MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Sophomore
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

In his first start at quarterback, Brown completed 29-of-36 passes for 242 yards and a touchdown, and carried the ball 20 times for 88 yards and a score to lead Liberty past Lafayette, 19-13. He scored the game's first touchdown on a 1-yard run, then tossed a touchdown pass to put the Flames ahead, 14-0. Brown finished with 330 yards of total offensive, and his 80.6 completion percentage is the sixth-highest single-game percentage on Big South history based on a minimum of 15 completions.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ARIN WEST • DB • Junior
Stony Brook • Toms River, N.J.

West matched his career-high with 11 tackles against Brown while picking up his first career interception in helping Stony Brook defeat the Bears. He had nine solo stops, and his interception in the end zone halted a 62-yard Brown drive that threatened to give the Bears a 14-point lead in the second quarter.

Brevi set a LaValle Stadium record with 140 return yards on three kickoffs for an average of 46.7. He had returns of 51, 36 and 53, becoming the second player in Big South history with two 50-yard kickoff returns in one game. After Brown took a 7-0 lead, Brevi's 51-yard return on the ensuing kickoff set up Stony Brook for a game-tying score. He finished with 221 all-purpose yards on the night as he led SBU with five catches and 76 yards, including three receptions on the game-winning drive in the fourth quarter, two of which resulted in first downs.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

MATTHEW GOODS • DT

Goods came off the bench at North Carolina State and was in on a pair of sacks of Wolfpack quarterback Russell Wilson. He dropped Wilson for a five-yard loss in the second quarter, and assisted on a sack for minus-4 yards in the third period. Goods finished with three tackles on the night, including an assisted tackle for no gain. Goods has 12 total tackles this season and leads the Big South with 6.0 tackles-for-loss, including a League-best 3.5 sacks.

TOP 25 MATCH-UP ON TAP SATURDAY

The No. 24-ranked Liberty Flames host No. 6 James Madison on Saturday in what is just the Big South's fourth-ever meeting between a ranked Big South squad and ranked non-Conference foe. The Big South is 2-1 in such match-ups, which are listed below.

LIBERTY NOW RANKED IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

The Liberty Flames are ranked No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Poll, and have cracked *The Sports Network* Top 25 for the first time this season at No. 25 this week. The Flames have been a nationally-ranked program in 16 of the last 17 weeks, dating back to Sept. 8, 2008. It also marks the sixth-straight season that the Big South has had a nationally-ranked program.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Big South's football playing members are 5-1 in their home openers this season, with Charleston Southern finally playing on its home turf this coming weekend. The Buccaneers are 10-8 all-time in home openers, including three consecutive victories. CSU carries a five-game home win streak into Saturday's affair with North Greenville -- the longest active streak in the Big South and tied for the fourth-longest home winning streak in Big South history. Meanwhile, Liberty's current home winning streak is four games, and VMI has won two-straight at home.

FLAMES TO PUT FOUR-GAME WIN STREAK ON LINE VS. DUKES

James Madison will be the highest-ranked opponent Liberty has faced since 2002, when the Flames hosted No. 4 Appalachian State at Williams Stadium on Sept. 21, 2002. The Flames carry a four-game home win streak into Saturday's game with the Dukes, and in that span, Liberty has outscored its opponents 133-23, allowing no more than 10 points in two of those contests. Liberty is 17-3 (.850) at home under head coach **DANNY ROCCO**.

SUMMER WIND

Liberty R-sophomore WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** tied the Big South single-game record with 14 receptions Saturday at Lafayette. He totaled 138 receiving yards and scored his first career touchdown in the win over the Leopards. Summers tied Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER**, who caught 14 passes against Wofford on Nov. 19, 2005. Summers' total was second-most in a game in Liberty history.

NORM!!

Coastal Carolina sophomore DB **JOSH NORMAN** intercepted two passes at Towson on Saturday, the first Chanticleer with two picks in a game since his brother **MARRIO** had three against Presbyterian on Oct. 20, 2007. Josh is now the sixth different Chanticleer with two interceptions in a game in school history.

SACK LUNCH

Gardner-Webb has recorded 10 quarterback sacks in three games and is on pace for 36 this season, which would break the Big South single-season record of 31, set by Charleston Southern in 2002. GWU freshman **MATTHEW GOODS** leads the Big South with 3.5 sacks, and is looking to become the first Bulldog to lead the League in sacks since **BRIAN JOHNSTON** in 2006.

ECLIPSE

For the first time in 20 weeks, the Big South did not have a 100-yard rusher on Saturday. The last time the Conference membership failed to produce a 100-yard rushing day was Oct. 13, 2007 -- when the League officially had five teams. The 20 consecutive weeks with a 100-yard rusher is a Big South record.

BIG BROWN

Liberty QB/WR **MIKE BROWN** amassed 330 total yards of offense on Saturday at Lafayette, just the third Liberty player with more than 300 offensive yards since the Big South began football in 2002. **BROCK FARREL** (2005) and **BROCK SMITH** (2005, 2008) were the others. Brown's 330 yards of offense were the most by a Liberty player since **BROCK SMITH** had 334 vs. Lafayette last season on Oct. 18.

ANOTHER MEETING WITH NUMBER 1

VMI travels to defending FCS champion and current No. 1 Richmond on Saturday. The last time the Keydets played the No. 1 team in the nation was Sept. 29, 2001 vs. Georgia Southern in Lexington (VMI lost, 31-14). Saturday's game will mark the second Big South vs. a No. 1-ranked Division I football program this season. Charleston Southern opened the season at FBS No. 1 and defending BCS champion Florida. The Big South is the only Conference in the country playing the reigning national champions in both NCAA Division I Football Subdivisions.

MR. 3,000

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** needs 54 yards to become the first player in school history with 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **EDWIN GOWINS** surpassed 1,500 career yards this past weekend against Brown, and has 1,510 rushing yards in just 14 career games. Cuttino had 858 yards in his first 14 games at Stony Brook.

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is four wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

DOOLITTLE DOES A LOT

Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, becoming just the seventh quarterback in Big South history to reach the milestone. He is now at 3,546.

POLLSTERS

Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll the week of Sept. 8, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern, Coastal, GWU, LU, SBU and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll.

CROWD PLEASERS

Liberty drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history in Week 2, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. The crowd bested the previous attendance record of 15,631 for Liberty-William & Mary on Oct. 14, 2006. The 16,112 fans was the eighth-highest attendance total in FCS that weekend, and marked the 22nd time that Liberty has surpassed 10,000 fans since Oct. 4, 2003, a span of 36 home games.

BLAZING THE TRAIL

Liberty carries its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak into the 2009 season. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. In that span, Liberty has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006, and five on the road.

MEET THE CANDIDATE

Gardner-Webb LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is one of 20 candidates on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award list, marking the third consecutive season and fourth overall a Big South student-athlete has been named an official candidate for the national Defensive Player of the Year award in FCS.

BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season.

* Charleston Southern meets North Greenville for the 10th time Saturday. The Buccaneers lead the series, 8-1, and have won the last five meetings.

* The Buccaneers have averaged 36.6 points in their last five wins over the Crusaders.

* With 188 yards of total offense at South Florida, the Bucs failed to hit the 200-yard mark for the first time since tallying 191 yards against Liberty last season on Oct. 25. That game also was the last time Charleston Southern was shutout prior to its blanking at USF.

* Charleston Southern has passed for at least 120 yards in every game this season and 13 of the last 15 games, dating back to last season.
