Monique Hudson • Junior G • Gardner-Webb Rocky Mount, N.C.

Hudson averaged 17.0 points and shot 43 percent from the floor and 45 percent from downtown to lead the Lady Bulldogs to a 2-0 record last week, including a win over then undefeated East Carolina. Hudson got her week started with 18 points on 83 percent from the floor and 80 percent from down town and the line as Gardner-Webb downed Wofford on Dec. 1. She also came up with three boards, dished out two assists and recorded one block against the Terriers. Four days later against the Lady Pirates, Hudson stayed hot as she poured in 16 points and came away with five steals, three boards and one assist in the Lady Bulldogs' first-ever win over East Carolina. The Lady Pirates entered the week with a 7-0 record and received 16 votes in the Coaches Top 25.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Mary Hathaway G • Winthrop Fort Wayne, Ind.

Hathaway scored a career-high 13 points to push Winthrop to a 62-53 win over USC Aiken on Dec. 5. She drilled 4-of-5 from the floor to finish with an 80 percent clip and connected on 3-of-3 from long range and 2-of-2 from the charity stripe. Hathaway also ripped down a career-best seven boards and dished out two assists in the win.

NUMBER 1 STUNNERS

Coastal Carolina's **AMANDA STULL** and **KATIE TULL** of Charleston Southern have found themselves ranked atop the nation's elite this week in the NCAA stats. Stull is connecting on 66.7 percent of her tries from downtown to lead the nation in that category, while Tull is averaging 4.4 treys per contest to lead all of Divison I.

HEAD OF THE CLASS

With Winthrop's win over Utah Valley, Lady Eagle mentor **BUD CHILDERS** became the school's All-Time winningest coach with 60 wins at the helm of the Winthrop squad.

LIGHTS OUT, UNCONSCIOUS... WHATEVER YOU WANT TO CALL IT

The Charleston Southern Bucs traveled to No. 4 North Carolina on Nov. 29 with the mindset of "if I am in the gym, I am in range" and they stuck to that game plan. Charleston Southern knocked down 17 three pointers against the Tarheels in a narrow 76-67 loss. The nine-point loss to UNC was the closest win of the season for the Tar Heels, and it was also the first single-digit loss by CSU in the eightgame all-time series. KATIE TULL led all three-point shooters with six and finished with a total of 18 points. Teammate KELSEY WASMER connected on five treys and totaled 19 points. The Bucs' 17 total threes tied thier own Big South single game record and set a record with 49 total three-point attempts. Charleston Southern outscored North Carolina in the second half 31-30.

TAKE'N HOME THE HARDWARE

The Liberty Lady Flames took home the tournament crown at the Navy Classic with wins over Tulane and Navy. Liberty held the homestanding Midshipmen to just 11 second half points in their first loss of the season.

1ST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

History was made with co-favorites being selected for the first time in the Big South's annual preseason poll. Liberty and High Point tied for the top spot with 160 points in the voting by the League's head coaches and media panel. The Lady Flames garnered nine first-place votes to the Panthers' seven top bids.

TOP DOGS

High Point's JURICA HARGRAVES was selected the Big South's Preseason Women's Basketball Player of the Year. Hargraves is just the second High Point player to recieved the honor, joining KATIE O'DELL who picked up the honor during the 2005-06 season. Other players on the Preseason All-Conference team were High Point's MACKENZIE MAIER, MARGARET ROUNDTREE and DOMINIQUE HUDSON of Gardner-Webb and KYMESHA ALSTON from Radford.

BIG SOUTH GIVING PROPS TO ITS "FANTASTIC FANS" THIS SEASON

The Big South Conference and its nine women's basketball playing member institutions have created a "Fantastic Fan" program for the 2009-10 season. The conference-wide program, created from a grant awarded by the NCAA Women's Basketball Grant Program, aims to increase attendance by an average of 20 percent at Big South Women's Basketball games by developing relationships between teams and fans, by rewarding loyalty. The program offers attendance-based prizes, with a grand prize trip for two(tickets, hotel and airfare) to the 2010 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in San Antonio, Texas, courtesy of the Big South Conference. Fans who attend a total of eight games will be eligible for the grand prize with the winner being randomly selected from the list of fans that successfully completed the "Fantasitc Fan" card.

GOING GREEN

Liberty head coach CAREY GREEN is among the nations elite women's basketball coaches of all-time. Green is currently ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches with his .755 winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching legends such as C. VIVIAN STRINGER, VAN CHANCELLOR and SYLVIA HATCHELL. His squads have averaged more than 23 wins a season during his tenure.

NOTING THE BIG SOUTH TEAMS

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN
Charleston Southern went .500 after taking care of UNC-Greensboro 56-54 Dec. 1 and falling to Atlantic Coast Conference opponent Clemson University 104-52 Dec. 6...The Buccaneers recorded their first-ever win against their old conference rival in the first meeting since the 1996-97 season...CSU is now 1-14 against the Spartans and remain winless (0-9) all-time against CU...KATIE TULL led CSU with 22 points against UNCG...She finished 5-of-11 from downtown and also grabbed five rebounds in a game-high 36 minutes...ALI SCHWAGMEYER came off the bench and had a monster game, playing a career-high 31 minutes...She scored eight points and grabbed eight boards, while setting career-highs in steals (4), assists (3) and blocks (2)...Schwagmeyer also had a season-high 15 points and brought down a team-high six rebounds against Clemson...LeCHELL RUSH also had a solid 2-for-2 performance against UNCG, scoring seven points and five rebounds.

