Abegesah posted his first 100-yard rushing game since the season opener with a season-high 165 yards at Presbyterian College, and scored three touchdowns in leading VMI to a 31-20 win over the Blue Hose - the Keydets' first Conference road win since Oct. 1, 2005. Abegesah averaged 6.6 yards per carry on the day and ran for scores of 1, 37 and 12 yards, with the 37-yarder his longest run of the season. He also had seven rushes that resulted in first downs. It was Abegesah's 11th career 100-yard rushing game and second career game with three touchdowns.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

EMILIO CALVIN • OLB • R-Sophomore
VMI • Woodbridge, Va.

Calvin posted nine tackles, including a season-high seven solo stops, and notched a career-high 4.0 tackles-for-loss of 18 yards at PC. He also logged a nine-yard sack in Presbyterian College's red zone and was part of a defense that limited the Blue Hose to 36 rushing yards. Calvin also stopped PC on 4th-and-1 with a tackle-for-loss in the second quarter.

Larsson averaged 36.5 yards on six punts at Charleston Southern, helping the Flames in the battle for field position. The Buccaneers managed just one return for one yard on his six kicks, while two fell inside the 20-yard line. He also had two punts over 50 yards -- a 52-yarder in the first quarter and a 71-yarder in the fourth stanza. The 71-yard punt is tied for second-longest in Big South history and is the third-longest in school history.

Vinson, who entered the Charleston Southern game with seven tackles, recorded a career-high eight stops against the Bucs, including four solo hits. His pass break-up stopped a potential game-tying touchdown late in the fourth quarter, as he stepped in front of a CSU receiver to deflect the pass thrown inside the red zone.

THREE TEAMS REMAIN UNDEFEATED IN BIG SOUTH ACTION

For the eighth consecutive season, the Big South has a team that has opened League play with a 3-0 record, as Stony Brook has taken over sole possession of first-place in the Conference standings at 3-0 following its 16-10 win over Coastal Carolina this past Saturday. The Seawolves are 3-0 for the first time since beginning their Big South affiliation last year. SBU is one of three teams still undefeated in Big South play, as Gardner-Webb and Liberty are both 2-0. The Runnin' Bulldogs are 2-0 in League play for the first time since 2007 and are looking to improve to 3-0 for the first time since 2003. Liberty is 2-0 for the third consecutive season. There will be one fewer undefeated team after this weekend, as Gardner-Webb hosts Stony Brook Saturday afternoon.

BLAZING THE TRAIL

Liberty rallied to win 20-13 at Charleston Southern this past Saturday to extend its Big South win streak to 13 games (7 home wins, 6 road victories), the longest Conference win streak in League history and the fourth-longest active League winning streak among FCS programs. Below is a closer look at the Flames' hot streak.

BUCCANEERS PUT OUT SOME FIRES

Charleston Southern snapped Liberty's Big South-record streak of 12-consecutive Conference games with 30 points scored, as the Bucs held Liberty to 20 points this past Saturday -- the Flames' lowest point total in a Big South game since scoring 16 against Gardner-Webb in 2005. In addition, CSU limited the Flames to 165 yards on offense -- Liberty's lowest offensive output under head coach **DANNY ROCCO** and the lowest by the Flames in a Big South game since gaining just 143 against Coastal Carolina in 2004. Also, the Buccaneers held Liberty to 55 rushing yards on 30 attempts (1.8 yards per carry) -- the Flames' lowest rushing total ever in a Big South contest.

KEYDETS KICK LOSING STREAKS

VMI snapped four losing streaks this past weekend with its 31-20 win at Presbyterian College. The Keydets ended their five-game losing streak this season, plus their seven-game Conference losing streak, plus their overall 10-game road losing streak, and finally their nine-game Conference road losing streak.

