CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Junior
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown was 17-of-22 passing for 338 yards and four touchdowns in leading the Flames back from an early 7-0 deficit against St. Francis (Pa.). In his second career start at quarterback, Brown threw three touchdown passes in the final 5:08 of the second quarter to give Liberty the lead for good. He started with a 75-yard touchdown strike on third down to Pat Kelly. On the next possession and facing a second-and-20, Brown hit B.J. Hayes for 49 yards and a score. Brown closed out the first half with a 40-yard touchdown to Chris Summers on a third-and-10 play. Brown connected with Summers again in the third quarter on a 20-yard scoring play. Three of Brown's four touchdown passes came on drives of 70-yards or longer. Brown also rushed for 14 yards and caught a pass for four yards.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

JEFFERY WILLIAMS • LB • Senior
Gardner-Webb • Frisco City, Ala.

Williams posted an 18-tackle game against Brevard and played the balance of a grueling 37:18 that the GWU defense was on the field against the Tornados' triple-option attack. Williams helped hold Brevard to just 3.5 yards per play and had nine solo stops -- including a pair behind the line and a half sack. He also intercepted a pass with 5:45 left in the second quarter that ended a 12-play drive in Gardner-Webb territory. Williams is now the eighth player in Big South history to surpass 300 career tackles (304). For his efforts, Williams was named National Defensive Player of the Week on Monday by *The Sports Network*.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES • RS • Senior
VMI • Pittsburgh, Pa.

Rainey-Wiles returned four punts for 112 yards (28.0 average), including a 52-yarder for a touchdown in the third quarter. It was his first career punt return TD and VMI's first punt return for a score since Tim Maypray on Oct. 3, 2009. Rainey-Wiles also had punt returns of 29 and 20 yards that gave the Keydets great field possession, and he also returned the opening kickoff 31 yards that eventually led to VMI's first points of the game.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Gardner-Webb • Wingate, N.C.

Blount was thrown into heavy action earlier than expected Saturday due to injuries, and he responded with 134 rushing yards and one touchdown in Gardner-Webb's 28-14 victory. Blount gained 58 yards on his first carry to set up the squad's second score of the game, and he later scored in the fourth quarter on a 2-yard run. He averaged 7.4 yards on his 18 carries and recorded the top freshman rushing debut in Gardner-Webb's Division I era.

FOUR TEAMS OPEN SEASON WITH WINS

Charleston Southern, Gardner-Webb, Liberty and VMI won their respective season openers, marking the third time overall that a League-best four members won their first game of the season. The previous times were 2005 and 2006. VMI won its Big South-record sixth consecutive season opener, while Charleston Southern won its opener for the first time since 2006.

MORE ON THE 1-0 TEAMS

As mentioned above, VMI is 1-0 for the sixth-straight season, and is looking to start 2-0 for the first time since 2002. The Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs are 1-0 for the second-straight year, and last started 2-0 last season. After a one-year hiatus, Liberty is 1-0 and last opened 2-0 in 2008 when the Flames started 6-0. Charleston Southern is 1-0 for the first time since 2006 when the Bucs opened that year 9-0 to establish the best start to a season in Big South history.

PC'S TOP PLAY

Presbyterian College's 68-yard misdirection touchdown pass from **DERRICK OVERHOLT** to **MICHAEL RUFF** against Wake Forest last Thursday was the "Top Play" on ESPN's "SportsCenter" that night. The play started when QB **BRANDON MILEY** lateralled the ball to Overholt on a bounce pass, with Overholt acting as if the pass was incomplete. As Wake Forest stopped pursuing, Overholt lofted a deep pass to Ruff for the highlight-reel touchdown. The 68-yard pass play was the second-longest in Big South history against an FBS opponent, behind Liberty's 76-yard touchdown pass from **ADRIAN HALL** to **ERICK HARRIS** against Akron on Oct. 12, 2002.

BIG BUCS

Charleston Southern has won its last five games, dating back to last season. It is the Buccaneers' longest win streak since winning a Big South-record 14 consecutive games from 2005-06. Saturday's season opening win over North Greenville was Charleston Southern's third-straight home win.

HOME SWEET HOME

Stony Brook will make its home debut this Saturday, with Coastal Carolina's home opener set for Week 3. Presbyterian College opens its home slate on Sept. 25. Below is a look at the three teams' last home opening win and current home opening streaks.

