### CHOICE HOTELS OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**MIKE BROWN • QB • R-Junior**  
Liberty • Charlottesville, Va.

Brown had a career-high 421 yards of total offense in Liberty's victory at Presbyterian College, the third-most in a Big South game and the fifth-highest overall single-game total in League annals. He rushed for a career-best 149 yards and a touchdown, while passing for 272 yards to become just the third quarterback in Big South history with more than 250 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game. Brown was responsible for nearly 80 percent of Liberty's total offense against the Blue Hose, and had 251 of his yards in the second half alone (11-of-14 passing for 148 and 103 yards rushing). Brown, who had 17 plays of 10 yards-or-more Saturday, now leads the nation in total offense.

**MIGUEL MAYSONET • RB • Sophomore**  
Stony Brook • Riverhead, N.Y.

Maysonet tied a Big South single-game record with four touchdowns scored in Stony Brook's win over Charleston Southern. He rushed for 158 yards and three scores, and caught two passes for 37 yards and a touchdown to become the sixth player in Big South history with four touchdowns in a game. Maysonet averaged 8.3 yards per carry and scored on runs of 32, 8 and 9 before catching a 35-yard TD pass in the third quarter. In the second quarter against the Buccaneers, he rushed five times for 81 yards and two scores, and followed with 49 yards on seven carries in the third quarter, including his third rushing touchdown of the day.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**DOMINIQUE DAVENPORT • S • R-Senior**  
Coastal Carolina • Bonaire, Ga.

Davenport had 11 tackles (six solo, five assisted), including a half-tackle for loss, in Coastal's overtime win at Gardner-Webb. In addition, he had a key interception return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. After a GWU interception in the Chanticleers' red zone, Davenport stepped in front of a Bulldog pass on the ensuing possession and returned it 28 yards for a score that tied the game at 17-17. He also recorded a pass break-up in the game.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**MATT BEVINS • K • Junior**  
Liberty • Newport News, Va.

Bevins made all six of his placekicks at Presbyterian College and finished the day with 10 points scored. He made field goals from 34 and 43 yards and was perfect on his four PAT attempts in recording his second-straight 10-point game. With his two field goals, Bevins became Liberty's all-time career leader with 45.

### THE CRONS BRAND FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

**RYAN SINGER • QB**  
Presbyterian College • Dunedin, Fla.

In just his third career game, Singer rushed for 72 yards and two touchdowns against Liberty, in addition to throwing for 63 yards on 7-of-12 passing. His five-yard touchdown run in the second quarter gave the Blue Hose a 10-7 lead and it was the first rushing touchdown allowed by Liberty in five games. Singer later scored on a 70-yard run in the fourth quarter, which is the longest run in PC's Division I history.

**GOING FOUR IT**

Liberty has started Big South play 3-0 for the fourth consecutive season, becoming the first program in League history to accomplish this feat. In addition, Stony Brook has opened Conference action at 3-0 for the second consecutive year. Both teams will attempt to start 4-0 this weekend, which would mark the second-straight year two teams opened League play at 4-0 in the same season. Meanwhile, Liberty is attempting to start 4-0 for the fourth consecutive season, which would also be a Conference first.

**THIS YEAR IS OUR YEAR -- BIG SOUTH TO ADVANCE TO FCS PLAYOFFS IN 2010**

Beginning this season, the Big South Conference will receive an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in League history. The automatic playoff berth coincides with the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams.

**BIG SOUTH'S TELEVISION PACKAGE FEATURES TWO GAMES THIS WEEKEND**

The Big South's television package features two broadcasts this weekend, as Stony Brook visits Presbyterian College at 1:00pm on SportSouth, and VMI hosts Coastal Carolina at 1:30pm on ESPN3.com. The Seawolves-Blue Hose game will also be available on The Big South Network presented by State Farm. **FRED CUNNINGHAM** (play-by-play) and **RALPH PATTERSON** (analyst) get the call in Clinton, while **MARK BRYANT** (play-by-play) and **NATE ROSS** (analyst) will call the action in Lexington. The broadcasts are part of a League-record eight Conference games that will be televised this year.

**TOP BILLING**

The League's top two defenses will be on the same field this Saturday when Liberty hosts Gardner-Webb. The Flames lead the Big South in scoring defense (16.9 points allowed) and is second in total defense (293.0). The Runnin' Bulldogs are tops in the Conference in total defense (287.9) and passing defense (138.0). Liberty is first in the League in passing offense with 292.8 yards per game.

