### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### JAMES PERRY III • WR • R-Junior Gardner-Webb • Greensboro, N.C.

Perry caught 10 passes for 125 yards and two touchdowns in Gardner-Webb's 38-37 overtime win at Akron. His two TD catches rallied the Runnin' Bulldogs back from a 31-17 deficit to tie the game with five minutes left. His first score came from four yards away -- a diving catch that cut the lead to 31-24 with 18 seconds left in the third quarter. His final score was from 13 yards out to help tie the game. In overtime, Perry accounted for 16 of the 25 yards gained, as he rushed seven yards for a first down and hauled in a nine-yard catch that set-up Gardner-Webb's final scoring play.

#### MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Junior Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown amassed a career-high 363 yards of total offense and was responsible for three of Liberty's four touchdowns in the Flames' 27-23 victory at Ball State. He was 24-of-38 passing for 276 yards and two touchdowns, and rushed 18 times for 87 yards and the eventual game-winning score from one yard out with 4:55 left in the contest. On the game-winning drive, Brown was 3-of-3 passing for 30 yards and carried the ball five times for 28 yards on the nine-play, 74-yard drive. Brown's two touchdown passes were to Chris Summers -- a 21-yarder in the first quarter to give Liberty a 7-0 lead, and a 65-yard connection in the third period that erased a three-point deficit.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### BRUCE NIXON • CB • Senior Gardner-Webb • Ellenwood, Ga.

Nixon recorded nine tackles (eight solo), broke up a pass in the end zone, recovered a fumble and blocked the Zips' extra point attempt in overtime. Nixon's PBU came with the score tied at 31-31 with less than 30 seconds to play. Earlier in the fourth quarter, Nixon pounced on a loose ball at the GWU four-yard line that halted an Akron drive and preserved the tie score with 2:46 remaining. After the Zips scored on their first overtime possession, Nixon came around the left edge and blocked the PAT attempt to give GWU a chance for the win.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### RYAN GATES • PK • Junior Gardner-Webb • Sharpsburg, Ga.

Gates was perfect on all six of his place kicks Saturday at Akron, going 5-of-5 on PATs and making his lone field goal attempt from 40 yards out -- his first field goal attempt in six games. He also had a touchdown-saving tackle on a kickoff return near midfield with GWU trailing 31-24 in the third quarter. Gates finished with eight points scored and his PAT kick in overtime provided the winning margin to mark Gardner-Webb's and the Big South Conference's first-ever win over an FBS program.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

#### JUANNE BLOUNT • RB Gardner-Webb • Wingate, N.C.

Blount rushed for a team-high 69 yards and scored the game-tying touchdown in overtime at Akron. Making his first career start in just his second collegiate game, Blount had a 16-yard burst in the first quarter that led to an eventual Gardner-Webb field goal, and later bulled into the end zone from four yards out on third down to tie the score at 37-37, setting up the historic victory.

**TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history this past weekend as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. It was the Runnin' Bulldogs' first-ever win against an FBS opponent, while the Flames notched their second win against an FBS foe -- the first coming in 1989 at Eastern Michigan. It also was the third consecutive FBS game that Liberty has scored at least 20 points. Both Gardner-Webb and Liberty had come close to recording FBS wins in recent seasons, as GWU lost 10-7 at Georgia Tech in 2008 and the Flames were edged 35-34 at Toledo in 2007.

**MORE ON THE 2-0 TEAMS**

The Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs are 2-0 for the second-straight year, and it marks the fourth time that **STEVE PATTON's** squad has opened the season 2-0 since the start of Big South football in 2002 (the other times being 2005, 2006 and 2009). Gardner-Webb is looking to achieve its first 3-0 start since 1999. After a one-year hiatus, Liberty is 2-0 for the first time since in 2008 when the Flames started 6-0.

**BIG BROWN**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the third player in Big South history to record back-to-back games with at least 350 yards of total offense. He racked up 352 in Week 1 vs. St. Francis (Pa.) and had a career-high 363 at Ball State this past Saturday. Brown joins Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (2006) and Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** (2008) in the club, as both players went on to record three consecutive games with 350-plus yards of total offense.

**COASTAL CAROLINA SUFFERS HEART-BREAKING LOSS IN BIG SOUTH'S LONGEST GAME - 5 OTS**

Coastal Carolina's 47-45, five overtime loss at Towson this past Saturday was the longest game in Big South history. The previous longest was three overtimes, a record that was established in 2005 during two Conference games on the same day. On Oct. 25, 2005, Gardner-Webb and VMI played three extra sessions. Later that night, Coastal Carolina's game at Liberty went into three overtimes before the Chanticleers emerged with a 27-21 victory.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Stony Brook won its fourth-straight home opener Saturday, meaning the Big South is now 5-0 in home openers this season with two teams left. Coastal Carolina's home opener is set for this Saturday against Georgia Southern, while Presbyterian College opens its home slate on Sept. 25 vs. North Greenville. Below is a look at the two teams' last home opening win and current home opening streaks.

**POINT OF ORDER**

VMI's streak of 61 consecutive games with a point scored was snapped this past weekend at No. 11 William & Mary. The Keydets' run was the longest in school history and the second-longest streak in Big South annals. Liberty now owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 54 games. Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 43 games (25 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (24), Stony Brook (18) and Charleston Southern (10).

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** surpassed 1,000 career passing yards over the weekend, and is now the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards. Brown has thrown for 1,066 yards in his short stint as a quarterback, and has amassed 1,033 yards in his career as a receiver. He needs 315 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing milestone, which would make him the Conference's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards.

**MORE ON BROWN**

In his three career starts at quarterback, Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** is 70-of-96 passing (=72.9 percent) for 856 yards and seven touchdowns, in addition to being 3-0.

