CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MIKE BROWN • WR/QB • R-Sophomore
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown caught 11 passes for 157 yards and a touchdown, and later added a rushing touchdown in Liberty's season-opening loss at FBS member West Virginia. His 20-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter tied the ballgame at 10-10, while his nine-yard scamper in the fourth quarter provided the game's final margin at 33-20. Brown's 157 receiving yards were the second-highest by a Big South player against an FBS opponent, while his 11 receptions marked the first time a Liberty receiver caught 10 passes in a game during head coach Danny Rocco's tenure. Brown added 107 kickoff return yards to finish the day with 271 all-purpose yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ERIC CHURCH • LB • R-Sophomore
VMI • Louisa, Va.

Church recorded a career-high 13 tackles in helping VMI to a 14-13 win over Robert Morris. Church had nine solo tackles as well as two tackles-for-loss for 11 yards, including a sack for a seven-yard loss. He had 10 tackles in the first half alone, and helped the Keydets hold the Colonials to 267 total yards -- the Keydets' lowest amount since holding Coastal Carolina to 252 yards last season on Oct. 11.

GARDNER-WEBB, VMI KICKOFF 2009 SEASON WITH HOME WINS

VMI won its fifth consecutive season opener this past Saturday, a 14-13 win over Robert Morris. It was the Keydets' second consecutive win, dating back to last season, as well as their second-straight home victory. Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb also won its season opener, a resounding 58-14 win over Mars Hill.

MORE ON THE 1-0 TEAMS

As mentioned above, VMI is 1-0 for the fifth-straight season, and is looking to start 2-0 for the first time since 2002. VMI's streak of five consecutive season-opening wins ties the Big South record, which was established last season by the Liberty Flames. The Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs are 1-0 for the first time since 2006, which also was the last time GWU opened the season 2-0. The Bulldogs also opened 2-0 in 2005.

HOME SWEET HOME

Coastal Carolina, Liberty and Presbyterian will make their home debut this Saturday. Below is a look at the three teams' last home opening win and current home opening streaks.

ROADIES

Gardner-Webb will play its next four games on the road, becoming the second Big South team in League history to play four consecutive road games in one season. Former member Elon was the first to do so in the Big South's first football season in 2002. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern is opening the campaign with three-straight road games for the second consecutive year -- the first Big South team with this distinction. Liberty is the only other member to open a season with three-straight road games (2003).

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season. The Big South has come close to knocking off one of the big boys in recent seasons -- Gardner-Webb lost to Georgia Tech by three points last year (10-7), while Liberty was edged by Toledo by one point in 2007 (35-34).

SILVER LINING

Coastal Carolina allowed the second-fewest points by a Big South team in an FBS match-up last week at Kent State (18 points). Liberty has now scored at least 20 points in consecutive FBS affairs (20 at West Virginia, 34 at Toledo). Charleston Southern became the first Big South squad to play the No. 1 ranked FBS team (Florida) this past Saturday.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Liberty WR **MIKE BROWN** hauled in 11 catches for 157 yards and a touchdown at West Virginia on Saturday -- the most receptions by a Big South player against an FBS opponent and the second-highest yardage. Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** owns that record with 168 receiving yards against Akron on Oct. 12, 2002.

MILESTONE MEN

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** became the seventh player in Big South football history with 2,000 career rushing yards this past Saturday with his 79 rushing yards against Robert Morris. Maypray is seventh in League history with 2,016 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **HOWARD ABEGESAH** narrowly missed joining Maypray in the 2,000-yard club on Saturday, as he finished the day just four yards shy of the magic number. Below is a look at the Big South's 2,000-yard rushing club. The updated Top 10 appears on page nine of this report.

MORE ON MAYPRAY

VMI senior quarterback **TIM MAYPRAY** -- the only player in Big South football history with 1,000 rushing and receiving yards in a career, needs 205 yards to break the Big South's career record for all-purpose yards. Maypray's 4,416 career yards rank second all-time in League history to **SEAN MIZZER** (VMI, 2003-06), who owns the record of 4,621.

MEET THE CANDIDATE

Gardner-Webb LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is one of 20 candidates on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award list, marking the third consecutive season and fourth overall a Big South student-athlete has been named an official candidate for the national Defensive Player of the Year award in FCS.

