CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

STAN DOOLITTLE • QB • Senior
Gardner-Webb • Ninety Six, S.C.

Doolittle led Gardner-Webb to a 27-20 road win at Western Carolina on Saturday. He helped GWU build a 20-0 lead, then directed the game-winning rally in the final minutes. Doolittle finished with 295 of Gardner-Webb's 349 yards of total offense, went 23-of-40 passing for 265 yards and one touchdown, and added 30 yards on the ground. He managed a 12-play, 79-yard game-winning touchdown drive in 4 minutes and 16 seconds, where he completed 4-of-6 passes for 56 yards and three first downs, before capping the drive with his one-yard sneak with 2:02 remaining for the final margin.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MARTY PATTERSON • LB • Junior
Gardner-Webb • Mt. Airy, Ga.

Patterson recorded seven tackles from his linebacker position, including six solo stops, in the Runnin' Bulldogs road win at Western Carolina. He added 2.0 tackles-for-loss (minus-6 yards), including a four-yard sack. He helped limit Western Carolina to 43 rushing yards on 25 attempts, 3-of-14 on third downs, and two fourth down stops.

LIBERTY RETURNS TOP 25

The Liberty Flames returned to the national Top 25 last week, as the Flames were ranked No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Poll following its 33-20 loss at FBS-member West Virginia. This week, the coaches have Liberty again at No. 24 in its ranking. The Flames have been a nationally-ranked program in 15 of the last 16 weeks, dating back to Sept. 8, 2008. This marks the sixth-straight season the Big South has had a nationally-ranked program.

POLLSTERS

Last week, Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team has received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll. VMI received Top 25 votes for the first since *The Sports Network's* 2004 preseason Top 25 ranking.

GARDNER-WEBB STANDS 2-0 FOR FIRST TIME IN FOUR SEASONS

For the first time since 2006, the Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs are 2-0. It is the third time that **STEVE PATTON's** squad has opened the season 2-0 since the start of Big South football in 2002, with the other times being 2005 and 2006. Gardner-Webb is looking to achieve its first 3-0 start since 1999. Charleston Southern (2006) and Liberty (2008) are the lone members to open a season 3-0 in Big South history.

CROWD PLEASERS

Liberty drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history this past Saturday, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. The crowd bested the previous attendance record of 15,631 for Liberty-William & Mary on Oct. 14, 2006. The 16,112 fans was the eighth-highest attendance total this past weekend in FCS, and marked the 22nd time that Liberty has surpassed 10,000 fans since Oct. 4, 2003, a span of 36 home games.

VMI RETURNS TO ACTION THIS WEEK

VMI was idle last week following its Week 1 win over Robert Morris. The Keydets are 1-0 for the fifth-straight season, tying the Big South record for most consecutive season-opening wins that was established last season by the Liberty Flames. VMI visits No. 6 James Madison Saturday with the chance to start 2-0 for the first time since 2002. The last time the Keydets defeated the Dukes was in 1990.

LIBERTY EXTENDS HOME WINNING STREAK TO FOUR GAMES

Liberty won its fourth consecutive home game with its 35-10 win over North Carolina Central this past Saturday. In that span, the Flames have outscored their opponents 133-23, and have allowed no more than 10 points in two of those contests. Liberty is now 17-3 (.850) at home under head coach **DANNY ROCCO**.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Big South's football playing members are 4-1 in their home openers this season, with Stony Brook and Charleston Southern still waiting to debut on their home turf. The Seawolves will have that opportunity Saturday when Brown visits LaValle Stadium -- the first of just four home games for Stony Brook this season. SBU has won two-straight home openers and is 17-8 overall in its first home game of the year. Charleston Southern opens its home slate next week.

ROADIES

Gardner-Webb is 1-0 during its current four-game road stretch. The Runnin' Bulldogs are just the second Big South team in League history to play four consecutive road games in one season. Former member Elon was the first to do so in the Big South's first football season in 2002, going 0-4. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern is opening the campaign with three-straight road games for the second consecutive year -- the first Big South team with this distinction. Liberty is the only other member to open a season with three-straight road games (2003).

STATISTICAL CORRECTION GIVES ABEGESAH RUSHING MILESTONE

A statistical correction from VMI's season opener against Robert Morris was made late last week to properly credit two rushing plays involving **TIM MAYPRAY** and **HOWARD ABEGESAH**. The spot of a rush by Maypray was incorrectly inputed in the statistics as a six-yard gain, leading the next play to become a no gain for Abegesah. It was in fact the opposite. Therefore, Abegesah finished with 106 rushing yards vs. Robert Morris, pushing his career total to 2,002. Maypray ended with 73 rushing yards instead of 79, and his career total dips to 2,010.

EN FUENGO

Liberty has scored at least 20 points in 11 consecutive games and in 20 of its last 21 contests. In fact, the Flames have scored 20 points in 31 of 36 games since **DANNY ROCCO** became head coach in 2006.