**THE IGNITOR**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing, passing and receiving yards. Brown surpassed the rushing milestone this past Saturday at Presbyterian College, and now has 1,130 career rushing yards, 2,580 career passing yards and 1,047 career receiving yards.

**ROAD TRIP**

The road teams have won eight of the first 12 Conference games this season (66.7 percent). The most times the road squads have won during a Conference season was nine in 2009 (21 League contests). This season, the road teams have won by an average of 14.4 points, compared to 18.3 for the four times the home team has been the victor in a Big South game.

**EARLY SEASON TREND**

Of the first 12 Big South Conference games this season, 10 have been decided by at least 10 points -- matching the League record for most Big South games decided by double figures in a season, which was established in 2009 during a 21-game League slate. Four of this year's Conference games have been decided by at least 20 points, and the average winning margin currently sits at 15.7 points -- the highest since the 2007 season.

**HIGH RATE OF RETURN**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became the Big South's all-time leader for combined kick return yards this past weekend, as broke the career record of 2,492 that was held by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY**. Stevenson, who became the Big South's all-time leader in career kickoff return yardage in Week 7, stands at 2,493 combined yards (2,294 kickoffs, 199 punts). He needs seven kickoff returns to break Maypray's Conference record of 98.

**100% TOTAL**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** amassed a career-high 421 yards of total offense this past Saturday at Presbyterian College, which is the third-highest in a Big South game and the fifth-most overall single-game total in League history. It was his second game this season with 400 total offensive yards, and he is just the second player in Big South history to accomplish this feat twice in a season and in a career. Gardner-Webb's **DEVIN CAMPBELL** was the first to have two games with 400 yards of total offense during the 2008 season. With his effort on Saturday, Brown is now the nation's leader in total offense at 334.25.

**FOUR SCORE AND TWO YEARS AGO**

Stony Brook RB **MIGUEL MAYSONET** is the first Big South player to score four touchdowns in a game since VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** scored four times against Presbyterian College on Nov. 22, 2008. Maysonet had three rushing touchdowns and one TD reception against Charleston Southern this past Saturday to become the sixth player in League annals with four touchdowns in one game. Maysonet has now reached the end zone seven times in his last two games.

**TURNING THE CALENDAR PAGE**

Charleston Southern has won its last seven games played in the month of November, going 3-0 last season and 4-0 in 2008. The Bucs are 13-3 (=81.3 percent) in the month of November since 2005. Coastal Carolina is 16-6 (=72.7) in its history during the final month of the season, while Liberty is 18-7 (=72.0) since 2002. Stony Brook is 3-2 in November since joining the Big South in 2008. Coastal Carolina is the only Big South member to win a game in November every season since 2003.

**SUPER SIZED COMBO**

Stony Brook running back duo **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (183) and **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (158) combined for 341 rushing yards this past Saturday against Charleston Southern, the seventh-highest rushing total by two teammates in a single-game in League history.

**FIRE BALL**

Liberty's streak of not allowing a rushing touchdown was snapped at four games and 140 rushing attempts by Presbyterian College this past weekend. The Flames allowed two rushing scores to the Blue Hose, just their fourth and fifth given up this season. The Big South record for fewest rushing touchdowns allowed in a single-season is nine.

**RUSH WEEK**

Stony Brook continues to lead the Big South in rushing offense at 227.5 per game, while **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (877) and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (771) rank first and second, respectively, in rushing yards. If the two can continue at their current pace, they would be the first pair of teammates to finish 1-2 in season rushing yards in Big South history. Meanwhile, the pair are looking to become just the third set of teammates to rush for more than 800 yards in a season, as well as the fourth duo with 10 rushing touchdowns each. Maysonet has nine rushing scores this year and Jackolski has eight.

**THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS**

Gardner-Webb has held its last four opponents to under 300 yards of total offense, tying the Big South record. Coastal Carolina was the first team in League history to accomplish this feat when the Chanticleers held four consecutive teams under 300 offensive yards in 2004 from Sept. 25-Oct. 23.

**CATCH HIM IF YOU CAN**

Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** became the fourth player in Big South history with 2,000 career receiving yards when he surpassed the milestone this past Saturday at Stony Brook. He is currently fourth all-time with 2,006, in addition to being fifth in career receptions with 155 and tied for eighth with 14 career touchdown receptions.

**STILL BURNING**

Liberty is in the midst of a Big South-record 10-game Conference home winning streak. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 460 points (46.0 points per game), while holding its League brethren to 154 points (15.4 average). In Week 6, Charleston Southern was the first Big South team to score 20 points against Liberty in Williams Stadium since 2007.

