### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MIGUEL MAYSONET • RB • Sophomore**  
Stony Brook • Riverhead, N.Y.

Maysonet rushed for 193 yards and three touchdowns in Stony Brook's victory at Coastal Carolina. He averaged 9.6 yards per carry on his 20 attempts, and had five rushes of at least 10 yards, including a 78-yarder on the first play of SBU's second drive of the game, as well as a 31-yard touchdown run later in the first half. Maysonet had all three scores in the opening stanza, and his rushing total was the 11th-highest in school history. He also caught one pass for six yards and returned a kickoff 21 yards to finish with 220 all-purpose yards on the night.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**BRIAN DAVIS • DL • Junior**  
Presbyterian College • Charlotte, N.C.

Davis enjoyed a career day in helping the Blue Hose snap their 20-game losing streak with a victory at Gardner-Webb. He posted a career-high eight tackles, including a team-high six solo stops. Davis also recorded his first tackles behind the line of scrimmage this season with three quarterback sacks and four tackles-for-loss of 20 yards. Two of his sacks were on Gardner-Webb's final possession of the game that forced a 4th-and-19 situation. Davis had one-third of PC's Division I school-record and Big South single-game record nine sacks on the day.

**IN POSITION FOR THREE**

Liberty has started Big South play 2-0 for the fourth consecutive season, becoming the first program in League history to open Conference action 2-0 four-straight years. In addition, Stony Brook has opened Conference action at 2-0 for the second consecutive year. Both teams will attempt to start 3-0 this weekend, which would mark the second-straight year two teams opened League play at 3-0 in the same season. Meanwhile, Liberty is attempting to start 3-0 for the fourth consecutive season, which would also be a Conference first.

**PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE NOT FEELING SO BLUE AFTER SNAPPING SEVERAL STREAKS**

Presbyterian College snapped its 20-game overall losing streak with its 26-24 victory at Gardner-Webb this past Saturday, giving head coach **HAROLD NICHOLS** his first collegiate head coaching win in the process. In addition to the 20-game streak, the Blue Hose ended their 16-game road losing streak, as well as their eight-game skid in Big South play. In picking up its first-ever official Big South win, PC now must conquer its seven-game home losing streak and a four-game slide in home Conference games.

**ROAD TRIP**

The road teams have won six of the first nine Conference games this season (66.7 percent), including the past six games in-a-row. The most times the road squads have won during a Conference season was nine in 2009 (21 League contests). This season, the road teams have won by an average of 17.0 points, compared to 17.7 for the three times the home team has been the victor in a Big South game.

**EARLY SEASON TREND**

Of the first nine Big South Conference games this season, eight have been decided by at least 10 points, including three by at least 24 points, and the average winning margin currently sits at 17.2 points -- the highest since the 2007 season. The most Big South games decided by double figures in a season was 10 during a 21-game League slate in 2009.

**THREE-PEAT**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first player in Big South history to throw three touchdown passes in three consecutive games. Brown's streak started with three scoring strikes against Savannah State in Week 5, followed by three touchdown passes against Charleston Southern in Week 6. Brown then connected with **CHRIS SUMMERS** three times through the air at VMI in Week 7. Brown has thrown at least three TD passes in a game four times this season, just two away from the Big South single-season record of six, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006. In addition, Brown's 17 touchdown passes this year are tied for ninth-most in a season in League history.

**FIRE BALL**

Liberty has allowed just three rushing touchdowns this season, the fewest among the Big South football members. The Flames' defense has not allowed a rushing score in the past four games, a span of 130 rushing attempts.

**HIGH RATE OF RETURN**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** is 10 kick return yards away from breaking the Big South's all-time record for combined kickoff returns. He has 2,483 combined return yards in his career (2,284 kickoffs, 199 punts) and is on the cusp of eclipsing **TIM MAYPRAY**'s all-time mark of 2,492. Stevenson, who became the Big South's all-time leader in career kickoff return yardage in Week 7, needs eight kickoff returns to break Maypray's Conference record of 98.

