Doolittle led the Bulldogs to a come-from-behind win at VMI with a season-best 301 passing yards on 32 completions. He also compiled a career-high 341 yards of total offense, helping Gardner-Webb control the clock (32:32 and 26 first downs) and post its second comeback win of the season. In the second half against the Keydets, Doolittle completed 16-of-25 passes (=64.0 percent) for 187 yards, and was 6-of-8 for 54 yards on the Bulldogs' first scoring drive of the fourth quarter, which included five-straight completions. He also had a key 12-yard scramble for a first down on the drive and went a combined 7-of-10 passing on GWU's two scoring drives in the final stanza.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DARREN ROGERS • FS • Senior
Gardner-Webb • Ambridge, Pa.

Rogers, a senior making just his second career start, played a major role in Gardner-Webb's ability to slow down VMI's offensive attack. He took part in two key red zone stands in the fourth quarter and contributed six tackles, an interception, a pass break-up, a tackle-for-loss and a fumble recovery in the win. Rogers' interception at the GWU two-yard line thwarted a VMI scoring chance with just 4:01 to play and the 'Dogs clinging to a 27-23 lead. He also recovered a blocked punt by VMI with just one minute left to prevent a potential scoop-and-score by the Keydets. Rogers later batted away a pass on second-and goal with 38 seconds left.

Skiffington tied two Big South single-game records with four field goals made and 16 points kicking in Stony Brook's win over Presbyterian College. He hit from distances of 22, 22, 37 and 38 yards to set a school record for field goals in a game, and at one point scored nine-straight points that stretched SBU's lead from nine to 18 points. His 16 points set another school mark, besting the old record by two points.

TIM MAYPRAY • QB/PR • Senior
VMI • Madisonville, Ky.

Maypray broke through with an 86-yard punt return touchdown to give VMI a 10-point third quarter lead over Gardner-Webb. It was the first punt return touchdown in his career, was the longest punt return in a Big South game, and the third-longest overall in League history. He also averaged 25.6 yards on five kickoff returns and finished the day with 250 all-purpose yards.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

MATTHEW GOODS • DT
Gardner-Webb • East Orange, N.J.

Goods tied his career-best with six tackles off the bench, and recovered a VMI fumble in Keydet territory that led to the Bulldogs' game-winning score. He added a tackle for a four-yard loss, and made four tackles for three-yard gains or less -- including three on one series in the third quarter. Goods' fumble recovery came with Gardner-Webb trailing 23-20 and set up the game-winning touchdown drive of 24 yards.

AND WE ARE UNDERWAY...

The Conference portion of the 2009 schedule began this past weekend with Gardner-Webb and Stony Brook emerging victorious. Gardner-Webb is 1-0 in League play for the first time since 2007 and the fifth time overall. Stony Brook is 1-0 for the first time since beginning its Big South affiliation last year. Coastal Carolina begins Conference action this Saturday at home against VMI, while Charleston Southern and preseason favorite Liberty open League play on Oct. 17. Below is a breakdown of how the remaining three teams have fared in their Big South openers, as well as some additional notes:

Coastal Carolina will open Big South play at home for the third-straight year and is 2-2 when opening the League season at home ... Charleston Southern will open its League season on the road for the first time since 2005 ... Liberty has finished with a winning League record when winning its Conference opener.

SWEET SIX-HUNDRED

Stony Brook gained 623 yards of offense in its Big South opener against Presbyterian, the third time in the last seven games that the Seawolves have amassed 600 offensive yards. SBU is the first Big South team with three games over 600, and its total against PC was the second-highest in a Conference game. Coastal Carolina owns the League game record with 638 against Gardner-Webb in 2006.

MR. ALL-PURPOSE

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY**'s second touch against No. 1 Richmond in Week 4 resulted in a 44-yard touchdown pass play, and the yardage broke the Big South's career record for all-purpose yards. He now stands at 5,005 career all-purpose yards after collecting 250 against Gardner-Webb this past Saturday -- his eighth career game over 200. Maypray is second in FCS among active players in all-purpose yards per play with a career average of 10.11. Below is a breakdown of Maypray's yardage and respective rank in Big South history. He is the only player in League annals with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards.

SHIP SHAPE

Charleston Southern extended its home winning streak to seven games following its 47-10 win over Savannah State on Saturday. In that span, the Buccaneers are averaging 27.9 points while holding their opponents to 9.3 (195-65), including two shutouts. The streak is the third-longest home winning streak in Big South history. The second-longest home win streak is 11, while the League record is 12 consecutive home wins, accomplished by both Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern.

HE IS HUGHES

VMI senior QB **KYLE HUGHES** moved into fourth-place on the Big South's all-time quarterback rushing list this past weekend with 814 in his career, and is 186 yards shy of becoming the fourth Big South QB with 1,000 career rushing yards. In Week 4 at No. 1 Richmond, Hughes had his second career game with both 100 rushing and 100 passing yards when he rushed for 133 yards and threw for 141. He joined Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** as the only players in Big South history to accomplish this feat twice.