FLAMMABLE

Liberty set a Big South single-game record with 452 team passing yards in Saturday's season-opening win over St. Francis (Pa.) -- just three yards short of the school record of 455 against Towson State in 1991. The previous League record was 431 passing yards, set by Charleston Southern against North Greenville on Oct. 25, 2003. The Flames also threw six touchdown passes, tying the Big South single-game mark first accomplished by Charleston Southern on Oct. 23, 2004 vs. North Greenville.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** is the fourth player in Big South history with 4,000 career all-purpose yards, as he ranks fourth with 4,094. He needs 62 yards to surpass **RASHAD JENNINGS** (4,155) for third place. In addition, Stevenson is 15 kick return yards shy of becoming just the second player in Conference annals with 2,000 combined kickoff/punt return yards. Meanwhile, Stevenson needs 289 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 61 games -- the longest run in the history of the program and the second-longest scoring streak in Big South history. The Big South record for most consecutive games scoring a point is 67, set by Coastal Carolina from Sept. 6, 2003 - Nov. 15, 2008. Liberty follows VMI, as the Flames' current streak stands at 53 games, while Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 42 games (24 as official Big South members). Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 23 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (17) and Charleston Southern (9).

THREE BILLS

Liberty receiving tandem **CHRIS SUMMERS** (129), **PAT KELLY** (115) and **B.J. HAYES** (110) became the second trio in Big South history with 100 receiving yards in the same game Saturday against St. Francis (Pa.). The first group to accomplish this trifecta was Charleston Southern receivers **EDDIE GADSON** (150), **MAURICE PRICE** (113) and **HARRY SEABROOK** (103) vs. Allen on Nov. 6, 2004.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening in over Brevard. Williams now has 304 career stops, and needs five tackles to jump from eighth-place into fifth. Former teammate **MARIO BROWN** is fourth with 313 tackles. Charleston Southern's **JADA ROSS** is the Big South's all-time leader in tackles with 454 from 2004-07.

RECORD DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAK BELONGS TO LIBERTY

Liberty has broken the Big South record for most consecutive games scoring in double figures -- 43. The Flames entered the season tied with Coastal Carolina for the longest such streak. The Chanticleers established their 42-game double-figure scoring streak from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 15, 2008.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. This week, Conference members will play three FBS foes for the second consecutive week, with Presbyterian College being just the second Big South football member to play FBS schools in back-to-back weeks. Liberty was the first in 2003 (at Toledo, at Bowling Green). Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season. The Big South has come close to knocking off one of the big boys in recent seasons -- VMI lost to Army by five points last year (22-17), while Gardner-Webb fell to Georgia Tech by three points in 2008 (10-7) and Liberty was edged by Toledo by one point in 2007 (35-34).

SPEAKING OF FBS...

Liberty travels to MAC member Ball State this week, and the Flames will look to extend its consecutive 20-point game streak against FBS opponents to three. In its last two FBS match-ups, Liberty scored 20 points at West Virginia in the 2009 season opener, and prior to that, scored 34 points in a one-point loss at Toledo in 2007.

A GAME OF CATCH

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** are the Big South's active leading receivers with nearly identical career numbers. Below is a closer look at this talented receiving duo and their respective spots in Big South history:

HEIR APPARENT

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** is the Big South's active leading rusher with 2,254 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, is 90 yards away from seventh-place and is 1,380 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Gowins, whose nine career 100-yard rushing games is tied for fifth-most in Big South history, has gained his 2,254 rushing yards in 22 career games for a career average of 102.45 rushing yards per game.

GATES KEEPER

Gardner-Webb kicker **RYAN GATES** needs one field goal to become the fifth kicker in Big South history with 30 career field goals. He is currently tied with Charleston Southern's **NICK ELLIS** and VMI's **BARRETT WAY** for sixth-place in League annals with 29 field goals.

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has rushed for a touchdown in each of his last three games (six total) and is tied for seventh in Big South history with 21 career rushing touchdowns. All but six of his 21 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 32.1 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3).

THE BIG FIVE-OH

Gardner-Webb punter **GRAHAM PURVIS** averaged 50.4 yards on his five punts Saturday against Brevard College, becoming just the fifth punter in League history to average 50 yards a punt in a game, based on a minimum of three punts. Purvis booted punts of 47, 51, 48, 55 and 51 against the Tornados, with two landing inside the 20-yard line.

THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

HIDE TIDE

Charleston Southern carries a League-best four-game Conference win streak into this season, and scored 30 points in each of the four games -- a first in school history. The win streak is just one away from matching the school record of five-straight Big South wins.

THE LAST ONE STANDING

Gardner-Webb is the only Big South member to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South Conference game, a span of 34 contests. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 31 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

FRED MITCHELL PLACEKICKING AWARD WATCH LIST

Three Big South Conference placekickers were among the 40 individuals named to the initial Fred Mitchell Award Watch List for 2010. Charleston Southern's **JOHN PAGLIA**, Stony Brook's **WESLEY SKIFFINGTON** and Liberty's **MATT BEVINS** are three of the 15 FCS kickers on the list, and mark the Big South's first-ever recognition for the award. The award is named after longtime Chicago Tribune columnist **FRED MITCHELL**, who was a record-setting, Hall of Fame placekicker at Wittenberg University.
