### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**GERALD STEVENSON • WR • Senior**  
Charleston Southern • Naples, Fla.

Stevenson played a key role in Charleston Southern's 28-14 win over Mars Hill Saturday. He caught six passes for 198 yards -- tied for the fourth-most in a single-game in Big South history -- and averaged 33.0 yards per catch. While he did not reach the end zone, Stevenson kept alive three touchdown scoring drives with four third down conversions. His catches went for 26, 27, 38, 27, 42 and 38 yards, and he finished the day with 246 all-purpose yards.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**CEDRICK MOORE • DB • Junior**  
Stony Brook • Lakewood, Calif.

Moore tied a Big South Conference single-game record and school record with three interceptions at Brown, in addition to 12 tackles (eight solo, four assists) and a pass break-up against the Bears. Two of his three interceptions came on back-to-back drives in the second quarter with Stony Brook leading 14-10. His first pick stopped a 7-play, 52-yard drive at the SBU 19-yard line. On Brown's next drive, Moore again thwarted the Bears with an interception at the SBU 18 and returned it 41 yards. Moore's third interception came in the third quarter at the Brown 30-yard line that the Seawolves converted into a touchdown and 20-10 lead.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**ANDY BROWN • P • Junior**  
Charleston Southern • Daytona, Fla.

Brown averaged 43.5 yards on his four punts and placed three inside the 20-yard line against Mars Hill. He had a long of 52 that was downed on the MHC five-yard line, while two other punts landed at the 11-yard line and 14-yard line as the Lions were not able to return any of his kicks. Brown also took over extra point duties and went 4-for-4 on the day, his first PAT kicks since early in the 2008 season.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**JAMES NUNLEY • WR**  
Charleston Southern • Sacramento, Calif.

Nunley had four catches for 102 yards and a touchdown in CSU's victory over Mars Hill. He caught a season-long 48-yarder on the first play of the game that set up CSU's two-play, 69-yard opening touchdown drive. He had a 13-yard catch on 3rd-and-7 to give the Bucs a first down, then had two catches for 41 yards in the fourth quarter -- including a 24-yard touchdown reception that gave Charleston Southern a 28-7 lead.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

The Big South is 5-1 in home openers thus far this season, and after three weeks, Presbyterian College finally opens its home schedule this Saturday as the Blue Hose host North Greenville. PC is looking to snap a 17-game overall losing streak, as well as a five-game skid at home. The Blue Hose are also in search of their first home-opening win since knocking off Fayetteville State, 38-28, in 2008.

**TOTALLY OFFENSIVE**

For just the fifth time in Big South football history, three players surpassed 300 yards of total offense in the same weekend, as Charleston Southern's **A.J. TOSCANO** (389), Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** (344) and Coastal Carolina's **ZACH MacDOWALL** (329) eclipsed the benchmark in their respective games this past weekend. The last time this occurred was the weekend of Oct. 3, 2009 when Toscano (308), Gardner-Webb's **STAN DOOLITTLE** (341) and Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** (335) achieved the feat.

**WE WANT TO SEE MOORE OF THIS**

Stony Brook's **CEDRICK MOORE** tied a Big South single-game record with three interceptions at Brown this past weekend. He is the fourth player in League history to pick off three passes in a game, joining VMI's **CHRISTIAN KELLY** (at Charleston Southern on Oct. 21, 2006), Coastal Carolina's **MARRIO NORMAN** (vs. Presbyterian College on Oct. 20, 2007) and Coastal Carolina's **JOSH NORMAN** (vs. Gardner-Webb on Nov. 7, 2009).

**BIG BROWN**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is now the sixth player in Big South history with three consecutive games with 300 total offensive yards, and just the second to accomplish this feat in his team's first three games of the season, joining Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** (2006). The last Big South player with three consecutive games with 300 yards of total offense was Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** from Oct. 25 - Nov. 8, 2008. Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** is the only player in League history with four-straight 300-yard total offense games, having done so from Sept. 9 - Oct. 7, 2006.

**ZACH ATTACK**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** needs one touchdown pass to become the sixth player in Big South history with 30 in a career. He had three scoring strikes this past Saturday against Georgia Southern, the fourth 3-TD pass game of his Coastal Carolina career, and he posted his fourth career 300-yard passing game with 314 yards against the Eagles. MacDowall is third in Big South history with most 300-yard passing games, behind **COLLIN DRAFTS** (6) and **TYLER THIGPEN** (5).

**TOSCANO SAUCE**

Charleston Southern QB **A.J. TOSCANO** moved into 10-place on the Big South's all-time passing yardage list this past weekend with his 374 passing yards against Mars Hill, which is the ninth-most in a game in League history. It was his first career 300-yard passing game at CSU, and pushed his career total to 3,013 yards to surpass VMI's **KYLE HUGHES** for the 10th spot.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** surpassed 1,000 career passing yards in Week 2, and is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards. Brown has thrown for 1,333 yards in his short stint as a quarterback, and has amassed 1,033 yards in his career as a receiver. He needs 238 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing milestone, which would make him the Conference's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards.

**CAN'T STOP THIS BUC**

Charleston Southern WR **GERALD STEVENSON** caught six passes for 198 yards this past Saturday against Mars Hill, tied for the fourth-highest single-game receiving yard total in Big South history. Stevenson's average of 33.00 yards per catch is the third-highest average in a game, based on a minimum of five receptions.

