EDWIN GOWINS • RB • Sophomore
Stony Brook • Bellport, N.Y.

Gowins rushed for a season-high 165 yards and matched his career-high with three touchdowns to help Stony Brook win a share of the Big South title with its 36-33 victory over No. 16 Liberty. On his second carry of the game, Gowins burst through the LU defense for a 52-yard touchdown run to put Stony Brook ahead, 7-0. After Liberty tied the game at 7-7, Gowins ran for a total of 43 yards on SBU's next drive and scored from 11 yards out to give the Seawolves a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter. After the Flames took their first lead of the game in the fourth quarter (26-21), Gowins answered again, this time bowling past the Flames from 42 yards away to regain the advantage for SBU. Gowins averaged 9.2 yards per carry and seven of his rushes resulted in first downs.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MATT BACH • DB • Senior
Charleston Southern • Jacksonville, Fla.

Bach had four tackles (three solo) and his first career interception in Charleston Southern's 30-23 win over Coastal Carolina. His pick came at an opportune time for the Buccaneers, as CSU was ahead seven points with 4:38 remaining, and just turned the ball over to the Chanticleers. On Coastal Carolina's first play from scrimmage, Bach intercepted Zach MacDowall's pass and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown that put CSU up 30-16.

BIG SOUTH CROWNS CO-CHAMPIONS

For the second time in the Big South's eight-year football history, co-champions have emerged following the Conference season, as preseason Big South favorite Liberty and preseason No. 2 Stony Brook tied for first-place in the League standings with 5-1 records. It is the Flames' third-straight Big South football title -- tying Coastal Carolina for the most championships won, as well as for most consecutive championships. The Seawolves capture their first Big South crown in just their second year as an associate football member, and have now defeated every Big South opponent on the gridiron.

NEXT YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010

The Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs starting next season, as part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

SEAWOLVES DOUSE THE FIRE

Stony Brook ended Liberty's Big South-record 16-game Conference win streak with its 36-33 victory over the Flames in the season finale. Liberty's streak began in 2006, included League records for longest home Conference win streak at 9 -- which remains intact, and longest road Conference win streak at 7, and saw the Flames score 50 points six times during the streak. Liberty outscored its opponents by a margin of 25.4 points (42.9 to 17.5) and averaged 5.4 touchdowns and more than 430 yards of offense. The Flames scored 50 points against every Big South team except Stony Brook during the streak, was the first team to score 50 points in three consecutive Big South games, as well as post four 50-point games during the Conference season.

PICK SIX

For the third time in Big South history, four teams won at least six games in the same season. Liberty led the 2009 campaign with eight wins, followed by six victories for Stony Brook, Charleston Southern and Gardner-Webb. The feat was first accomplished in 2003 (GWU, LU, VMI, CCU) and matched in 2006 (CCU, CSU, GWU, LU).

SEVEN UP

Liberty is now 16-3 in Big South games since **DANNY ROCCO** became head coach in 2006, with the three losses by a combined eight points (2.7 average). The Flames' last seven Big South losses (LU went 0-4 in 2005) have been by a combined 23 points total (3.3 per game average).

OH THANK HEAVENS FOR BEVINS

Liberty sophomore **MATT BEVINS** set the Big South single-season record for field goals made with 22 and points scored kicking with 107. He broke the field goal record in Week 11, besting the old mark of 17 by VMI's **MATT SHARPE** in 2003, and surpassed the kick scoring record of 101 points in the season finale at Stony Brook. Bevins is the third consecutive Liberty player to score more than 100 points in a campaign, joining **NOAH GREENBAUM** -- who originally set the kick scoring mark in 2007, and **RASHAD JENNINGS** -- who scored a Big South-record 114 points last season. Bevins ended the regular season ranked first in the FCS in field goals per game with 2.00.

HE DID THIS A LOT

Gardner-Webb senior QB **STAN DOOLITTLE** departs Gardner-Webb ranked third in Big South history with 506 career completions. He also became the seventh QB in League annals with 5,000 career passing yards during the season finale at Presbyterian College, and moved into sixth-place with 5,190. Doolittle, who threw a touchdown pass in each of his final five games (7 total), ends his career with 28 TD passes, good for a tie for sixth-place in the Conference's record books.

C-S-U LATER

Charleston Southern tied the Big South single-season record with three interception returns for touchdowns, a mark first established by Gardner-Webb in 2004 and matched by Liberty in 2007. However, the Buccaneers are the first team in League history to return an interception for a TD in three consecutive games, which they accomplished in their final three contests of the 2009 season.