COASTAL CAROLINA

The Coastal Carolina won both games last week and are on a four-game win streak. Coastal beat in-state rival College of Charleston in a close game, 57-53. It was a back and forth battle the whole game until the last five minutes when the Chants went 8-for-9 from the line to ensure the victory. AMANDA STULL went 6-for-9 from the field, 2-for-3 from beyond the arc and finished with game-high 18 points, six steals, and four rebounds. SYDNEI MOSS added 14 points and five rebounds. OLIVIA IRICK grabbed a career-high six rebounds. In the second game of the week, the Chanticleers struggled shooting, but their defense made up for it at Savannah State, 49-35. Coastal shot 92 percent (11-12) from the charity stripe, with Moss going 5-for-5 herself. Moss also posted her first double-double of the year scoring the game-high 17 points and collecting 10 rebounds. KATIE AHAUS added 12 points and Amanda Stull had eight.

GARDNER-WEBB

Gardner-Webb continued its winning streak, picking up wins at home over Wofford and East Carolina last week. The Lady Bulldogs 8-1 start is the best in its NCAA Division I history, while its current eight game-winning streak is the longest in GWU's Division I history. Gardner-Webb has five players averaging double-digit points, while eight players are recording at least 11 minutes per game for Coach Reeves. The two wins this past week was huge for GWU, as the win over Wofford was the first win for GWU over the Terriers since 1989 and its first in its last 10 chances. Gardner-Webb's win over East Carolina was its first over the Lady Pirates, as GWU is now 1-4 against ECU, and its first over a Conference USA team in nine tries (1-8). East Carolina entered the game with a perfect 7-0 record and had received 16 votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top-25 poll, yet Gardner-Webb held the Lady Pirates to 45 points on 29.3 percent shooting for the game. The Lady Bulldogs toughest task of the season is next, as its eight game winning streak will be on the line as they travel to Chapel Hill, N.C. to face off with the No. 4 nationally ranked North Carolina Tar Heels on Sunday afternoon at 3 p.m.

The Panthers struggled this week dropping three-straight games on the road to South Carolina, George Mason and American. Junior LaTesiha Dean led HPU with 11 points per game during the three road contests including a 20-point game against George Mason which tied her career high.

LIDERT 7
At 6-1, Liberty has equaled its second-best start to a season in program history ... The 1975-76, 1983-84, 1996-97 and 2007-08 Lady Flames also started out 6-1 ... James Madison handed Liberty a 60-50 setback on Dec. 1, ending the Lady Flames' 12-game home winning streak ... Defensively, Liberty has held 91 consecutive opponents below 50 percent field goal shooting, and 34 straight foes have failed to score 70 points versus the Lady Flames ... JELENA ANTIC posted her first career double-double (12 points, 10 rebounds) during Saturday's 86-50 wing over Glamille State becoming the second Liberty freshman (also DEVON BROWN) to record a double-double 10 points. 45 win over Glenville State, becoming the second Liberty freshman (also DEVON BROWN) to record a doubledouble this season ... Liberty will only play one game in the next three weeks, the Lady Flames first-ever trip to Auburn on Dec. 15.

PRESBYTERIAN

Presbyterian College women's basketball returned to the friendly confines on Saturday night and rebounded from a lackluster first half to reel Georgia State back in and ultimately only fall by 14 points. AMANDA MILLS accounted for 15 points in the loss to the Panthers as MARIAH PIETROWSKI continues to lead the team with 12.1 points per game. Top rebounding honors go to Dria David with 4.6 boards per game. The Blue Hose now break for exam week before coming back to the court on Monday morning against South Carolina State at 11:30

Coming off its first win of the season, Radford begins a tough stretch of road games on Tuesday evening at No. 11 North Carolina. The Highlanders will face the Tar Heels who have started the season winning six of their first seven games of the season after an 83-73 victory over St. John's on Sunday. Radford last played a ranked team on Dec. 2, 2008 when it fell at No. 16 Vanderbilt, 78-41. Radford will play six of its next seven games on road after playing four of its first six at the Dedmon Center. The Highlanders started last season with six straight road games before playing their first contest at home against today's opponent Southern Virginia on Dec. 5, 2008. DENAY WOOD registered a game and career-high 14 points to pace Radford in its first win of the season over Southern Virginia on Saturday. Some of Radford's new faces contributed in its victory over Southern Virginia. Freshman DA'NARIA ERWIN SPENCER and junior JEWELL KINLAW netted 13 and 11 points respectively and each recorded a game-high four steals. Also, freshman VICTORIA HAMILTON pulled down a game-high nine rebounds. After a season-high 37 forced turnovers against SVU, Radford has forced its opponents into 21 or more turnovers in five of its first six contests of the season. The only team to stay under the 21-turnover mark was Howard who took care of the ball, resulting in only 11 mistakes.

UNC Asheville dropped games at Western Carolina and Charlotte this week. The Bulldogs will take time off for exams before facing Southern Wesleyan on Friday. LINDAAUGHBURNS led the Bulldogs averaging 9.5 points and 6.5 rebounds for teh week. She scored 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds against Western Carolina.

Freshman MARY HATHAWAY scored a career-high 13 points to help Winthrop over USC Aiken. She was 4-for-5 from the field and a perfect 3-for-3 from behind the arc. She also pulled down a career-best seven boards. She was the sixth different player to lead Winthrop in scoring this year. **SHANICE COLE** leads the team with 8.3 ppg. In the six seasons that coach **BUD CHILDERS** has been at Winthrop, this is the best rebounding margin team he's had at +7.0, even through just seven games in a season. Shanice Cole is the team leader at 9.0 a game followed by TAQUOIA HAMMICK'S 6.4 per game. The rebounding margin ranks 40th nationally. Winthrop is also ranked 26th defensively allowing 54.7 points per game.
