# CHOICE HOTELS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### Katie Tull • Junior G • Charleston Southern Cleburne, Texas

Tull knocked down six treys, dished out fives assists and finished with 18 points in a narrow 76-67 loss at No. 4 North Carolina on Nov. 29, UNC's only single digit win this season. Tull averaged 19.3 points, shot 42 percent from downtown and 44 percent from the floor in Charleston Southern's three games last week, leading the Bucs to a 2-1 record. She got her week started with 23 points on 53 percent from the floor, 5-of-12 from long range and added two from the line in CSU's win over Bluefield on Nov. 24. She also corralled six boards and dished out five assists in the win over the Rams. In the Bucs' win over South Carolina State on Nov. 28, Tull poured in 17 points as she connected on 6-of-12 from the floor and 4-of-8 from beyond the arc to go along with four assists and two steals against the Bulldogs. The honor marks her first Player of the Week plaudit of her career

Washington scored a team-high 21 points to lead Liberty past Lafayette on Nov. 28. She also posted two assists and came up with four steals, helping Liberty score 24 fast-break points in the win. The honor is her first Freshman of the Week nod this season.

#### HEAD OF THE CLASS

With Winthrop's win over Utah Valley, Lady Eagle mentor **BUD CHILDERS** became the school's All-Time winningest coach with 60 wins at the helm of the Winthrop squad.

#### LIGHTS OUT, UNCONSCIOUS... WHATEVER YOU WANT TO CALL IT

The Charleston Southern Bucs traveled to No. 4 North Carolina on Nov. 29 with the mindset of "if I am in the gym, I am in range" and they stuck to that game plan. Charleston Southern knocked down 17 three pointers against the Tarheels in a narrow 76-67 loss. The nine-point loss to UNC was the closest win of the season for the Tar Heels, and it was also the first single-digit loss by CSU in the eightgame all-time series. KATIE TULL led all three-point shooters with six and finished with a total of 18 points. Teammate KELSEY WASMER connected on five treys and totaled 19 points. The Bucs' 17 total threes tied thier own Big South single game record and set a record with 49 total three-point attempts. Charleston Southern outscored North Carolina in the second half 31-30.

#### TAKE'N HOME THE HARDWARE

The Liberty Lady Flames took home the tournament crown at the Navy Classic with wins over Tulane and Navy. Liberty held the homestanding Midshipmen to just 11 second half points in their first loss of the season.

#### 1ST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

History was made with co-favorites being selected for the first time in the Big South's annual preseason poll. Liberty and High Point tied for the top spot with 160 points in the voting by the League's head coaches and media panel. The Lady Flames garnered nine first-place votes to the Panthers' seven top bids.

#### TOP DOGS

High Point's JURICA HARGRAVES was selected the Big South's Preseason Women's Basketball Player of the Year. Hargraves is just the second High Point player to recieved the honor, joining KATIE O'DELL who picked up the honor during the 2005-06 season. Other players on the Preseason All-Conference team were High Point's MACKENZIE MAIER, MARGARET ROUNDTREE and DOMINIQUE HUDSON of Gardner-Webb and KYMESHA ALSTON from Radford.

#### BIG SOUTH GIVING PROPS TO ITS "FANTASTIC FANS" THIS SEASON

The Big South Conference and its nine women's basketball playing member institutions have created a "Fantastic Fan" program for the 2009-10 season. The conference-wide program, created from a grant awarded by the NCAA Women's Basketball Grant Program, aims to increase attendance by an average of 20 percent at Big South Women's Basketball games by developing relationships between teams and fans, by rewarding loyalty. The program offers attendance-based prizes, with a grand prize trip for two(tickets, hotel and airfare) to the 2010 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in San Antonio, Texas, courtesy of the Big South Conference. Fans who attend a total of eight games will be eligible for the grand prize with the winner being randomly selected from the list of fans that successfully completed the "Fantasitc Fan" card.

