CHRIS SUMMERS • WR • R-Junior
Liberty • Jacksonville, Fla.

Summers caught seven passes for 119 yards and two touchdowns against Gardner-Webb, which entered the game with the nation's third-ranked passing defense. His first touchdown grab of the day was a 26-yarder against double coverage in the end zone, and helped return the momentum to the Flames. Summers' second score was on a 56-yard catch-and-run after he got behind GWU's last line of defense and caught a sideline pass before out-running the defense. Summers, who ranks first in the nation with 14 touchdown receptions, posted the most receiving yards against the Runnin' Bulldogs this season.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ANDRAE JACOBS • LB • Sophomore
Coastal Carolina • Tabor City, N.C.

Jacobs had eight tackles (five solo, three assisted) and was part of a defense that allowed VMI just 199 yards and 3.0 yards per play. He notched a career-high five solo stops in addition to a sack and pass break-up. His pass deflection came on a 2nd-and-8 situation that led to an eventual VMI punt. Jacobs later made two key plays during a Keydet drive deep in Chanticleer territory. He first sacked the quarterback for a three-yard loss, then with VMI facing 4th-and-1 at the Coastal 2-yard line, he stopped Chaz Jones for no gain that gave the ball back to the CCU offense.

Bevins tied the Big South single-game record with four field goals made against Gardner-Webb, becoming the first kicker in League history to make four field goals in a game three times. Bevins connected from 23, 39, 28 and 23 yards, and added four extra-points to finish the day with 16 points and a perfect 8-of-8 on his placekicks. His 16 points tied for the most kicking points in a Conference game, and it was his 10th career 10-point game.

THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

MALCOM DIXON • QB
Charleston Southern • Tifton, Ga.

In just his fourth career game and first at the quarterback position, Dixon had 141 of CSU's 269 yards of offense at Kentucky. He completed 7-of-8 pass attempts for 45 yards and also carried the ball a team-high 19 times for a career-best 96 yards (5.1 yard average), including a long of 30 - the team's longest rush of the season.

CONFERENCE RACE FOR BIG SOUTH'S FIRST AUTOMATIC BID DOWN TO THREE TEAMS

Three teams are still alive for the Conference's first automatic bid to the FCS playoffs -- current League leaders Liberty (4-0) and Stony Brook (4-0) and Coastal Carolina (3-1). It will come down to the final two weeks of the regular-season, as Liberty travels to Coastal Carolina this weekend, and Stony Brook meets the Flames in the season finale on Nov. 20. The teams could end in a three-way tie for first at 5-1 each, which means the Conference's tiebreaker procedure would be utilized to determine the Big South's automatic qualifier to the postseason.

GIMME FIVE?

Liberty has started Big South play 4-0 for the fourth consecutive season, becoming the first program in League history to accomplish this feat. In addition, Stony Brook has opened Conference action at 4-0 for the second consecutive year. Both teams will attempt to start 5-0 this weekend, which would mark the first time two teams opened League play at 5-0 in the same season. Meanwhile, Liberty is attempting to start 5-0 for the third consecutive season, which would also be a Conference first.

BIG SOUTH'S TELEVISION PACKAGE FEATURES PIVOTAL GAME THIS WEEKEND

The Big South's television package this weekend features League-leading Liberty at second-place Coastal Carolina at 1:00pm on ESPN3.com in a game that will impact the top of the Conference standings. **MARK BRYANT** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action from Conway. The game will also be the FCS National Radio Game of the Week on radio, with **FRANK SANTORE** behind the mic.

TURNING THE CALENDAR PAGE

Charleston Southern's seven-game winning streak in November was snapped this past weekend at Kentucky. Still, the Buccaneers are 13-4 (=76.5 percent) in the month of November since 2005. Coastal Carolina is 17-6 (=73.9) in its history during the final month of the season, while Liberty is 19-7 (=73.1) since 2002. Stony Brook is 4-2 in November since joining the Big South in 2008. With its victory at VMI this past weekend, Coastal Carolina is the only Big South member to win a game in November every season since 2003.

ROAD WORK AHEAD

The road teams have won 10 of the first 15 Conference games this season (=66.7 percent), breaking the League record for the most times the road squads have won during a Conference season (nine in 2009, which featured 21 League contests for the first time).

A LOT TO A LITTLE

Of the first 15 Big South Conference games this season, 13 have been decided by at least 10 points -- a League record for most Big South games decided by double figures in a season. The previous record was 10, which was established in 2009 during a 21-game League slate. Seven of this year's Conference games have been decided by at least 20 points. The average winning margin for the Big South season currently sits at 18.1 points -- the highest since 2007.