**SUMMERS TIME**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** leads the Big South with 62 receptions for 835 yards and 12 touchdowns, and is just the sixth player in Big South history with 50 receptions and 10 receiving touchdowns in the same season. His 12 TD catches is tied for the national lead, and he ranks seventh in the country in receptions per game (7.75) and sixth in receiving yards per game (104.38). Summers is on pace for 85 catches, 1,148 receiving yards and 17 touchdowns this year. The Big South single-season record for each category is 103 receptions, 1,077 receiving yards and 16 touchdown catches. Stay tuned.

**WAS THAT A NINER I JUST HEARD?**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first quarterback in Big South football history to pass for 200 yards in each of his team's first eight games of the season. Brown broke the record of four games that was established by Gardner-Webb's **NICK ROBERTS** in 2005. Meanwhile, Brown has set the school record for most consecutive games passing for 200 yards, breaking the old mark of six set by **ROBBY JUSTINO** and **BROCK SMITH**. This Saturday against Gardner-Webb, Brown will look to become the first Big South quarterback in Conference history to throw for more than 200 yards in nine-straight games.

**POINT OF ORDER**

Liberty owns the Conference's active scoring streak at 60 games, and is the third team in League history to score in 60 consecutive contests, joining Coastal Carolina and VMI. In addition, Presbyterian College has not been shutout in its last 49 games (31 as official Big South members), followed by Gardner-Webb (30), Stony Brook (24) and Charleston Southern (16).

**BIG SOUTH TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE**

Below is the Big South's tiebreaking procedure for multiple ties (more than two teams)...

- i. Composite records between the tying teams shall be evaluated to determine if one team has won more games against the other tying teams.
- ii. In the event step "i" does not resolve the multiple ties or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying teams against the next highest team shall be compared.
- iii. The process outlined in step "ii" shall continue through the last team, if necessary.
- iv. Points allowed in Conference games - **NOTE, a recommendation to change this to "average points allowed in Conference games" is being reviewed by the Big South's Council of Chief Executives.**
- v. Sagarin Rating
- vi. If ties still remain, the automatic qualifier shall be drawn by lot. If the multiple ties are reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-way tiebreaker formula shall be utilized.

**DOUBLE DOWN**

Stony Brook is the Big South's active leader for most consecutive games scoring in double figures at 24, the fourth-longest streak in Big South history. The Seawolves took over the top spot after Liberty's Big South-record of 45 consecutive games scoring double figures was snapped in Week 4 at James Madison, as the Flames managed just a field goal against the Dukes.

**RUSHING UPDATE**

Liberty's **MIKE BROWN** and Presbyterian College's **TRANDON DENDY** surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the same game this past weekend. Below is a look at the Big South Conference's active career 1,000-yard rushers and where they rank in League history. Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS**, the Big South's active leading career rusher with 2,355 yards, is out for the remainder of the season with an injury.

Also closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards are PC's **LANCE BYRD** (920) and Charleston Southern's **GERALD STEVENSON** (831). Stevenson is looking to join the Conference's 1,000-yard rushing and 1,000-yard receiving clubs, which currently boasts two members -- Maypray and Brown.

**BIG MAC**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** continues to move up the Conference's career charts for total offense and passing yards. He is fifth all-time with 5,828 career yards of total offense, and is 172 away from becoming the fifth player with 6,000. MacDowall also ranks seventh with 5,184 career passing yards and needs seven for sixth-place in League history.

**HALL PASS**

Gardner-Webb RB **PATRICK HALL** recorded his 10th career multi-touchdown game with two rushing scores against Presbyterian College in Week 8. He is fourth all-time in League history with 27 career rushing touchdowns, and is now the fourth player with 10 career multi-TD contests. With three games remaining, Hall has a chance to become the third player in Big South history with 30 career rushing touchdowns.

**KICK STAND**

Liberty junior **MATT BEVINS** is the Big South's all-time leader with 45 career field goals, as he broke the League record of 40 against Charleston Southern in Week 6. He is 45-of-60 in his career at Liberty (=75.0), and ranks third in Big South history with 227 career points kicking as well as seventh in overall scoring. Bevins, who surpassed the 200-point barrier in Week 6, needs one point to move into second on the all-time kick scoring list. Gardner-Webb's **HUNTER SMITH** (2003-06) currently holds that spot with 228.

**BULL DURHAM**

Coastal Carolina kicker **JUSTIN DURHAM** became just the fifth placekicker in Big South history with 200 career points when he eclipsed the milestone at Presbyterian College in Week 7. Durham, who is the second Coastal Carolina kicker with 200 points kicking and is currently at 210, has made 39 field goals (third-most in Big South record books) and 93 point-after kicks in his career.