#### **GOING GREEN**

Liberty head coach CAREY GREEN is among the nations elite women's basketball coaches of all-time. Green is currently ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches with his .755 winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching legends such as C. VIVIAN STRINGER, VAN CHANCELLOR and SYLVIA HATCHELL. His squads have averaged more than 23 wins a season during his tenure.

#### NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

#### CHARLESTON SOLITHERN

Charleston Southern finished the week with a solid 2-1 record, which included dominating performances against Bluefield (Va.) College (95-55) Nov. 24 and South Carolina State University (87-71) Nov. 28...The Buccaneers had their first road game of the season Nov. 29 and lost 76-67 to No. 4 University of North Carolina...The nine-point loss to UNC was the closest win of the season for the Tar Heels, and it was also the first single-digit loss by CSU in the eight-game all-time series...The closest loss prior to Nov. 29 was 35 points...Charleston Southern went 17-for-48 from behind the three-point line against UNC, and both marks were the most ever allowed in the 33-year history of the program for the Tar Heels...CSU also moved to 1-0 all-time against Bluefield and 5-12 all-time against S.C. State...KATIE TULL led the way for Charleston Southern, averaging 19.3 points per game in 35.7 minutes per game...She hit six treys against UNC and averaged five over the week...She also leads the conference with 29 made three's this season...Wasmer averaged 14.3 points per game, and led CSU in scoring with 19 points against UNC...She finished 5-of-11 from downtown against the Tar Heels...TINA DeCARVALHO had her best game of the season against S.C. State, shooting 5-of-7 from the field and finishing with 12 points and five rebounds...LAKEITHA ALSTON finished the week with 9.3 points per game and 7.3 rebounds per game...She was 8-for-8 from the free-throw line and shot 50 percent (9-for-18) from the field...She also hit her first two-collegiate three-point baskets...LeCHELL RUSH recorded a career-high 15 points on 7-of-8 against the Bulldogs and had a career-high 10 rebounds against the Rams...HELEN TERRY had a career-high 16 points and seven assists against Bluefield...She also had 13 points and six assists against S.C. State..She had the best all-around game of her young career against North Carolina...She scored nine points, grabbed six rebounds, recorded four assists and had six steals in 35 minutes...The entire UNC team ha

#### COASTAL CAROLINA

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers came in the third place in the Great Alaska Shootout taking place in Anchorage Alaska. For the first game, the Chants took on host Alaska Anchorage and fell 89-47. SYDNEI MOSS and JESSICA NOLL both had a teamhigh 10 points. Moss had a teamhigh six rebounds. The Chanticleers redeemed themselves in day two by beating Western Carolina 72-64. Moss scored a teamhigh 17 points and collected eight rebounds. KATIE AHAUS scored crucial points throughout the game and finished with a career-high 14 points and three assists. Ahaus was named "Player of the Game" while Moss was named to the All-Tournament team. The Chants finished the week at home topping Coker for the 35th time in its history, 81-46. Coming of the bench OLIVIA IRICK scored 12 of her game-high 16 points. Irick went 7 of 8 from the field and scored on both three-pointers taken.

#### GARDNER-WEBE

The Lady Bulldogs are off to its best start since going to NCAA Division I in 2000-01, as Gardner-Webb is 6-1 thus far this season. After dropping its season opener to the University of Houston back on November 13th, the Lady Bulldogs have been on a tear, winning six straight games, matching the longest winning streak in its division I history. The last time the Lady Bulldogs won six straight games was back in the middle of the 2007-08 season. Gardner-Webb has four players averaging in double-digit points thus far this season, as the Lady Bulldogs are spreading the ball around. Last week, Gardner-Webb defeated Appalachian State at home 70-58 before taking off for the Thanksgiving break. After the break, the Lady Bulldogs went 2-0 at the Lancer Classic hosted by Longwood University this past weekend, as Gardner-Webb defeated Morehead State, the OVC Preseason favorites, in overtime 75-65. The Lady Bulldogs outscored the Eagles 14-4 in the overtime period to come away with the win. On day two of the tournament, Gardner-Webb held Texas-Pan American to only eight field goals on 26.1 shooting in the first half to run away with the 74-57 win. The wins over Morehead State and Texas-Pan American were both firsts for GWU, as Gardner-Webb was 0-5 combined against those teams heading into play last weekend. In the overtime win over Morehead State, senior forward and preseason all-conference selection MARGARET ROUNDTREE eclipsed the 1,000 point plateau and became only the 14th player in Gardner-Webb women's basketball history to join the 1,000-career points club.