HE'S NOT PLAYING LIKE A COLT

Stony Brook sophomore QB **MICHAEL COULTER** has thrown for 1,058 yards in his last four games (264.5 average), including two 300-yard games. He has thrown two TD passes in each of his last five outings, the first Big South player with this streak since Liberty's **BROCK SMITH** last season. Coulter, who leads the Big South with 12 scoring strikes this season, is looking to become the first Big South player to throw two touchdown passes in six consecutive games.

FULL MONTY

Gardner-Webb senior RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** entered last week with the second-most career receptions (62) in Big South history without a touchdown catch. All that changed this past Saturday against Southern Virginia, as Montgomery's first reception of the game was a 9-yard TD to give the Runnin' Bulldogs an early 7-0 lead. He added his second career touchdown reception on a 73-yarder in the third quarter. Montgomery now has 65 career catches, the second-most by a running back in Big South history. Former Gardner-Webb rusher **JERMAINE BOSTON** (2002-05) holds the mark with 68.

GIMME FIVE

VMI senior RB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** moved into fifth-place all-time in Big South history in career rushing yards this past weekend at Presbyterian College. He rushed for a season-high 165 yards to push his career total to 2,427 to move past Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS**, who gained 2,343 yards from 2003-06. Liberty's **ZACH TERRELL** (2005-08) is fourth in League history with 2,479 yards.

BUCKING THE TREND

Charleston Southern is third in the Big South in rushing offense with 163.7 yards per game, its highest average since the Big South began sponsoring football in 2002, and its highest since averaging 179.8 rushing yards in 2000. In the last four games alone, the Buccaneers have gained 885 yards on the ground, a 221.3 average in that span. CSU rushed for 185 yards against Liberty this past weekend, the most allowed by the Flames against a Conference foe other than VMI since Coastal Carolina rushed for 213 yards in 2007.

BUDDY LEE

Liberty's **KAJUAN LEE** has recorded an interception in four-straight games, tying a Big South record first set in 2005 by former Coastal Carolina safety and current Carolina Panther **QUINTON TEAL**. Lee leads the Big South with four picks this season, and his last three interceptions have resulted in eventual touchdowns for Liberty.

THE KEYS TO SUCCESS

The VMI Keydets held Presbyterian College to 36 rushing yards this past weekend, the fewest the Keydets have allowed in a Big South game since joining the Conference in 2003. It was their lowest amount allowed to an opponent since VMI held St. Francis (Pa.) to minus-2 rushing yards in the 2008 season opener. VMI leads the Big South in rushing defense at 124.1 yards per game, and is the only Big South team this season to not allow an opponent to rush for 200 yards in a game.

HE LOVES THE 70s

Gardner-Webb RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** became the first player in Big South history with a 70-yard rushing touchdown and 70-yard receiving touchdown in the same game when he accomplished the feat this past Saturday against Southern Virginia. Montgomery scored on a 73-yard pass play from **JOHN ROCK** in the third quarter, and then rushed 74 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter -- his third career rushing touchdown of 70-or-more yards.

OH THANK HEAVENS FOR BEVINS

Liberty's **MATT BEVINS** made a 50-yard field goal at Charleston Southern this past Saturday, the first Big South kicker to make a 50-yarder in four seasons. VMI's **BARRETT WAY** was the last when he kicked a 51-yarder against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 22, 2005. Bevins' distance is tied for the third-longest in League history, and he is just the fourth kicker in League history to make a 50-yard field goal, joining VMI's **MATT SHARPE** and Way, and Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH**.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook sophomore RB **EDWIN GOWINS'** four rushing TDs this season have gone for an average of 35.5 yards (39-27-44-32), and in his career, Gowins is averaging 35.6 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32). All but two of his 15 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. Gowins scored 12 of his 15 career scores during a nine-game stretch from Nov. 1, 2008 to Oct. 10 of this season.

GROUND GAINER

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 4 against North Greenville, ranks seventh all-time with 3,590 in his career. He needs six yards to pass Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (3,595 yards from 2005-08) for sixth-place, 25 yards to eclipse Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (3,614 from 2004-07) for fifth-place, and 193 to surpass Liberty's **DRE BARNES** (3,782 from 2002-04) for fourth all-time.