**A GAME OF CATCH**

Gardner-Webb's **JAMES PERRY III** is tied with former Coastal Carolina receiver **JEROME SIMPSON** for third-place in Big South history with 161 career receptions. Perry also ranks eighth on the League's all-time career receiving yards list with 1,868, and needs 19 to pass former Liberty wideout **BRANDON TURNER** for seventh (1,886).

**CATCHING UP**

Liberty's **CHRIS SUMMERS** has 110 career receptions for 1,452 yards and 16 touchdowns in his career, and is four TD grabs away from becoming the fourth Big South player with 20 career touchdown catches. Other receivers who eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving milestone with Summers this season are Charleston Southern's **KWAME KRAKUE** (1,159) and Coastal Carolina's **BRANDON WHITLEY** (1,140). Presbyterian College's **PATRICK McKOY** (999) is on the doorstep of 1,000 career receiving yards.

**CUNNINGHAM HARDWARE**

Coastal Carolina's **KEON CUNNINGHAM** became the Big South's all-time leader in interception return yardage this past weekend at Gardner-Webb. Cunningham returned his seventh career pick 36 yards to push his career total to 186, breaking the previous Conference record of 184 return yards that was held by Liberty's **ERICK HARRIS** (2002-04).

**FAVORITE TOPPINGS**

Liberty leads the Big South in both scoring offense (34.5) and scoring defense (16.9), a feat they accomplished in 2007 and 2009. The Flames are looking to become the first team in Big South history to lead in scoring offense in consecutive seasons, while their defensive prowess has them on track to have the Conference's top scoring defense for an unprecedented fifth-straight campaign.

**SOMETHING SPECIAL**

Coastal Carolina holds the Big South's longest streak of not allowing a punt return touchdown in a Conference game at 34 games. The last time the Chanticleers allowed a punt return touchdown in a League game was in their first-ever Big South contest, Oct. 4, 2003 against Gardner-Webb.

**BIG BROWN**

Of his 17 touchdown passes this season, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** has thrown eight on third down and two on fourth down, while seven have gone for at least 36 yards. In just nine career starts at quarterback, Brown is 191-of-286 passing ( =66.8 percent) for 2,370 yards and 18 touchdowns, in addition to being 7-2. He also has rushed 124 times for 634 yards (5.1 average) and six scores starting under center. Brown's 149 rushing yards this past Saturday at Presbyterian College was the third-highest single-game total by a quarterback in Big South history. Meanwhile, Brown was the third Big South player to pass for 250 yards and rush for 100 yards in the same game this past Saturday at PC.

**BABY BOOMER**

Presbyterian College sophomore P **PATRICK MORGANO** is averaging a League-best 42.6 yards per punt. The last time a Big South punter averaged 40.0 yards a punt was Gardner-Webb's **MICHAEL HANNA** in 2007 (40.6), and just two players have averaged at least 43.0 yards a punt in a single-season -- Gardner-Webb's **GRAHAM WHITLOCK** (45.5 in 2003) and Hanna (43.5 in 2006).

**ADDING TO HIS TOTAL**

Coastal Carolina QB **ZACH MacDOWALL** recorded his fifth career 300-yard total offense game at Presbyterian College in Week 7, and his second this season. MacDowall has recorded four of those games against Big South foes -- Liberty, Stony Brook, Gardner-Webb and now PC. MacDowall will have his chance to achieve the feat against the remaining two teams this month, first against VMI on Saturday, and later against Charleston Southern on Nov. 20.

**TACKLE BOX**

Gardner-Webb linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS**, who became the eighth player in Big South history with 300 career tackles when he surpassed the milestone with 18 tackles in GWU's season-opening win over Brevard, is fourth all-time in Big South history with 322 career stops. Here is a look at the League's all-time top four tacklers.

**THREE-PEAT**

Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** is the first player in Big South history to throw three touchdown passes in three consecutive games. Brown's streak started with three scoring strikes against Savannah State in Week 5, followed by three touchdown passes against Charleston Southern in Week 6. Brown then connected with **CHRIS SUMMERS** three times through the air at VMI in Week 7. Brown has thrown at least three TD passes in a game four times this season, just two away from the Big South single-season record of six, which was set by Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006. In addition, Brown's 17 touchdown passes this year are tied for ninth-most in a season in League history.