DID YOU KNOW...?

... That Liberty and Stony Brook have won each of their four Big South games this season by at least 10 points? The Flames average winning margin in Conference games is 23.5 points, while Stony Brook's margin against League foes stands at 19.5 points.

SUMMERS TIME

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 69 receptions for 954 yards and 14 touchdowns. He is one reception away from becoming the sixth player in League history with 70 receptions in a season, as well as 46 yards shy of becoming the fifth player with 1,000 receiving yards in a campaign. Summers' 14 touchdown catches lead all of FCS and are second-most in a single-season in Big South history. Summers is challenging the Conference single-season records for most receiving yards (1,077) and touchdown receptions (16).

RUSH WEEK

Stony Brook is averaging 283.0 rushing yards in the last three games and continues to lead the Big South in rushing offense at 232.1 per game. **MIGUEL MAYSONET** surpassed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the season this past weekend at Presbyterian College, and sits atop the League's rushing leaders at 1,007. Teammate **BROCK JACKOLSKI** is second with 872 yards rushing, and if the two can continue at their current pace, they would be the first pair of teammates to finish 1-2 in season rushing yards in Big South history. Meanwhile, the pair are looking to become just the second set of teammates to rush for more than 900 yards in a season, as well as the fourth duo with 10 rushing touchdowns each. Maysonet has nine rushing scores this year and Jackolski has eight.

A REAL KICK

Liberty kicker **MATT BEVINS** tied the Big South single-game record with four field goals this past Saturday against Gardner-Webb, but he is the first in League history to do so three times in a career. Bevins finished with 16 points kicking against GWU, matching the single-game record for a Conference game. It was his 10th career 10-point kicking game, tying the Big South career record that was first set by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** from 2003-06.

SUPER SIZED COMBO

Stony Brook running back duo **BROCK JACKOLSKI** and **MIGUEL MAYSONET** have rushed for 100 yards in the same game three times this season and have nine 100-yard rushing games between them. The pair combined for 341 rushing yards in Week 9 against Charleston Southern, the seventh-highest rushing total by two teammates in a single-game in League history, and combined for 231 this past weekend at Presbyterian College. Jackolski has five 100-yard rushing games, and averages 138.0 yards when he surpasses the century mark. Maysonet has rushed for 100 yards in each of his last three games (four total) and has averaged 159.8 yards when he eclipses the 100-yard barrier in a game.

WAS THAT A NINER I JUST HEARD?

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for 200 yards in nine consecutive games -- all since the beginning of the season. Brown's nine games with at least 200 yards passing is the second-most in a single-season in Conference annals, and one behind the record of 10, which was established by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006.

IT'S GOOD TO TURN 50

Gardner-Webb WR **JAMES PERRY III** is two receptions away from recording his third season with 50 catches. He would become the second player in Big South history to accomplish this feat, as former Runnin' Bulldog wideout **DUVAUGHN FLAGLER** was the first to do so from 2005-07.

2,000-RECEIVING YARD ODYSSEY

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became the fourth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone in Week 9 at Stony Brook. He is currently fourth all-time with 2,074, in addition to being fifth in career receptions with 160 and tied for eighth with 14 career touchdown receptions. Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is 85 yards away from 2,000 in his career, and is third all-time with 164 career receptions.

STILL BURNING

Liberty extended its Big South-record Conference home winning streak to 11 games this past weekend with its 40-14 victory over Gardner-Webb. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 500 points (45.5 points per game), while holding its League brethren to 168 points (15.3 average). In Week 6, Charleston Southern was the first Big South team to score 20 points against Liberty in Williams Stadium since 2007.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 61 games, which is tied for the second-longest in League history. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 50 games (32 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (31), Stony Brook (25) and Charleston Southern (17).

HIGH RATE OF RETURN

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became the Big South's all-time leader for combined kick return yards in Week 9, as broke the career record of 2,492 that was held by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**. Stevenson, who became the Big South's all-time leader in career kickoff return yardage in Week 7, currently owns 2,559 combined yards (2,359 kickoffs, 200 punts). He needs two kickoff returns to break Maypray's Conference record of 98.

DOUBLE DOWN

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 25, the fourth-longest streak in Big South history. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes.

DOUBLED UP

Liberty has tied the Conference record for most consecutive League games scoring in double figures at 26. The Flames match the VMI Keydets record that was established from Oct. 4, 2003 - Oct. 10, 2009. Meanwhile, Liberty and VMI have not been shutout in Big South play. The Flames have scored in all 38 of their Big South games since 2002, while the Keydets have tallied points in all 36 of their Big South contests since joining in 2003.

BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE

Below is the Big South's tiebreaking procedure for multiple ties (more than two teams)...

- i. Composite records between the tying teams shall be evaluated to determine if one team has won more games against the other tying teams.
- ii. In the event step "i" does not resolve the multiple ties or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.
- iv. Points allowed in Conference games - **NOTE, a recommendation to change this to "average points allowed in Conference games" is being reviewed by the Big South's Council of Chief Executives.**
- v. Sagarin Rating
- vi. If ties still remain, the automatic qualifier shall be drawn by lot. If the multiple ties are reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-way tiebreaker formula shall be utilized.

CATCHING UP

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** has 117 career receptions for 1,571 yards and 18 touchdowns in his career, and is two TD grabs away from becoming the fourth Big South player with 20 career touchdown catches. Summers also is 10 catches away from cracking the League's top 10. His five 100-yard receiving games this season is tied for second-most in a campaign (the record is six). Summers has caught a touchdown pass in seven of nine games this year, including five multi-TD receiving games -- matching the Big South single-season record that was first set by Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006.

GROUND GAINER

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has rushed for 623 yards this season, the fourth-highest single-season rushing total for a quarterback in League history and 34 yards away from the second spot. The Big South single-season record for most rushing yards by a quarterback is 1,266 by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2008.

RUSHING UPDATE

Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET** surpassed 1,000 rushing yards this season, and is the 31st player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards. Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** and Presbyterian College's **TRANDON DENDY** surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the same game in Week 9. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history. Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS**, the Big South's active leading career rusher with 2,355 yards, is out for the remainder of the season with an injury.

Also closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards are PC's **LANCE BYRD** (927) and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (840). Stevenson is looking to join the Conference's 1,000-yard rushing and 1,000-yard receiving clubs, which currently boasts two members -- Maypray and Brown.

BIG MAC

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MACDOWALL** continues to move up the Conference's career charts for total offense and passing yards. He became the fifth player in Big South history to surpass 6,000 career yards of total offense this past Saturday at VMI, and holds the fifth spot at 6,089 yards. He also is 38 plays away from becoming the fifth player with 1,000. Meanwhile, MacDowall also ranks sixth with 5,438 career passing yards and needs 177 for fifth-place in League history.

KICK STAND

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** is the Big South's all-time leader with 49 career field goals, as he broke the League record of 40 against Charleston Southern in Week 6. He is 49-of-64 in his career at Liberty (=76.5), and ranks second in Big South history with 243 career points kicking as well as fifth in overall scoring. Bevins, who surpassed the 200-point barrier in Week 6, is 54 points away from tying the Big South career record for kick scoring, which is 297 points by Coastal Carolina's **JOSH HOKE** (2003-06).

BULL DURHAM

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** is the third kicker in Big South history to make 40 career field goals, which also ties the school record that was set by **JOSH HOKE** from 2003-06. Durham, who became just the fifth placekicker in Big South history with 200 career points when he eclipsed the milestone at Presbyterian College in Week 7, is currently at 217. He has made 40 field goals and 97 point-after kicks in his career.

A BIG PUP

Gardner-Webb true freshman DE **PRESTON PEMASA** leads the Big South with 5.5 quarterback sacks, and is looking to become the first frosh in League history to lead the Conference in sacks. Pemasa is approaching the freshman sack record of 6.5, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **ADRAIN GRADY** in 2003.

CUNNINGHAM HARDWARE

One week after becoming the Big South's all-time leader in career interception return yardage, Coastal Carolina's **KEON CUNNINGHAM** added to his total with a 39-yard pick six at VMI this past weekend. Cunningham has returned eight career interceptions for 225 yards. The old Big South interception return yard record was 184 set by Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** (2002-04).

IT'S ACADEMIC

Presbyterian College OL **JARED TAVERNIER** and Charleston Southern LB **BRAD SWEATT** were named to the 2010 *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District III team late last week, and are now eligible for Academic All-America honors. The All-District team is comprised of Division I student-athletes in both FBS and FCS, and the Big South has had multiple All-District honorees every year since starting football in 2002.

HE'S COULT-IVATING

In his last five games, Stony Brook QB **MICHAEL COULTER** is 71-of-106 passing (=67.0) for 884 yards and nine touchdowns for a 165.05 passing efficiency rating. More important is that he has not thrown an interception in that span. Coulter threw four touchdown passes this past Saturday at Presbyterian College and is second in the Big South with 13 TD throws. Meanwhile, Coulter has quietly entered the Conference's all-time top 10 for passing yards and touchdown passes, as he ranks 10th with 3,498 career passing yards and is tied for seventh with 28 career TDs.