**KEYDET KICKS**

VMI snapped its five-game road losing streak with a 34-16 victory at Charleston Southern this past Saturday. It was the Keydets' most points scored on the road since putting 34 on the scoreboard at Liberty in 2007. The 18-point victory was VMI's largest in a Big South game since defeating Coastal Carolina by 27 points in 2008. Meanwhile, the Keydets held Charleston Southern to 60 rushing yards, their fewest allowed since limiting Presbyterian College to 36 rushing yards on Oct. 24, 2009.

**SACK LUNCH**

Presbyterian College set a Big South single-game record this past Saturday with nine quarterback sacks at Gardner-Webb. The old mark was eight, established by Coastal Carolina at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. PC's **BRIAN DAVIS** recorded 3.0 sacks against the Runnin' Bulldogs, the sixth player in League history with three sacks in a game and first since VMI's **A.J. GROSS** had three against Coastal Carolina on Oct. 11, 2008.

**TRIED AND TRUD**

Charleston Southern QB **ANDREW TRUDNOWSKI** set a Conference-game record with 53 passing attempts this past Saturday against VMI. The previous record was 51, set by Gardner-Webb's **STAN DOOLITTLE** also against the Keydets on Oct. 3, 2009.

**SUMMERS TIME**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 54 receptions for 753 yards and 12 touchdowns, and is just the sixth player in Big South history with 50 receptions and 10 receiving touchdowns in the same season. His 12 TD catches lead all FCS wide receivers, and he ranks fifth in the country in receptions per game (7.71) and fourth in receiving yards per game (107.57). Summers is on pace for 85 catches, 1,183 receiving yards and 19 touchdowns this year. The Big South single-season record for each category is 103 receptions, 1,077 receiving yards and 16 touchdown catches. Stay tuned.

**THE NEW 40**

Liberty has tied the Big South record for most consecutive games scoring at least 40 points (three), as the Flames have scored 52, 44 and 41 points in their last three contests. The feat has now been achieved five times, including by Liberty last season in a three-game span from Oct. 31-Nov. 14.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for 200 yards in each of his team's first seven games of the season. Brown broke the record of four games that was established by Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** in 2005. Meanwhile, Brown has established the school record for most consecutive games passing for 200 yards, breaking the old mark of six set by **ROBBY JUSTINO** and **BROCK SMITH**. This Saturday at Presbyterian College, Brown will look to become the first Big South quarterback to throw for more than 200 yards in eight-straight games since Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** in 2006.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 59 games, and is looking to become the third team in League history to score in 60 consecutive games, joining Coastal Carolina and VMI. In addition, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 48 games (30 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (29), Stony Brook (23) and Charleston Southern (15).

**DOUBLE DOWN**

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 23, the fourth-longest streak in Big South history. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** needs 19 rushing yards to reach the 1,000-yard rushing plateau. That milestone would make him the Conference's first player with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. Brown has thrown for 2,308 yards in his short stint as a quarterback, and has also amassed 1,047 receiving yards in his career.

**RUSH WEEK**

Stony Brook continues to lead the Big South in rushing offense at 209.4 per game, while **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (719) and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (588) rank first and second, respectively, in rushing yards. If the two can continue at their current pace, they would be the first pair of teammates to finish 1-2 in season rushing yards in Big South history.

**SOMETHING SPECIAL**

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 33 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

**CATCHING SOME RAYS**

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** is the first player in Big South history to catch three touchdown passes in a game twice in the same season. Summers' 12 TD receptions this season leads all of FCS, and are just four away from matching the Conference record of 16, which was established by Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006. Summers has four multi-TD reception games this year and has caught a TD pass in six of Liberty's seven contests this season.

**CATCH HIM IF YOU CAN**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** is 35 receiving yards away from moving into fourth-place all-time in Conference annals, as well as 98 away from becoming just the fourth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards. He currently is tied for sixth with 143 career receptions and tied for eighth with 14 career touchdown receptions.

**RUSHING UPDATE**

Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS**, the Big South's active leading career rusher with 2,355 yards, has missed the last three games due to an injury, and his status for the remainder of the season is doubtful. Charleston Southern's **DeMARCUS MOON** joined the Big South's career 1,000-yard rushing club in Week 4, becoming the third Buccaneer to reach the milestone since the League started football in 2002, and the seventh CSU player overall. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history.