LEADER OF THE PACK

VMI senior RB **HOWARD ABEGESAH** led the Big South with 964 rushing yards this season, becoming just the second player to lead the Big South in rushing twice, as he was the League's leading rusher in 2007 with 1,121 yards. Liberty's **DRE BARNES** was the Big South's leading rusher in 2002 and 2003. The Big South did not have a 1,000-yard rusher for just the second time in League history (2005). Abegesah ends his collegiate career as the Big South's fourth-leading rusher with 2,860 yards.

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY** concludes his collegiate career with a Big South-record 6,129 career all-purpose yards (3,396 against Big South members). He is currently fourth among active Division I FCS players in all-purpose yards, and is fifth in all-purpose yards per play with a career average of 10.06. Below is a breakdown of Maypray's yardage and respective rank in Big South history, as well as his career total against every Big South team. Maypray is the only player in League annals with 1,000 rushing, receiving and kickoff return yards.

ADVANTAGE: MAYPRAY

VMI senior **TIM MAYPRAY** departs as the Big South's career leader in kickoff returns (98) and kickoff return yards (2,181), as well as the League's record holder for combined kickoff/punt returns (127) and combined kickoff/punt return yardage (2,494). Charleston Southern junior **GERALD STEVENSON**, who originally broke the Big South career record for most combined kickoff/punt return yards in Week 2, trails Maypray in all four categories, but did not return a kick in his last five games of the season. Stevenson has one more year of eligibility in 2010. Below is a look a breakdown of each player's combined kick return totals.

30 ROCK

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** finishes his career fourth all-time in Big South history with 38 career touchdowns, just missing becoming the fourth member of the Big South's 40-touchdown club. Maypray is the only player in Big South history, and the only active player in FCS, to score a rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown, kickoff return touchdown, punt return touchdown and pass for a touchdown. In addition, he is the only player in League history with at least 20 rushing touchdowns (22) and 10 receiving touchdowns (13). He departs with 228 career points -- the fourth-most by a non-kicker in Big South history.

NORTHERN EXPOSURE

Stony Brook senior RB **CONTE CUTTINO** ends his career as the school's all-time leading rusher with 3,607 yards, sixth-highest among the 12 active FCS players with 3,000 career rushing yards. Cuttino just missed becoming the 10th player to rush for 2,000 yards in the Big South, as he finished with 1,995 -- still good for the 10th spot on the League's career rushing list.

HEIR APPARENT

Stony Brook sophomore **EDWIN GOWINS** will return as the Big South's active leading rusher in 2010 with exactly 2,200 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, and will enter his junior season 1,433 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Gowins, whose nine career 100-yard rushing games is tied for fifth-most in Big South history, has gained his 2,200 rushing yards in 21 career games to rank fourth among active FCS players with 104.76 rushing yards per game.

RUNNING IN THE HALL

Gardner-Webb junior running back **PATRICK HALL** led the Big South this season with 12 touchdowns, becoming just the second Gardner-Webb player to lead the League in trips to the end zone. In 2005, **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** was the Big South's TD leader with 13. Hall has scored a touchdown in 13 of his 31 career games, with eight being multi-TD performances -- including five this season. His 22 career rushing touchdowns are tied for fourth-most in League history.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook sophomore RB **EDWIN GOWINS'** nine rushing TDs this season went for an average of 30.9 yards (39-27-44-32-14-17-52-11-42), and in his career, Gowins is averaging 33.6 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42). All but five of his 20 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. Gowins rushed for 12 touchdowns in a nine-game stretch from Nov. 1, 2008 - Oct. 10, 2009, and ended the 2009 season with five TDs in his last two games.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

Eleven of the 21 League games played this season were decided by seven points-or-less (5.5 point average) -- setting a Conference record. The old record was seven such games in 2005 and 2008, with the average margin of victory being 4.0 points in 2005 and 3.7 in 2008.

NORM!

Coastal Carolina sophomore **JOSH NORMAN** finished the season with a Big South single-season record eight interceptions this year, which broke the previous record of six set by former Chanticleer **QUINTON TEAL** in 2004 and matched by Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** last season. Norman is tied for fourth all-time in Big South history with 10 career INTs, and is the seventh player in Big South history to intercept a pass in three consecutive games.

HOME RUN

Coastal Carolina concluded its home schedule with a perfect 5-0 record, its first undefeated home slate since 2005 and third overall (7-0 in 2004 and 5-0 in 2005). The Chanticleers are the first Big South team to post a perfect record at home three times since Big South football began in 2002. Meanwhile, Stony Brook went a perfect 4-0 at home this year, marking the first time in Big South history that two teams were undefeated at home in the same season.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 60 games -- the longest run in the history of the program and the second-longest scoring streak in Big South history. Liberty's current streak stands at 52 games, while Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 41 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 22 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (16), Coastal Carolina (10) and Charleston Southern (8).

