. ALL-PURPOSE**

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY** is the Big South's all-time leader in all-purpose yards with 5,308, breaking the Conference record in Week 4 at No. 1 Richmond. Maypray is fourth among active Division I FCS players in all-purpose yards, and remains second in all-purpose yards per play with a career average of 10.15. Bucknell's **A.J. KIZEKAI** is first at 11.22. Below is a breakdown of Maypray's yardage and respective rank in Big South history. He is the only player in League annals with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards.

**HE IS THE ONLY ONE**

Presbyterian College RB **TRANDON DENDY** is the only player in the Big South to lead his team in rushing in every game this season. He has racked up 85, 14, 44, 147, 59 yards and 106 yards in PC's six games for 455 rushing yards. Dendy is looking to become just the second player in the Conference's football history to lead his team in rushing in every game of the season. VMI's **SEAN MIZZER** led the Keydets in rushing in all 12 games of the 2003 season, VMI's first year in the Big South.

**HE IS HUGHES**

VMI senior QB **KYLE HUGHES** sits in fourth-place on the Big South's all-time quarterback rushing list with 942 in his career, and is 58 yards shy of becoming the fourth Big South QB with 1,000 career rushing yards. In Week 4 at No. 1 Richmond, Hughes had his second career game with both 100 rushing and 100 passing yards when he rushed for 133 yards and threw for 141. He joined Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** as the only players in Big South history to accomplish this feat twice.

**POINT OF ORDER**

VMI has scored a point in its last 55 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Liberty's current streak stands at 45 games, while Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 36 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 17 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (12), Coastal Carolina (5) and Charleston Southern (3).

**MR. 3,000**

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** became the first player in school history with 3,000 career rushing yards when he surpassed the milestone against Presbyterian College in Week 5. Cuttino's school record total now stands at 3,186 (1,574 in the Big South), and he is one of just seven active players in FCS with 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **EDWIN GOWINS** surpassed 1,500 career yards against Brown in Week 3, and has 1,776 rushing yards in just 17 career games (104.5 yards per game).

**SACK LUNCH**

Coastal Carolina senior **PHILLIP OBOH** leads the Big South with 4.0 quarterback sacks, and is tied for fourth on the Big South's all-time list with 14.0 in his career. Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the all-time leader with 20.5. Meanwhile, GWU freshman **MATTHEW GOODS** is tied for second in the Big South with 3.5 sacks and is challenging to become the first Bulldog to lead the League in sacks since Johnston in 2006.

**GOING FOR TWO... HUNDRED**

Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS** (138) and **CONTE CUTTINO** (62) combined for 200 rushing yards in a game for the first time this season when they finished with exactly 200 against Presbyterian College in Week 5. It was the sixth time the duo has combined for 200 rushing yards in a game, with Stony Brook going 5-1 in those games.

**CROWD PLEASERS**

Liberty drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history in Week 2, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. After four home games, the Flames are averaging 15,046 fans per game, which is pacing ahead of its Big South single-season record of 14,190 established in 2007. Liberty has surpassed 10,000 fans 25 times since Oct. 4, 2003, a span of 39 home games.

**RUSH WEEK**

VMI has not had an individual rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games, the first such occurrence since the 2007 season (Sept. 8 vs. William & Mary, Sept. 15 at James Madison and Sept. 22 at Lehigh). The Keydets still rank No. 10 in the nation in rushing offense at 214.2, and are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead the Conference in rushing offense four consecutive seasons.

**PERRY III IS XIX**

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** became the 19th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he eclipsed the milestone this past Saturday vs. Charleston Southern. The redshirt-sophomore has 1,058 yards on 86 receptions in just 17 career games, and is the sixth GWU player on the Big South's career 1,000-yard receiving list. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern junior **GERALD STEVENSON** is 16 yards shy of 1,000 career receiving yards, and would be the fifth Buccaneer player on the list.

**BUCKING THE TREND**

Charleston Southern rushed for 198 yards this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb, its highest total in a Big South game since gaining 200 yards against the Runnin' Bulldogs in 2005. The Buccaneers fell just short of having its first three-game streak with 200 rushing yards since before the 2002 season.

**TACKLE BOX**

Gardner-Webb junior LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is the Big South's active leading career tackler with 279 career stops. He needs 21 hits to become just the seventh player in League history with 300 career tackles. Williams is averaging 9.96 tackles per game in his 28-game career. Teammate **MARIO BROWN** is 25 tackles away from 300.

**RUSHING UPDATE**

Following his career-high 118 rushing yards this past Saturday vs. Charleston Southern, Gardner-Webb's **PATRICK HALL** is exactly 100 yards away from 1,000 in his career. VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** is 58 rushing yards shy of the milestone as well. Meanwhile, **EDWIN GOWINS** cracked the Big South's top 10 leaders this past weekend, and is 224 rushing yards away from 2,000 in his young career. In addition, VMI senior **HOWARD ABEGESAH** is 81 yards away from unseating Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** for fifth on the career list. **PORT AUTHORITY**

Stony Brook WR **DONALD PORTER** became the first player in Big South football history with two 50-yard touchdown receptions in the same game when he accomplished the feat vs. Presbyterian College in Week 5. Porter hauled in a 59-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter, then added a 60-yard TD catch and run in the fourth quarter.

**DAILY DOUBLE**

Coastal Carolina is the first Big South team to achieve the following feat against two consecutive FCS opponents -- gain more than 400 yards of offense and limit the opposition to less than 250. In Week 4 against North Carolina A&T, the Chanticleers gained 414 yards and held the Aggies to 239. The next week against VMI, Coastal Carolina amassed 418 offensive yards and limited the Keydets to 243.

**TREASURE CHEST**

For the first time since the Big South began football in 2002, Charleston Southern recorded back-to-back games with 500 yards of total offense. The Buccaneers amassed 516 in Week 4 vs. North Greenville, and 528 in Week 5 against Savannah State. For the second consecutive week, Charleston Southern collected 200 yards both rushing and passing. Prior to the North Greenville game, the last time CSU achieved this feat was during the 2005 campaign.

**A DAY AT THE BEACH**

Coastal Carolina rushed for 304 yards in Week 4 vs. North Carolina A&T, its first game over 300 rushing yards since gaining 302 against Towson last season. The Chanticleers have gained 300 yards on the ground 13 times in their existence, tied with VMI for the most in Big South history, and are 13-0 in those games. Coastal Carolina has posted at least one 300-yard rushing game in every season since its inception in 2003.

**SWEET SIX-HUNDRED**

Stony Brook gained 623 yards of offense in its Big South opener against Presbyterian College in Week 5, the third time in a seven-game span that the Seawolves amassed 600 offensive yards. SBU is the first Big South team with three games over 600, and its total against PC was the second-highest in a Conference game. Coastal Carolina owns the League game record with 638 against Gardner-Webb in 2006.

**FB-YES**

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season.

**POLLSTERS**

Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll the week of Sept. 8, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern, Coastal, GWU, LU, SBU and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll.

**BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009**

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

**THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010**

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.
