CHRIS SUMMERS • WR • R-Junior
Liberty • Jacksonville, Fla.

Summers caught eight passes for 132 yards and three touchdowns in Liberty's win over Savannah State, becoming just the seventh player in Big South history with three touchdown receptions in a game. He also is the first Liberty player to accomplish this feat since 2001. Summers scored on plays from nine, 30 and 17 yards out, and averaged 16.5 yards per reception. In addition, seven of his eight catches went for first downs, while his first two touchdown grabs gave Liberty 14-point margins both times. Summers now leads all FCS receivers with eight touchdown receptions this season.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

A.J. GROSS • LB • R-Junior
VMI • Waldorf, Md.

Gross finished with nine tackles (four solo and five assisted), a team season-high three tackles-for-loss (minus-3 yards) and forced a fumble in VMI's victory over Presbyterian College. One of his TFLs forced a third-and-long, while another stop came on third down and led to a punt. Gross helped the VMI defense limit PC to 205 yards of offense, 10 first downs and just 1-of-12 on third down opportunities.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

PATRICK MORGANO • P • Sophomore
Presbyterian College • Greenville, S.C.

Morgano averaged 43.3 yards on seven punts at VMI, including one kick from his own 20-yard line that traveled 64 yards and was not returned. The 64-yarder is the fifth-longest punt in Big South football history, and was one of his four kicks of 46 yards or longer. Morgano nearly finished with three punts inside the Keydets' 20-yard line, as two punts fell at the one before trickling into the end zone. VMI, which entered the game averaging 19.1 yards on punt returns, managed just three punt returns for 18 yards (6.0 average) on the day.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

JIMMY PRUITT • CB
Presbyterian College • Orlando, Fla.

Pruitt recorded a career-high nine tackles at VMI, finishing with three solo hits and six assisted stops. Pruitt, who entered the game with just six tackles in his previous four games, also recorded two pass break-ups against the Keydets that would have been first down plays.

VMI WINS CONFERENCE OPENER

The VMI Keydets claimed victory in the first Big South Conference game of the year, defeating Presbyterian College this past Saturday, 24-13. VMI is 1-0 in Big South play for the first time since 2008 and the third time overall (also in 2005). Presbyterian College suffered its seventh consecutive Big South loss, dating back to last season.

TWO DOWN, FIVE TO GO

Five teams will play their Big South openers during the next two weeks, starting with Charleston Southern, Liberty and Stony Brook this weekend. Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb will play their respective Conference openers Oct. 16. Below is a breakdown of how the five squads have fared in their Big South openers, as well as some additional notes:

Charleston Southern is opening on the road for the second-straight season and fifth time overall (0-4) ... Liberty carries a Big South-record nine-game home Conference win streak into Saturday's game ... Stony Brook has won its last four Big South home games ... Coastal Carolina has finished the season with a .500 record or better when winning its Conference opener ... Gardner-Webb will open League play against Charleston Southern for the second time in three seasons.

HIDE TIDE

Charleston Southern carries a League-best four-game Conference win streak into Saturday's action, and includes a streak of 30 points scored in each of the four games -- a first in school history. The win streak is just one away from matching the school record of five-straight Big South wins. Charleston Southern puts its four-game Conference win streak on the line Saturday at Liberty. The last time the Buccaneers defeated the Flames was in 2005.

BROWN ADDED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

On Monday, Oct. 4, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** was one of four players added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the Watch List since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. The Payton Award Watch List will be revised again on Oct. 25 before the final ballot is sent out to voters on Nov. 22.

BIG TIME RUSH

Coastal Carolina RB **ERIC O'NEAL**, who ranks third in the League with 341 rushing yards, has led the Chanticleers in rushing in each of the team's five games, the lone Big South player with this distinction this season. Following O'Neal are Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** and Presbyterian College's **TRANDON DENDY**, who have been their team's top rusher three times thus far.

CROWDED HOUSE

Liberty opened the newly refurbished and expanded 19,200-seat Williams Stadium this past Saturday with a resounding 52-14 win over Savannah State in front of 19,314 fans -- a Williams Stadium and Big South Conference single-game attendance record. The previous record was 16,112 for last year's game against North Carolina Central on Sept. 12. Saturday's game was the third-largest attended FCS game in the country, and the Flames have now played seven-straight games at Williams Stadium in front of a crowd that exceeds the stadium's capacity.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for 200 yards in each of his team's first five games of the season. Brown broke the record that was established by Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** during the first four games of the 2005 campaign. Meanwhile, Brown is the fourth quarterback in program history to throw for 200-or-more yards in five-straight games, and is one away from the program record of six by **ROBBY JUSTINO** and **BROCK SMITH**.

