THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

BIG SOUTH KICKS OFF NINTH SEASON THIS WEEK

The Big South Conference begins Year Nine of its football history this week with all seven teams in action. It will be the third consecutive year that the League will open on a Thursday night (Presbyterian College at Wake Forest) and fourth time overall. Big South football teams are a combined 21-22 in season openers since 2002, including a League-best four wins in 2005 and 2006. Eight of the 22 losses have been against FBS members. VMI owns the longest season-opening win streak in Big South history, as the Keydets have won their last five openers, including shutouts in 2005, 2007 and 2008. Gardner-Webb and Liberty have also won five season openers since the Conference began football.

TEAM-BY-TEAM OPENERS

Charleston Southern is opening the campaign at home for the first time since 2002, as the Buccaneers had opened on the road the last seven seasons. Coastal Carolina is opening on the road for the sixth time overall in its eight-year history, and will open the season against an FBS opponent for the third-straight year. Gardner-Webb is opening at home for the second consecutive season, while Liberty will play its season opener at City Stadium in Lynchburg due to continued renovations at Williams Stadium. Presbyterian College is opening its season on the road for the fifth consecutive year, while Stony Brook opens the slate on the road for the second-straight season. VMI -- which is playing its 120th season, will open at home for the sixth-straight year. Below is a team-by-team look at season openers:

LIBERTY PICKED TO WIN IT ALL IN 2010

For the fourth consecutive season, Liberty University has been tabbed as the favorite in the Big South Conference's annual preseason football poll for the 2010 campaign, as voted by the League's head coaches and media panel. The Flames, which have won or shared the Big South title each of the past three seasons, is the first team in League history to be chosen as the preseason favorite four-straight seasons.

POINT OF ORDER

VMI has scored a point in its last 60 games -- the longest run in the history of the program and the second-longest scoring streak in Big South history. The Big South record for most consecutive games scoring a point is 67, set by Coastal Carolina from Sept. 6, 2003 - Nov. 15, 2008. Liberty follows VMI, as the Flames' current streak stands at 52 games, while Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 41 games. Gardner-Webb has not been blanked in 22 consecutive contests, followed by Stony Brook (16), Coastal Carolina (10) and Charleston Southern (8).

FB-YES

The Big South will play a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season. The Big South has come close to knocking off one of the big boys in recent seasons -- VMI lost to Army by five points last year (22-17), while Gardner-Webb fell to Georgia Tech by three points in 2008 (10-7) and Liberty was edged by Toledo by one point in 2007 (35-34).

HEIR APPARENT

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** is the Big South's active leading rusher with exactly 2,200 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, and enters this season 1,433 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**. Gowins, whose nine career 100-yard rushing games is tied for fifth-most in Big South history, has gained his 2,200 rushing yards in 21 career games to rank second among active FCS players with 104.76 rushing yards per game.

LIBERTY'S BROWN TABBED PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Liberty redshirt-junior quarterback **MIKE BROWN** has been voted the 2010 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Brown was the 2009 Big South Offensive Player of the Year -- becoming the first sophomore in Big South history to win the postseason award. He was named to *College Sporting News'* Fabulous 50 All-America team, and started all 11 games a year ago with 10 at wide receiver and one at quarterback. Brown is the third Liberty player to be voted Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, joining **DRE BARNES** (2003, 2004) and **RASHAD JENNINGS** (2008).

GARDNER-WEBB'S PATTERSON PICKED AS PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Gardner-Webb senior linebacker **MARTY PATTERSON**, who has already been named a 2010 preseason All-American by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* and *The Sports Network*, has been voted the 2010 Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Tabled the 2010 Big South Defensive Player of the Year by *Lindy's College Football Magazine*, Patterson is the fifth Gardner-Webb player to earn the preseason defensive honor, joining **MARIO WILLIAMS** (2003, 2004), **BRIAN JOHNSTON** (2007), **MARIO BROWN** (2008) and **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** (2009). Patterson needs 79 tackles to join the Big South's 300-tackle club.

HIDE TIDE

Charleston Southern carries a League-best four-game Conference win streak into this season, and scored 30 points in each of the four games -- a first in school history. The win streak is just one away from matching the school record of five-straight Big South wins.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS'** nine rushing TDs in 2009 went for an average of 30.9 yards (39-27-44-32-14-17-52-11-42), and in his career, Gowins is averaging 33.6 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42). All but five of his 20 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. Gowins rushed for 12 touchdowns in a nine-game stretch from Nov. 1, 2008 - Oct. 10, 2009, and ended the 2009 season with five TDs in his last two games.

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** ranks fourth all-time in Big South history with 3,984 career all-purpose yards. He enters the 2010 season needing 16 yards to become the fourth player in League history with 4,000 in a career, and 637 yards to move into second-place all-time. Stevenson is 2,145 yards away from **TIM MAYPRAY's** Big South Conference record of 6,129 career all-purpose yards. Meanwhile, Stevenson, who had career-highs of 364 rushing yards, 55 receptions and 724 receiving yards in 2009, needs just 323 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards. Stevenson owns a career average of 7.1 yards per rushing attempt.

THE LAST ONE STANDING

Gardner-Webb is the only Big South member to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South Conference game, a span of 34 contests. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 31 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.