TOTAL RECALL

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** ranks first in the nation in total offense at 330.1, which is currently pacing ahead of the Big South single-season record of 329.3, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006. With 2,971 yards of offense thus far, Brown is 29 away from becoming the third player in Big South history with 3,000 in a season, and is 208 yards shy of the second-highest single-season total in Conference annals (3,178 - Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** in 2006). Thigpen owns the record for most total offensive yards in a season with 3,952 during Coastal's 2006 playoff campaign.

FAVORITE TOPPINGS

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (35.1) and scoring defense (16.6), a feat they accomplished in 2007 and 2009. The Flames are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead in scoring offense in consecutive seasons, while their defensive prowess has them on track to have the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented fifth-straight year.

SOMETHING SPECIAL

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 35 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

BIG BROWN

In just 10 career starts at quarterback, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is 211-of-317 passing (=66.6 percent) for 2,590 yards and 20 touchdowns, in addition to being 8-2. He also has rushed 139 times for 711 yards (5.1 average) and seven scores starting under center. Brown's 149 rushing yards at Presbyterian College in Week 9 was the third-highest single-game total by a quarterback in Big South history. He also was the third Big South player to pass for 250 yards and rush for 100 yards in the same game at PC.

SAND CASTLES

For the first time in school history, Coastal Carolina scored 30 points in three consecutive Conference road games, as the Chanticleers scored 35, 30 and 31 in its three Big South games away from home this season. Coastal allowed just 37 points in those contests en route to a 3-0 Conference road record. Meanwhile, the Chanticleers have held its last two Big South opponents under 100 yards rushing, another first for the program.

BABY BOOMER

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 41.0 yards per punt. The last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** in 2007 (40.6), and just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Hanna (43.5 in 2006).

TACKLE BOX

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is fourth all-time in Big South history with 326 career stops. He needs 22 to move into a tie for third-place, which is currently held by former Liberty LB **MANNY ROJAS** (2003-06) with 348.

FIRE BALL

Liberty has allowed just six rushing touchdowns this season, and is challenging the Big South record for fewest rushing touchdowns allowed in a season. The current record is nine and was set by the 2004 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers. Earlier this year, Liberty did not permit a rushing touchdown in four-straight games, a span of 140 rushing attempts.

The NCAA does not list reclassifying teams in its overall statistics listings, therefore, Presbyterian College will not be ranked in the NCAA statistics again this season.

ZACH ATTACK

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** is three touchdown passes away from becoming the fifth player in Big South history with 40 career scoring strikes. He needs two to tie Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** for fifth all-time with 39.

THREE-PEAT

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown at least three TD passes in a game four times this season, just two away from the Big South single-season record of six, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006. In addition, Brown's 19 touchdown passes this year are tied for seventh-most in a season in League history. He was the first player in Big South history to throw three touchdown passes in three consecutive games earlier this season during Weeks 5-7.

STONEWALLED

Stony Brook is looking to become the first Big South team since Coastal Carolina in 2005 to lead the Conference in both rushing offense and rushing defense. The Seawolves are holding their opponents to 113.8 rushing yards per game, which is currently the second-lowest total allowed in a season. SBU would become the fourth team in League history to lead in both rushing offense and rushing defense in the same season if it can maintain its current pace.

THE IGNITOR

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. Brown surpassed the rushing milestone in Week 9 at Presbyterian College, and now has 1,207 career rushing yards, 2,800 career passing yards and 1,047 career receiving yards.

GOOD WORK YOUNG MAN

Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

BROWN ADDED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

On Monday, Oct. 4, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** was one of four players added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the Watch List since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. The final official ballot will be sent out to voters on Nov. 22.

CROWDED HOUSE

Liberty opened the newly refurbished and expanded 19,200-seat Williams Stadium in Week 5 with a re-sounding 52-14 win over Savannah State in front of 19,314 fans -- a Williams Stadium and Big South Conference single-game attendance record. The previous record was 16,112 for last year's game against North Carolina Central on Sept. 12. A crowd of 18,587 attended the Charleston Southern contest in Week 6 -- setting the attendance record for a Big South game. The previous high for a Conference game was 15,208 for the VMI at Liberty game on Nov. 7, 2009.

BIG SOUTH RECEIVING MORE AIR TIME THIS SEASON

This season, 26 football games involving Big South members will be televised -- including the League's first-ever appearances on ESPN3.com, and the Conference membership will appear on TV during 11 of the 12 weeks during the regular-season. A League-record eight Conference games will be televised this season, including two nationally on Fox College Sports Atlantic (FCSA).

NORTHERN EXPOSURE

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.