BIG MAC

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL**, who became the sixth player in Big South history with 30 career touchdown passes in Week 4, is now the eighth player in League annals with 5,000 yards of total offense. MacDowall eclipsed the milestone this past weekend at No. 11 Richmond, and ranks eighth in Conference history with 5,158 yards (4,672 passing, 486 rushing). MacDowall needs 129 yards to pass VMI's **JONATHAN WILSON** (5,286) for seventh-place in Big South history.

THREE BALL

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** became the seventh player in Big South history with three touchdown receptions in a game this past weekend against Savannah State. The last Big South player with this accomplishment was Stony Brook's **DWAYNE ELEY** on Oct. 25, 2008 at Coastal Carolina. Summers is the first Liberty player with three receiving TDs since **DANIEL THOMAS** had three against Wingate in 2001.

DAILY DOUBLE

Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** is the first Chanticleer to catch two touchdown passes in back-to-back games since **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2007. This past Saturday, VMI's **MARIO SCOTT** was the first Keydet to score two touchdowns receiving since **MICHAEL RAINEY-WILES** did it in 2008.

SUMMERS TIME

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 43 receptions for 561 yards and eight touchdowns. He leads all FCS wide receivers with his eight TD catches, while ranking fourth in the country in receptions per game (8.60) and receiving yards per game (112.20). Summers is on pace for 95 catches, 1,234 receiving yards and 18 touchdowns. The Big South single-season record for each category is 103 receptions, 1,077 receiving yards and 16 touchdown catches. Stay tuned.

BABY BOOMER

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 43.2 yards per punt, including 44.7 in his last four games. This season, Morgano has booted seven of his 34 punts at least 50 yards -- including three at The Citadel in Week 3 as well as a 64-yarder at VMI last weekend -- tied for the fifth-longest in Big South history. Just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** (43.5 in 2006). The last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Hanna in 2007 (40.6).

TOSCANO SAUCE

Charleston Southern QB **A.J. TOSCANO**, who moved into 10-place on the Big South's all-time passing yardage list during Week 3, became the Bucs' second-leading passer in school history in Week 4 as he increased his career passing yard total to 3,186. Toscano will hold onto the second spot for a long while, as the school record is 9,768 passing yards -- which is also the Big South Conference record -- held by **COLLIN DRAFTS**. Toscano is 10th in Big South history in both passing yards and completions, and needs one more touchdown pass to move into 10th-place in that category as well.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 57 games. Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 46 games (28 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (27), Stony Brook (20) and Charleston Southern (12).

EVEN STEVEN

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** remains third all-time in the Big South Conference with 4,469 career all-purpose yards. He is 153 yards away from supplanting **SEAN MIZZER** (4,621) for second place. Stevenson recorded his fifth career game with 200 all-purpose yards with 246 in Week 3 against Mars Hill.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** surpassed 1,000 career passing yards in Week 2, and is the only player in Big South history with 1,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards. Brown has thrown for 1,767 yards in his short stint as a quarterback, and has amassed 1,033 yards in his career as a receiver. He needs 158 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing milestone, which would make him the Conference's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards.

A GAME OF CATCH

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is fifth in Big South history with 149 career receptions, and needs three to move past former VMI receiver **ZOHN BURDEN** (151) for fourth. Perry also is 33 yards away from cracking the League's top 10 in career receiving yards. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** sits in a three-way tie for ninth-place with 127 career receptions, and is one of six players (and three active) tied for ninth with 12 career touchdown catches. Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** and Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** also have 12.

BIG BROWN

Of his 11 touchdown passes this season, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown eight on third down, while five have gone for at least 36 yards. In just six career starts at quarterback, Brown is 150-of-223 passing (=67.3 percent) for 1,767 yards and 12 touchdowns, in addition to being 4-2. He also has rushed 76 times for 346 yards (4.6 average) and three scores starting under center.