LOOKS LIKE IT WILL BE A PHOTO FINISH

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** quietly grabbed two Big South career records in Week 7 -- combined kickoff/punt returns and combined kickoff/punt return yardage. He entered Week 8 with a 13-yard lead over the previous yardage record-holder -- Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON**, who originally broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff/punt return yards in Week 2. Stevenson did not have a return this past Saturday against Liberty, but remains the Big South career leader in kickoff return yardage at 1,836. Below is a look a breakdown of each player's combined kick return totals.

WILD WILD WES

Stony Brook redshirt-freshman **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** is second in the Big South with a school-record 12 field goals on the season, breaking the SBU mark first set by **BOB BURDEN** in 1986, Stony Brook's second season of varsity football. Skiffington has made at least two field goals in a game four times this season, including a Big South-record tying four against Presbyterian College in Week 5.

MR. ALL-PURPOSE

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY** is the Big South's all-time leader in all-purpose yards with 5,439, breaking the Conference record in Week 4 at No. 1 Richmond. Maypray is fourth among active Division I FCS players in all-purpose yards, and is third in all-purpose yards per play with a career average of 10.04. Below is a breakdown of Maypray's yardage and respective rank in Big South history. He is the only player in League annals with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards.

HE IS THE ONLY ONE

Presbyterian College RB **TRANDON DENDY** is the only player in the Big South to lead his team in rushing in every game this season. He has racked up 85, 14, 44, 147, 59, 106 and 47 yards in PC's seven games for 502 rushing yards. He has also scored a touchdown in his last five games -- the second-longest streak in the Big South this year. Dendy is looking to become just the second player in the Conference's football history to lead his team in rushing in every game of the season. VMI's **SEAN MIZZER** led the Keydets in rushing in all 12 games of the 2003 season, VMI's first year in the Big South.

HE IS HUGHES

VMI senior QB **KYLE HUGHES** became the fourth quarterback in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he surpassed the milestone this past weekend at Presbyterian College. Hughes gained 108 yards on the ground against the Blue Hose for his third career 100-yard rushing game. His total stands at 1,050, and he needs 133 rushing yards to pass Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** (1,182 yards from 2002-05) for third-place on Big South's all-time QB rushing list. In Week 4 at No. 1 Richmond, Hughes had his second career game with both 100 rushing and 100 passing yards when he rushed for 133 yards and threw for 141 against the Spiders. He joined Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** as the only players in Big South history to accomplish this feat twice.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 56 games -- the longest run in the history of the program and the second-longest scoring streak in Big South history. Liberty's current streak stands at 48 games, while Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 37 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 18 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (13), Coastal Carolina (6) and Charleston Southern (4).

MR. 3,000

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** became the first player in school history with 3,000 career rushing yards when he surpassed the milestone against Presbyterian College in Week 5. Cuttino's school record total now stands at 3,282 (1,670 in the Big South), and he is one of just seven active players in FCS with 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **EDWIN GOWINS** surpassed 1,500 career yards against Brown in Week 3, and has 1,808 rushing yards in just 18 career games (100.4 yards per game).

GOING FOR TWO... HUNDRED

Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS** (138) and **CONTE CUTTINO** (62) combined for 200 rushing yards in a game for the first time this season when they finished with exactly 200 against Presbyterian College in Week 5. It was the sixth time the duo has combined for 200 rushing yards in a game, with Stony Brook going 5-1 in those games.

Liberty DT **TREY JACOBS** is tied with VMI's **ERIC HALL** (2003-06) for first in the Big South history with five career blocked kicks.

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES** set a Big South single-game record with 17 points kicking in the Runnin' Bulldogs' 65-0 win over Southern Virginia. Gates made three field goals and was 8-of-8 on his PAT attempts. The old kick scoring record was 16 points, which Gates shared with two other players. Gates has scored 140 points in less than two seasons, good for sixth-place in Big South history. He also is tied for fourth in League annals with 29 career field goals and tied for second with five career 10-point kicking games. In addition, Gates is second all-time in Big South history with nine career field goals of 40-yards or longer. The record is 13, held by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06).