**ZACH ATTACK**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** rushed for two scores in Saturday's five overtime loss at Towson, becoming the seventh QB in Big South history to score 10 career rushing touchdowns. MacDowall has 10 rushing TDs during his time in Conway, and trails **TYLER THIGPEN** (13) for the most by a Chanticleer quarterback. Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** holds the Conference record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 19.

**TRIPLE PLAY**

Charleston Southern is opening the season with three consecutive home games for the first time in school history. The Buccaneers are just the third team in Big South football history to open a campaign with three-straight home games, joining Liberty (2002) and Gardner-Webb (2005).

**RECORD DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAK BELONGS TO LIBERTY**

Liberty holds the Big South record for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 44. In Week 1, the Flames broke the record of 42 consecutive games that was established by Coastal Carolina from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 15, 2008.

**SUMMERS TIME**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** is the first Big South player since Gardner-Webb's **DOBSON COLLINS** in 2008 with two consecutive 100-yard receiving games. Summers tallied 129 receiving yards in the season opener against St. Francis (Pa.), and followed that performance with 146 receiving yards this past Saturday at Ball State. The last Liberty receiver with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games was **DOMINIC BOLDEN**, who posted three consecutive 100-yard receiving games from Oct. 18-Nov. 1, 2008 -- one week prior to Collins' two-game streak.

**TWO NEW SEAWOLVES EATING UP YARDAGE**

New Stony Brook running back tandem and Hofstra transfers **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (167) and **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (158) combined for 325 rushing yards this past Saturday against American International, the sixth time that the Seawolves have had two players surpass 100 rushing yards in the same game since joining the Big South in 2008. They also are the first pair of teammates to rush for more than 150 yards in the same game since Nov. 14, 2009, when Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS** (177) and **CONTE CUTTINO** (163) did it at Charleston Southern.

**EVEN STEVEN**

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** is third all-time in the Big South Conference with 4,223 career all-purpose yards. He needs 399 yards to surpass **SEAN MIZZER** (4,621) for second place. In addition, Stevenson became just the second player in Conference history with 2,000 combined kick-off/punt return yards when he surpassed the milestone this past weekend against Wofford. He now has 2,008 in his career (1,869 kickoffs, 139 punts) and is 484 yards away from the all-time mark of 2,492 (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**). Meanwhile, Stevenson needs 260 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards.

**A GAME OF CATCH**

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** cracked the League's all-time top 10 for career receptions over the weekend, and now stands eighth in Big South history with 130 career catches. He needs eight receptions to move into a tie with Liberty's **BRANDON TURNER** for seventh (138). Perry and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** continue to climb the Conference's all-time receiving records and have nearly identical career numbers. Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** booted two crucial overtime field goals of longer than 40 yards Saturday at Towson to end a skid in which he made just five of his previous 12 attempts. Durham connected on a 42-yarder in the first overtime to tie the game at 24-24. In the fourth overtime, Durham made a 43-yarder to give the Chanticleers their final lead of the night, 39-36. It was his first career game with two field goals of at least 40 yards, and the second such occurrence in school history.

**GATES KEEPER**

Gardner-Webb kicker **RYAN GATES** became the fifth kicker in Big South history with 30 career field goals when he connected on a first quarter 40-yard field goal at Akron. It was his 10th career field goal from that distance, becoming just the second kicker in League annals with that many field goals of 40-plus yards. Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH** (2003-06) holds the all-time record of 13 made field goals from at least 40 yards.

**O'NEAL FOR THREE**

Coastal Carolina RB **ERIC O'NEAL** scored three touchdowns in Coastal Carolina's five overtime loss at Towson. He rushed for two scores and caught another. He scored two of his TDs in overtime, and both were needed as Towson had already scored touchdowns on its possessions. In the last OT, O'Neal kept Coastal alive as he converted a 4th-and-1 with a 5-yard touchdown reception. O'Neal is the first Chanticleer to score three touchdowns in a game since **MIKE TOLBERT** scored three times against Charleston Southern on Nov. 17, 2007.

**VMI RECEIVING MORE AIR TIME**

VMI's game at Virginia on Sept. 25 will be broadcast on ESPN3.com and will start at 1:30pm. The Keydets will now appear on television a school-record seven times this season. Meanwhile, the Big South Conference will announce additional national television coverage of two Conference games on Tuesday, Sept. 14.

**RECORD RETURN**

VMI's **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** set a Big South single-game record with 112 punt return yards in the season opener against Lock Haven. The previous record was 109 yards set by Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** at Chattanooga on Nov. 13, 2004. Rainey-Wiles returned four punts in the game and averaged 28.0 yards per return, which included a 52-yarder for a touchdown. After two games, he is averaging a League-best 19.1 yards per punt return.

**HEIR APPARENT**

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** is the Big South's active leading rusher with 2,254 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, is 90 yards away from seventh-place and is 1,380 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Gowins, whose nine career 100-yard rushing games is tied for fifth-most in Big South history, has gained his 2,254 rushing yards in 22 career games for a career average of 102.45 rushing yards per game.

**WELCOME TO THE CLUB**

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard. Williams now has 304 career stops, and needs five tackles to jump from eighth-place into fifth. Former teammate **MARIO BROWN** is fourth with 313 tackles. Charleston Southern's **JADA ROSS** is the Big South's all-time leader in tackles with 454 from 2004-07.

**GO-GO-GOWINS**

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has rushed for a touchdown in each of his last three games (six total) and is tied for seventh in Big South history with 21 career rushing touchdowns. All but six of his 21 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 32.1 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3).

**THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010**

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE**

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.

**FB-YES**

The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.