MAKING THEIR POINTS

Stony Brook's 52 points against Presbyterian this past weekend was its most in a Conference game since scoring 52 against former Northeast Conference foe Wagner in 2001. Charleston Southern's 47 points on Saturday was its most since a 48-6 win over Edward Waters last season. Liberty's 45 points scored were its most since scoring 49 in its 2008 season opener against North Greenville.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 53 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Liberty's current streak stands at 44 games, while Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 35 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 15 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (10), Coastal Carolina (3) and Charleston Southern (2).

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is now fourth all-time in Big South history with 33 career touchdowns, surpassing Gardner-Webb's **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** (32). Maypray, who has scored a touchdown in his last eight games (8 R, 3 P, 1 PR = 12 total), is approaching an elite group. He needs to reach the end zone seven more times to become the fourth member of the Big South's 40-touchdown club. Ahead of him are **JEROME SIMPSON** (44), **RASHAD JENNINGS** (46) and **AUNDRES PERKINS** (47). Maypray is the only player with at least 10 rushing (18) and 10 receiving (12) touchdowns. Meanwhile, Maypray needs just two points to become the seventh player in League history with 200 career points scored.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook sophomore RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has three rushing touchdowns this season, and has scored 11 of his 14 career scores in his last seven outings. His three running TDs in 2009 have gone for an average of 36.7 yards (39-27-44), and in his career, Gowins is averaging 35.9 yards per rushing touchdown. All but two of his 14 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. Gowins's shortest TD run is 3 yards, accomplished twice last season.

GO WEST YOUNG MEN

Stony Brook travels to North Dakota this Saturday in what will be the second-farthest FCS opponent in the Big South's football history. Gardner-Webb established the record when the Bulldogs played at Big Sky Conference member Montana State in 2003. Charleston Southern traveled the furthest to play a football game when the Buccaneers played at Hawaii in 2007.

HEADING THEM OFF AT THE PASS

Coastal Carolina, which led the Big South in pass defense efficiency from 2004-07, is atop the League in the category after the first month of the season. The Chanticleers have a pass efficiency rating of 102.03, which is currently the second-lowest in a single-season in the Big South. Coastal Carolina is second in the League with eight interceptions, and has allowed just four TD passes this year.

GROUND GAINER

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards in Week 4 against North Greenville, ranks seventh all-time with 3,284 in his career. He needs 312 yards to pass Liberty's **DOMINIC BOLDEN** (2005-08) for sixth-place.

KICK STARTERS

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON**, who broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff and punt return yards in Week 2, has not returned a kick in his past two games and is in jeopardy of losing his record. His combined return yard record of 1,837 (1,729 KR, 108 PR) is just 30 ahead of VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**. Maypray has 1,592 career kickoff return yards and 215 career punt return yards for a combined total of 1,807. Maypray now has 89 combined returns (71 kickoffs, 18 punts) to move ahead of Stevenson (86), and is five punt/kickoff returns shy of tying the Big South record of 94.

GOLDEN GATES BRIDGE

Gardner-Webb sophomore K **RYAN GATES**, who became the eighth kicker in Big South history with 100 career points when he reached the milestone in Week 2 at Western Carolina, is seventh all-time with 111. He needs nine points to move into sixth-place. Meanwhile, Gates is already sixth in League annals with 23 career field goals, and owns four career 10-point kicking games, tied for third-most in Big South history.

WILD WILD WES

Stony Brook redshirt-freshman **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** tied two Big South single-game records Saturday vs. Presbyterian, as he made four field goals against the Blue Hose and finished with 16 points. He is just the second player with four field goals in a Conference game, while his 16 points are the most by a kicker in a League contest.

ALL THE WAY MAYPRAY

TIM MAYPRAY's 86-yard punt return for a touchdown against Gardner-Webb this past Saturday was the longest in a Conference game and the third-longest overall in League history. It was Maypray's first career punt return for a touchdown and third kick return for a score.

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is three wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

TREASURE CHEST

For the first time since the Big South began football in 2002, Charleston Southern has recorded back-to-back games with 500 yards of total offense. The Buccaneers amassed 516 in Week 4 vs. North Greenville, and 528 this past weekend against Savannah State. For the second consecutive week, Charleston Southern collected 200 yards both rushing and passing. Prior to the North Greenville game, the last time CSU achieved this feat was during the 2005 campaign.

MR. 3,000

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** became the first player in school history with 3,000 career rushing yards when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday against Presbyterian. Cuttino's school record total now stands at 3,028 (1,416 in the Big South), and he is one of just seven active players in FCS with 3,000 career rushing yards. Meanwhile, teammate **EDWIN GOWINS** surpassed 1,500 career yards against Brown in Week 3, and has 1,648 rushing yards in just 15 career games (109.9 yards per game).

BLAZING THE TRAIL

Liberty will begin League play next week with its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak in tow. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. In that span, Liberty has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006, and five on the road.