CROWD PLEASERS

Liberty drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history in Week 2, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. After four home games, the Flames are averaging 15,046 fans per game, which is pacing ahead of its Big South single-season record of 14,190 established in 2007. Liberty has surpassed 10,000 fans 25 times since Oct. 4, 2003, a span of 39 home games.

PERRY III IS XIX

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** became the 19th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he eclipsed the milestone vs. Charleston Southern in Week 7. The redshirt-sophomore now has 1,118 yards on 91 receptions in just 18 career games, and is the sixth GWU player on the Big South's career 1,000-yard receiving list. Perry needs nine receptions to become the 15th player in League history (and sixth GWU player) with 100 career catches.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** became the 20th player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone this past weekend against Liberty. He is the fifth Buccaneer player on the list, and has 1,029 yards on 86 career receptions.

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb junior LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is the Big South's active leading career tackler with 279 career stops. He needs 21 hits to become just the seventh player in League history with 300 career tackles. Williams is averaging 9.96 tackles per game in his 28-game career. Teammate **MARIO BROWN** is 23 tackles away from 300.

RUSHING UPDATE

CAN'T SAY THEY HAVE

Gardner-Webb and Liberty are the lone teams to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South game, a span of 30 games each. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 28 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

30 ROCK

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is fourth all-time in Big South history with 36 career touchdowns and is approaching an elite group. Maypray, who became just the sixth player in Big South annals with 20 career rushing touchdowns in Week 7, needs to reach the end zone four more times to become the fourth member of the Big South's 40-touchdown club. Ahead of him are **JEROME SIMPSON** (44), **RASHAD JENNINGS** (46) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (47).

CALL HIM TOUCHDOWN TIM

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is the only player in Big South history, and the only active player in FCS, to score a rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown, kickoff return touchdown, punt return touchdown and pass for a touchdown. In addition, he is the only player in League history with at least 20 rushing touchdowns (21) and 10 receiving touchdowns (12). Meanwhile, Maypray became the seventh player in League history to reach the 200-point plateau when he eclipsed the milestone in Week 7 against Stony Brook. Maypray now has 216 career points -- which is fourth-most by a non-kicker.

RUSH WEEK

VMI ended its three-game drought of not having an individual rush for 100 yards in a game when **HOWARD ABEGESAH** rushed for 165 yards at Presbyterian College this past weekend. It was the first such occurrence for the Keydets since the 2007 season (Sept. 8 vs. William & Mary, Sept. 15 at James Madison and Sept. 22 at Lehigh). The Keydets are No. 3 in the nation in rushing offense (244.14), and are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead the Conference in rushing offense four consecutive seasons.

SWEET SIX-HUNDRED

Stony Brook gained 623 yards of offense in its Big South opener against Presbyterian College in Week 5, the third time in a seven-game span that the Seawolves amassed 600 offensive yards. SBU is the first Big South team with three games over 600, and its total against PC was the second-highest in a Conference game. Coastal Carolina owns the League game record with 638 against Gardner-Webb in 2006.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season.

POLLSTERS

Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll the week of Sept. 8, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern, Coastal, GWU, LU, SBU and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll.

BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.

* Charleston Southern meets VMI for the ninth time Saturday. The series is tied 4-4, but the Buccaneers have won the last three meetings.

* CSU's four wins in the series have all come during Big South play, and its win over VMI in 2004 was its first-ever Big South victory.

* Charleston Southern held Liberty to 55 rushing yards on Saturday, the second-fewest yards allowed this season by CSU.

* The Buccaneer offense had a 16-9 advantage in first downs and a 185-55 advantage on the ground, but turnovers led to 10 Liberty points.

* CSU has dropped its two Big South games by an average of 7.0 points.