WILD WILD WES

Stony Brook's **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** went 15-of-17 on field goal attempts this season, and his 88.2 success rate broke the League record of 84.6 percent (based on 10 field goals made), set by VMI's **BARRETT WAY** in 2005 (11-of-13). A Big South-record five placekickers made at least 10 field goals this season.

KICK IT

Big South placekickers went a combined 37-of-45 on field goals from 30-39 yards, an 82.2 percentage. Three teams -- Gardner-Webb, Liberty and Stony Brook -- were perfect from that distance this season (combined 24-of-24). Overall, Big South placekickers went 88-of-119 on field goal attempts this season for an all-time League-best 73.9 percentage, surpassing the previous top season percentage of 67.5 percent (2007). The 88 field goals are the most combined total among the Big South programs in one season. Last season, the seven Conference members combined for 70 field goals.

HIDE TIDE

Charleston Southern carries a League-best four-game Conference win streak into next season, and has scored 30 points in each of the four games -- a first in school history. The win streak is just one away from matching the school record of five-straight Big South wins.

PERRY III IS THE V WITH L

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is the fifth player in Big South history with 50 receptions in back-to-back seasons, and the first to accomplish this feat in his freshman and sophomore campaigns. He led the Big South with 61 receptions for 749 yards in 2009, becoming the first player to lead the Conference in both categories since Charleston Southern's **DEE BROWN** in 2007.

A GAME OF CATCH

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** both surpassed the 100 reception and 1,000 receiving yard milestones this season. Perry III reached 1,000 career receiving yards in Week 7 vs. Charleston Southern and 100 career catches in Week 10 at Coastal Carolina. Stevenson eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards in Week 8 against Liberty. Meanwhile, Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** quietly surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards in the season finale at Stony Brook. Below is a closer look at this talented receiving trio and their respective spots in Big South history:

BIG SOUTH STAT OF THE WEEK

The Big South's seven members combined to score 1,145 points in 21 League games, an average of 54.5 combined points per game.

The 54.5 combined average is higher than last season's average of 50.1 in 15 official Conference games involving six members (PC was not an official Conference opponent in 2008), and the fourth-highest season average in League history.

Meanwhile, 736 points were scored in the final 12 Big South games of the season, a combined average of 61.3 points in that span.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern junior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** remains fourth all-time in Big South history with 3,984 career all-purpose yards. He will enter the 2010 season needing 16 yards to become the fourth player in League history with 4,000 in a career, and 637 yards to move into second-place all-time. Stevenson is 2,145 yards away from **TIM MAYPRAY**'s Big South record of 6,129 career all-purpose yards. Meanwhile, Stevenson had career-highs of 364 rushing yards, 55 receptions and 724 receiving yards this season. He needs just 323 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and receiving yards. Stevenson is averaging 7.1 yards per rushing attempt in his career.

THE LAST ONE STANDING

Gardner-Webb is the only Big South member to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South game, a span of 34 games. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 31 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

CROWD PLEASERS

Liberty set the Big South single-season record for average attendance, as the Flames averaged 14,931 fans in six home games this season. The old record average was 14,190, set by Liberty in 2007. This season, the Flames drew the largest home crowd in program and Big South Conference history in Week 2, as 16,112 fans witnessed the Flames' 35-10 victory over North Carolina Central. In addition, the home finale crowd of 15,208 for the VMI game was the largest crowd for a Big South contest.

BIG BROWN

Gardner-Webb reshirt-senior LB **MARIO BROWN**, who became the seventh player in Big South history with 300 career tackles in Week 10 at Coastal Carolina, finishes his career fourth all-time in League annals with 313.

FULL MONTY

Gardner-Webb senior RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** departs as the Big South's career leader for most receptions by a running back with 75. He broke the record of 68, set by former Gardner-Webb rusher **JERMAINE BOSTON** (2002-05), in Week 9 vs. Stony Brook. Montgomery collected his four career touchdown receptions on his final 13 catches after scoring none on his first 62 receptions.

NOVEMBER SWEEPS

Charleston Southern has won its last seven games played in the month of November, going 3-0 this season and 4-0 in 2008. The Bucs are 13-3 (=81.3 percent) in the month of November since 2005. Coastal Carolina is 16-6 (=72.7) in its history during the final month of the season, while Liberty is 18-7 (=72.0) since 2002. Stony Brook is 3-2 in November since joining the Big South in 2008. Coastal Carolina is the only Big South member to win a game in November every season since 2003.