SACK LUNCH

Coastal Carolina senior **PHILLIP OBOH** has recorded two sacks in back-to-back games and leads the Big South with 4.0. Oboh is now tied for fourth on the Big South's all-time list with 14.0 in his career. Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** is the all-time leader with 20.5. Meanwhile, GWU freshman **MATTHEW GOODS** is second in the Big South with 3.5 sacks and is challenging to become the first Bulldog to lead the League in sacks since Johnston in 2006.

YOU CAN CALL IT A SUCCESSFUL ROAD TRIP

Gardner-Webb is 2-1 during its current four-game road stretch, with the lone loss against FBS-member N.C. State. The Runnin' Bulldogs conclude the odyssey this Saturday at FBS-member Buffalo. Gardner-Webb is just the second Big South team in League history to play four consecutive road games in one season. Former member Elon was the first to do so in the Big South's first football season in 2002, going 0-4.

HE IS THE ONLY ONE

Presbyterian College RB **TRANDON DENDY** is the only player in the Big South to lead his team in rushing in every game this season. Dendy has racked up 85, 14, 44, 147 and 59 yards in PC's five games for a Big South League-leading 349 rushing yards. Gardner-Webb's **PHILIP PEOPLES**, Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS**, and VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH** have each led their teams in rushing three times this season.

BEWARE OF THE DOGS

Gardner-Webb is first in the Big South in rushing defense at 99.2 yards allowed per game, which is pacing ahead of the Big South single-season record of 108.8. The Runnin' Bulldogs have not allowed a 100-yard rusher in six consecutive games, and are the first Big South team to hold VMI under 200 yards rushing since Oct. 28, 2006 when GWU limited the Keydets to 196. Gardner-Webb also kept VMI from posting a 100-yard rusher for the first time in seven meetings between the two squads.

GOING FOR TWO... HUNDRED

For the first time this season, Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS** (138) and **CONTE CUTTINO** (62) combined for 200 rushing yards in a game when they finished with exactly 200 in Saturday's win over Presbyterian College. It is the sixth time the duo has combined for 200 rushing yards in a game, with Stony Brook going 5-1 in those games.

A RACE FOR NO. 19

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** enters the week with 955 career receiving yards, just 45 away from becoming the 19th player in Big South history with 1,000. Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** also is approaching the milestone with 944 (56 shy), but the Buccaneers are idle this week. If Perry should eclipse the mark Saturday at Buffalo, he would be the sixth GWU player on the Big South's career 1,000-yard receiving list.

PORT AUTHORITY

Stony Brook WR **DONALD PORTER** became the first player in Big South football history with two 50-yard touchdown receptions in the same game when he accomplished the feat Saturday vs. Presbyterian College. Porter hauled in a 59-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter, then added a 60-yard TD catch and run in the fourth quarter.

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb junior linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** has 264 career tackles in 26 career games (10.15 per game), and needs 36 tackles to become just the seventh player in Big South history with 300 career tackles. Teammate **MARIO BROWN** has 257 career stops and is 43 hits away from 300.

HE'S THE REAL O'NEAL

Coastal Carolina junior RB **ERIC O'NEAL** rushed for a career-high 130 yards in Week 4 against North Carolina A&T. It was his second career 100-yard rushing game, and the most yards rushing by a Chancellor since current San Diego Charger **MIKE TOLBERT** rushed for 244 yards against VMI on Oct. 27, 2007. O'Neal needs 28 rushing yards to become the 25th Big South player with 1,000 in a career.

RUSHING TO JUDGEMENT

With 138 rushing yards vs. Presbyterian College, Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS** jumped from 14th to 12th on the League's all-time rushing list, passing **CHRIS FOSTER** and **TYLER THIGPEN** in the process. Gowins needs 122 yards to crack the Big South's top 10 leaders. VMI senior **HOWARD ABEGESAH** is 68 yards away from unseating Coastal Carolina's **PATRICK HALL** for sixth on the career list. A DAY AT THE BEACH

Coastal Carolina rushed for 304 yards in Week 4 vs. North Carolina A&T, its first game over 300 rushing yards since gaining 302 against Towson last season. The Chanticleers have gained 300 yards on the ground 13 times in their history, tied with VMI for the most in Big South history, and are 13-0 in those games. Coastal Carolina has posted at least one 300-yard rushing game in every season since its inception in 2003.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season.

POLLSTERS

Coastal Carolina, Gardner-Webb, Liberty, Stony Brook and VMI all received votes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 poll the week of Sept. 8, marking the first time in League history that every Big South football team received Top 25 consideration in one season. Charleston Southern, Coastal, GWU, LU, SBU and Presbyterian received votes in *The Sports Network's* preseason poll.

MEET THE CANDIDATE

Gardner-Webb LB **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** is one of 20 candidates on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award list, marking the third consecutive season and fourth overall a Big South student-athlete has been named an official candidate for the national Defensive Player of the Year award in FCS.

BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.