KICK STAND

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** tied the Big South Conference career record of 40 field goals when he made a 27-yarder this past Saturday against Savannah State. Bevins, who is 40-of-54 in his career at Liberty, joins Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06) as the only Big South kickers with 40 career field goals. Hoke was 40-of-63 during his time in Conway. Not far behind is Hoke's successor, **JUSTIN DURHAM**, who has made 38 career field goals since arriving at Coastal in 2007.

CATCHING UP

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** became the 22nd player in Big South history to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards when he reached the milestone in Week 4 at James Madison, and now stands at 1,178. He needs nine receptions for 100 in his career. Summers was joined in the 1,000-yard receiving club this past weekend when Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** (1,082) became the 23rd player to eclipse the milestone. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern's **KWAME KRAKUE** (968) and Presbyterian College's **PATRICK MCKOY** (944) are on the doorstep of 1,000 career receiving yards.

DOUBLE DOWN

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 20. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes. Stony Brook's current streak is the fifth-longest in Big South history.

BULL DURHAM

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** is three points away from becoming just the fourth place-kicker in Big South history with 200 career markers. The last kicker to reach the milestone was Charleston Southern's **NICK ELLIS** in 2007. Durham has made 38 field goals (third-most in Big South record books) and 83 point-after kicks.

HEIR APPARENT

Stony Brook junior **EDWIN GOWINS** recorded his 10th career 100-yard rushing game with his 101-yard effort in Week 4 against UMass. Gowins is just the fifth player in Big South history to reach the century mark in a game 10 times. Gowins also surpassed Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** (2,343) for seventh-place on the League's all-time rushing list with 2,355 career yards. Former VMI standout **TIM MAYPRAY** holds the sixth position at 2,456. Gowins is 1,279 yards away from breaking the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar **RASHAD JENNINGS**.

RUSHING UPDATE

Charleston Southern's **DeMARCUS MOON** joined the Big South's career 1,000-yard rushing club in Week 4, becoming the third Buccaneer to reach the milestone since the League started football in 2002, and the seventh CSU player overall. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

GO-GO-GOWINS

Stony Brook junior RB **EDWIN GOWINS** has rushed for a touchdown in each of his last four games (seven total) and is tied for fifth in Big South history with 22 career rushing touchdowns. All but seven of his 22 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 31.0 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3 - 8).

STILL KICKIN'

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became just the second player in Conference history with 2,000 combined kickoff/punt return yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 2 against Wofford. He now has 2,045 in his career (1,895 kickoffs, 150 punts) and is 447 yards away from the all-time mark of 2,492 (VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**). In addition, Stevenson needs 249 rushing yards to become the second player in League history with 1,000 career rushing and 1,000 career receiving yards.

THE KEYS TO SUCCESS

VMI held Presbyterian College to 13 points this past weekend, the fewest points the Keydets have allowed a Big South foe since Oct. 8, 2005, when VMI limited Charleston Southern to 12 points in a 34-12 victory over the Buccaneers.

GIVE THEM PASSING GRADES

Charleston Southern's **A.J. TOSCANO** and Stony Brook's **MICHAEL COULTER** have thrown a TD pass in each game this year. Dating back to last season, Toscano has thrown a touchdown pass in his last seven outings, while Coulter's streak is at five-straight games.

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is now fourth all-time in Big South history with 322 career stops. Here is a look at the League's all-time top four tacklers.

GOOD WORK YOUNG MAN

Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

JOLLY GOOD PLAY

Coastal Carolina's **TARVORRIS JOLLY** returned a Delaware State blocked field goal attempt 94 yards for a touchdown in Week 4 -- the first such return in school history. It was the fourth blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in Big South history, and the first since Charleston Southern's **PHILIP ASHLEY** did it against Johnson C. Smith on Sept. 15, 2007 with a 68-yard return. Jolly's 94-yarder is the longest return of a blocked field goal in League history.

THE LAST ONE STANDING

Gardner-Webb is the only Big South member to have not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South Conference game, a span of 34 contests. Meanwhile, Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 31 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

BIG SOUTH RECEIVING MORE NATIONAL AIR TIME

The Big South Conference announced that the Oct. 23 VMI at Charleston Southern football game on SportSouth and the Nov. 20 VMI at Gardner-Webb game on SportSouth will be simulcast nationally on **FOX COLLEGE SPORTS ATLANTIC** (FCSA). This season, 24 games involving Big South members will be televised, and the League will appear on TV during 11 of the 12 weeks during the regular-season.

THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

NORTHERN EXPOSURE

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.