#### HIGH POINT

High Point trailed Wake Forest by just eight with eight minutes remaining before the Demon Deacons pulled away for a 76-52 winon Wednesday. Junior AMY DODD led the Panthers with 15 points and four steals in the contest. Senior ASHLEE' SAMUELS set new season highs with nine points and a team-best six rebounds and juniors MACKENZIE MAIER and LATEISHA DEAN each added seven points for High Point in the loss. WFU controlled the glass in the game, outrebounding the Panthers 50-23 in the game.

#### LIBERTY

Liberty is 5-0 to start the season for the first time since 2006-07 and just the third time in program history ... Freshman LaKENDRA WASHINGTON scored a career-high 21 points during Saturday's win at Lafayette, becoming the second Liberty freshman to notch a 20-point game this season (also DEVON BROWN) ... This is the first time since 2001-02 that two Liberty rookies have recorded 20-point outings in the same season ... That year, KATIE FEENSTRA and STEPHANIE WALKER accomplished the feat ... The 90 points Liberty scored at Lafayette Saturday were the most points the Lady Flames have tallied versus a Division I opponent since a 99-42 home win over Charleston Southern, Feb. 18, 2008 ... The Lady Flames, who have a pair of home games scheduled this week, are 98-9 in their last 107 contests at the Vines Center.

#### **PRESBYTERIAN**

Presbyterian dropped two games last week to ACC opposition, gaining experience for the upcoming conference slate of games. MARIAH PIETROWSKI leads the team in points with 12.3 ppg and has captured two Big South Freshman of the Week Honors. DRIA DAVID paces the team in rebounds with 4.9 rpg and had a game high nine boards against Wake Forest. PC will face Charlotte on Wednesday afternoon before the home opener on Saturday afternoon against Georgia State.

#### RADFORD

Radford heads to Morgantown, W.Va. to take on West Virginia in a mid-week road tilt on Wednesday and return home on Saturday to host Southern Virginia. The Highlanders, still searching for their first win of the season, have a tough road ahead playing seven of their next nine games away from the Dedmon Center. After opening the season at home, the Highlanders enjoyed a three-game homestand. It was welcome change to second-year head coach TAJAMA ABRAHAM NGONGBA. In her first season with the Highlanders, Radford did not play a home game in November. The Highlanders started 2008-09 with six straight road games, which included a four-game, nine-day cross country trek. Radford did not play its first home game last season until Dec. 5, a 78-58 victory over Southern Virginia. Junior KAYLYN CROSIER has tallied a career-high 11 points in three of Radford's first four games of the season. She also matched her career-best with seven rebounds agaisnt Howard on Sunday. Redshirt senior KYMESHA ALSTON has recorded two double-doubles this season against Mount St. Mary's and William & Mary bringing her career total to 10. She also led Radford in scoring in the first three games of the season and is tops on the team averaging 11.8 ppg.

#### **UNC ASHEVILLE**

UNC Asheville dropped both games this week to Campbell and USC Upstate despite LINDSEY THOMPSON averaging 12 points and four rebounds per game. Thompson had a career-high eight rebounds at Upstate. KELLI RILES had career highs in both games. She scored seven points against Campbell with a career high nine rebounds and then posted 11 points and seven rebounds against Upstate.

#### WINTHROP

The Lady Eagles went 1-1 at the Wingate Thanksgiving Classic on the campus of Montana State over the holiday break. Junior LACEY LYONS and senior SHANICE COLE were named to the All-Tournament Team. Lyons averaged 11.0 ppg and scored a season-high against Montana State. She also went 4-for-4 at the foul line down the stretch against Utah Valley. Cole put up 15 points and pulled down 14 rebounds in the win over Utah Valley.