**SACK LUNCH**

Presbyterian College set a Big South single-game record with nine quarterback sacks at Gardner-Webb in Week 8. The old mark was eight, established by Coastal Carolina at Davidson on Nov. 8, 2003. PC's **BRIAN DAVIS** recorded 3.0 sacks against the Runnin' Bulldogs, the sixth player in League history with three sacks in a game and first since VMI's **A.J. GROSS** had three against Coastal Carolina on Oct. 11, 2008.

**EVEN STEVEN**

Charleston Southern senior WR **GERALD STEVENSON** amassed 389 all-purpose yards against Gardner-Webb in Week 7, shattering the Big South single-game record of 346 that was established by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** on Nov. 3, 2007 against Charleston Southern in Stevenson's freshman year. Against GWU, Stevenson had 243 kickoff return yards, 65 rushing yards, 47 receiving yards and 34 punt return yards to set the new standard. He also eclipsed 5,000 career all-purpose yards during the contest -- becoming the second player in League history to surpass the mark, and is currently at 5,330. Maypray (2006-09) is the Big South career leader with 6,129 all-purpose yards.

**CATCHING SOME RAYS**

Liberty WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** is the first player in Big South history to catch three touchdown passes in a game twice in the same season. Summers' 12 TD receptions this season is tied for the lead in FCS, and are just four away from matching the Conference record of 16, which was established by Coastal Carolina's **JEROME SIMPSON** in 2006. Summers has four multi-TD reception games this year and has caught a TD pass in six of Liberty's eight contests this season.

**GOOD WORK YOUNG MAN**

Charleston Southern OL **JORDAN LANCASTER** was one of 22 players from all classifications to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team -- college football's preeminent community service award. Lancaster is the first Big South Conference student-athlete to be recognized with this achievement.

**PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE NOT FEELING SO BLUE AFTER SNAPPING SEVERAL STREAKS**

Presbyterian College snapped its 20-game overall losing streak with its 26-24 victory at Gardner-Webb in Week 8, giving head coach **HAROLD NICHOLS** his first collegiate head coaching win in the process. In addition to the 20-game streak, the Blue Hose ended their 16-game road losing streak, as well as their eight-game skid in Big South play. In picking up its first-ever official Big South win, PC now must conquer its eight-game home losing streak and a five-game slide in home Conference games.

**TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE -- BIG SOUTH SCORES FIRST-EVER FBS WINS**

Gardner-Webb and Liberty made Big South Conference history in Week 2 as both schools defeated FBS opponents -- the League's first-ever wins against FBS programs. Gardner-Webb was the first to claim victory with its 38-37 overtime triumph at Akron at 3:15pm. Less than seven hours later, Liberty emerged with a 27-23 win at Ball State at 9:55pm. The Big South is playing a League-record 10 games against FBS opponents in 2010. The previous high was eight, just last year. Charleston Southern, Presbyterian College and VMI each will play two FBS foes this season.

**BROWN ADDED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST**

On Monday, Oct. 4, Liberty QB **MIKE BROWN** was one of four players added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is presented by *The Sports Network* and sponsored by Fathead.com. Brown is the first Big South player on the Watch List since former Flames RB **RASHAD JENNINGS** in 2008, and is the fourth overall to be among the top candidates for the top individual honor in FCS. The final official ballot will be sent out to voters on Nov. 22.

**CROWDED HOUSE**

Liberty opened the newly refurbished and expanded 19,200-seat Williams Stadium in Week 5 with a resounding 52-14 win over Savannah State in front of 19,314 fans -- a Williams Stadium and Big South Conference single-game attendance record. The previous record was 16,112 for last year's game against North Carolina Central on Sept. 12. A crowd of 18,587 attended the Charleston Southern contest in Week 6 -- setting the attendance record for a Big South game. The previous high for a Conference game was 15,208 for the VMI at Liberty game on Nov. 7, 2009.

**BIG SOUTH RECEIVING MORE AIR TIME THIS SEASON**

This season, 26 football games involving Big South members will be televised -- including the League's first-ever appearances on ESPN3.com, and the Conference membership will appear on TV during 11 of the 12 weeks during the regular-season. Charleston Southern's game at Kentucky this Saturday will be televised live on ESPN GamePlan, as well as on a tape-delayed basis on Big Blue Sports Network and FS South. A League-record eight Conference games will be televised this season, including two nationally on Fox College Sports Atlantic (FCSA).

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE**

On Sept. 1, the Big South Conference and Stony Brook University announced a four-year membership extension. SBU, which began its associate membership in 2008, will continue as Big South football members through the 2015 season.