Meanwhile, Presbyterian College's **TRANDON DENDY** (991) and Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** (981) could surpass the milestone in the same game this weekend. Also closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards are PC's **LANCE BYRD** (913) and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (819). Brown and Stevenson are looking to join the Conference's 1,000-yard rushing and 1,000-yard receiving clubs, which currently boasts one member (Maypray).

**STILL BURNING**

Liberty extended its Big South record for longest home Conference win streak to 10 following its 44-20 win over Charleston Southern in Week 6. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 460 points (46.0 points per game), while holding its League brethren to 154 points (15.4 average). The Buccaneers were the first Big South team to score 20 points against Liberty in Williams Stadium since 2007.

**BIG MAC**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL**, who became the eighth player in League annals with 5,000 yards of total offense in Week 5, ranks sixth in Conference history with 5,592 (4,979 passing, 613 rushing). MacDowall is 54 total offensive yards away from supplanting Gardner-Webb's **STAN DOOLITTLE** (5,645) for fifth-place in Big South history. Meanwhile, MacDowall needs 21 passing yards to become the eighth QB in Big South history with 5,000 in a career.

**HALL PASS**

Gardner-Webb RB **PATRICK HALL** recorded his 10th career multi-touchdown game with two rushing scores against Presbyterian College this past weekend. He is fourth all-time in League history with 27 career rushing touchdowns, and is now the fourth player with 10 career multi-TD contests. With four games remaining, Hall has a chance to become the third player in Big South history with 30 career rushing touchdowns.

**KICK STAND**

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** is the Big South's all-time leader with 43 career field goals, as he broke the League record of 40 against Charleston Southern in Week 6. He is 43-of-58 in his career at Liberty, and ranks third in Big South history with 217 career points kicking as well as seventh in overall scoring. Bevins, who surpassed the 200-point barrier in Week 6, needs 11 points to move into second on the all-time kick scoring list. Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH** (2003-06) currently holds that spot with 228.

**BULL DURHAM**

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** became just the fifth placekicker in Big South history with 200 career points when he eclipsed the milestone at Presbyterian College in Week 7. Durham, who is the second Coastal Carolina kicker with 200 points kicking, has made 38 field goals (third-most in Big South record books) and 90 point-after kicks in his career.

**A GAME OF CATCH**

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is fourth in Big South history with 154 career receptions and needs eight to move past former Coastal Carolina receiver **JEROME SIMPSON** (161) for third. Perry also ranks ninth on the League's all-time top 10 in career receiving yards with 1,752.

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** became the 17th player in Big South history with 100 career receptions when he reached the milestone at VMI in Week 7. He now has 102 catches for 1,370 yards and 16 touchdowns in his career, and is four TD grabs away from becoming the fourth player with 20 career touchdown catches. Summers, who became the 22nd player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards in Week 4, was joined in the 1,000-yard receiving club in Week 5 when Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** (1,117) became the 23rd player to eclipse the milestone, and the duo was joined by Charleston Southern's **KWAME KRAKUE** (1,075) in Week 6. Presbyterian College's **PATRICK McKOY** (984) is on the doorstep of 1,000 career receiving yards.

**FAVORITE TOPPINGS**

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (34.6) and scoring defense (15.9), a feat they accomplished in 2007 and 2009. The Flames are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead in scoring offense in consecutive seasons, while their defensive prowess has them on track to have the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented fifth-straight campaign. In fact, Liberty is challenging the League's scoring defense record of 15.6, which was established by the 2006 Flames in head coach **DANNY ROCCO**'s first season at the helm.

**BIG BROWN**

Of his 17 touchdown passes this season, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown eight on third down and two on fourth down, while seven have gone for at least 36 yards. In just eight career starts at quarterback, Brown is 166-of-248 passing ( =66.9 percent) for 2,098 yards and 18 touchdowns, in addition to being 6-2. He also has rushed 101 times for 485 yards (4.8 average) and five scores starting under center.

