### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**KYLE HUGHES • QB • Senior**  
VMI • Williamsburg, Va.

In his second start of the season, Hughes accounted for all four of VMI's touchdowns and amassed 274 yards of offense (133 rushing, 141 passing) in the Keydets' 38-28 loss at No. 1 Richmond. He gave VMI an early 7-0 lead on a 44-yard touchdown pass to Tim Maypray, then brought the Keydets to within seven points late in the second quarter with a touchdown pass to Mario Scott. Hughes scored on a 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, then added a 66-yard TD rush and two-point conversion in the fourth stanza for VMI's final points of the day. Hughes led VMI to its most points vs. Richmond since 1995, and the most points allowed by the Spiders in their last 12 games.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**E.J. BROWN • LB • R-Junior**  
Coastal Carolina • Goose Creek, S.C.

Brown recorded a career-best five tackles in Coastal Carolina's 28-7 win over North Carolina A&T, including a pair of solo stops, a half-sack for minus-9 yards, and his first career interception. Brown's 29-yard interception return in the second quarter set up the Chanticleers' second score of the contest, one of two plays he made that ended A&T drives.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MIKE LARSSON • P • Sophomore**  
Liberty • Monroe, N.C.

Larsson averaged 41.4 yards on five punts and placed three inside the 20-yard line against No. 6 James Madison. He battled rainy conditions all night in posting his first career game with a 40.0 punting average. Larsson pinned JMU at its own 2, 13 and 5-yard lines during the night, and booted a career-long 50-yarder in the third quarter. He had a net average of 40.6 yards, and the Dukes managed just two returns for four yards.

### FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Tuiloma responded in his first career start with a career-high 12 tackles and an interception at No. 15 UMass. His interception and 27-yard return in the second quarter set up Stony Brook's second touchdown of the game that brought the Seawolves to within four points of the Minutemen.

**LET THE CONFERENCE SEASON BEGIN**

The Conference portion of the 2009 schedule begins this Saturday, Oct. 3, with two League games on the slate. Gardner-Webb opens at VMI, while Presbyterian plays its first official Big South game in its first-ever meeting with Stony Brook. Coastal Carolina begins Conference action next weekend, while Charleston Southern and preseason favorite Liberty open League play on Oct. 17. Below is a breakdown of how each team has fared in its Big South opener, as well as some additional notes:

Gardner-Webb is opening against VMI for just the second time, winning in Lexington in 2007 ... Presbyterian is 3-6 against Big South foes since 2007 ... Stony Brook has scored 20 points in its last four Big South games ... VMI is opening the Big South season at home for the fourth consecutive year ... Coastal Carolina will open Big South play at home for the third-straight year and is 2-2 when opening the League season at home ... Charleston Southern will open its League season on the road for the first time since 2005 ... Liberty has finished with a winning League record when winning its Conference opener.

**MR. ALL-PURPOSE**

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY**'s second touch against No. 1 Richmond resulted in a 44-yard touchdown pass play, and the yardage broke the Big South's career record for all-purpose yards. Maypray entered the game against the Spiders needing 43 yards for the record and he finished with 176, surpassing **SEAN MIZZER**'s record of 4,621 yards from 2003-06. Maypray now stands at 4,755 career all-purpose yards, and is second in FCS among active players in all-purpose yards per play with an average of 9.95. Below is a breakdown of Maypray's yardage and respective rank in Big South history. He is the only player in League annals with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

The Big South's football playing members went 6-1 in their home openers this season for the second consecutive year. The League has gone undefeated in home openers just once, recording a 5-0 record in 2007 prior to the arrival of Stony Brook and Presbyterian into the Conference.

**SHIP SHAPE**

Charleston Southern extended its home winning streak to six games following its 34-0 blanking of North Greenville on Saturday. In that span, the Buccaneers have outscored their visitors, 148-55, including two shutouts. The streak is tied for the third-longest home winning streak in Big South history, and a victory this Saturday at home vs. Savannah State would give the Bucs sole possession of third place. The League record is 12 consecutive home wins, accomplished by both Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern.