BALANCING ACT

Coastal Carolina rushed for 207 yards and passed for 203 in defeating Monmouth this past Saturday, 24-17. It was the first time since Nov. 11, 2006 that the Chanticleers surpassed 200 yards in both categories. That day, Coastal Carolina rushed for 332 yards and passed for 306 in a 52-24 win at Gardner-Webb. Not to be outdone, the Chanticleer defense held Monmouth below 100 yards rushing and passing, the sixth time in school history CCU held its opponent under the century mark in both rushing and passing in the same game.

COASTAL PROPERTY

Coastal Carolina held Monmouth to 40 offensive plays and 174 total yards this past Saturday, tying the Big South single-game record for fewest plays allowed. It is the fewest allowed to an FCS opponent in League annals. Liberty initially set the mark on Aug. 31, 2006, when the Flames limited St. Paul's to 40 plays and 57 total yards.

STAN THE MAN

For the second time in his career, Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** has passed for more than 200 yards in back-to-back games. He threw for 247 yards in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, and added 265 in Saturday's win at Western Carolina. It is the second-straight year that a Big South quarterback has thrown for more than 500 yards in the first two games of a season, as Presbyterian College QB **TIM WEBB** had 631 passing yards after two games in 2008. Doolittle is looking to become the first Big South QB with more than 200 passing yards in the season's first three games since Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006. The last Gardner-Webb quarterback to accomplish this feat was **NICK ROBERTS** in 2005.

KICK STARTER

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff and punt return yards this past Saturday at Wofford. Already the League's career record holder for kickoff return yards with 1,691, Stevenson now has 1,799 combined yards returning kickoffs and punts (108 yards) in his career. The previous record for combined kickoff and punt return yards was 1,717, set by Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** from 2005-08. Meanwhile, Stevenson has 84 combined returns (73 kickoffs, 11 punts), and is 11 away from breaking **ADRIAN HALL's** Big South record of 94.

GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES** became the eighth kicker in Big South history with 100 career points when he reached the milestone this past Saturday at Western Carolina. Gates needs two points to pass Liberty's **NOAH GREENBAUM** (101 points) for seventh-place on the League's all-time kick scoring list. Gates, who tied the Big South single-game record for kick scoring with 16 points in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, is already sixth in League annals with 21 career field goals, and owns four career 10-point kicking games, tied for third-most in Big South history.

ALL-PURPOSE MEN

VMI senior QB **TIM MAYPRAY** -- the only player in Big South football history with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards in a career, needs 212 yards to break the Big South's career record for all-purpose yards. Maypray's 4,410 career yards rank second all-time in League history to **SEAN MIZZER** (VMI, 2003-06), who owns the record of 4,621. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON** is 131 yards shy of becoming the eighth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 50 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Liberty's current streak stands at 41 games, while Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 32 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 13 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (7) and Charleston Southern (6).

GO-GO GOWINS

Stony Brook sophomore **EDWIN GOWINS** rushed for 108 yards Saturday at Colgate and now has 255 rushing yards and three touchdowns in two career games against the Raiders. It was Gowins' sixth career 100-yard rushing game in just his 13th collegiate appearance.

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb junior linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** has 249 career tackles in 24 career games (10.4 per game), and needs 51 tackles to become just the seventh player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. Teammate **MARIO BROWN** has 240 career stops and is 60 hits away from 300.

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is four wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

DOOLITTLE DOES A LOT

Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, becoming just the seventh quarterback in Big South history to reach the milestone. He is now at 3,434, and he also is tied for eighth with VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** with 20 career touchdown passes. Doolittle is seventh in League history with 330 career completions.

MORE ON MAYPRAY

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is sixth all-time in Big South history with 29 career touchdowns, and needs one score to become the fifth player with 30. The Conference record is 47 career touchdowns, set by Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** from 2003-06. Maypray is the only player with at least 10 rushing and 10 receiving touchdowns. Meanwhile, Maypray needs 26 points to become the seventh player in League history with 200 career points scored.

BLAZING THE TRAIL

Liberty carries its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak into the 2009 season. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. In that span, Liberty has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006, and five on the road.

HOME COOKIN'

Charleston Southern's five-game home winning streak is the longest active streak in the Big South and tied for the fourth-longest in Big South history. The Buccaneers' first home game of the season is not until Sept. 26 vs. North Greenville. Liberty's current home winning streak is four games, while VMI has won two-straight at home.

BIG BROWN

Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** amassed 271 all-purpose yards at West Virginia in Week 1, the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. He totaled 157 receiving yards, 107 kickoff return yards and seven rushing yards. Brown is the second player in League annals with 100 receiving yards and 100 kickoff return yards in the same game. VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** was the first in 2007 during his Big South-record 346 all-purpose yard performance against Charleston Southern (209 receiving, 102 kickoff returns, 36 rushing and -1 punt returns).

MEET THE CANDIDATE

Gardner-Webb LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is one of 20 candidates on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award list, marking the third consecutive season and fourth overall a Big South student-athlete has been named an official candidate for the national Defensive Player of the Year award in FCS.

BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season. The Big South has come close to knocking off one of the big boys in recent seasons -- Gardner-Webb lost to Georgia Tech by three points last year (10-7), while Liberty was edged by Toledo by one point in 2007 (35-34).