**RECORD RETURNER NAMED NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

After returning a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown at Liberty in Week 6, Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became the first player in Big South history to return two kickoffs for touchdowns in the same game against Gardner-Webb in Week 7. After GWU went ahead 14-3 in the first quarter, Stevenson returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards for a score. Later in the fourth quarter, Gardner-Webb moved ahead 28-17 only to see Stevenson scoop up a squib kick and return it 81 yards for another touchdown. Stevenson now has three kickoff return touchdowns this year, a Big South single-season record, and leads all of FCS with a 40.7 kickoff return average. Stevenson was named National Special Teams Player of the Week by *The Sports Network* and *College Sporting News* for his performance against Gardner-Webb.

**BREAKING THE STREAK**

Prior to **GERALD STEVENSON**'s exploits in Week 7, Gardner-Webb was the last Big South member to not allow a kickoff return for a touchdown in a Big South Conference game, a span of 34 contests.

**CENTENARIANS**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON**'s 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at Liberty in Week 6 was the second returned from that distance in Big South history. Gardner-Webb's **DAVID MONTGOMERY** was the first, and he also did it against the Flames just last season on Nov. 14. It was Stevenson's first career kickoff return touchdown.

**100% TOTAL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN**'s 403 yards of total offense against Charleston Southern in Week 6 was the sixth-highest single-game total in Big South history, and he was the first to surpass the 400-yard mark since Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** had 400 at Stony Brook on Nov. 1, 2008. It was Brown's fourth game with at least 300 yards of total offense in 2010, the third-most in a single-season. Brown is tied for fourth all-time in career 300-yard total offense games with five.

**ADDING TO HIS TOTAL**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** recorded his fifth career 300-yard total offense game at Presbyterian College in Week 7, and his second this season. MacDowall has recorded four of those games against Big South foes -- Liberty, Stony Brook, Gardner-Webb and now PC. MacDowall will have his chance to achieve the feat against the remaining two teams later this season, first against VMI on Nov. 6 and later against Charleston Southern on Nov. 20.

**TACKLE BOX**

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is now fourth all-time in Big South history with 322 career stops. Here is a look at the League's all-time top four tacklers.

**BABY BOOMER**

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 42.3 yards per punt. The last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** in 2007 (40.6), and just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Hanna (43.5 in 2006).

**EVEN STEVEN**

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** amassed 389 all-purpose yards against Gardner-Webb in Week 7, shattering the Big South single-game record of 346 that was established by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** on Nov. 3, 2007 against Charleston Southern in Stevenson's freshman year. Against GWU, Stevenson had 243 kickoff return yards, 65 rushing yards, 47 receiving yards and 34 punt return yards to set the new standard. He also eclipsed 5,000 career all-purpose yards during the contest (5,057), becoming the second player in League history to surpass the mark. Maypray (2006-09) is the Big South career leader with 6,129 all-purpose yards.

**BROWN ADDED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST**

On Monday, Oct. 4, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** was one of four players added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the Watch List since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. The final official ballot will be sent out to voters on Nov. 22.

**CROWDED HOUSE**

Liberty opened the newly refurbished and expanded 19,200-seat Williams Stadium in Week 5 with a re-sounding 52-14 win over Savannah State in front of 19,314 fans -- a Williams Stadium and Big South Conference single-game attendance record. The previous record was 16,112 for last year's game against North Carolina Central on Sept. 12. A crowd of 18,587 attended the Charleston Southern contest in Week 6 -- setting the attendance record for a Big South game. The previous high for a Conference game was 15,208 for the VMI at Liberty game on Nov. 7, 2009.

**GOOD WORK YOUNG MAN**

Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

**TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

**BIG SOUTH RECEIVING MORE AIR TIME THIS SEASON**

This season, 26 football games involving Big South members will be televised -- including the League's first-ever appearances on ESPN3.com, and the Conference membership will appear on TV during 11 of the 12 weeks during the regular-season. Charleston Southern's game at Kentucky on Nov. 6 will be televised live on ESPN GamePlan, as well as on a tape-delayed basis on Big Blue Sports Network and FS South. A League-record eight Conference games will be televised this season, including two nationally on Fox College Sports Atlantic (FCSA).

**THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010**

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE**

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.