**HE IS HUGHES**

VMI senior QB **KYLE HUGHES** had his second career game with both 100 rushing and 100 passing yards when he rushed for 133 yards and threw for 141 this past Saturday at No. 1 Richmond. Hughes joins Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** as the only players in Big South history to accomplish this feat twice. Meanwhile, Hughes now has 793 rushing yards in his career, just 21 away from passing Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** (803) for fourth-place on the Big South's all-time quarterback rushing list. Hughes is 207 yards shy of becoming the fourth Big South QB with 1,000 career rushing yards.

**POINT OF ORDER**

VMI has scored a point in its last 52 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Liberty's current streak stands at 43 games, while Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 34 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 14 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (9) and Coastal Carolina (3).

**30 ROCK**

With 31 career touchdowns, VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is the fifth player in Big South history with 30 career touchdowns. He has scored a touchdown in his last seven games (7 R, 3 P), and needs one to tie Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** for fourth-place in League history. The Conference record is 47 career touchdowns, set by Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** from 2003-06. Maypray is the only player with at least 10 rushing (17) and 10 receiving (12) touchdowns. Meanwhile, Maypray needs 14 points to become the seventh player in League history with 200 career points scored.

**HEADING THEM OFF AT THE PASS**

Coastal Carolina, which led the Big South in pass defense efficiency from 2004-07, is atop the League in the category after the first month of the season. The Chanticleers have a pass efficiency rating of 102.00, which is currently the second-lowest in a single-season in the Big South. Coastal Carolina leads the League with eight interceptions, and has allowed just four TD passes this year.

**GROUND GAINER**

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON** became the eighth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards when he totaled an even 200 this past Saturday against North Greenville. It was Stevenson's third career game with 200 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most by an individual in League history. Stevenson now has 3,144 career all-purpose yards and needs 18 yards to pass Liberty's **WYNTON JACKSON** (2003-07) for seventh-place on the Big South's career list.

**HE'S THE REAL O'NEAL**

Coastal Carolina junior RB **ERIC O'NEAL** rushed for a career-high 130 yards against North Carolina A&T this past Saturday. It was his second career 100-yard rushing game, and the most yards rushing by a Chanticleer since current San Diego Charger **MIKE TOLBERT** rushed for 244 yards against VMI on Oct. 27, 2007. O'Neal needs 28 rushing yards to become the 25th Big South player with 1,000 in a career.

**KICK STARTER**

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff and punt return yards in Week 2 at Wofford. Already the League's career record holder for kickoff return yards with 1,729, Stevenson now has 1,837 combined yards returning kickoffs and punts (108 yards) in his career. The previous record for combined kickoff and punt return yards was 1,717, set by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** from 2005-08. Meanwhile, Stevenson has 86 combined returns (75 kickoffs, 11 punts), and is nine away from breaking **ADRIAN HALL**'s Big South record of 94.

**GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE**

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES** became the eighth kicker in Big South history with 100 career points when he reached the milestone in Week 2 at Western Carolina. Gates increased his career total to 102 with two PATs at North Carolina State in Week 3 and moved past Liberty's **NOAH GREENBAUM** (101 points) for seventh-place on the League's all-time kick scoring list. Gates, who tied the Big South single-game record for kick scoring with 16 points in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, is already sixth in League annals with 21 career field goals, and owns four career 10-point kicking games, tied for third-most in Big South history.

**CROWD PLEASERS**

Liberty drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history in Week 2, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. On Saturday vs. James Madison, the school's and League's third-largest crowd of 15,532 sat through a constant downpour to watch the Flames take on No. 6 James Madison. The 15,532 marked the 23rd time that Liberty has surpassed 10,000 fans since Oct. 4, 2003, a span of 37 home games.

**WHITEWASHING**

Charleston Southern's shutout of North Greenville this past Saturday was the Buccaneers' sixth since the Big South began football in 2002, tying the League record set by Liberty. The Flames have recorded their six shutouts since the 2006 season.

**A DAY AT THE BEACH**

Coastal Carolina rushed for 304 yards Saturday vs. North Carolina A&T, its first game over 300 rushing yards since gaining 302 against Towson last season. The Chanticleers have gained 300 yards on the ground 13 times in their history, tied with VMI for the most in Big South history, and are 13-0 in those games. Coastal Carolina has posted at least one 300-yard rushing game in every season since its inception in 2003.

**BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE**

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is three wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

**TREASURE CHEST**

Charleston Southern amassed 516 yards of offense in its win over North Greenville this past weekend, its first game over 500 total yards since gaining 537 against the Crusaders in 2007. In addition, the Buccaneers rushed for 267 yards this past Saturday, their most in a game since collecting 272 yards on the ground against Savannah State on Oct. 6, 2007 -- a span of 22 games. Charleston Southern also passed for 249 yards for its first game with 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards since the 2005 campaign. On Nov. 5, 2005, the Bucs rushed for 200 yards and threw for 247 in a 38-7 win at Gardner-Webb.

**FANNING THE FIRE**

Liberty extended its rushing touchdown streak to 33 games Saturday vs. James Madison when **TOMMY BEECHER** scored from 1-yard out. However, the Flames were limited to just that TD by the Dukes, the first time in 36 games that Liberty had been held to just one touchdown. The last time the Flames did not reach the end zone at least twice in a game was Sept. 16, 2006, when Liberty lost 10-3 at Towson.

**DOOLITTLE DOES A LOT**

Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, becoming just the seventh quarterback in Big South history to reach the milestone. He is now at 3,546.

**MR. 3,000**

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** needs 34 yards to become the first player in school history with 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **EDWIN GOWINS** surpassed 1,500 career yards against Brown in Week 3, and has 1,510 rushing yards in just 14 career games. Cuttino had 858 yards in his first 14 games at Stony Brook.

**BLAZING THE TRAIL**

Liberty carries its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak into the 2009 season. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. In that span, Liberty has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006, and five on the road.

**SUMMER WIND**

Liberty R-sophomore WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** tied the Big South single-game record with 14 receptions at Lafayette in Week 3. He totaled 138 receiving yards and scored his first career touchdown in the win over the Leopards. Summers tied Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**, who caught 14 passes against Wofford on Nov. 19, 2005. Summers' total was second-most in a game in Liberty history.

**SACK LUNCH**

Gardner-Webb has recorded 10 quarterback sacks in three games and is on pace for 36 this season, which would break the Big South single-season record of 31, set by Charleston Southern in 2002. GWU freshman **MATTHEW GOODS** is second in the Big South with 3.5 sacks -- just 0.5 behind League leader **PHILLIP OBOH**, and is looking to become the first Bulldog to lead the League in sacks since **BRIAN JOHNSTON** in 2006.

**BRAVO BREVI**

Stony Brook's **MATT BREVI** returned three kickoffs for 140 yards against Brown in Week 3, tied for the 13th-most in a single-game in League history, while his return average of 46.7 was eighth-highest in a contest. Brevi had returns of 51, 36 and 53, becoming the second Big South player with two 50-yard kickoff returns in one game. Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** was the first when he had kickoff returns of 83 yards and 78 yards vs. VMI on Nov. 10, 2007.

**ROADIES**

Gardner-Webb is 1-1 during its current four-game road stretch. The Runnin' Bulldogs are just the second Big South team in League history to play four consecutive road games in one season. Former member Elon was the first to do so in the Big South's first football season in 2002, going 0-4. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern opened the campaign with three-straight road games for the second consecutive year -- the first Big South team with this distinction. Liberty is the only other member to open a season with three-straight road games (2003).

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season.

**POLLSTERS**

Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll the week of Sept. 8, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern, Coastal, GWU, LU, SBU and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll.

**MEET THE CANDIDATE**

Gardner-Webb LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is one of 20 candidates on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award list, marking the third consecutive season and fourth overall a Big South student-athlete has been named an official candidate for the national Defensive Player of the Year award in FCS.

**BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009**

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

**THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010**

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.

\* RB **TRANDON DENBY** ran for a career-high 147 yards on 23 carries Saturday at The Citadel. His rushing output vs. the Bulldogs is the highest in the Big South this season. He finished with 165 all-purpose yards on the night.

\* Denby scored on a 40-yard touchdown run in the second quarter that came on 4th-and-2, and gave PC an eventual 14-13 lead.

\* **BRANDON MILEY** recorded a rushing touchdown in the first quarter, marking the sixth of his career.