HONEST ABE

VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** rushed for exactly 100 yards in the season opener against Robert Morris, his 10th career 100-yard rushing game. He is just the fourth player in Big South history with at least 10 games over the century mark. Former VMI rusher **SEAN MIZZER** is fourth all-time with 15, while the League record is 22, held by Liberty's **RASHAD JENNINGS**.

GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES** tied a Big South single-game record for kick scoring with 16 points in the season opener vs. Mars Hill. He was perfect on all 10 placekicks -- 3 FG and 7 PATs, in matching Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE**'s single-game record. Hoke scored 16 points the same exact way against North Greenville on Sept. 25, 2004. It was Gates' fourth career 10-point kicking game, tied for third-most in Big South history. Meanwhile, Gates now has 91 points in his career and is just nine points away from becoming the eighth kicker in League annals with 100 career points.

BIG BROWN

Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** amassed 271 all-purpose yards at West Virginia this past Saturday, the fifth-highest single-game total in Big South history. He totaled 157 receiving yards, 107 kickoff return yards and seven rushing yards. Brown is the second player in League annals with 100 receiving yards and 100 kickoff return yards in the same game. VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** was the first in 2007 during his Big South-record 346 all-purpose yard performance against Charleston Southern (209 receiving, 102 kickoff return, 36 rushing and -1 punt returns).

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb junior linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** has 245 career tackles in 23 career games (10.7 per game), and needs 55 tackles to become just the seventh player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. Teammate **MARIO BROWN** has 234 career stops and is 66 hits away from 300.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 50 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Liberty's current streak stands at 40 games, while Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 31 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 12 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (6) and Charleston Southern (5). After setting the Big South scoring record at 67 consecutive games, Coastal Carolina has been held scoreless in its last two outings.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** is closing in on becoming the Big South's all-time leader in combined kick returns. Already the League's career record holder in kickoff returns (68) and kickoff return yards (1,576), Stevenson has 1,684 combined kick return yards -- just 34 yards away from breaking Liberty's **ADRIAN HALL**'s Big South record of 1,717. Hall also owns the record for combined kick returns at 94.

ELEVEN IS HEAVEN

Liberty carries its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak into the 2009 season. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. Liberty has won five of those 11 games on the road. Liberty also has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006.

WIN STREAKS

In addition to Liberty's 11-game Conference win streak, Charleston Southern has a five-game home winning streak intact, the longest active streak in the Big South. It is tied for the fourth-longest in Big South history. The Buccaneers first home game of the season is not until Sept. 26 vs. North Greenville.

A RARE SWEEP

The Big South is the only Conference in the country that will play the reigning national champions in both NCAA Division I Football Subdivisions. On the Big South's football schedule this season are the 2008 FBS national champion Florida Gators (vs. Charleston Southern) and 2008 FCS national champion Richmond Spiders (vs. VMI).

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is five wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

DOOLITTLE DOES A LOT

Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener vs. Mars Hill, becoming just the seventh quarterback in Big South history to reach the milestone. He is at 3,169, and he also ranks ninth with 19 career touchdown passes and seventh with 307 career completions.

MORE ON MAYPRAY

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is sixth all-time in Big South history with 29 career touchdowns, and needs one score to become the fifth player with 30. The Conference record is 47 career touchdowns, set by Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** from 2003-06. Maypray is the only player with at least 10 rushing and 10 receiving touchdowns. Meanwhile, Maypray needs 26 points to become the seventh player in League history with 200 career points scored.

ANYONE FEEL A DRAFT?

For the third consecutive year, the Big South Conference had a player selected in the NFL Draft, as former Liberty running back **RASHAD JENNINGS** was drafted in the seventh round by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2009. BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

PRESEASON PLAUDITS

Six of the seven Big South football teams received votes in *The Sports Network* Preseason Top 25 poll, a Conference record for most teams receiving Top 25 votes in the same poll at any time during the season. With a record 160 ballots cast, Liberty (330), Coastal Carolina (52), Charleston Southern (12), Stony Brook (10), Presbyterian (2) and Gardner-Webb (1) each received at least one Top 25 vote, and Liberty finished just outside the Top 25 at No. 27. In the FCS Coaches Preseason Poll, Liberty was No. 26.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.