**MORE ON BROWN**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown at least two touchdown passes in three consecutive games, the first Big South signal-caller to do so since Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** tossed two touchdowns in six-straight games last season. Of Brown's eight touchdown passes this season, six have come on third down, five have gone for at least 36 yards, and he is averaging 41.3 yards on his TD throws this year. In just four career starts at quarterback, Brown is 94-of-136 passing ( =69.1 percent) for 1,123 yards and nine touchdowns, in addition to being 3-1. He also has rushed 59 times for 266 yards (4.5 average) and two scores under center.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 55 games. Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 44 games (26 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (25), Stony Brook (19) and Charleston Southern (11).

**RECORD DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING STREAK BELONGS TO LIBERTY**

Liberty holds the Big South record for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 45. In Week 1, the Flames broke the record of 42 consecutive games that was established by Coastal Carolina from Sept. 24, 2005 to Nov. 15, 2008.

**BABY BOOMER**

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 43.0 yards per punt, including 45.4 in his last two games. This season, Morgano has booted six of his 24 punts at least 50 yards -- including three this past weekend at The Citadel. Just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** (43.5 in 2006). Meanwhile, Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM PURVIS** is averaging 41.3 yards a punt, and the last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Hanna in 2007 (40.6).

**SUMMERS TIME**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 27 receptions for 363 yards and five touchdowns. He is on pace for 99 catches, 1,331 receiving yards and 18 touchdowns. The Big South single-season record for each category is 103 receptions, 1,077 receiving yards and 16 touchdown catches. Stay tuned.

**A GAME OF CATCH**

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** cracked the League's all-time top 10 for career receptions in Week 2, and stands eighth in Big South history with 136 career catches. He needs three receptions to move into seventh. Perry and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** continue to climb the Conference's all-time receiving records and have nearly identical career numbers. **EVEN STEVEN**

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** is third all-time in the Big South Conference with 4,469 career all-purpose yards. He needs 153 yards to surpass **SEAN MIZZER** (4,621) for second place. Stevenson recorded his fifth career game with 200 all-purpose yards this past weekend with 246 against Mars Hill. Meanwhile, Stevenson became just the second player in Conference history with 2,000 combined kickoff/punt return yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 2 against Wofford. He now has 2,045 in his career (1,895 kickoffs, 150 punts) and is 447 yards away from the all-time mark of 2,492 (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**). In addition, Stevenson needs 249 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards.

**TACKLE BOX**

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is tied for fourth all-time in Big South history with 313 career stops. Here is a look at the League's all-time top five tacklers.

**BIG SOUTH RECEIVING MORE NATIONAL AIR TIME**

The Big South Conference has announced that the Oct. 23 VMI at Charleston Southern football game on SportSouth and the Nov. 20 VMI at Gardner-Webb game on SportSouth will be simulcast nationally on **FOX COLLEGE SPORTS ATLANTIC (FCSA)**. This season, 23 games involving Big South members will be televised, and the League will appear on TV during 11 of the 12 weeks during the regular-season.

**RECORD RETURN**

VMI's **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** leads the Big South with a 19.1 punt return average and is second in the League with a 25.2 kickoff return average. If Rainey-Wiles can overtake the lead in kickoff return average and finish as the League's leader in both categories, he would be just the second player in Big South history to lead the Conference in punt return average and kickoff return average in the same season. The first and only player was Charleston Southern's **MIKE WASHINGTON** in 2002 when he averaged League-bests of 10.4 per punt return and 25.2 yards on kickoff returns.

**HEIR APPARENT**

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** is the Big South's active leading rusher with 2,254 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, is 90 yards away from seventh-place and is 1,380 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Gowins has nine career 100-yard rushing games to his credit, tied for fifth-most in Big South history.

**RUSHING UPDATE**

Charleston Southern's **DeMARCUS MOON** is four yards away from joining the Big South's 1,000-career rushing club. He would be the third Buccaneer to reach the milestone since the League started football in 2002, and the seventh CSU player overall. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

- 8. 2,254 Edwin Gowins, Stony Brook (2008-)

In addition to Moon, the following players are likely to join the club this season: Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** (762), Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (751), and Presbyterian College's **LANCE BYRD** (755) and **TRANDON DENDY** (747).

**GO-GO-GOWINS**

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has rushed for a touchdown in each of his last three games (six total) and is tied for seventh in Big South history with 21 career rushing touchdowns. All but six of his 21 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 32.1 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3).

**TRIPLE PLAY**

Charleston Southern opened the season with three consecutive home games for the first time in school history. The Buccaneers are just the third team in Big South football history to open a campaign with three-straight home games, joining Liberty (2002) and Gardner-Webb (2005). Charleston Southern's three-game homestand was its longest since 2006 when the Bucs played four-in-a-row at Buccaneer Field.

**TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

**THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010**

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE**

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.

\* This season marks the first time in 25 years that VMI will play two FBS teams in the same season. In 1985, VMI opened at Virginia before taking on North Carolina two weeks later.

\* VMI currently ranks first in the Big South in rushing defense, holding opponents to 117.5 yards per game.