IT'S NOT OVER UNTIL... WELL, YOU KNOW

Charleston Southern and Stony Brook played the first overtime Conference game since the 2005 season in Week 11, and the Buccaneers prevailed, 30-27. Charleston Southern is now 3-0 in overtime games since 2002, winning in double-overtime against Coastal Carolina 2005 and The Citadel in 2006. The CSU-SBU game was just the fourth Big South contest to go past regulation.

HIGH OCTANE

Liberty scored a Big South-record 271 points during the Conference season, besting the previous mark of 191 points, which Liberty established in 2007 during a four-game Big South season. The 2009 Flames averaged 45.2 points in six League games, just below the Conference-game record scoring average of 47.8 set by the 2007 Flames. Liberty scored in 23 of 24 quarters against Big South opponents, including the last 17 in a row (LU failed to score in the third quarter at Charleston Southern). Meanwhile, Liberty has tied the Big South record for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 42, matching Coastal Carolina's streak from Sept. 24, 2005 - Nov. 15, 2008.

BOTH ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM

Liberty is the first Big South team to lead the Conference in scoring offense and scoring defense in the same season twice. The Flames paced the Big South members with 36.4 points on offense and 19.1 points allowed on defense -- their fourth consecutive League scoring defense title. Liberty first led the Big South in scoring offense and scoring defense in 2007.

BUCKING THE TREND

Charleston Southern rushed for an average of 163.5 yards per game, its highest since averaging 179.8 yards in 2000. The Buccaneers rushed for 239 yards in the season finale win over Coastal Carolina, their most rushing yards ever in a Big South game. In addition, **ANTWAN IVEY** rushed for a career-high 145 yards against the Chanticleers, snapping CSU's 27-game drought without a 100-yard rusher -- the last being **DeMARCUS MOON** (103) against Savannah State on Oct. 6, 2007. Ivey's 145 rushing yards were the most by a Buccaneer since **ANDRE COPELAND** rushed for 226 yards against West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 15, 2005.

FB-YES

The Big South played a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each played two FBS foes this season. The Big South is tentatively scheduled to play eight FBS foes again in 2010 -- Akron, Army, Ball State, Clemson, Hawai'i, Kentucky, South Florida and West Virginia.

IT'S ACADEMIC

The Big South placed four players on the 2009 *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District III team -- Liberty's **MATT BEVINS** and **CHRIS ROCCO**, Gardner-Webb's **MARIO BROWN** and Presbyterian College's **MATT FREEMAN**. It is the fourth time in eight seasons that the Conference has had at least four All-District honorees.

TOUGH GO OF IT

Presbyterian College played a full Division I FCS schedule in 2009, including a full Conference slate. PC's five non-Conference opponents finished with a combined record of 34-21 (=61.8 winning percentage) this season, including two nine-win teams in Elon and Old Dominion -- giving PC arguably the toughest non-Conference schedule among the Big South members this season.

BENNETT TURNS 50

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** recorded his 50th win as head coach of the Chanticleers in Week 11, as Coastal downed Presbyterian College, 41-37. He is the Big South's all-time leader in coaching victories since the Conference began football in 2002, just ahead of Gardner-Webb's **STEVEN PATTON** (49).

A FIRST TIME FOR ANYTHING

The Big South had its first team return an opening kickoff for a touchdown in Week 11, as it was done twice -- and within seconds of each other. With a 1:30pm start against Stony Brook, Charleston Southern's **DEON LEE** returned the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown 12 seconds into the game. With a 1:30pm start against Liberty, Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to give GWU an early 7-0 lead at 14:40. Montgomery's kickoff return is the longest in Conference history, and was the first time Liberty allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South game. It was the League's second 100-yard play in two weeks, as Charleston Southern's **ANTWAIN HARVEY** returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown at Presbyterian College in Week 10.

DON'T RUSH THROUGH THIS NOTE

The Big South had a record six 100-yard rushers in Week 11, as **EDWIN GOWINS** (177), **CONTE CUTTINO** (163), **TOMMY FRASER** (157), **LANCE BYRD** (148), **HOWARD ABEGESAH** (111) and **CAM JONES** (100) reached the century mark on the ground. The previous high was five players, which occurred on Sept. 29, 2007.

* The Flames ended the year with a school record for completion percentage (68.1), field goals (22) and fumbles lost (3). LU also tied a school record for the fewest interceptions thrown in a season (5).
